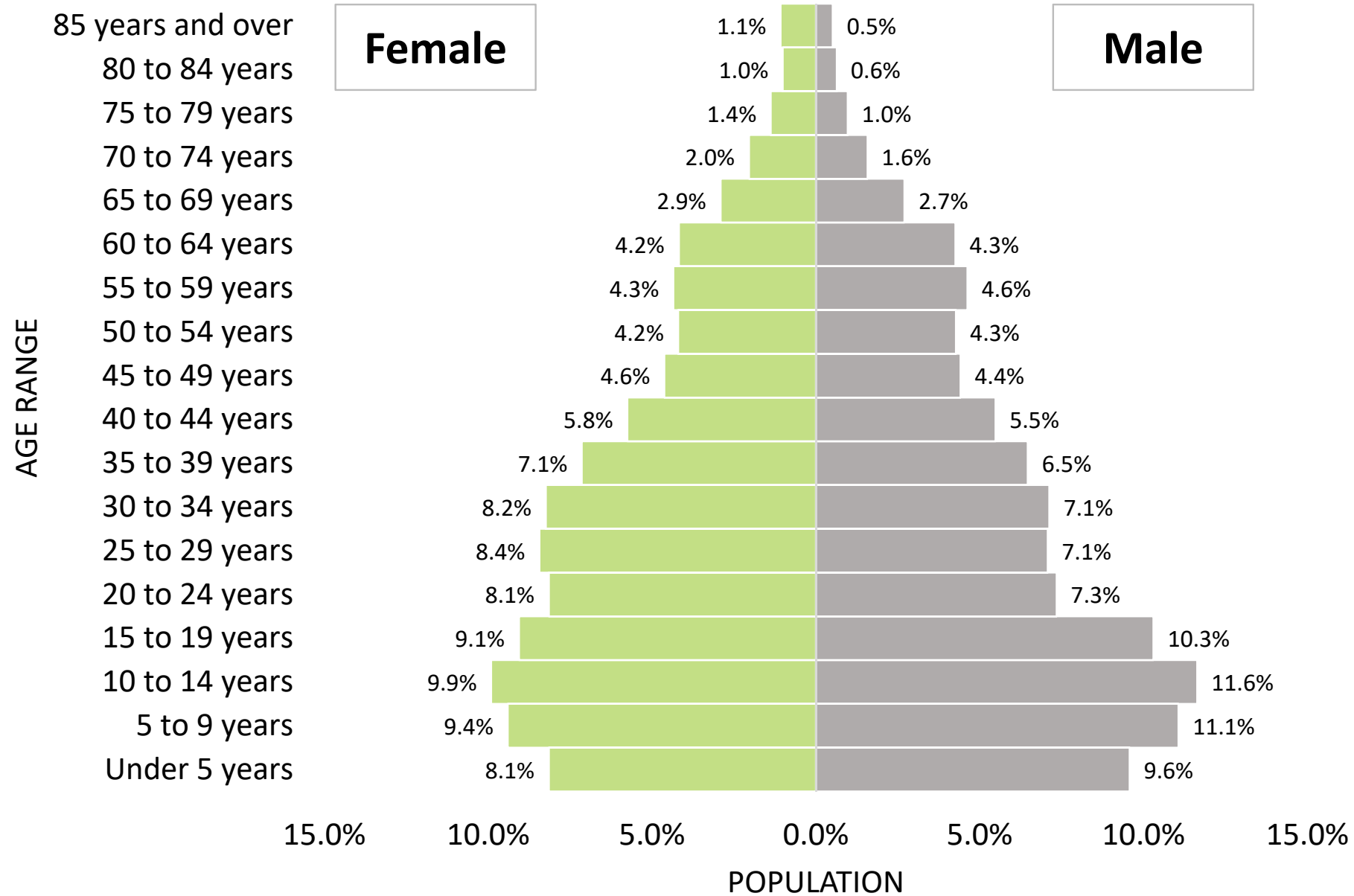
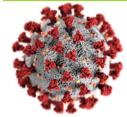

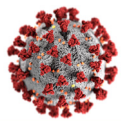
# New Mexico HSD Program Recipients by Age and Gender as a Percent of Total Recipients as of October 2020

## New Mexico Medicaid Program – Overview of Centennial Care 2.0 Programs

Centennial Care entered its seventh year in 2020 and has effectuated a modernized healthcare delivery system in New Mexico that focuses on improved access to care, integrated care, care coordination, and quality of service using its four guiding principles:

- To create a comprehensive service delivery system that provides the full array of benefits and services.
- To encourage personal responsibility, so that members become more active participants in their health and more efficient users of the health care system.
- To advance Payment Reform strategies that reward improved outcomes rather than for the quantity of services delivered.
- To simplify the administration of the program for providers and members.

**Managed Care Organizations (MCOs):** Blue Cross/Blue Shield of New Mexico, Presbyterian Health Plan, Western Sky Community Care

**Public Health Emergency (PHE) regarding Coronavirus (COVID-19):** On January 31, 2020, the Health and Human Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health emergency for the United States to aid the nation’s healthcare community in responding to the 2019 novel coronavirus also known as COVID-19. This declaration is retroactive to January 27, 2020. In response to the PHE, HSD requested several federal authorities and were approved for the following:

**New Mexico Disaster Relief State Plan Amendments (SPAs):** HSD submitted six Disaster Relief SPAs and received CMS approval for the following:

- Expands the list of qualified entities allowed to do Presumptive Eligibility
- Increases DRG rates for ICU inpatient hospital stays by 50% and all other inpatient hospital stays by 12.4%;
- Established Category of Eligibility (COE) for the COVID Testing Group for the uninsured population;
- Targeted Access UPL Supplemental Payments;
- Nursing Facility Rate Increases applied when treating fee for service COVID-19 members;
- Increased hospital stays services from April 1, 2020 – June 30, 2020;

- Increased rate increase for services provided under Family Infant Toddler (FIT) program for July 1, 2020 – July 31, 2020;
- A rate increase of \$1 to curbside medication pick-up for all Medicaid pharmacy providers for October 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020; and
- Increased rates to non-hospital providers for E&M, non-E&M, and dental services.

**1135 Waiver:** HSD submitted a 1135 waiver and received CMS approval for the following:

- Suspending prior authorizations and extending existing authorizations;
- Suspending PASRR Level I and II screening assessments for 30 days;
- Extension of time to request fair hearing of up to 120 days;
- Enroll providers who are enrolled in another state’s Medicaid program or who are enrolled in Medicare;
- Waive screening requirements (i.e., Fingerprints, site visits, etc.) to quickly enroll providers;
- Cease revalidation of currently enrolled providers;
- Payments to facilities for services provided in alternative settings;
- Temporarily allow non-emergency ambulance suppliers;
- Temporarily suspend payment sanctions; and
- Temporarily allow legally responsible individuals to provide PCS services to children under the EPSDT benefit.

**Appendix Ks:** HSD submitted five Appendix Ks and received CMS approval for the following:

**1915c Waivers (Medically Fragile, Mi Via, Developmental Disability, and Supports Waiver)**

- Exceed service limitations (i.e., additional funds to purchase electronic devices for members, exceed provider limits in a controlled community residence and suspend prior authorization requirements for waiver services, which are related to or resulting from this emergency);
- Expand service settings (i.e., telephonic visits in lieu of face-to-face and provider trainings also done through telehealth mechanisms);
- Permit payment to family caregivers;

- Modify provider enrollment requirements (i.e., suspending fingerprinting and modifying training requirements);

- Utilizing currently approved Level of Care Assessments to fulfil the annual requirement or completing new assessments telephonically;
- Modifying the person-centered care plan development process to allow for telephonic participation and electronic approval;
- Modifying incident reporting requirements;
- Temporarily increase payment rates; and
- Allow for payment for the purpose of supporting waiver participants in an acute care hospital or short-term institutional stay when necessary supports (including communication and intensive personal care) are not available in that setting, or when the individual requires those services for communication and behavioral stabilization, and such services are not covered in such settings.

## 1115 Demonstration Waiver for Home Community Benefit Services (HCBS)

- Expand service settings (i.e., telephonic visits in lieu of face-face and provider trainings also done through telehealth mechanisms);
- Permit payment for services rendered by family caregivers or legally responsible individuals if not already permitted under the waiver;
- Modifying provider qualifications to allow provider enrollment or re-enrollment with modified risk screening elements;
- Modification to the process for level of care evaluations or re-evaluations;
- Modifying person-centered service plan development process to allow for telephonic participation and electronic approval;
- Modifying incident reporting requirements;
- Allow for payment for services; and
- Retainer payments for personal care services.

## Native American Collaboration

The 2009 State-Tribal Collaboration Act codified an effective government-to-government communication and collaboration between state and Tribal governments. The Act provides the framework for the state and Tribes to work together to develop successful programs and services to benefit New Mexico's Tribes, Pueblos, Nations and Native American citizens. Part of the Act requires HSD to train state employees in cultural competency and to submit an annual report to the Indian Affairs Department regarding HSD's implementation of the Act, as well as the programs and service HSD provides for Native Americans.

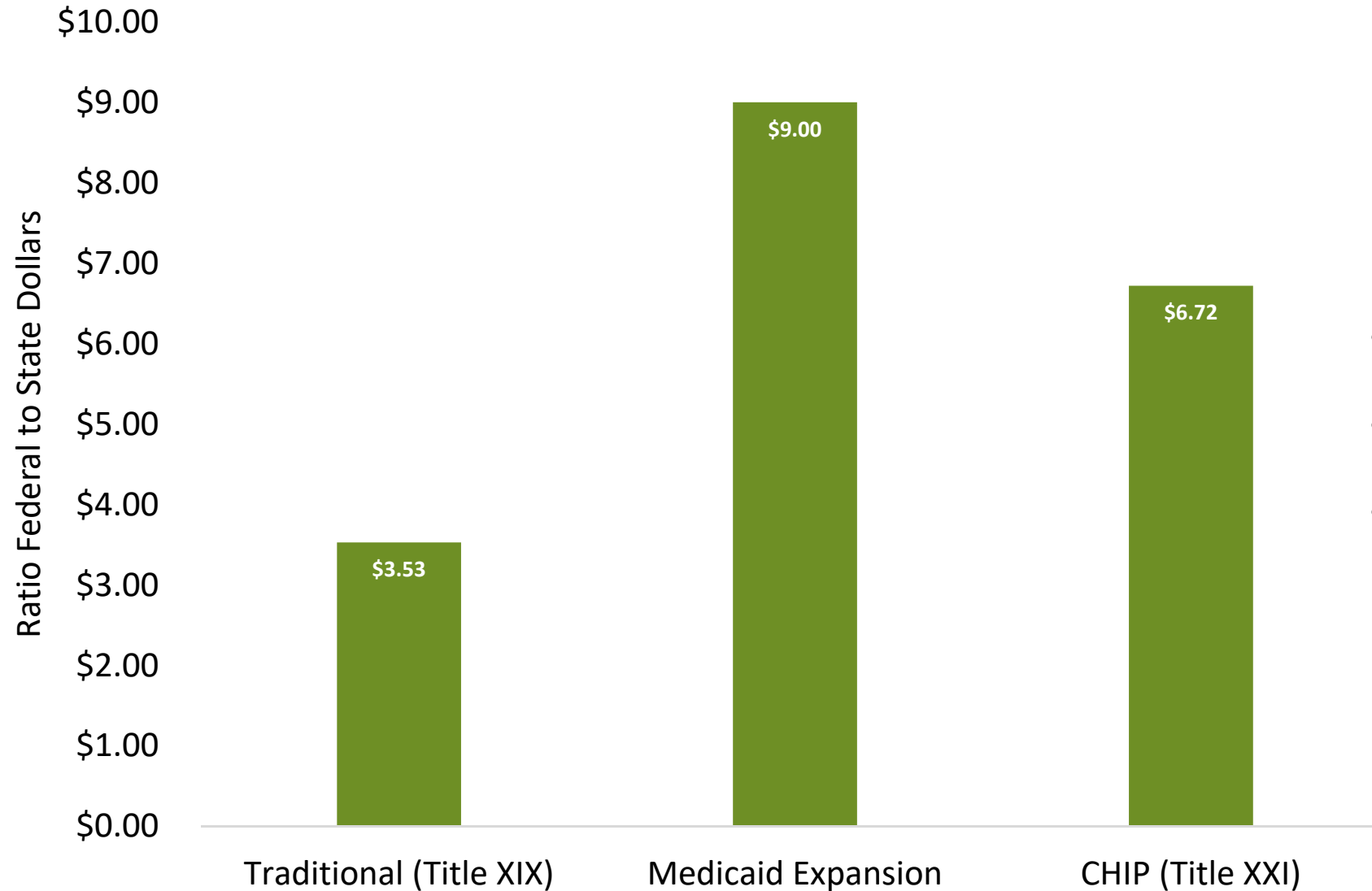
In 2020, with the onset of the COVID pandemic, HSD has worked extensively with the Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations in New Mexico to provide access to needed personal protective equipment, food, lodging, shelter, medical care, and transportation. The Medical Assistance Division and the Income Support Division have accessed federal waivers to increase Medicaid and SNAP benefits to New Mexico families.

The Native American Technical Advisory Committee (NATAC) was established in September 2012 as a subcommittee of the Medicaid Advisory Committee to give the Tribes, Pueblos, and Nations an opportunity to meet with the New Mexico Medicaid Director on a quarterly basis. The focus of these meetings is to continue discussion regarding Medicaid, including Centennial Care 2.0, Behavioral Health services, Income Support Division services, Tribal Notifications and the Indian Managed Care Entity (IMCE). HSD seeks the guidance from tribal leaders and their representative on how best to deliver services to their communities in this forum.

HSD continues to work with IHS/Tribal 638 facilities to develop the process for 100% Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAP) for services received through an IHS/Tribal 638 facility and furnished to Medicaid eligible Native Americans. Efforts include 100% FMAP for IHS/tribal 638 Pharmacy Outpatient Prescription refill and signed Care Coordination Agreements (CCA) between:

- UNMH and Albuquerque Area Indian Health Service (AAIHS)
- Presbyterian Health Services and AIIHS
- UNMH and Navajo Area Indian Health Service

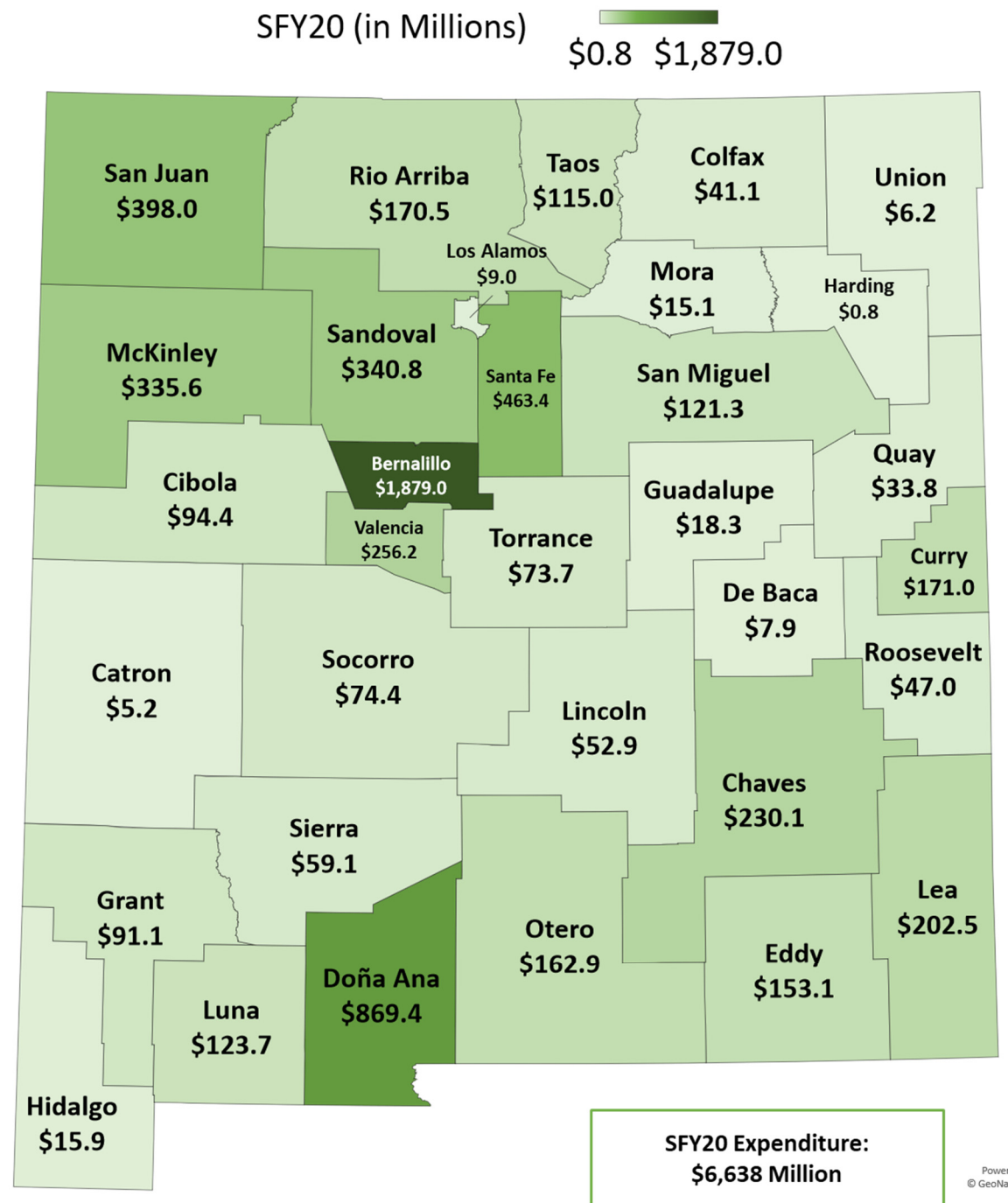
## Ratios of Federal to State Dollars Funding New Mexico Medicaid/CHIP Population, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 21

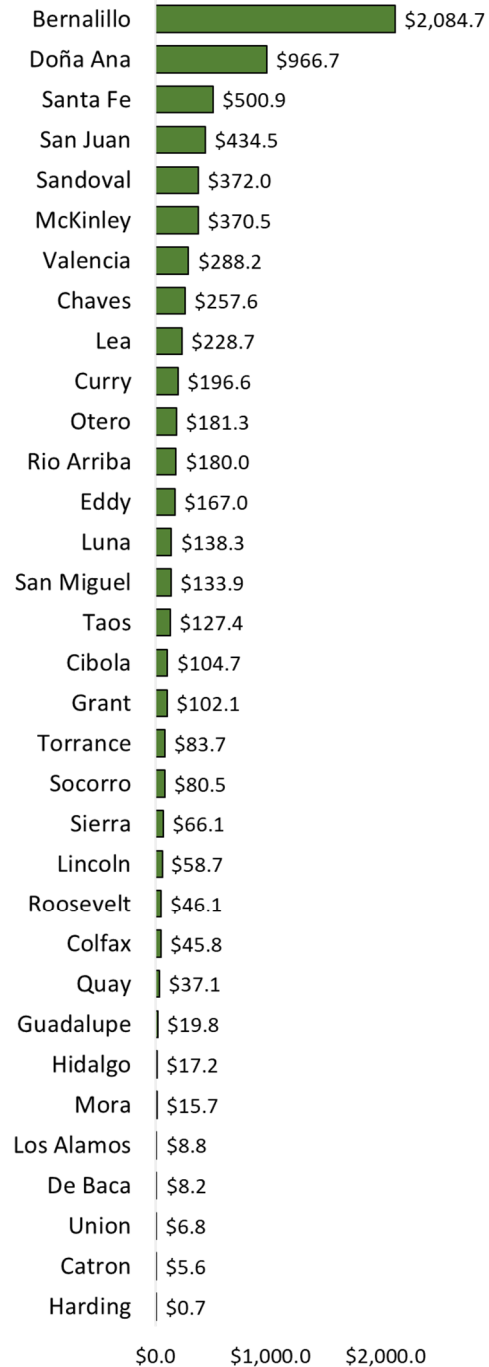
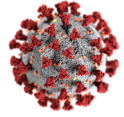
# State Fiscal Year (SFY) 20 (revised) Medicaid/CHIP Expenditures for New Mexico, Pro-rated by County



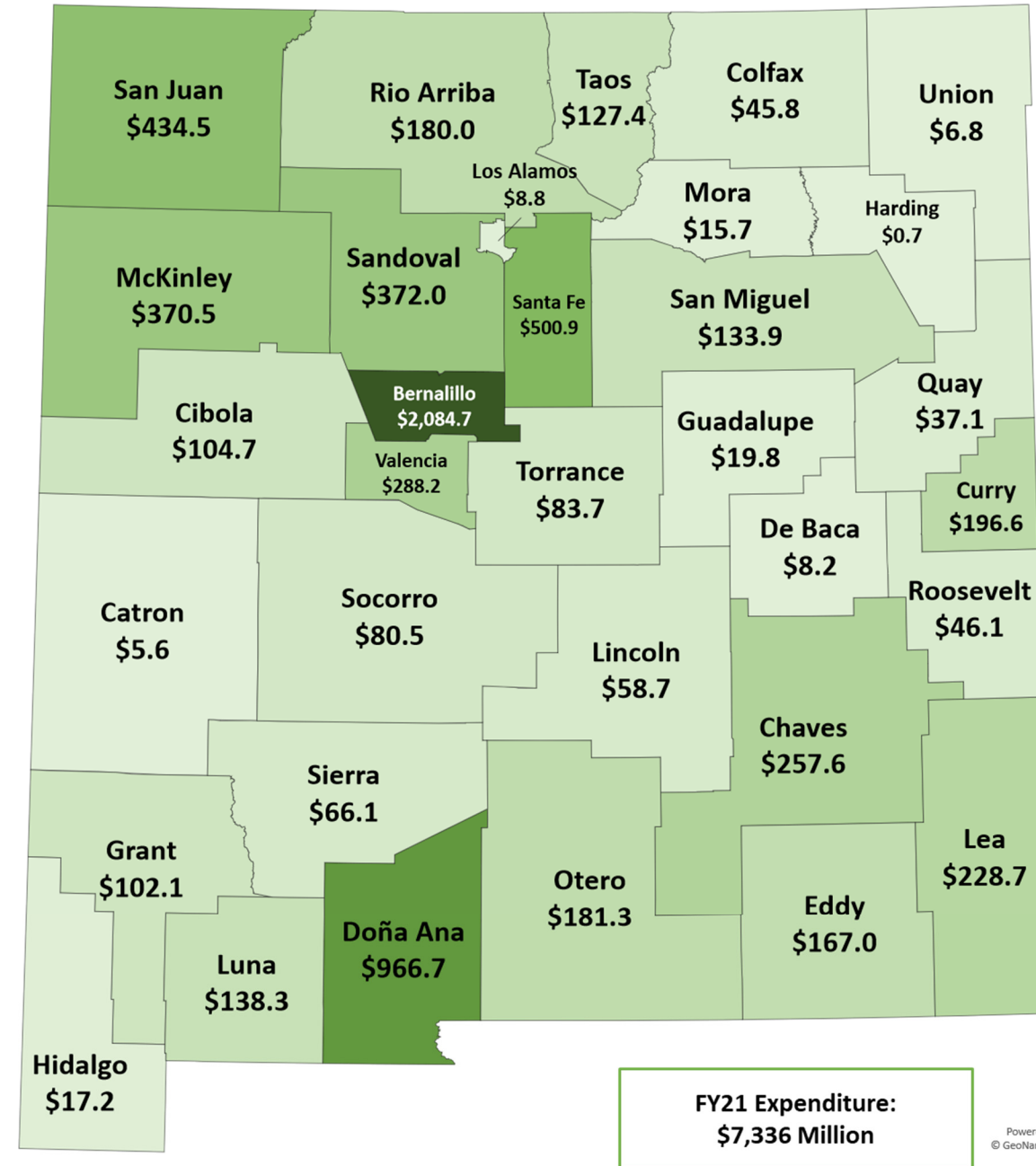

# State Fiscal Year (SFY) 21 Medicaid/CHIP Expenditures for New Mexico, Pro-rated by County



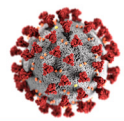
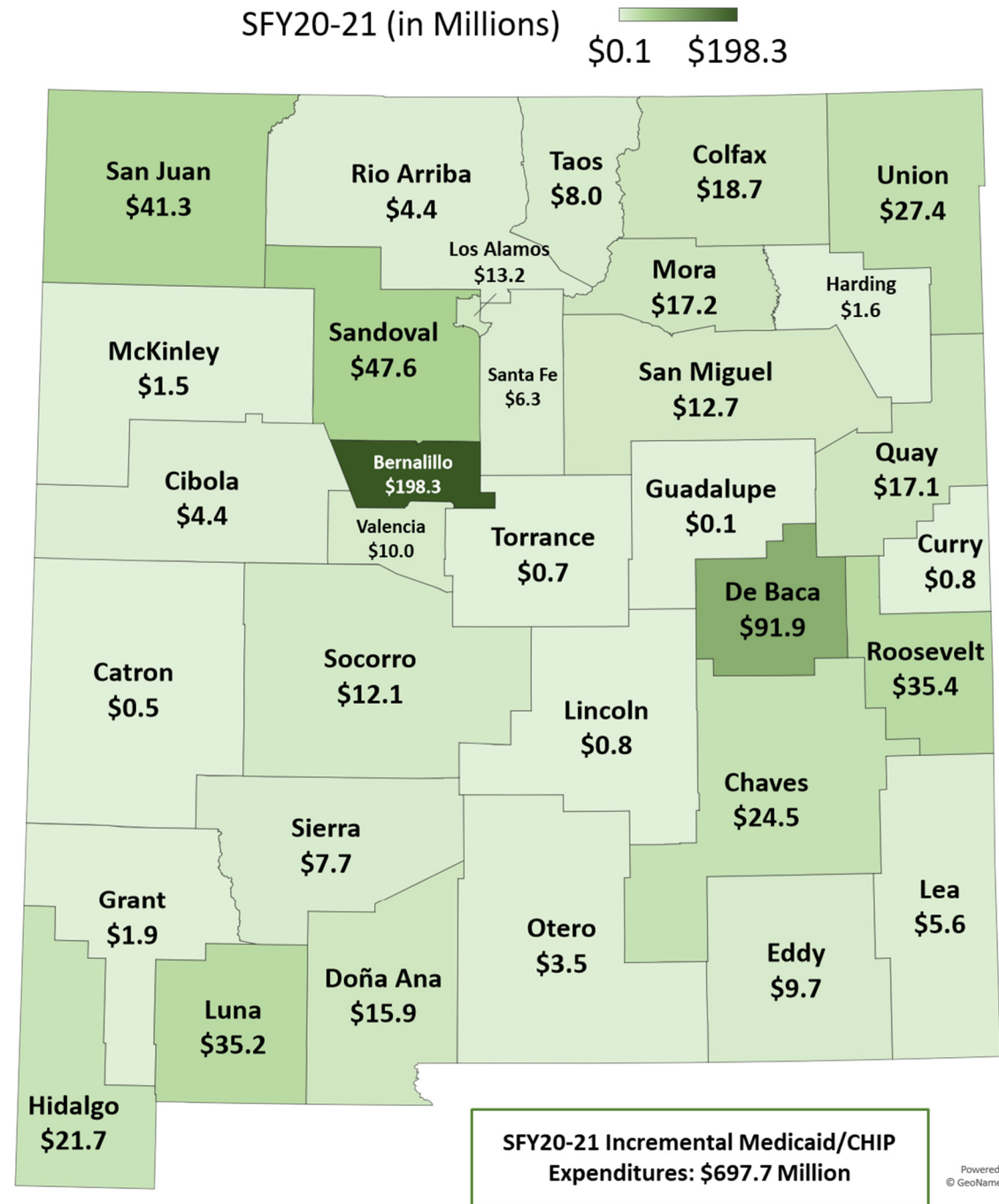

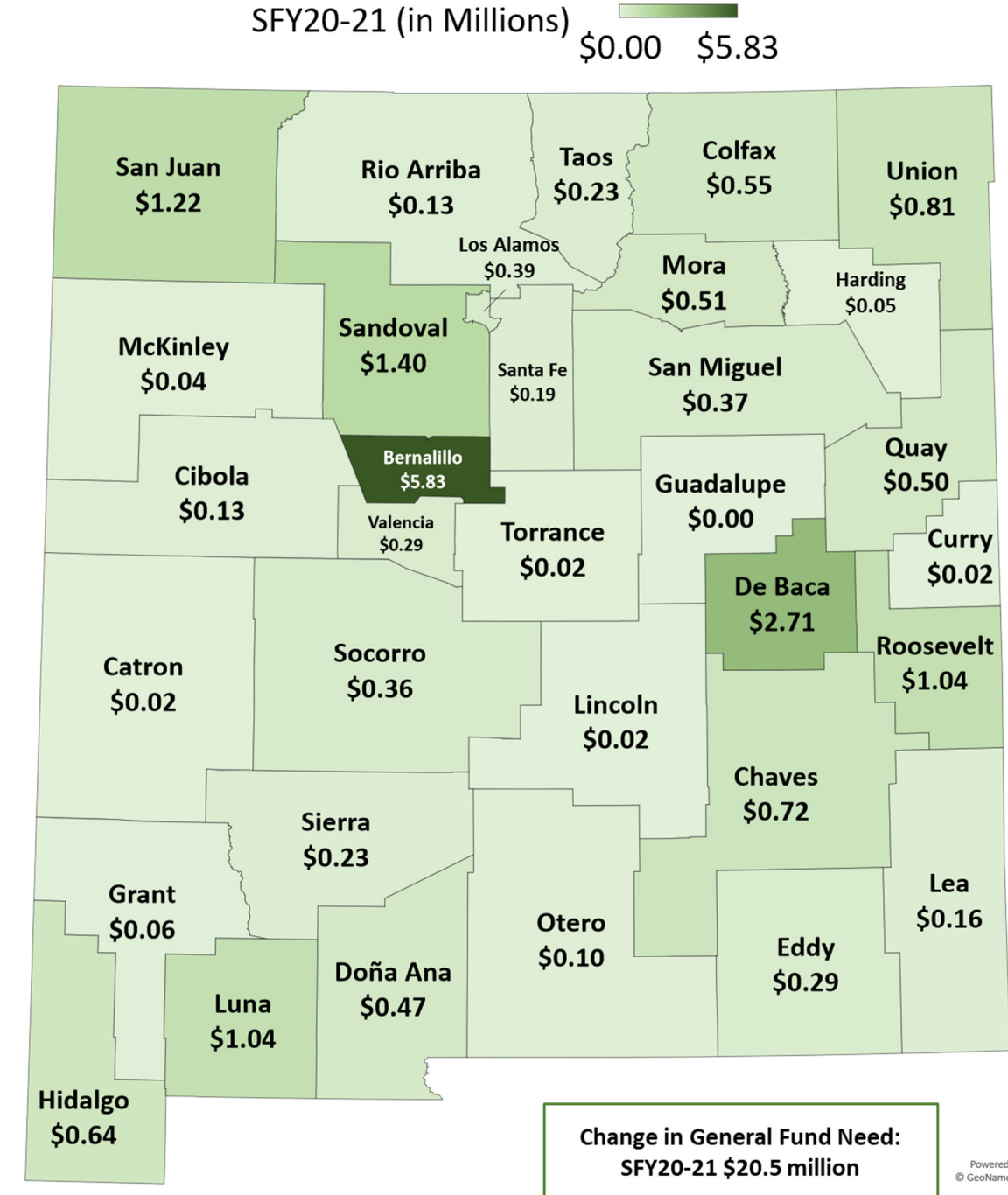
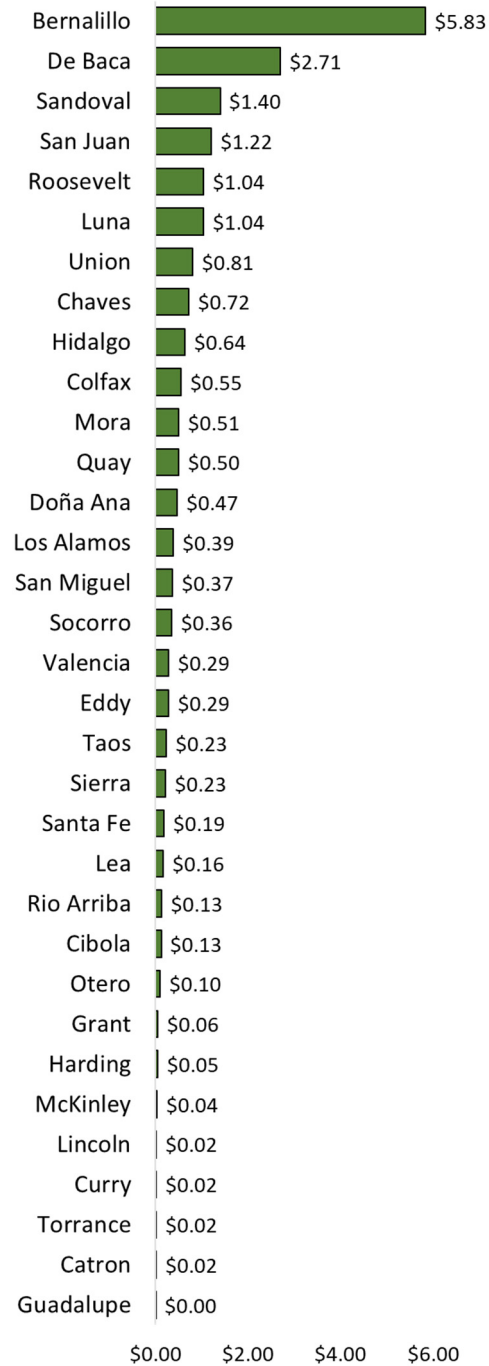


# State Fiscal Year (SFY) 20-21 Incremental Medicaid/CHIP Expenditures Pro-rated by County

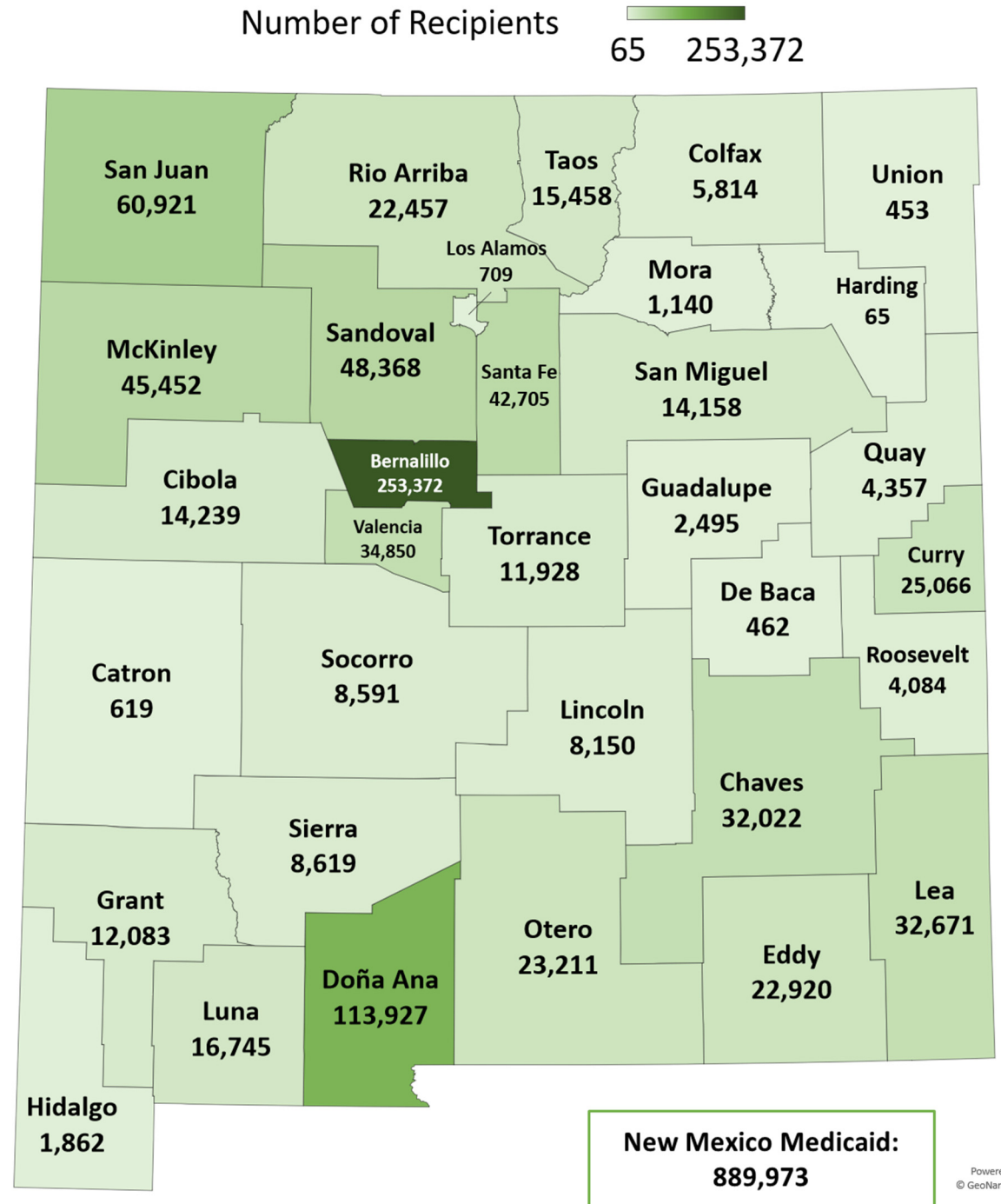
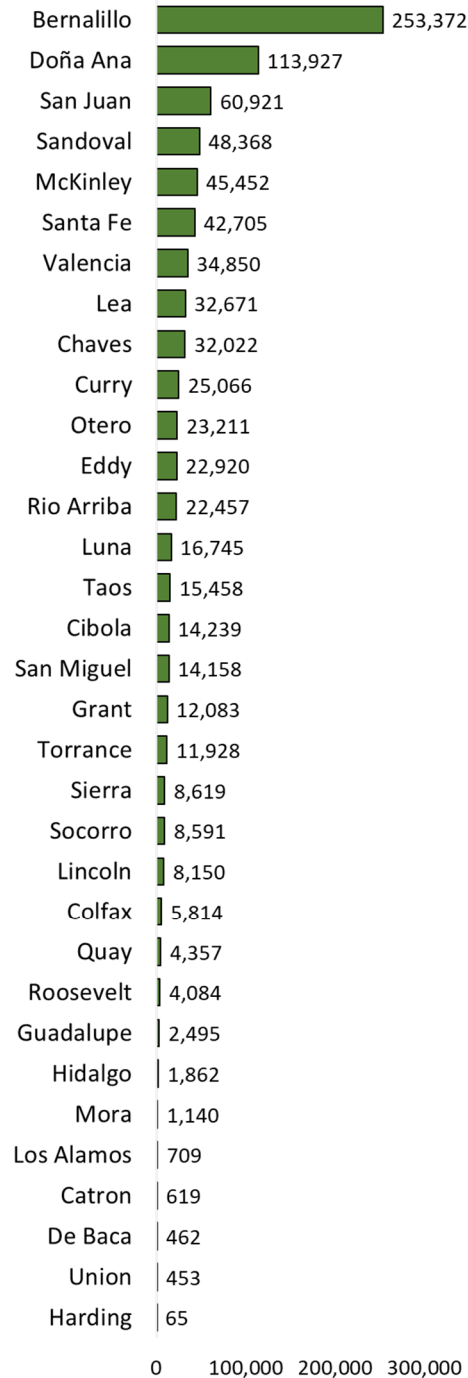
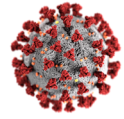
# State Fiscal Year (SFY) 20-21 Medicaid/CHIP General Fund Need Change Pro-rated by County

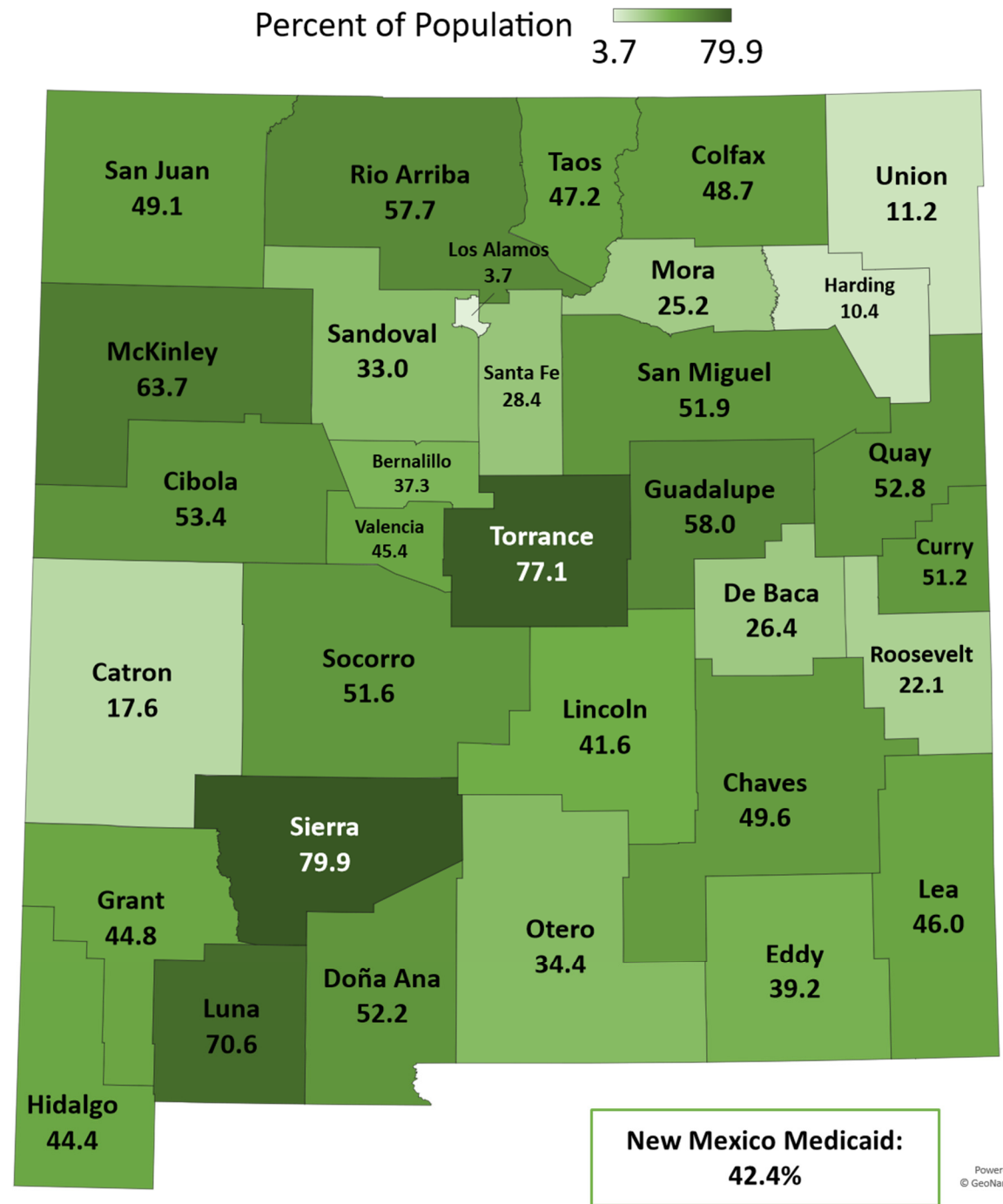
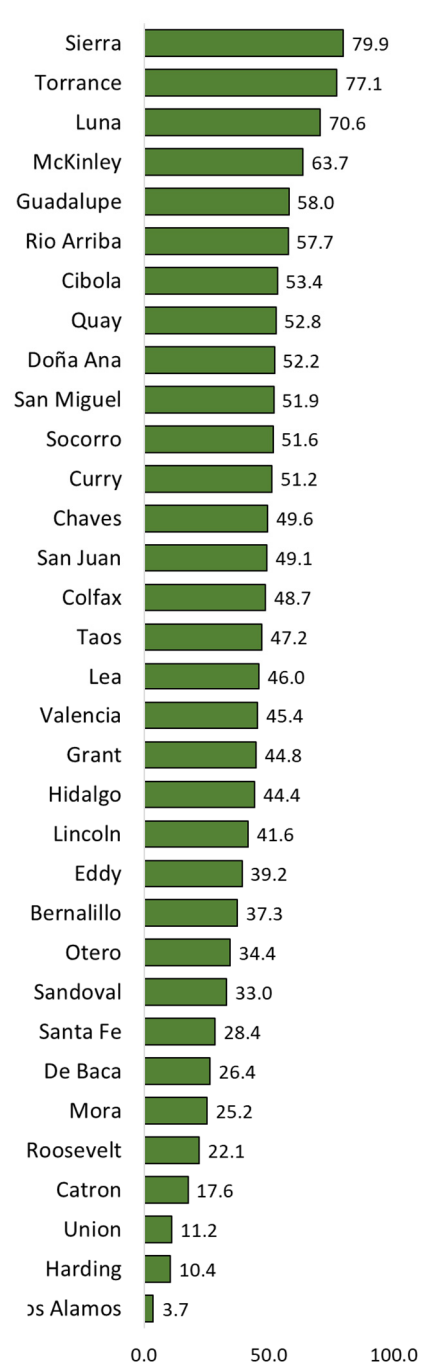
# New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Recipients by County as of October 2020

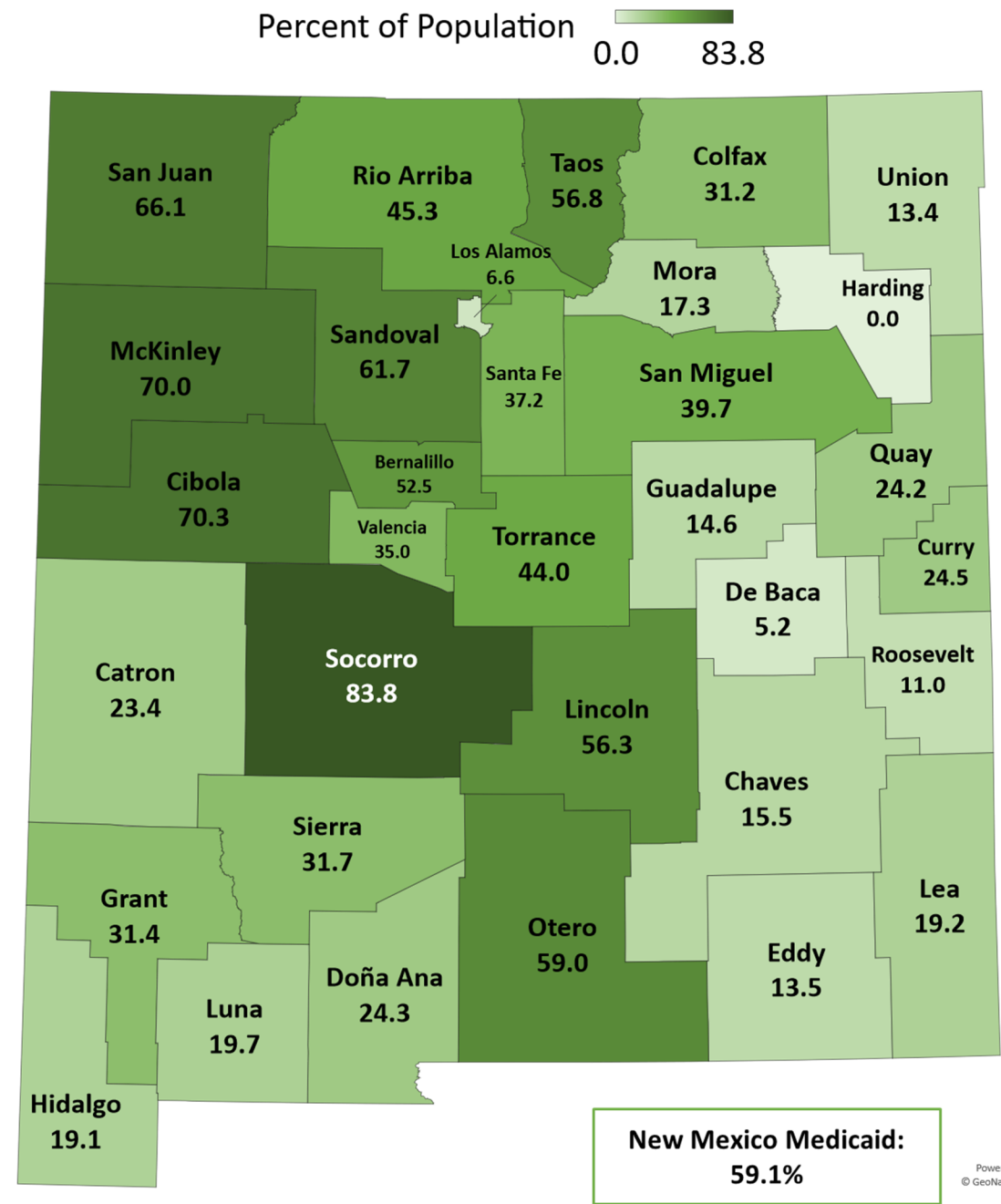
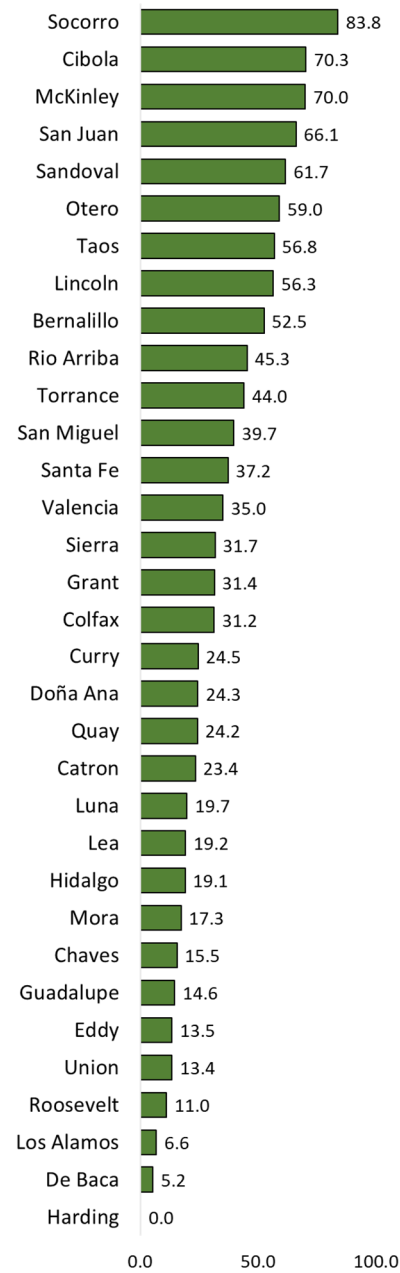
# New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP White Recipients as a Percentage of White Population by County as of October 2020

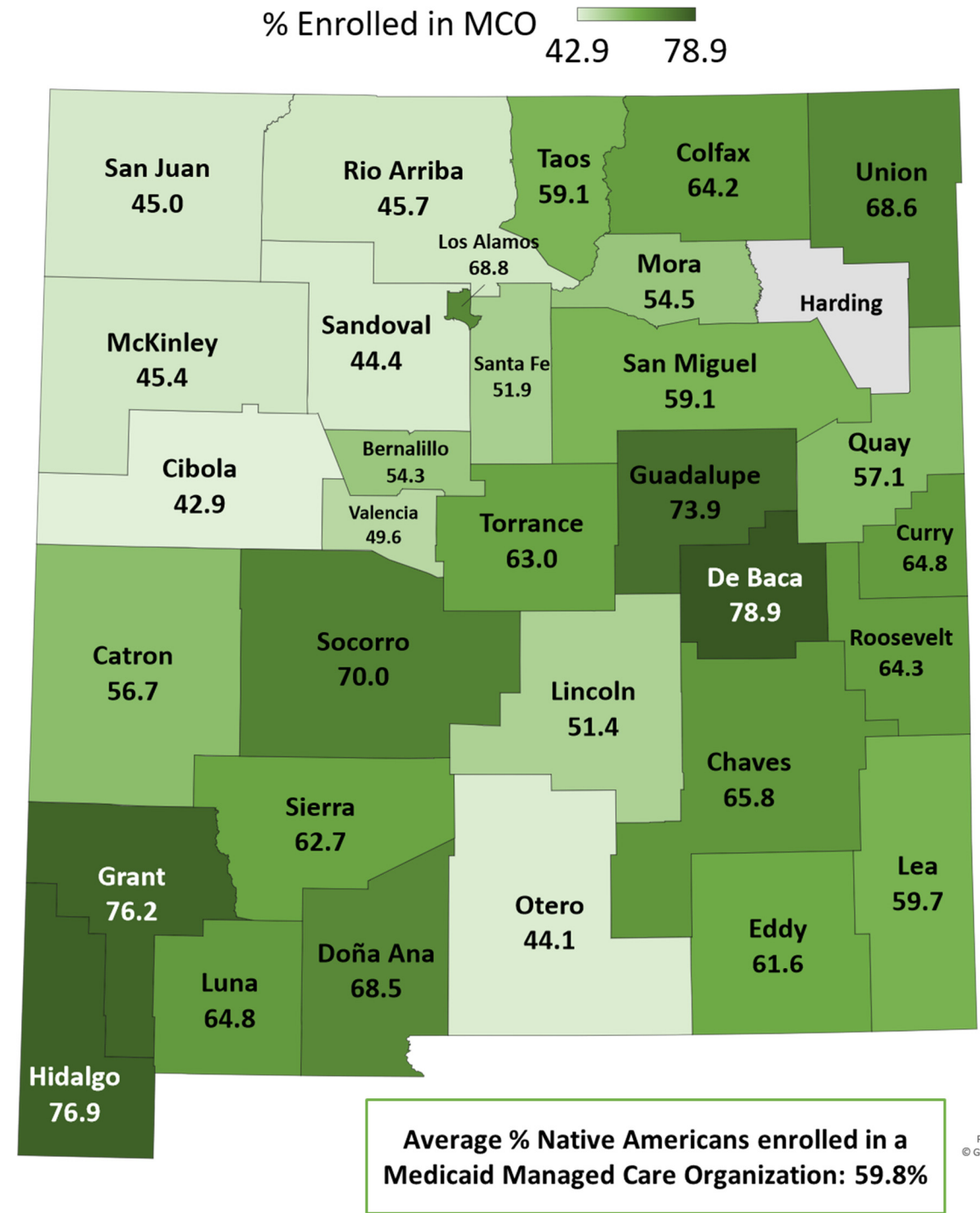
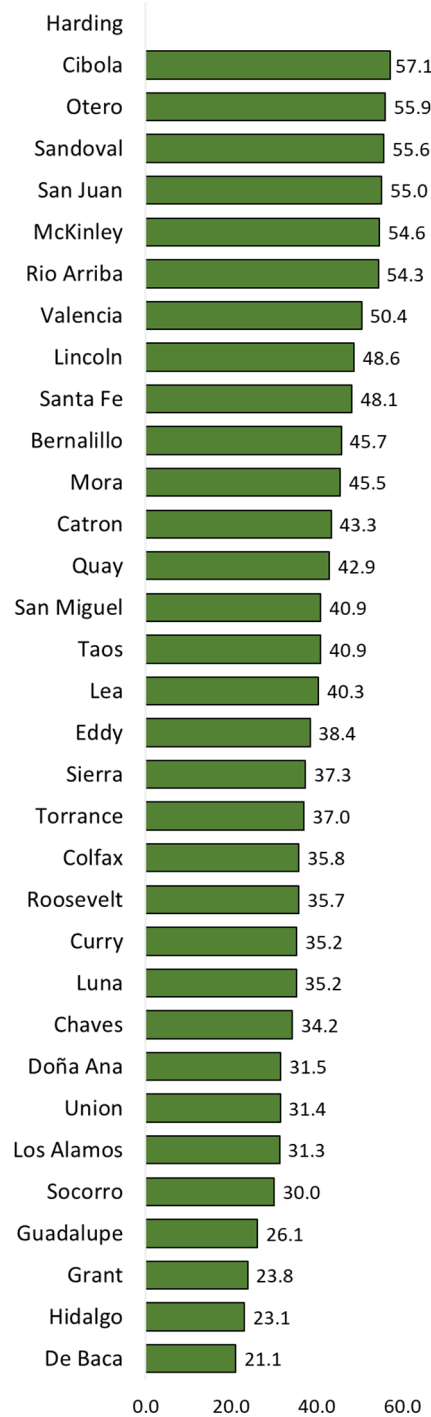
# New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Native American Recipients as a Percentage of Native American Population by County as of October 2020

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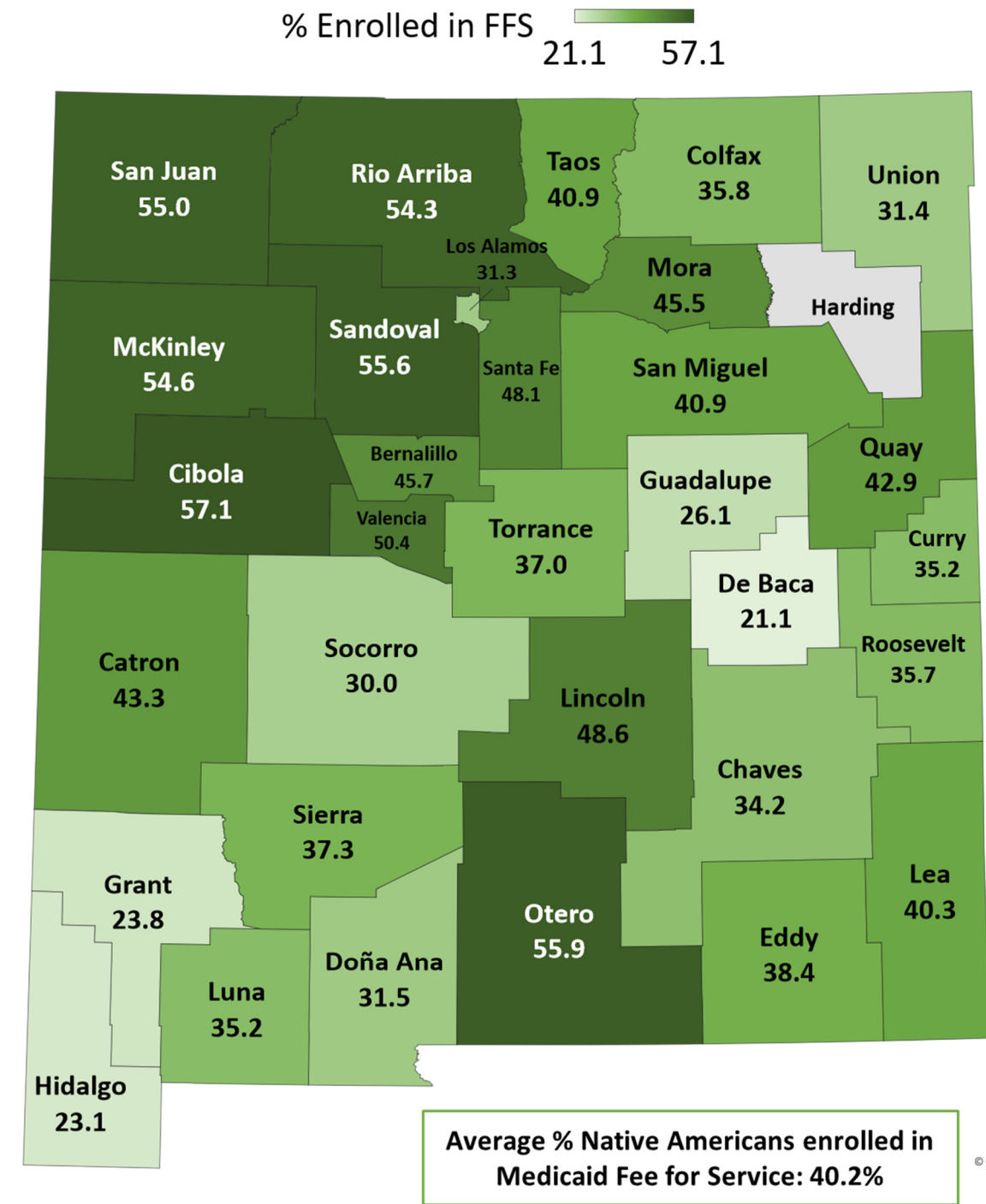
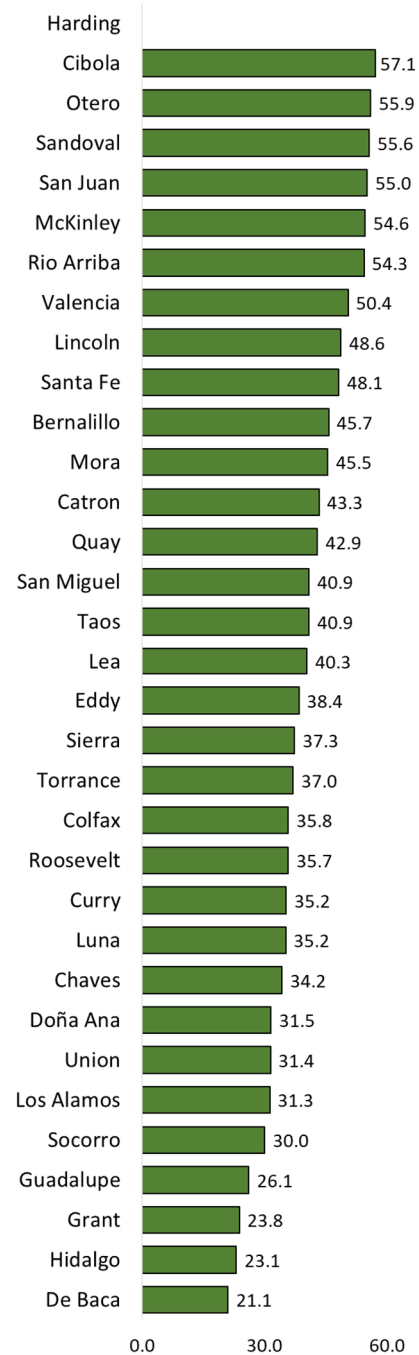
# New Mexico Percent of Native American Medicaid Enrollees that are Enrolled in a Medicaid Managed Care Organization (MCO) as of November 2020

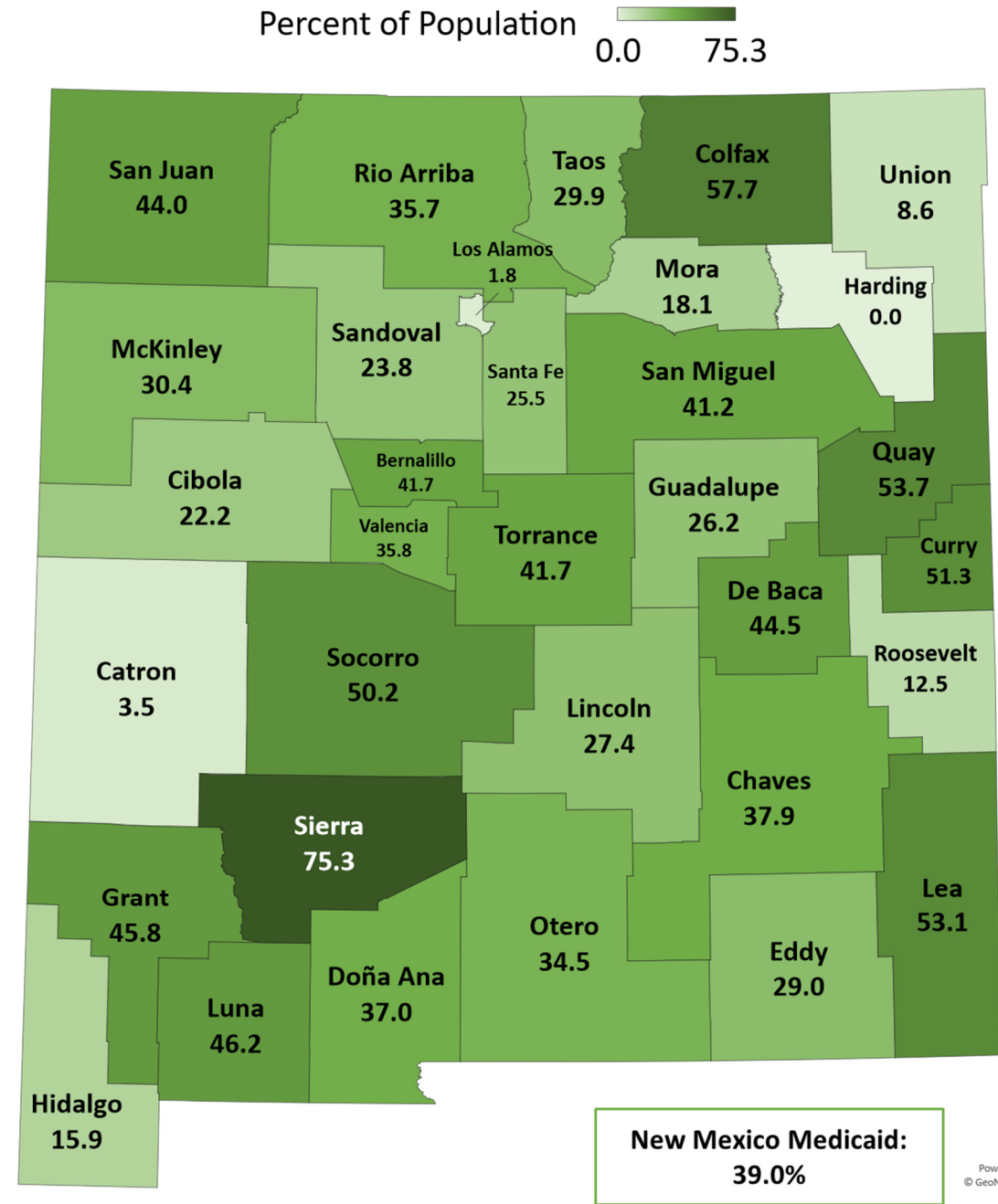
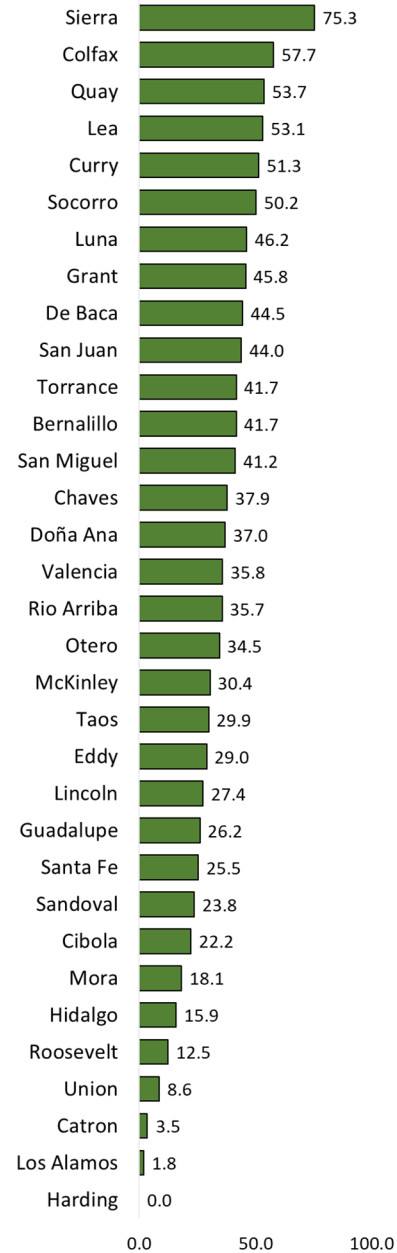
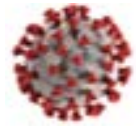


# New Mexico Percent of Native American Medicaid Enrollees that are Enrolled in Medicaid Fee for Service (FFS) as of November 2020

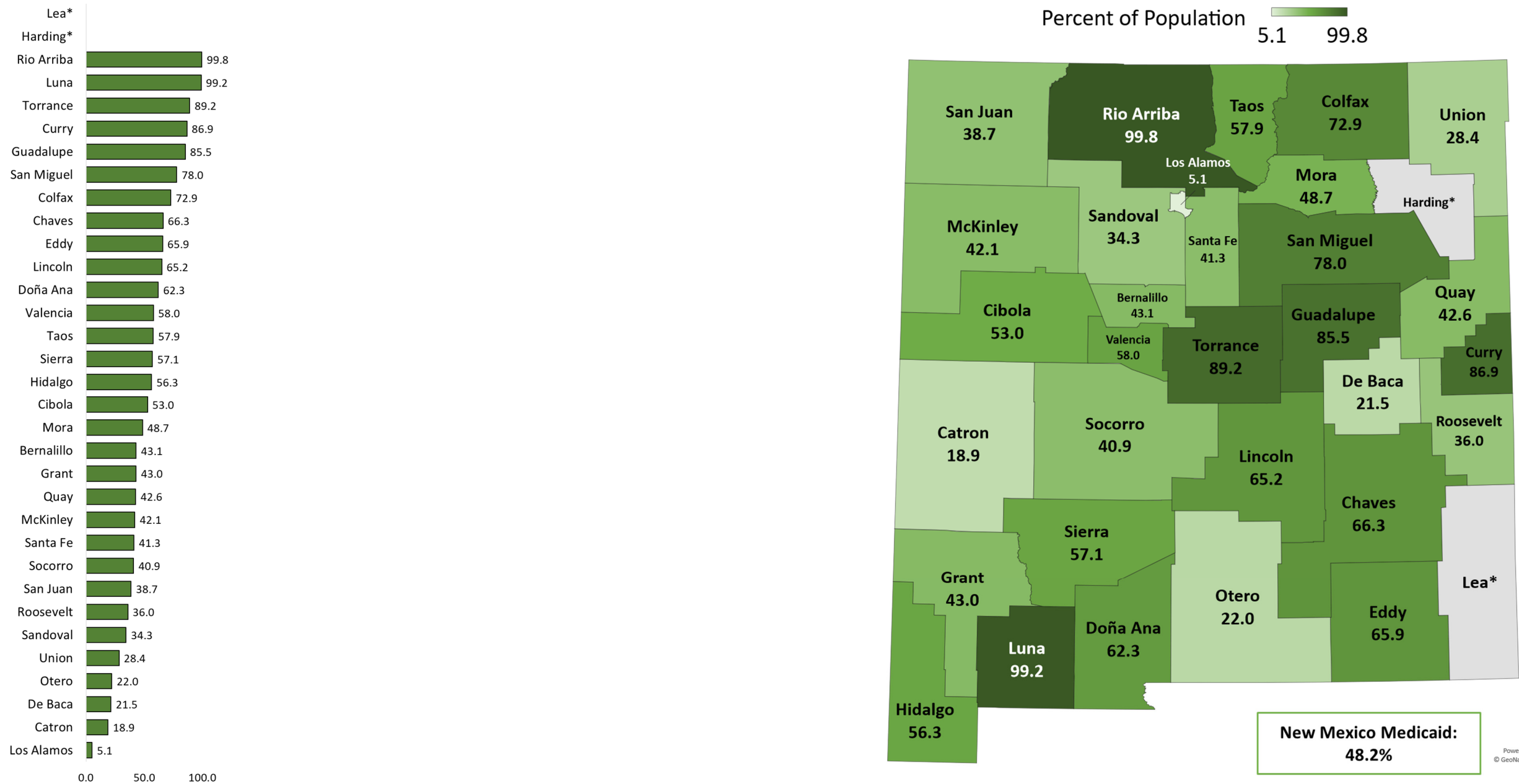
# New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Black/African American Recipients as a Percentage of Black/African American Population by County

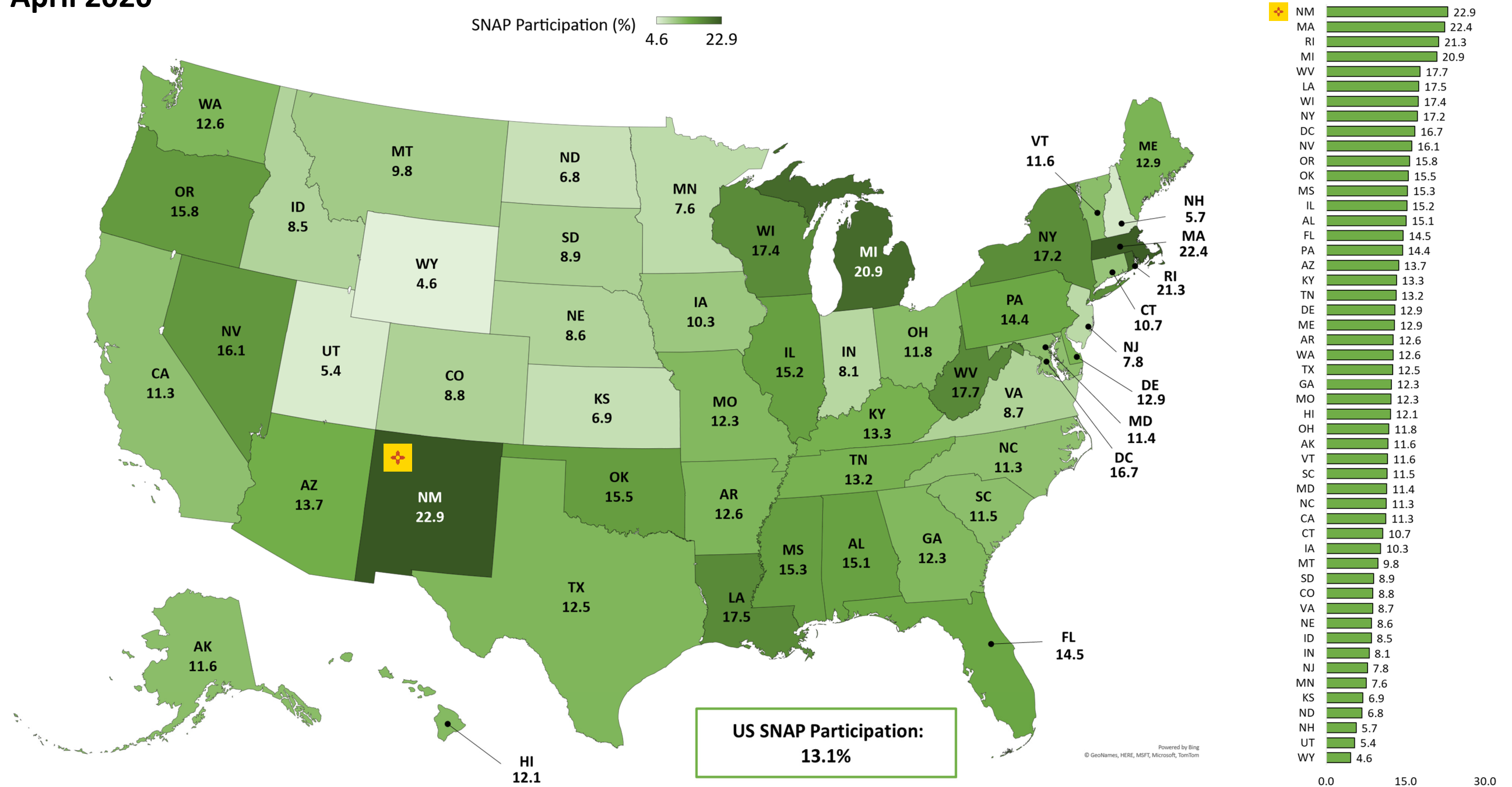
# New Mexico Medicaid & CHIP Hispanic/Latino Recipients as a Percentage of Hispanic/Latino Population by County as of October 2020

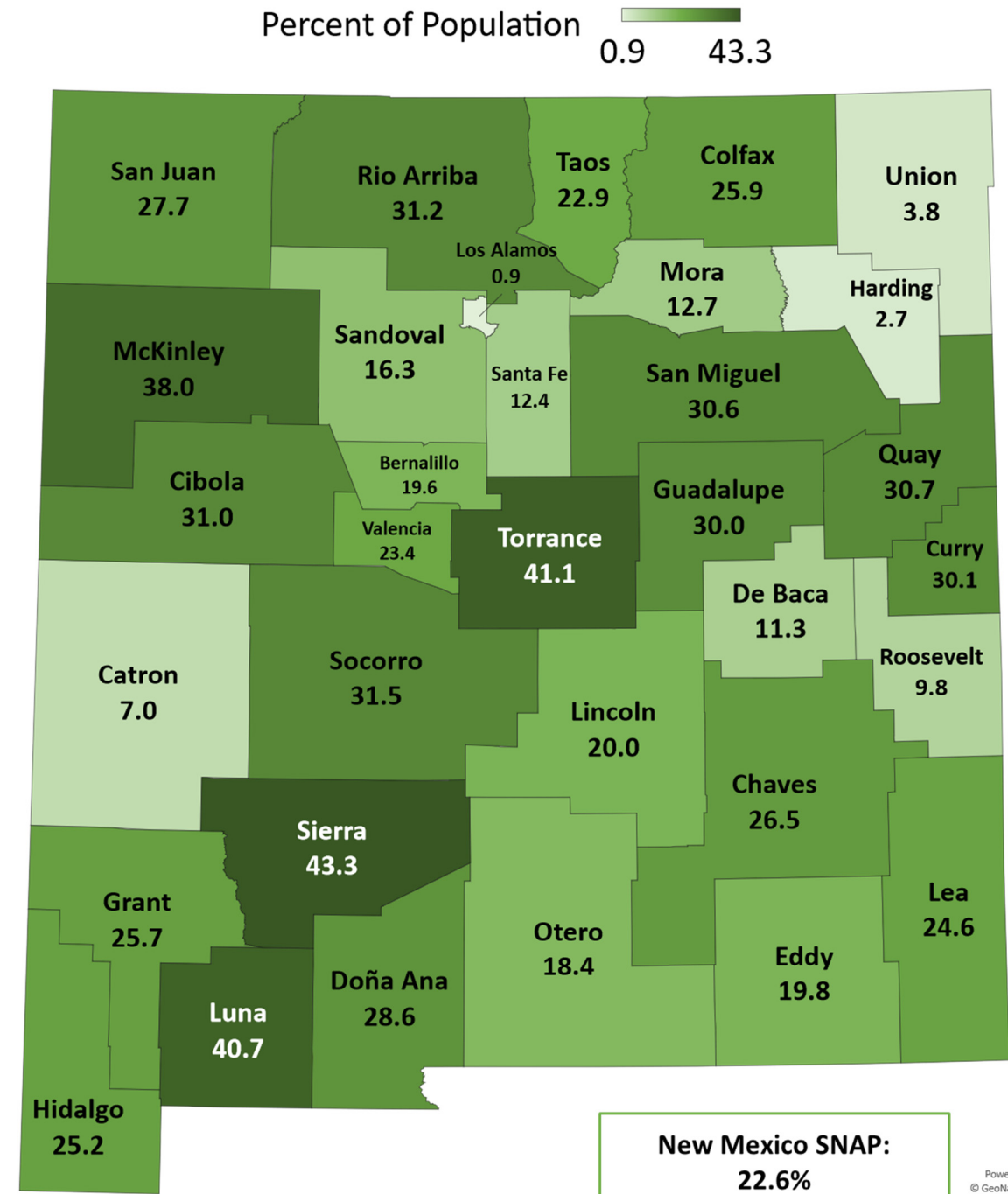
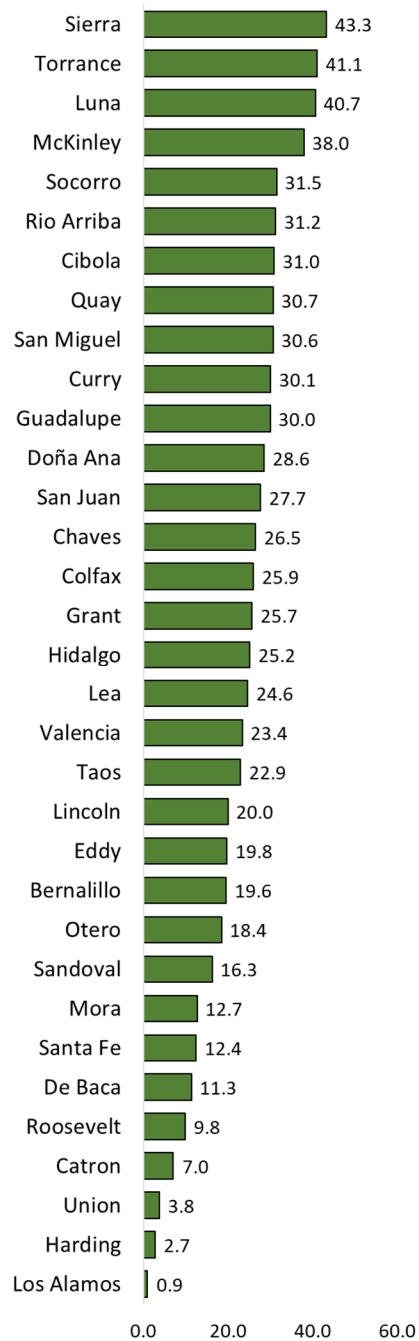
# New Mexico Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP) Recipients by County as of October 2020

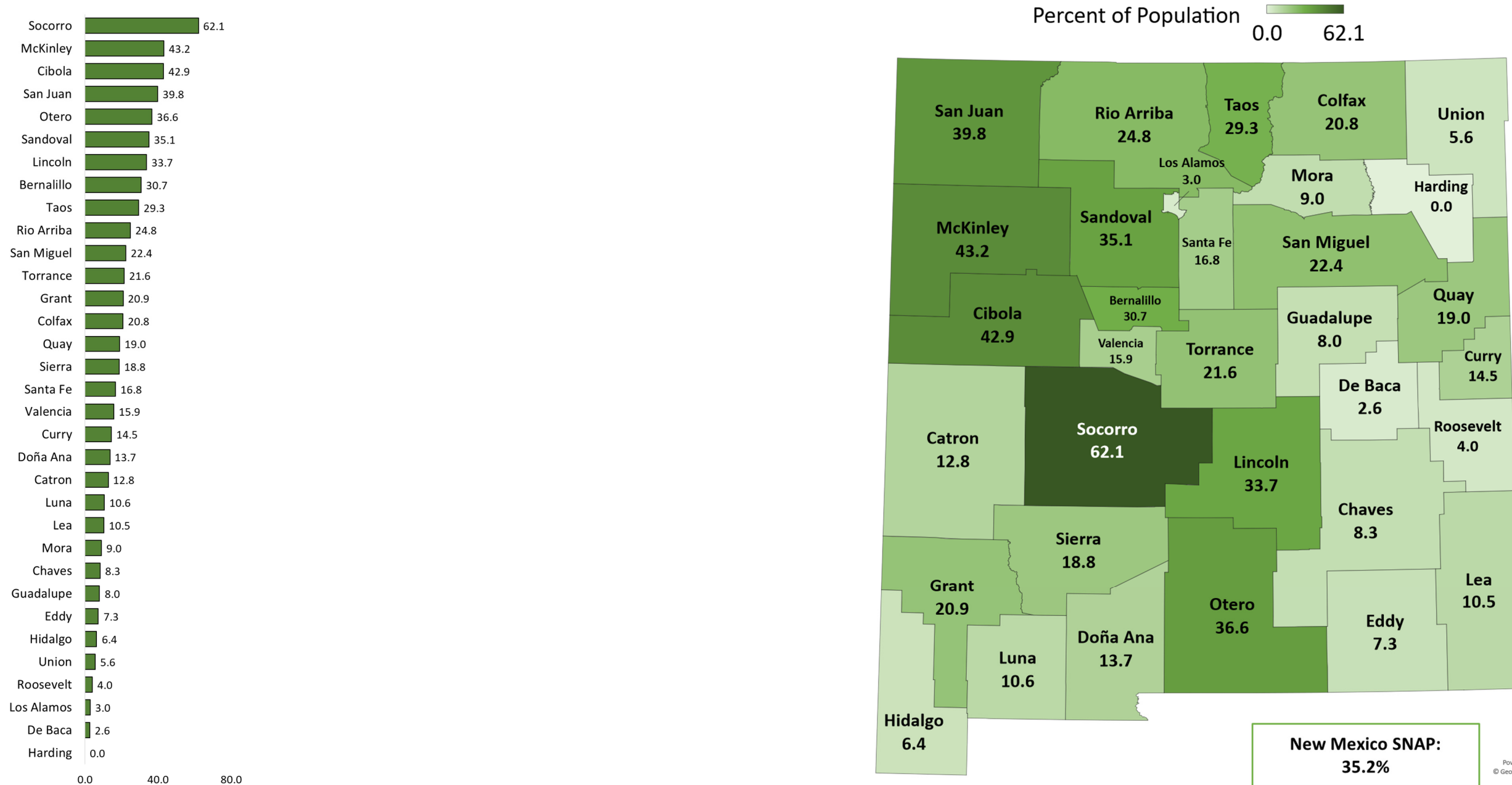

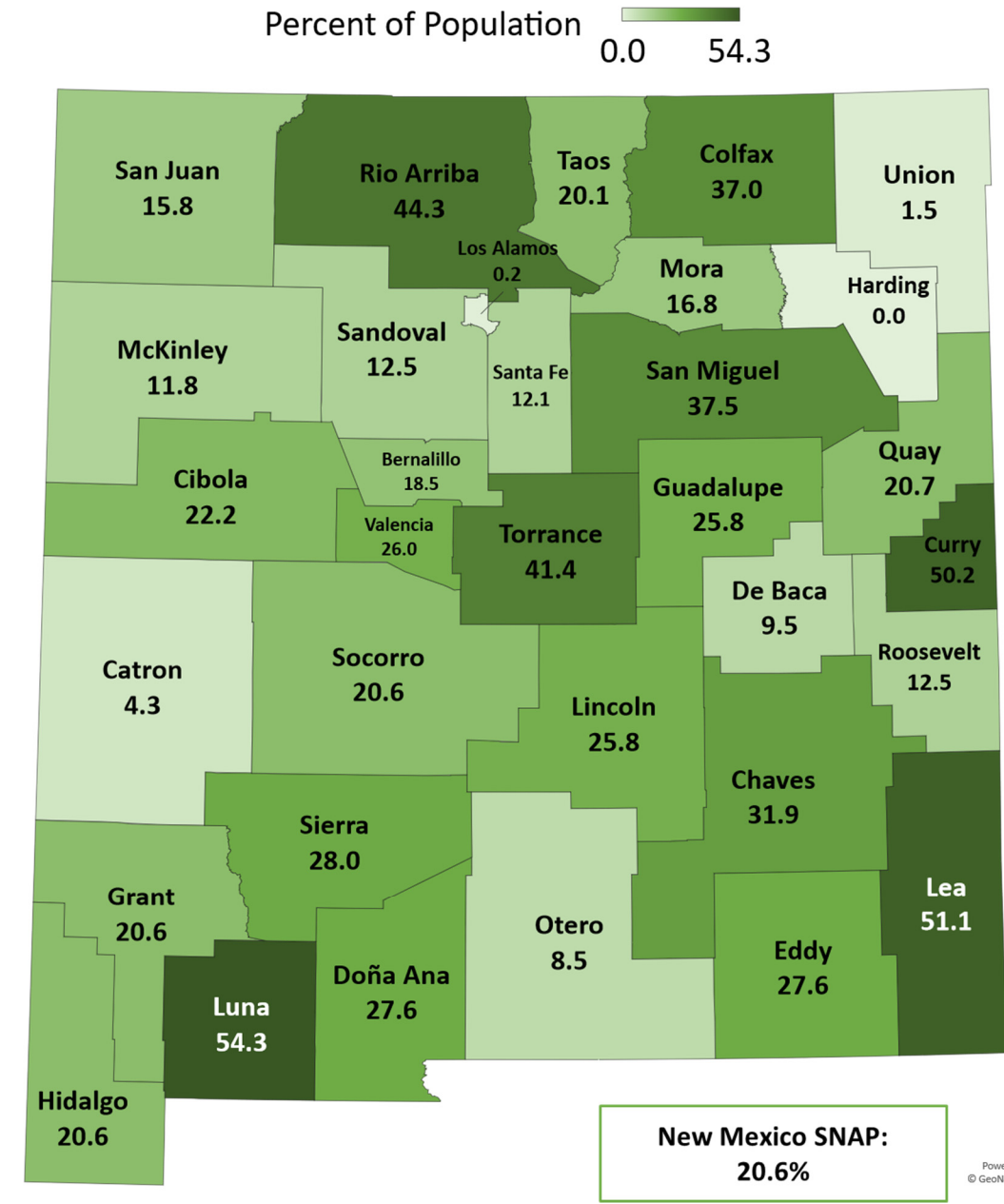
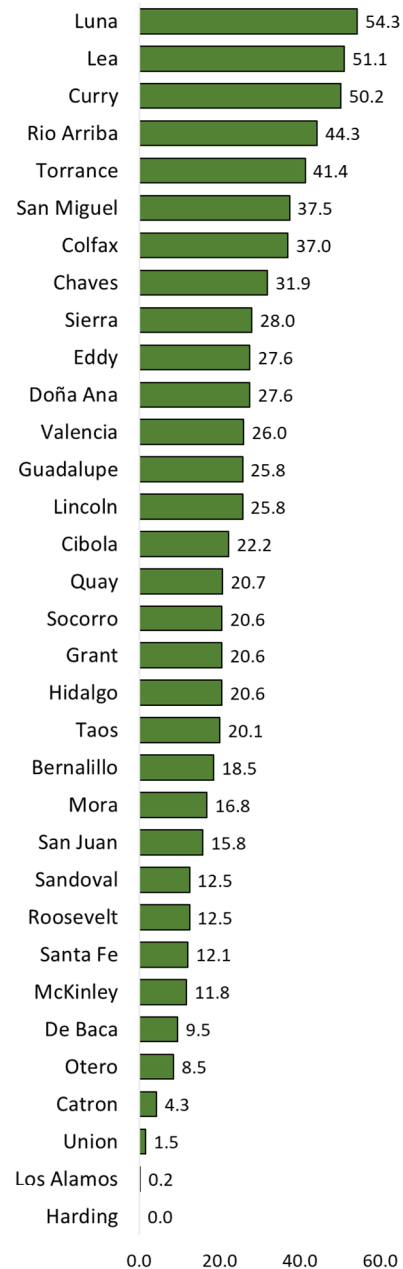
# New Mexico Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Black/African American Recipients as a Percentage of Black/African American Population by County as of October 2020

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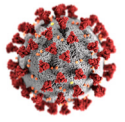
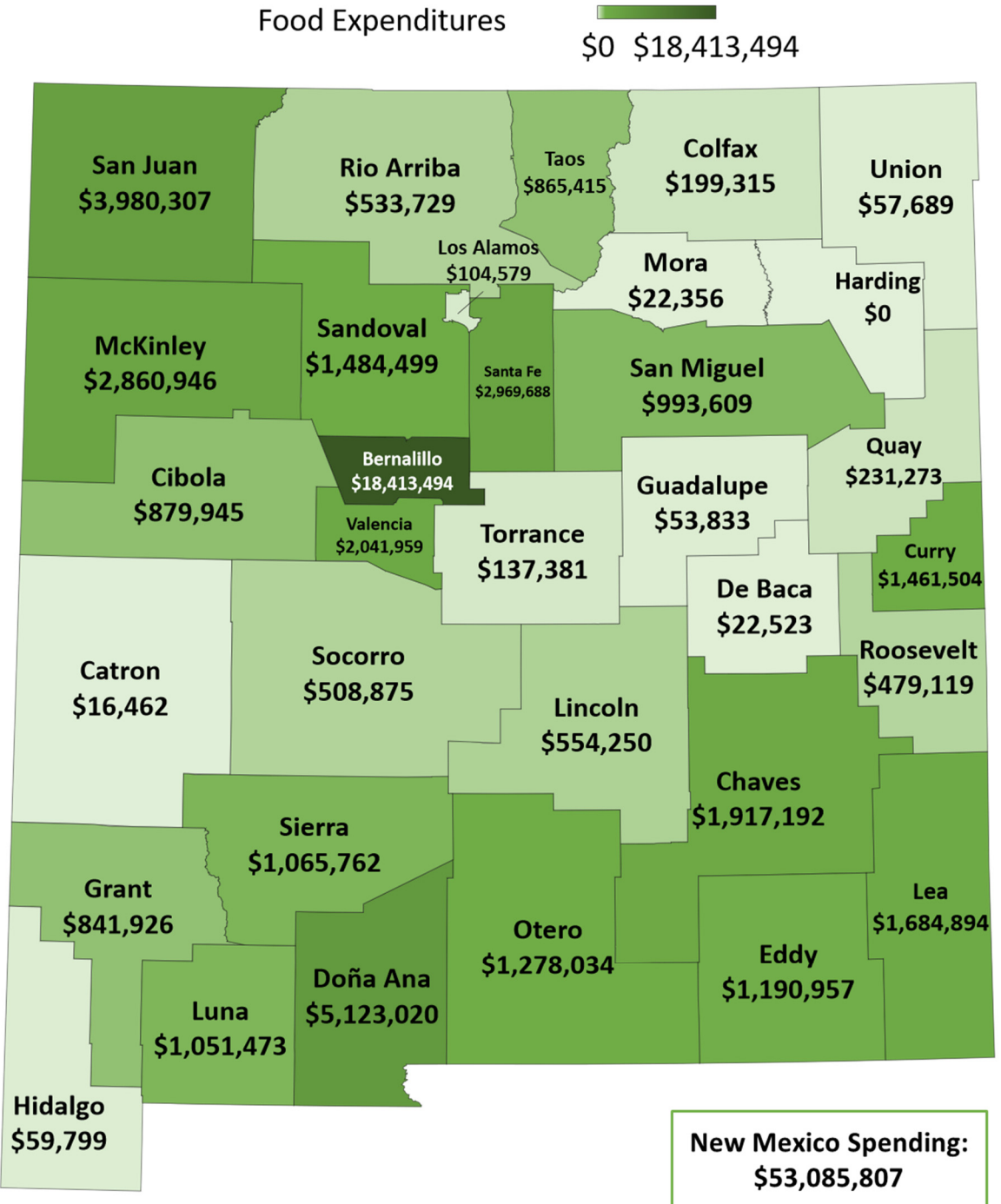
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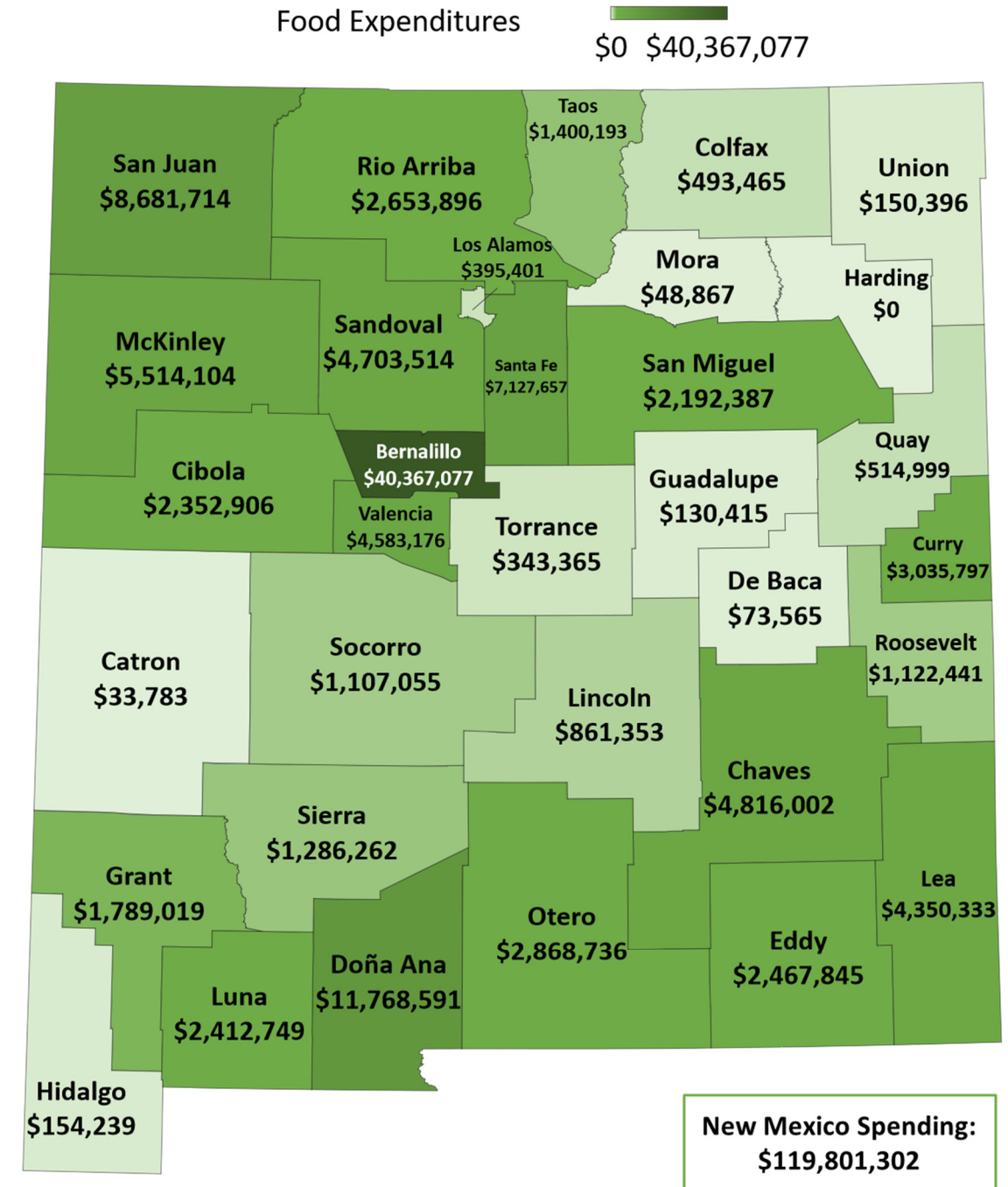
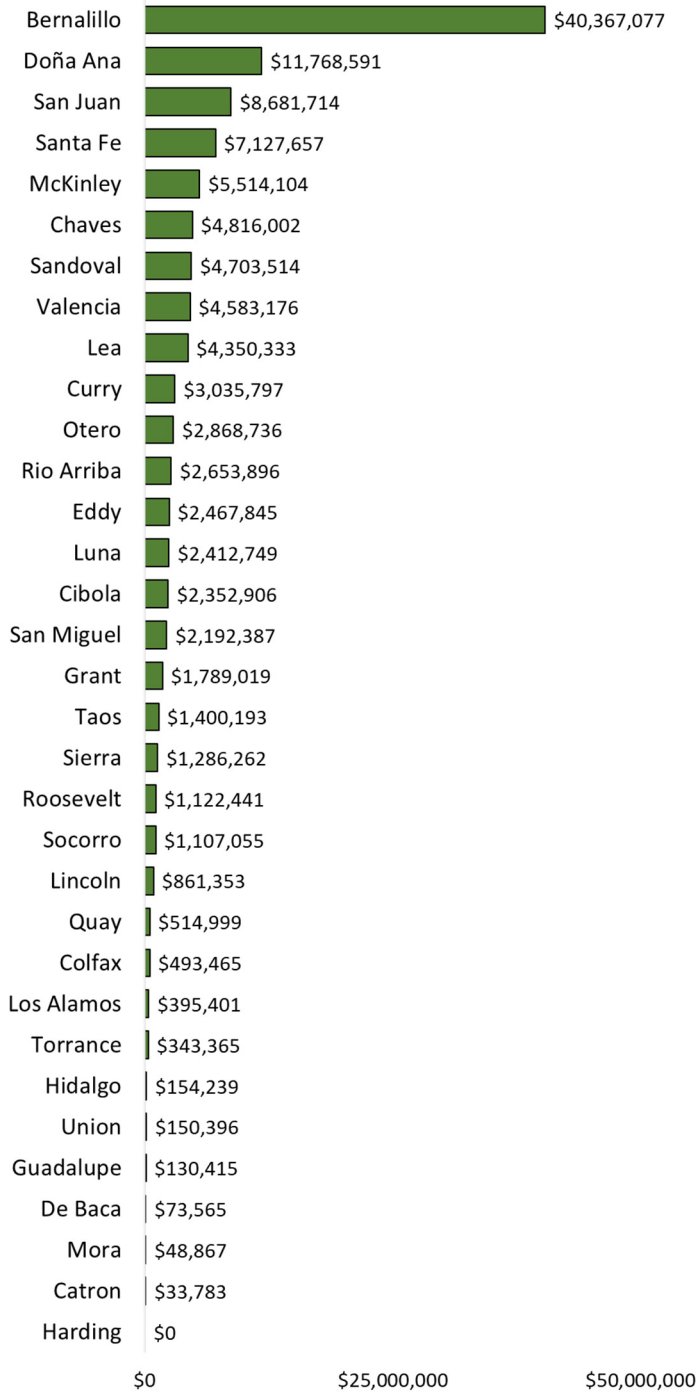
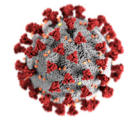
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# New Mexico Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program Benefit Spending by County, February 2020

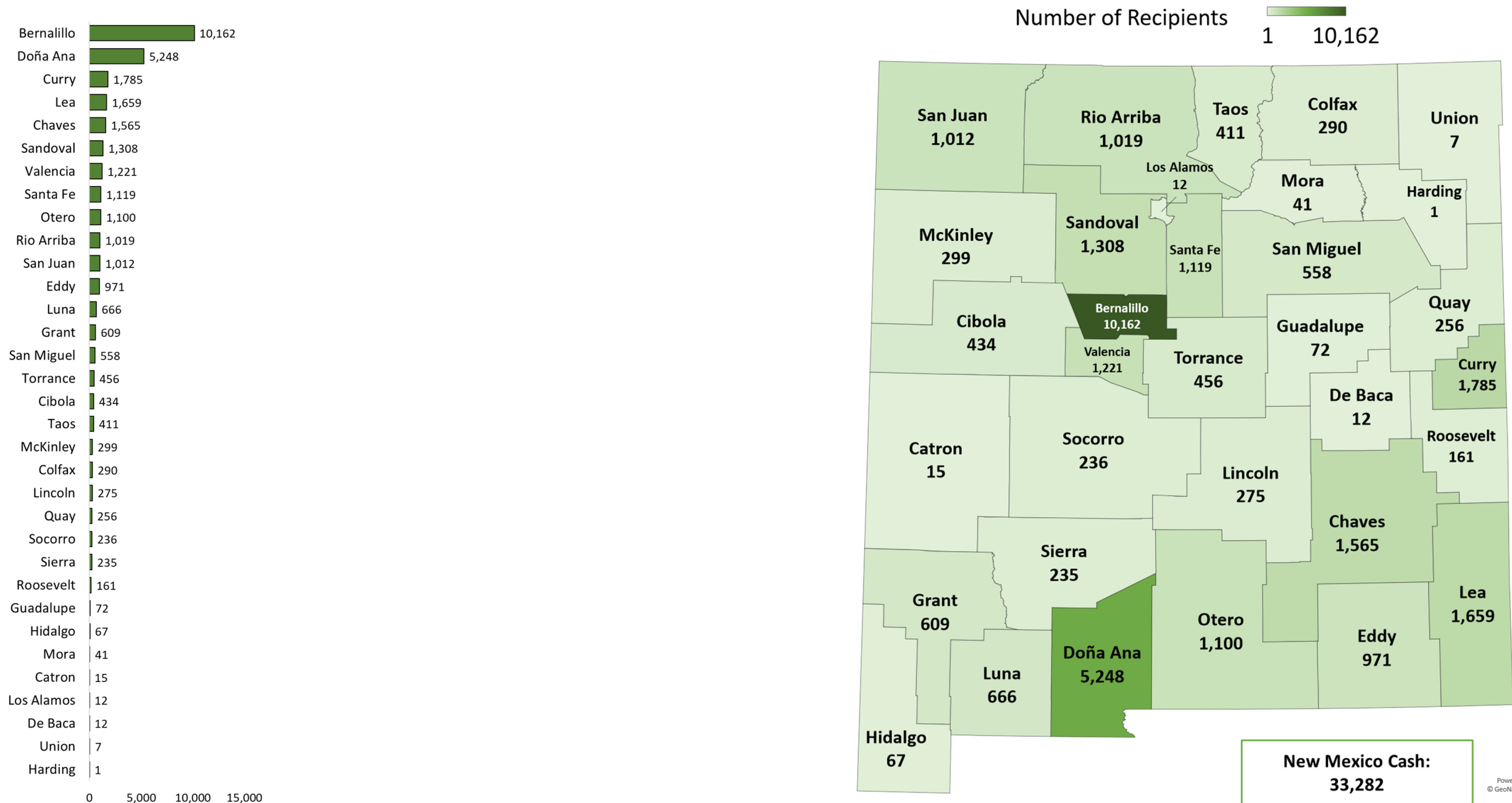
# New Mexico Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program Benefit Spending by County, November 2020

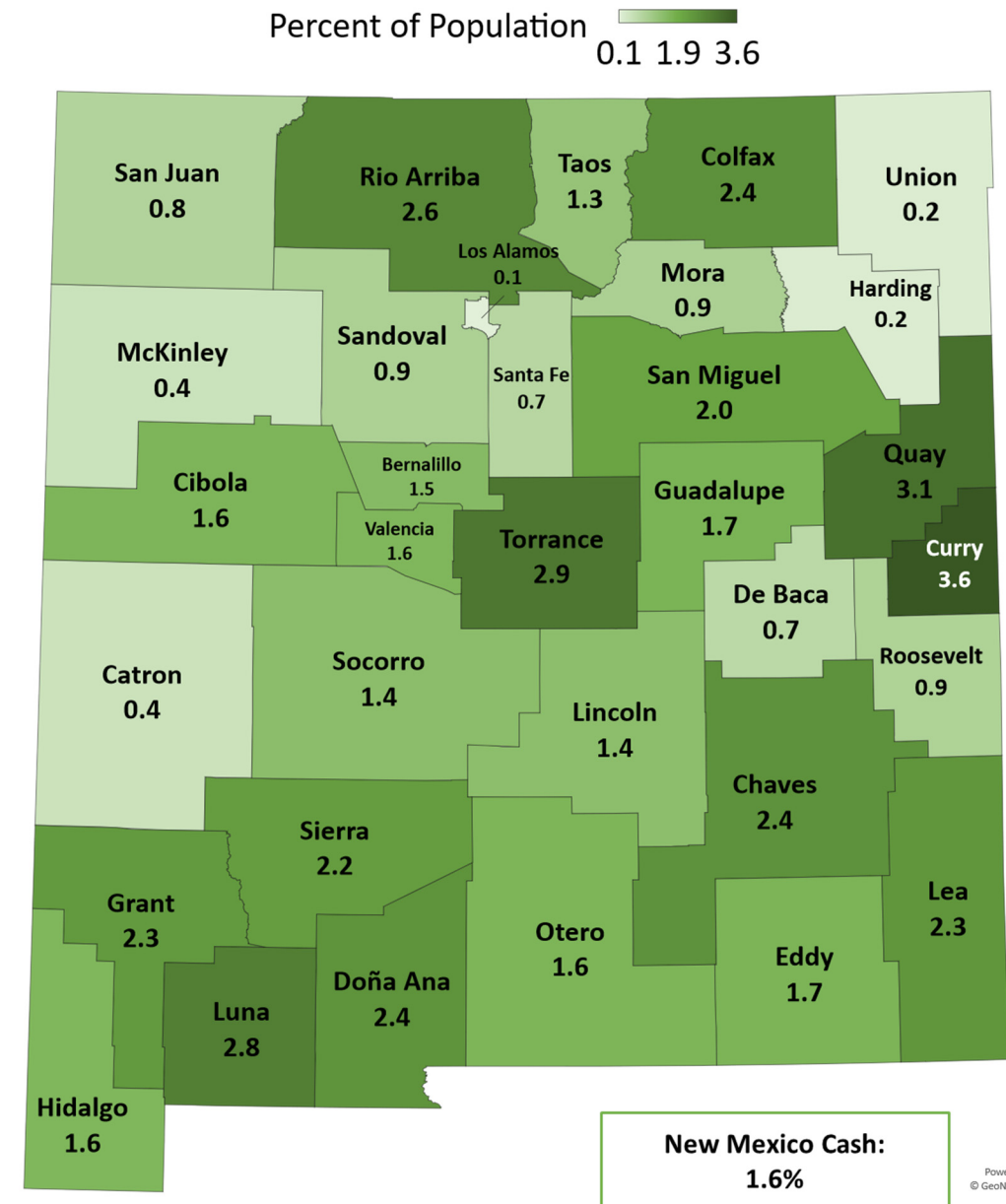
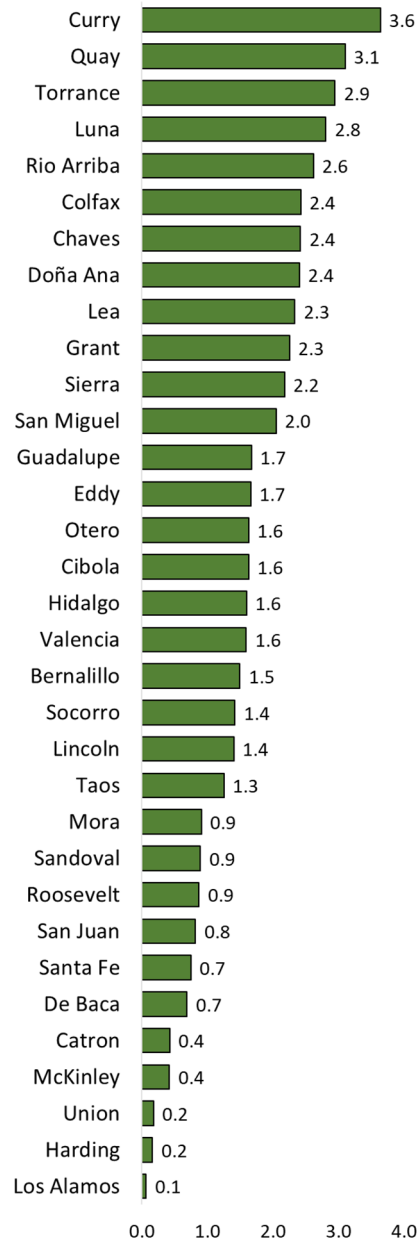
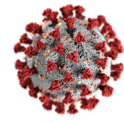

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# New Mexico Cash Assistance\* Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2020



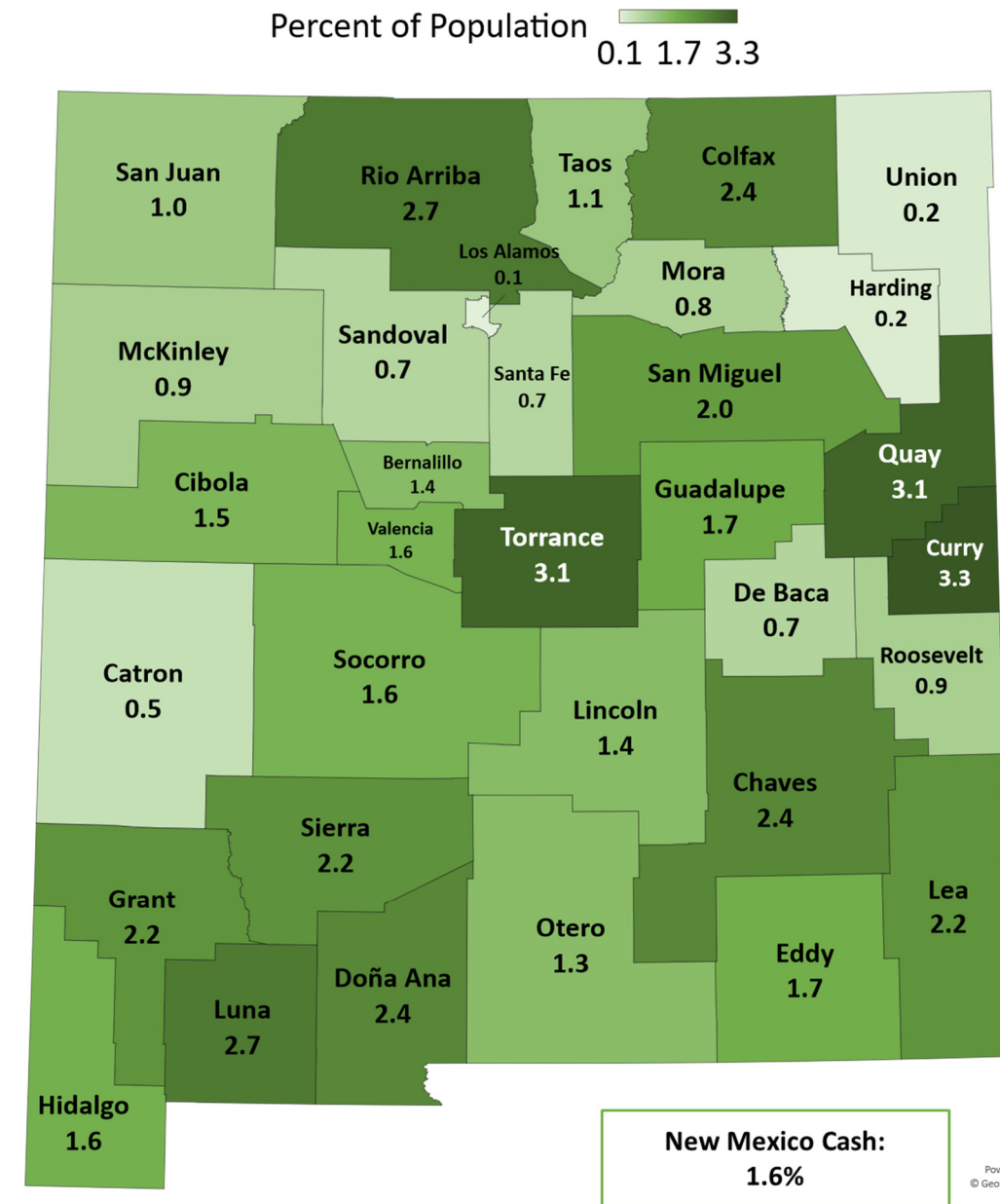
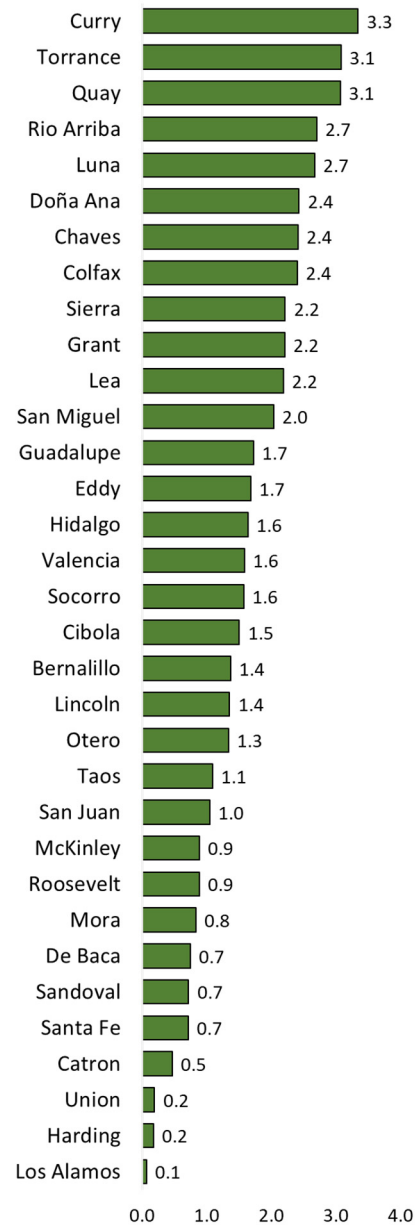

# New Mexico Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Online Purchasing Spending as Percentage of Total Spending by County, May-December 2020

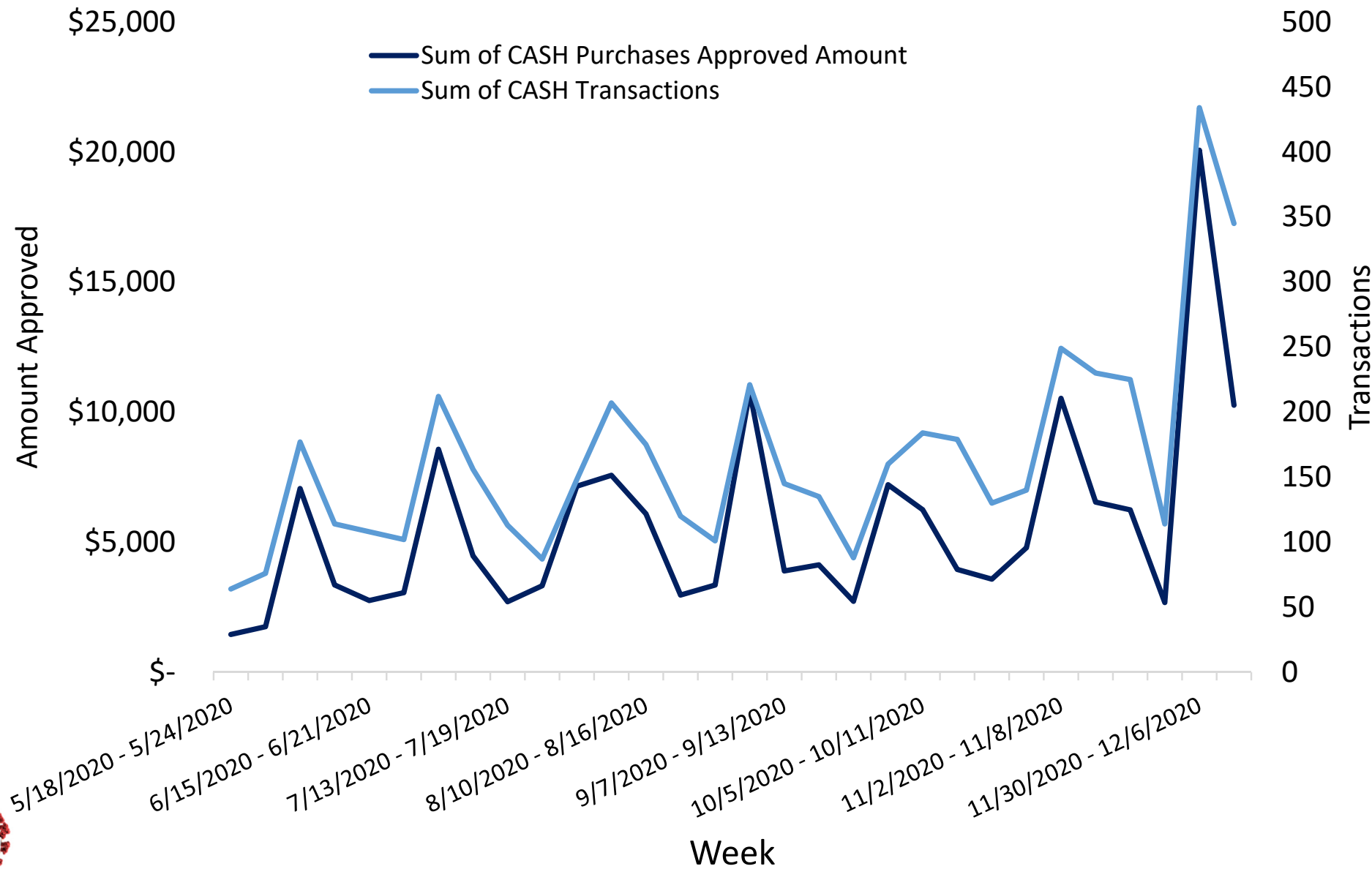

# New Mexico Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Online Purchasing Transactions by County, May-December 2020



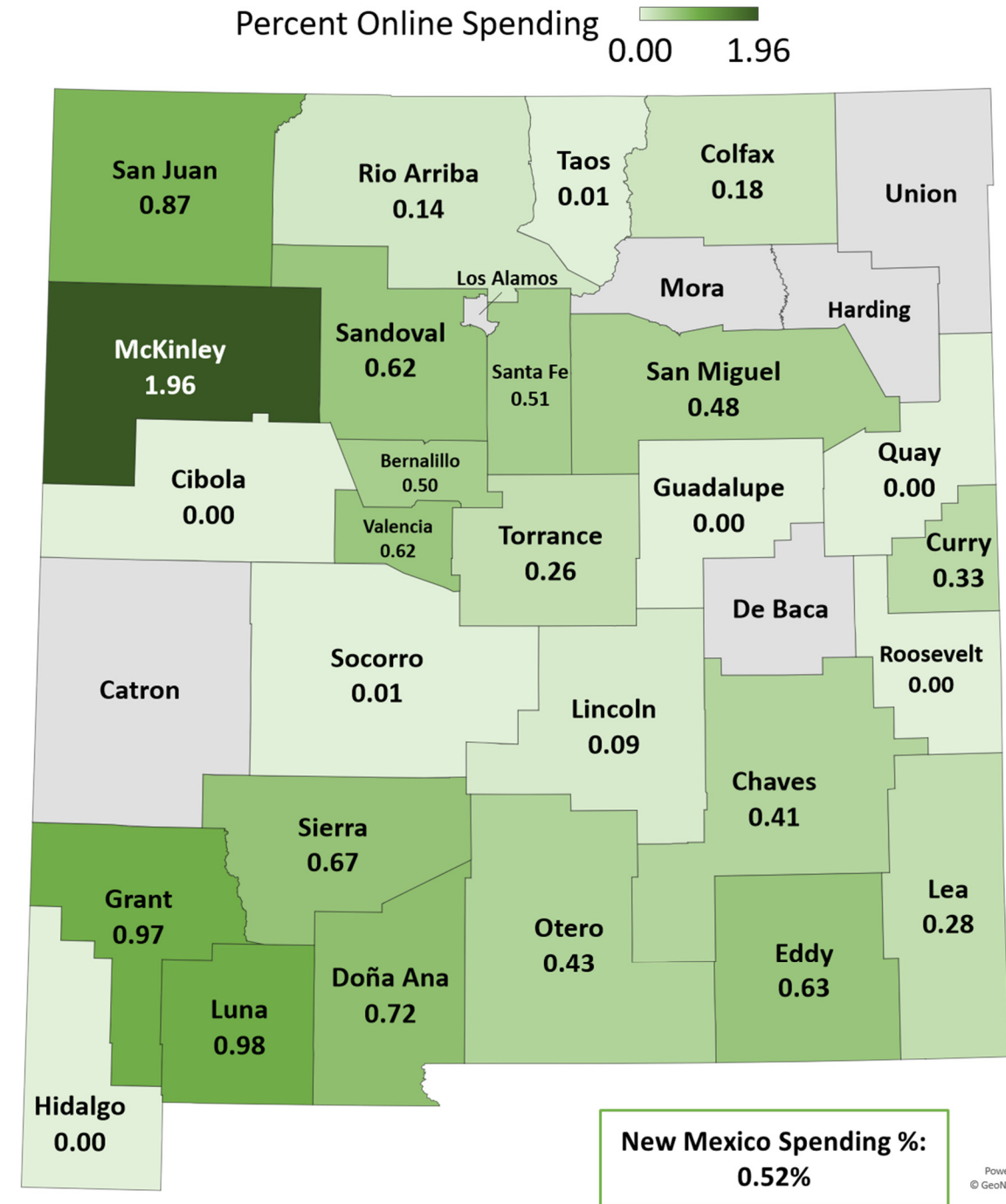
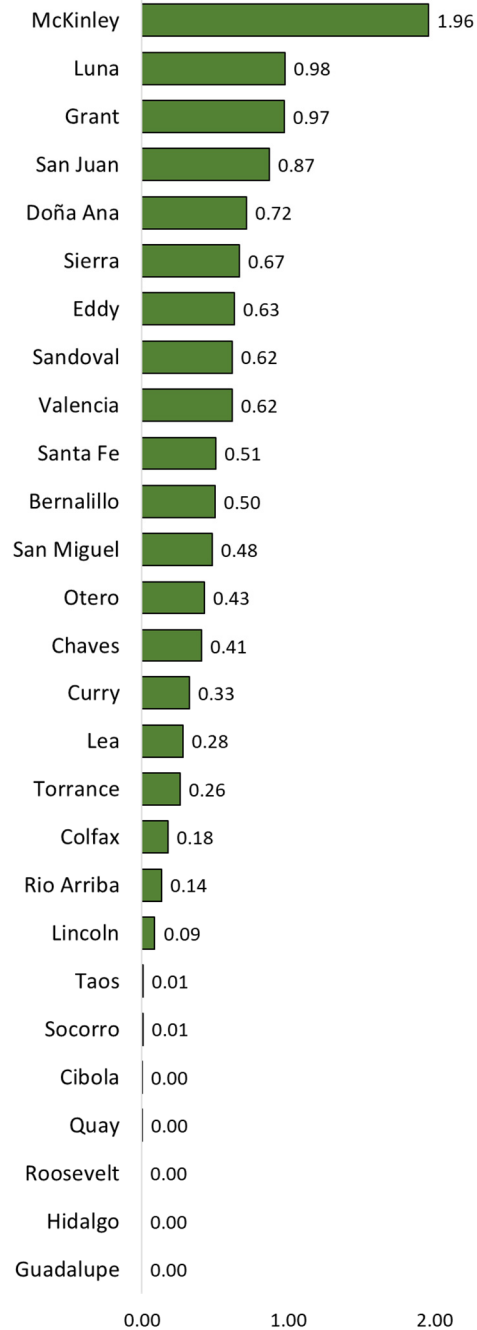
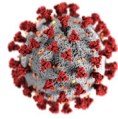

# New Mexico Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Online Purchasing Spending by County, May-December 2020



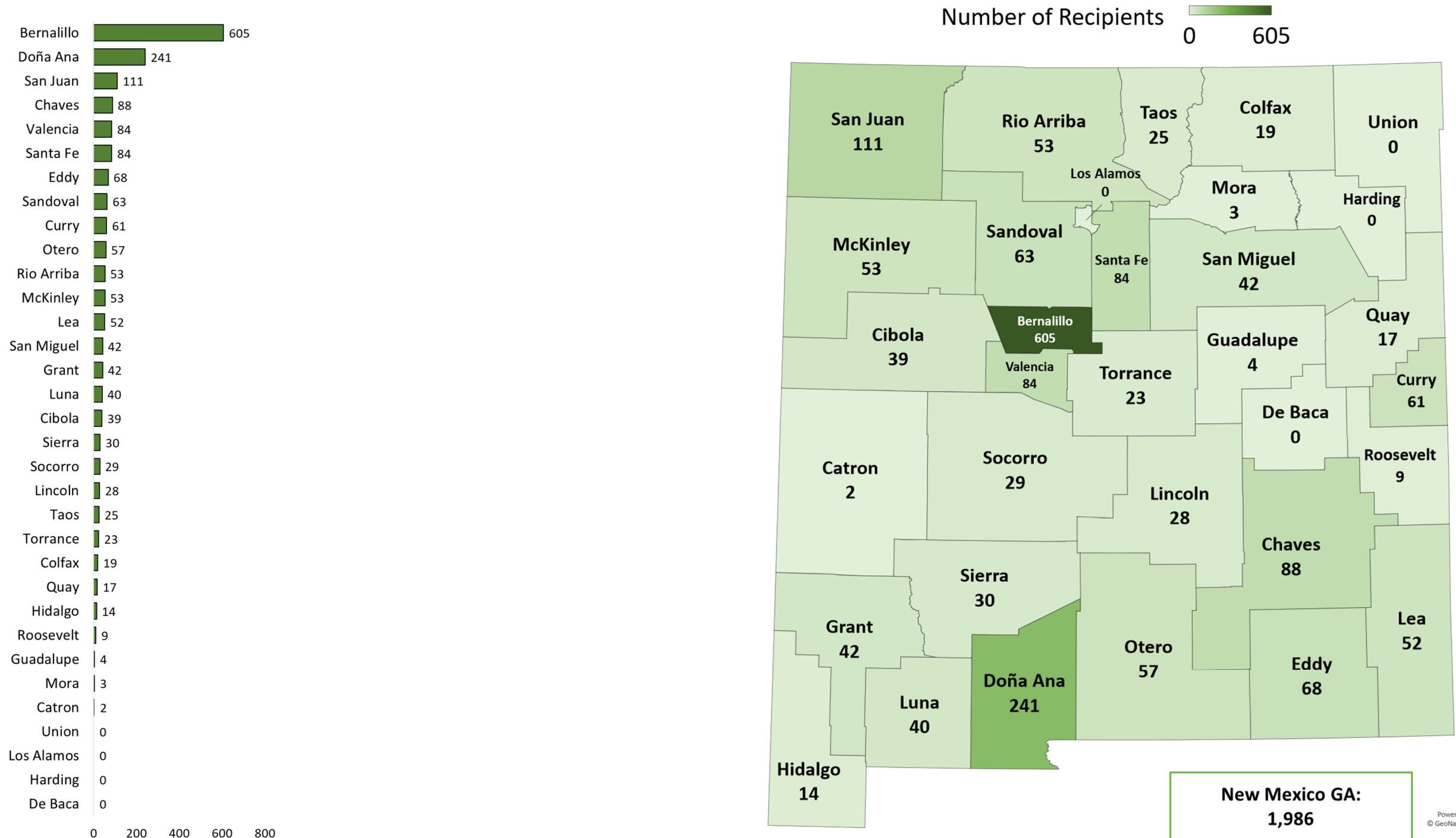

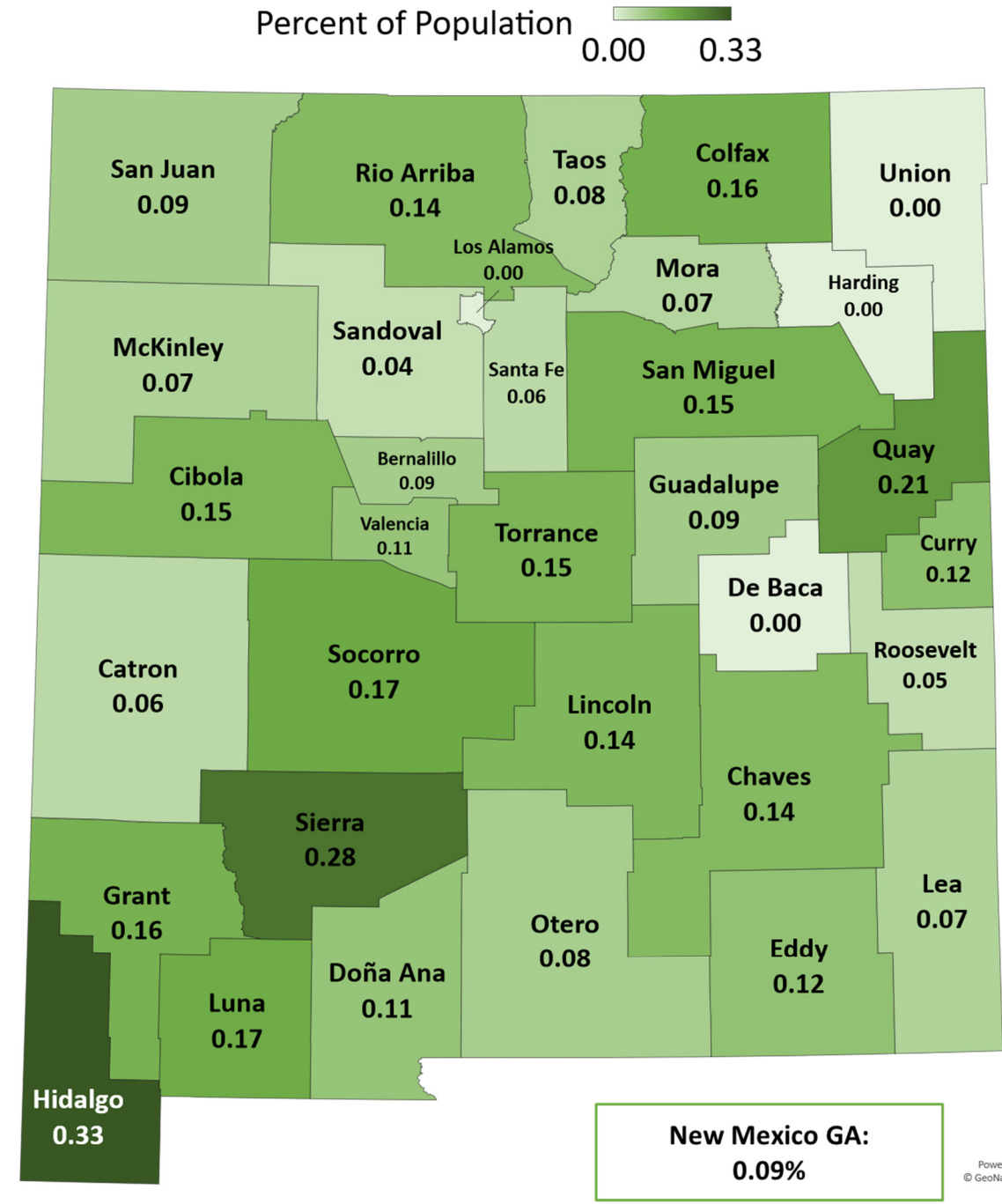
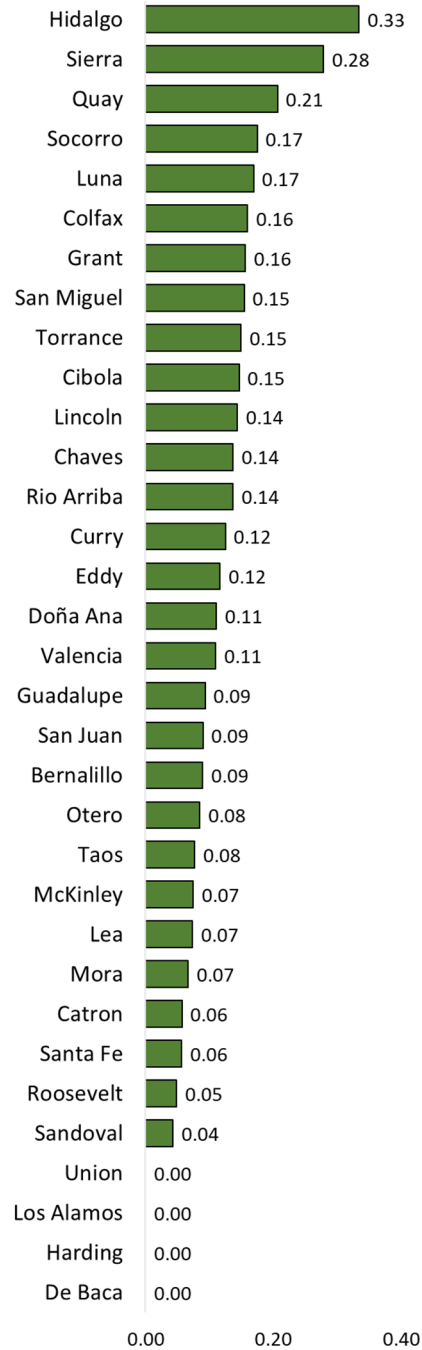
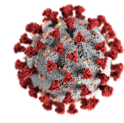
# New Mexico General Assistance Program Recipients by County as of October 2020

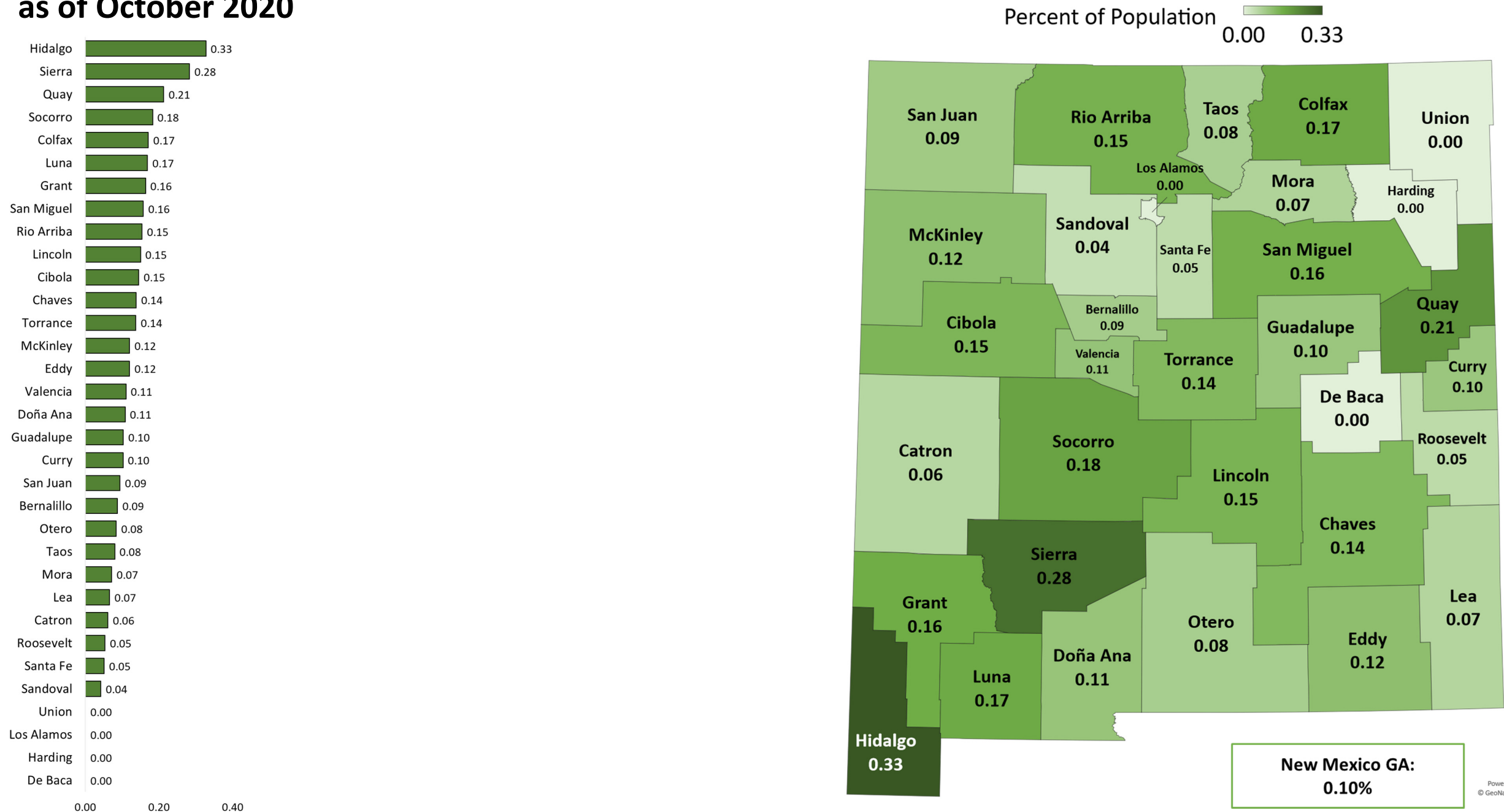
# New Mexico General Assistance Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County as of October 2020

# New Mexico General Assistance Program Black/African American Recipients as a Percentage of Black/African American Population by County as of October 2020

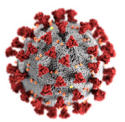

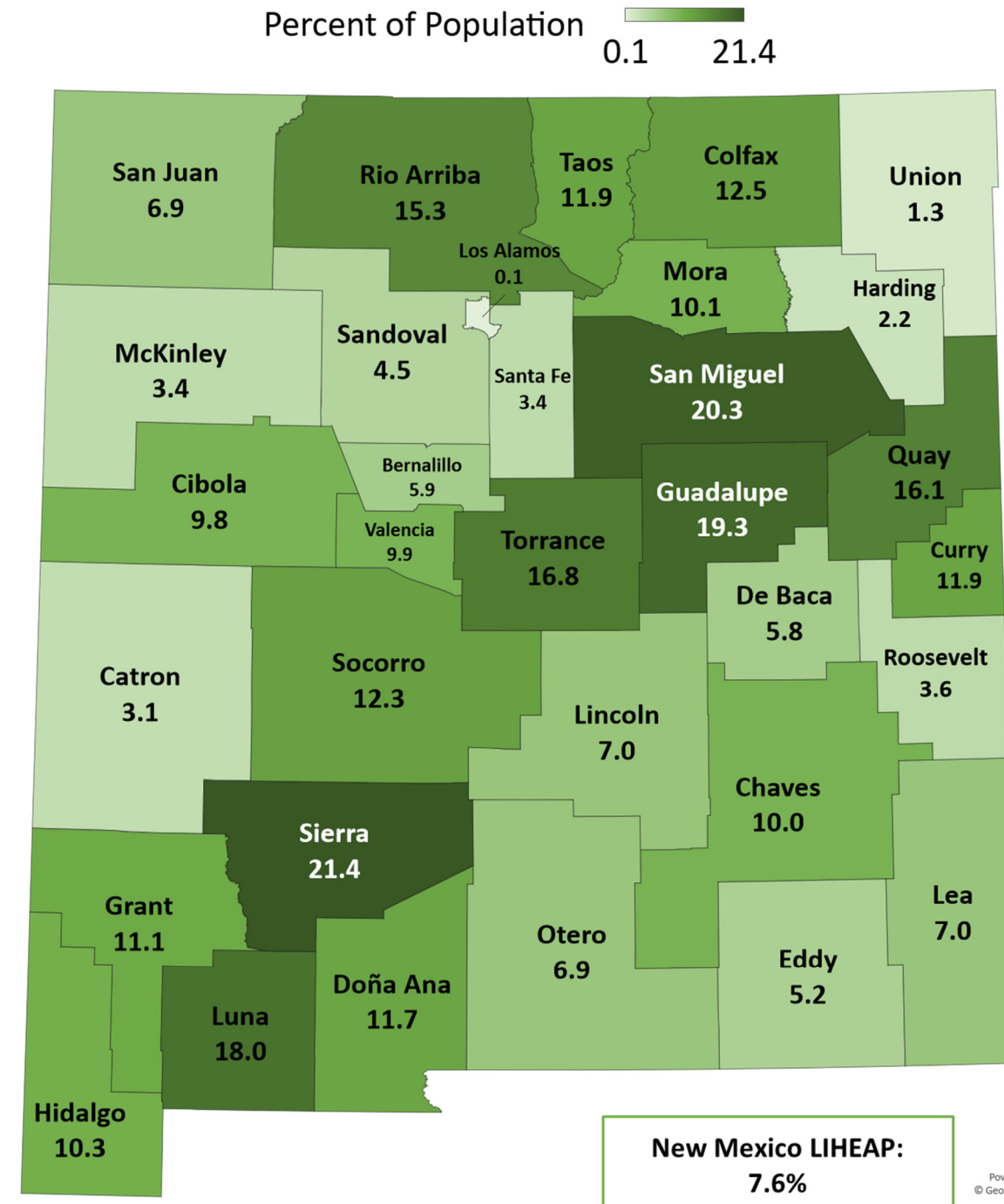
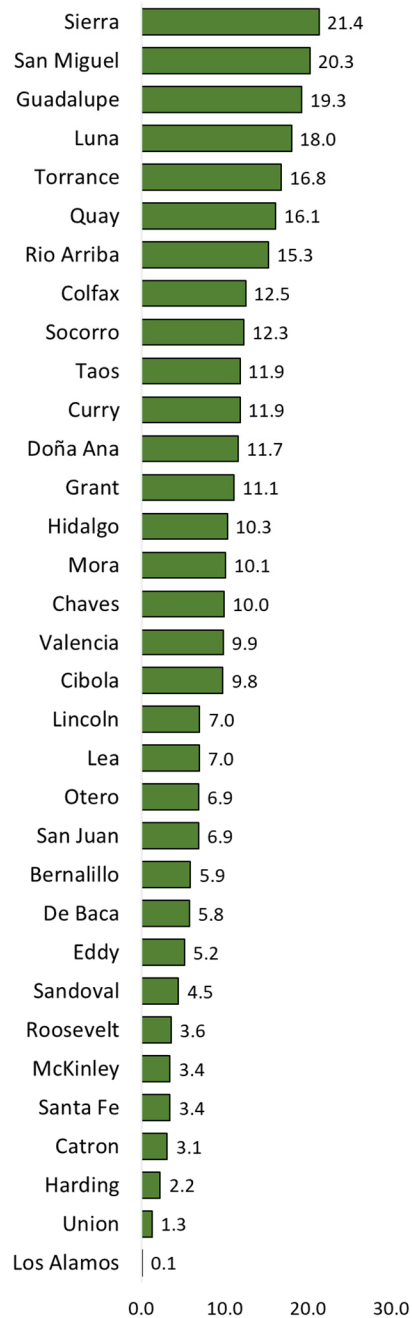
# New Mexico Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Recipients by County October 2019 to September 2020

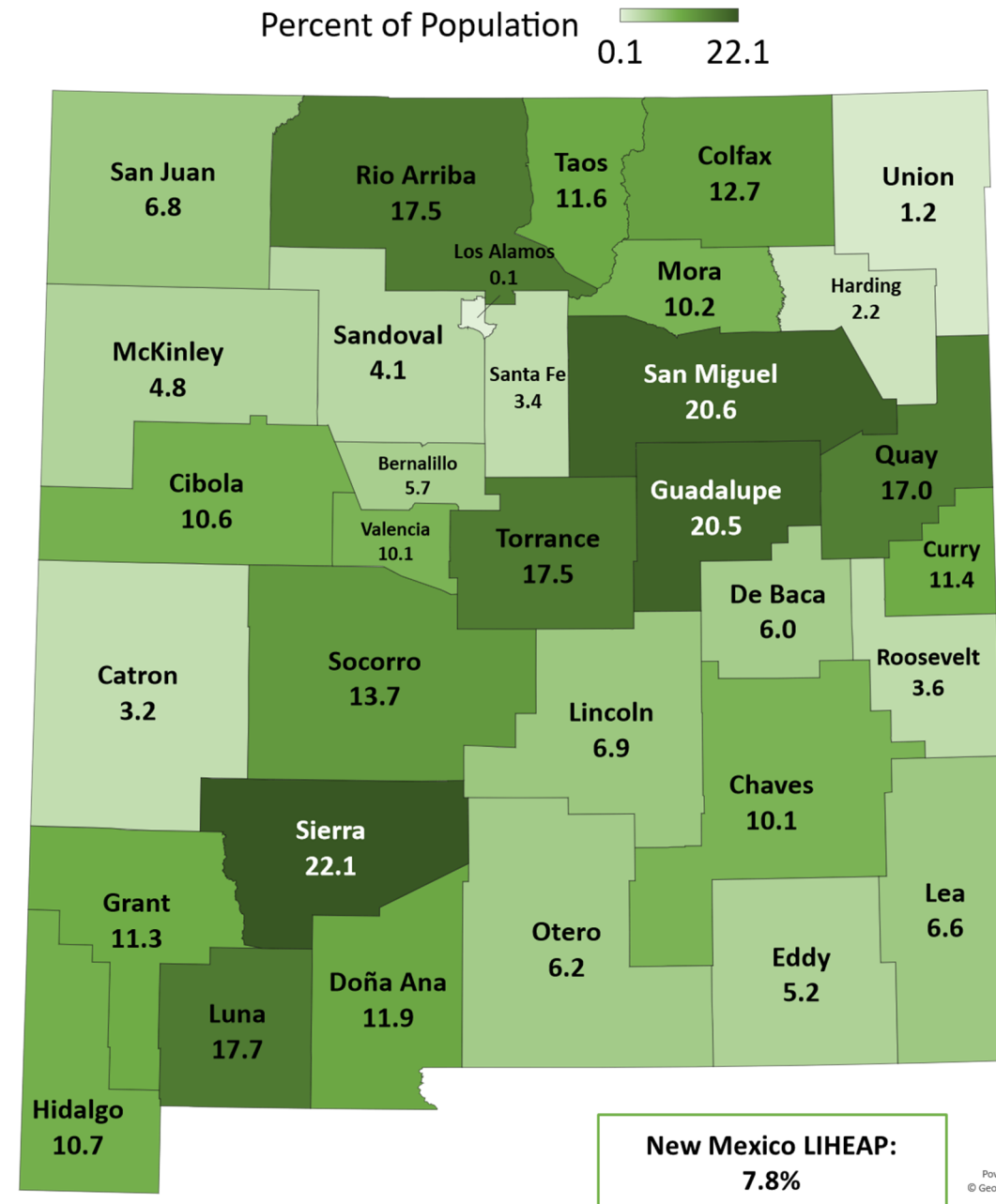
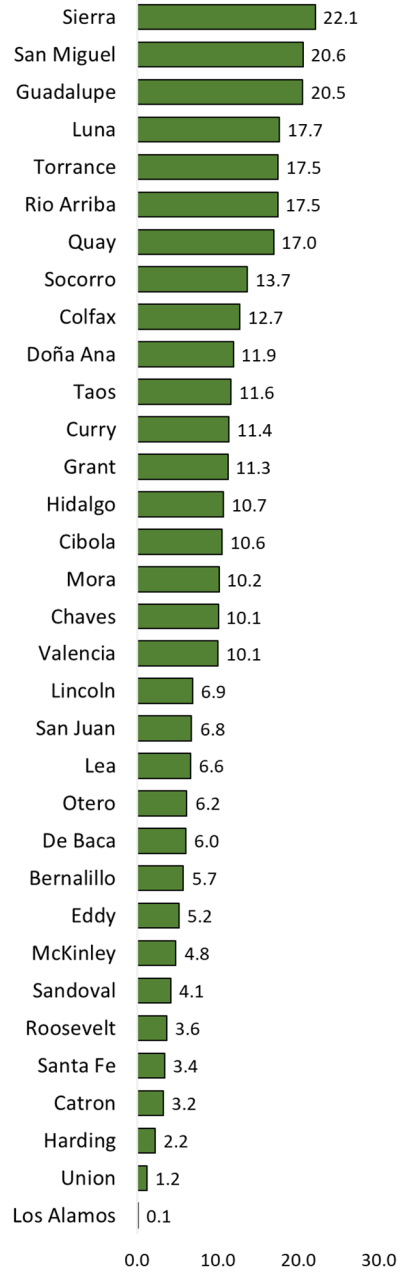
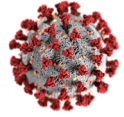
# New Mexico Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program Recipients as a Percentage of Population by County for October 2019 to September 2020

# New Mexico Emergency Support Function (ESF) Total Sheltered with Non-Congregate Shelter by County through November 2020



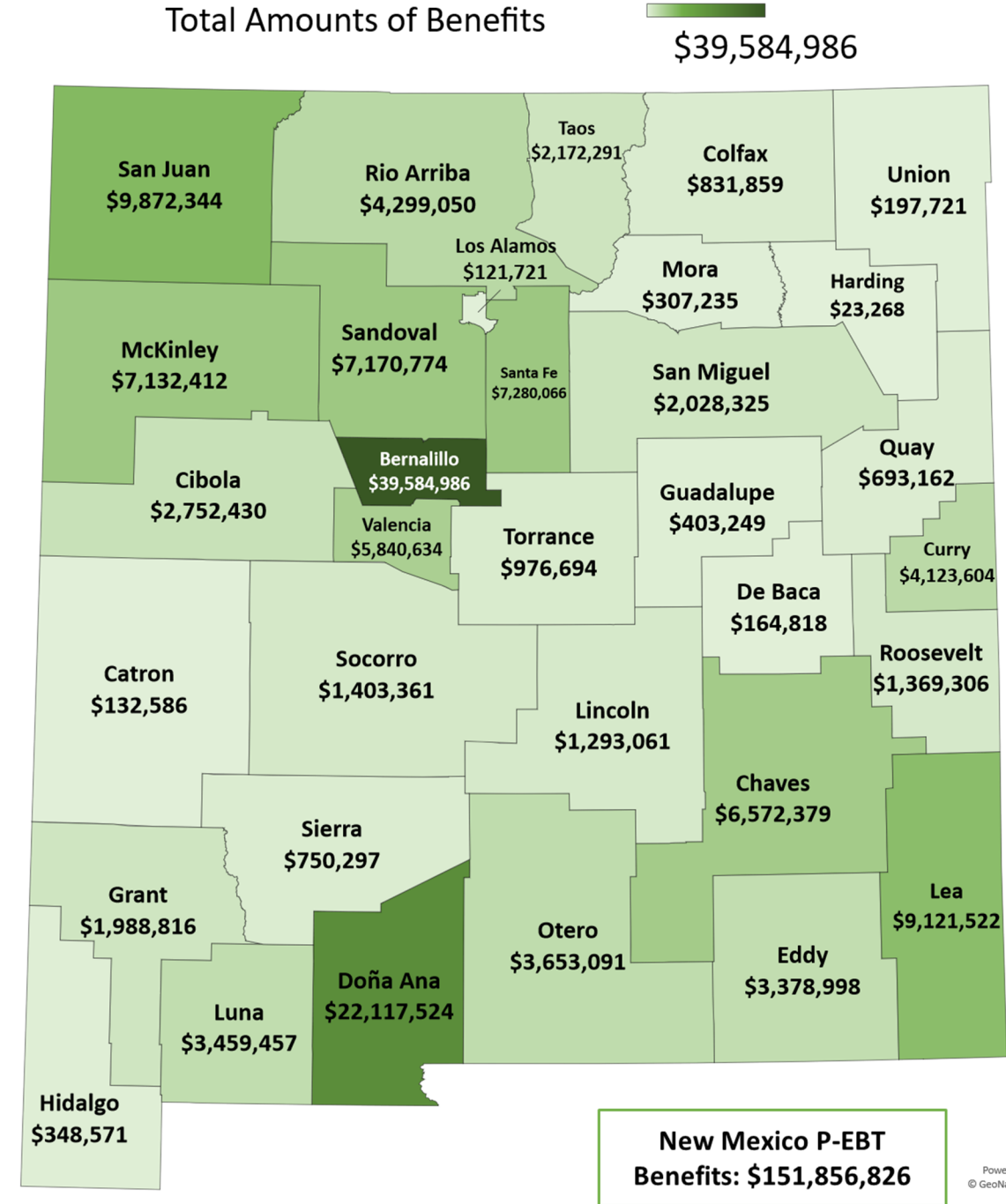
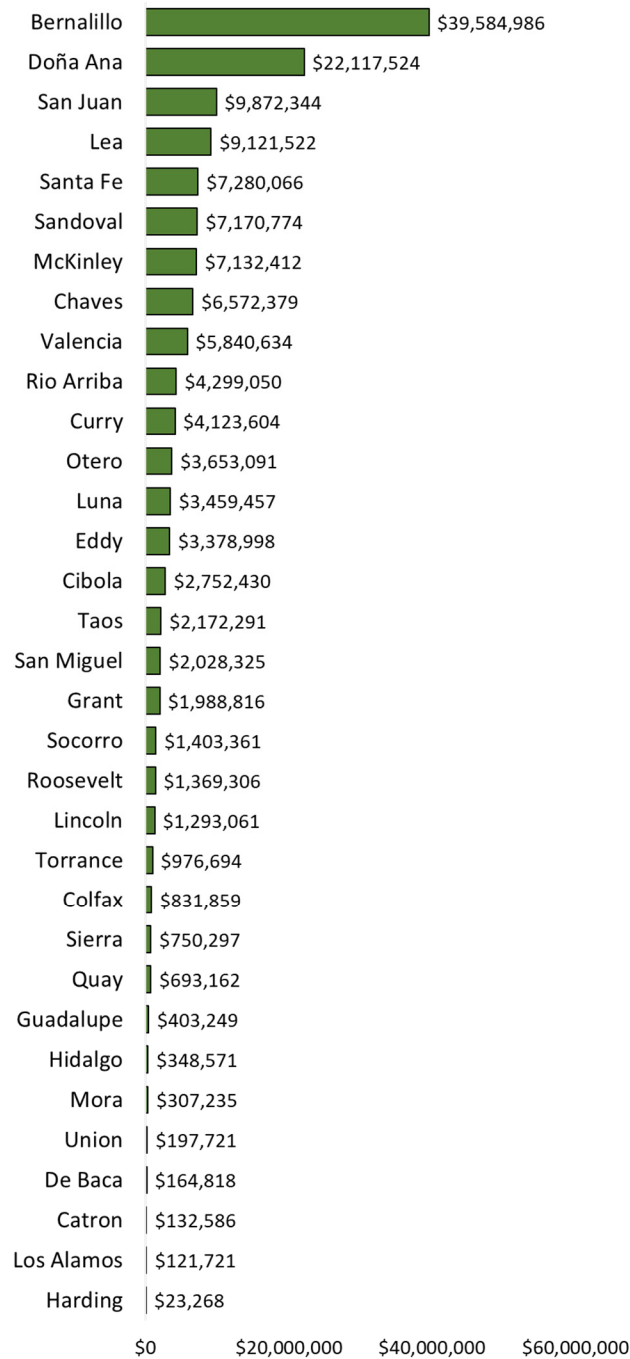

# New Mexico Average Number of School Children Issued Pandemic-EBT (P-EBT) by County, School Year 2019 and 2020



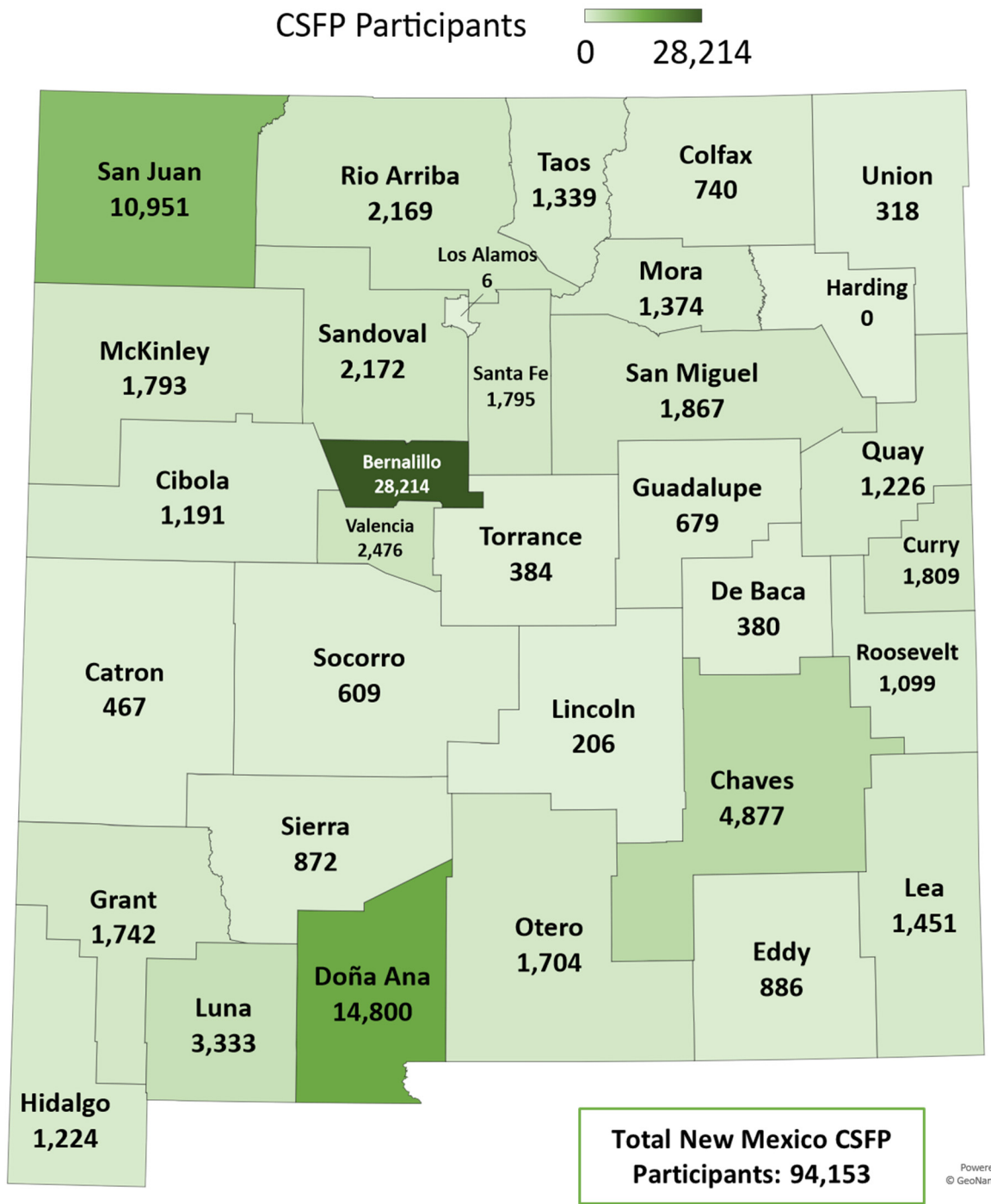
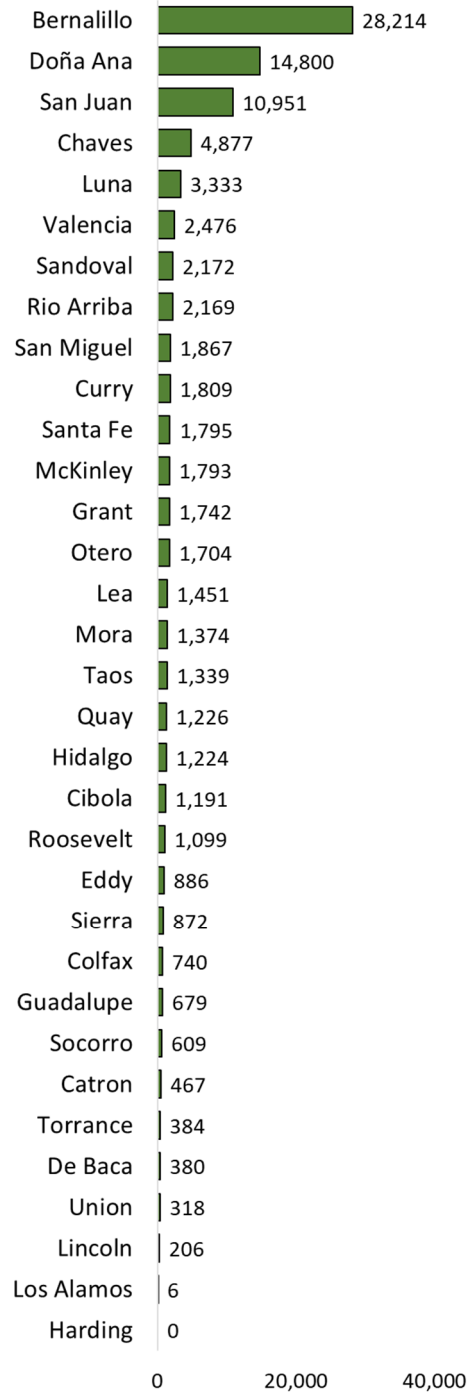
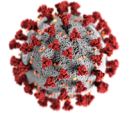

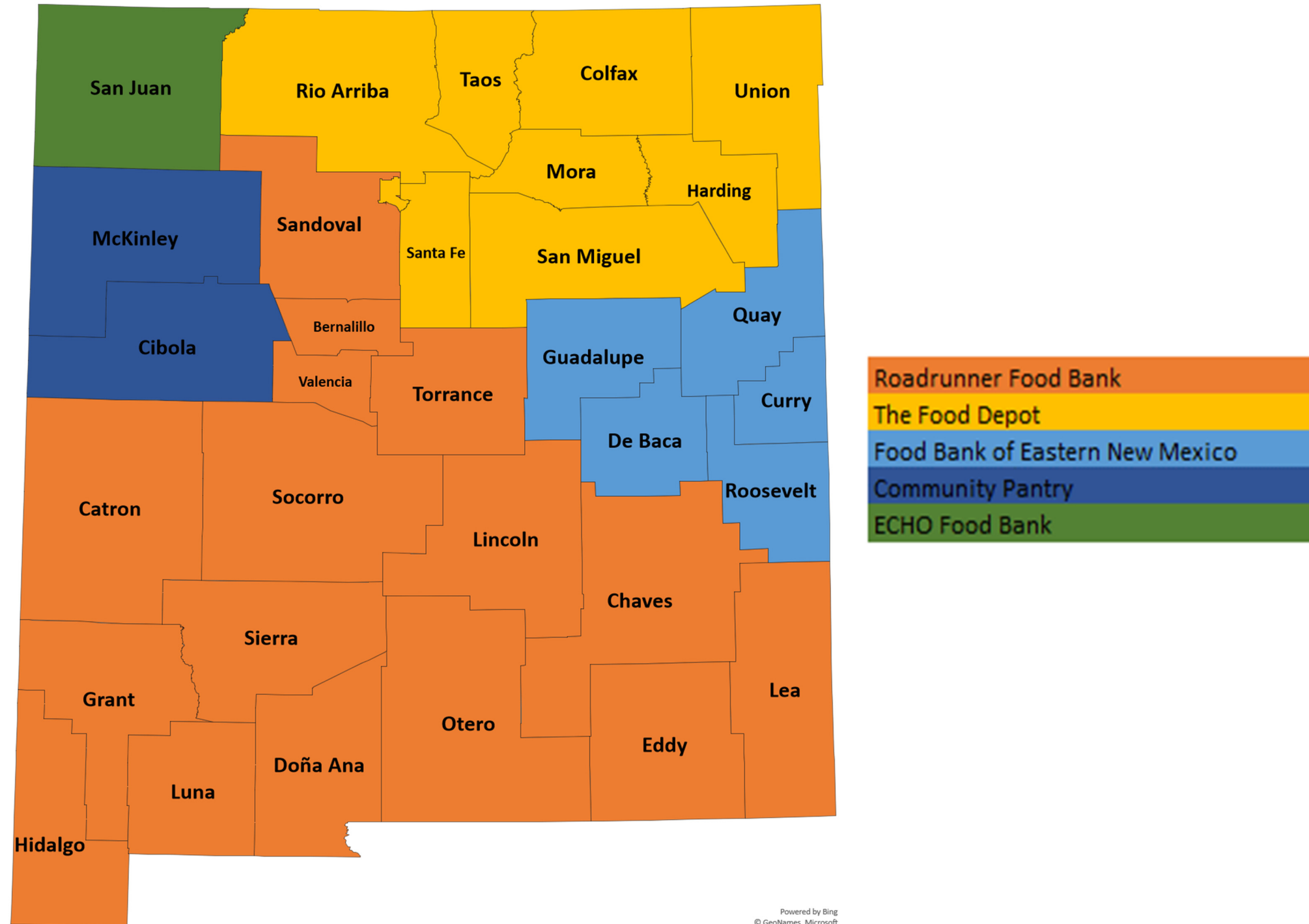
# New Mexico Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) Participation by County, January-August

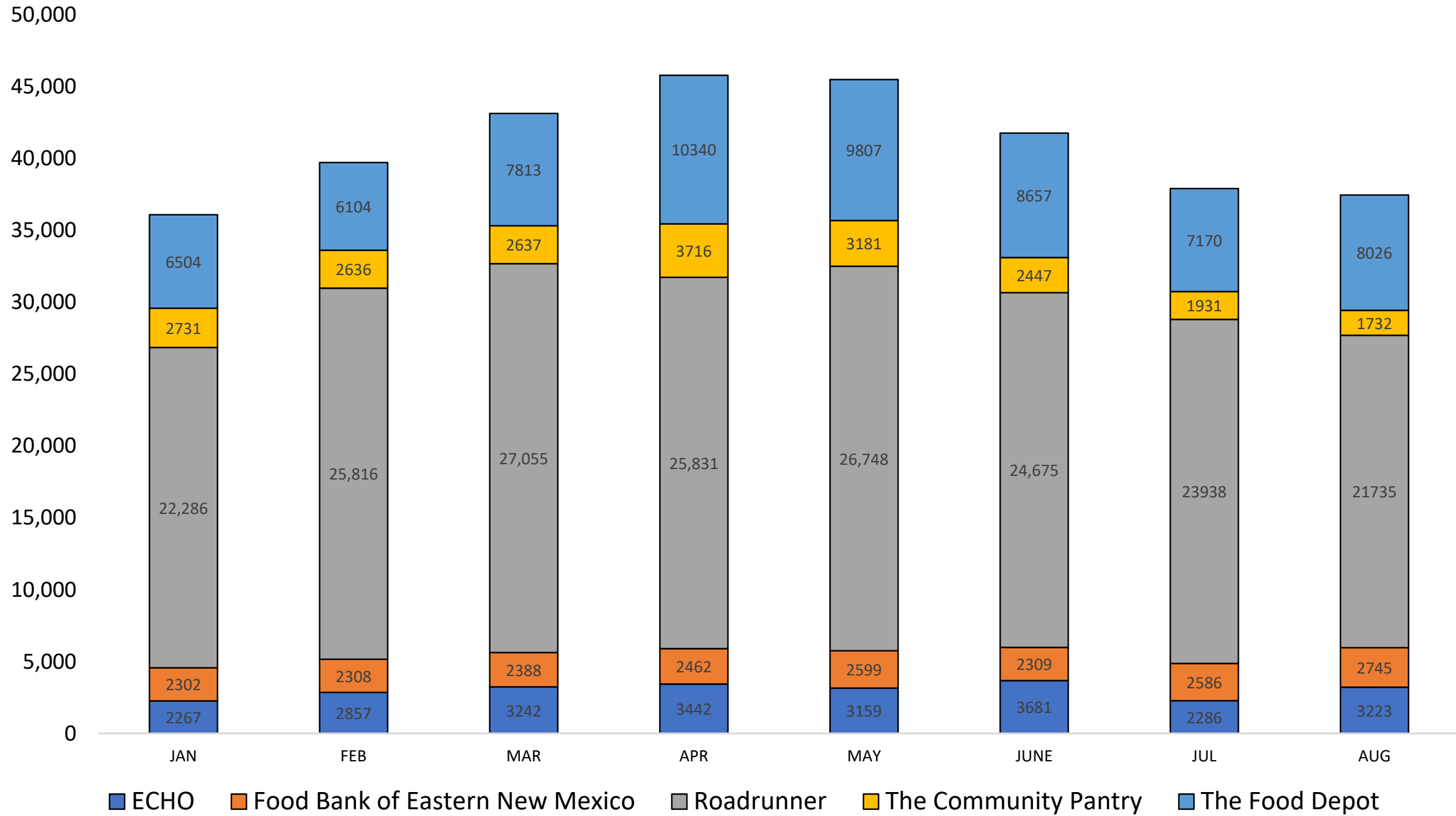

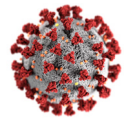
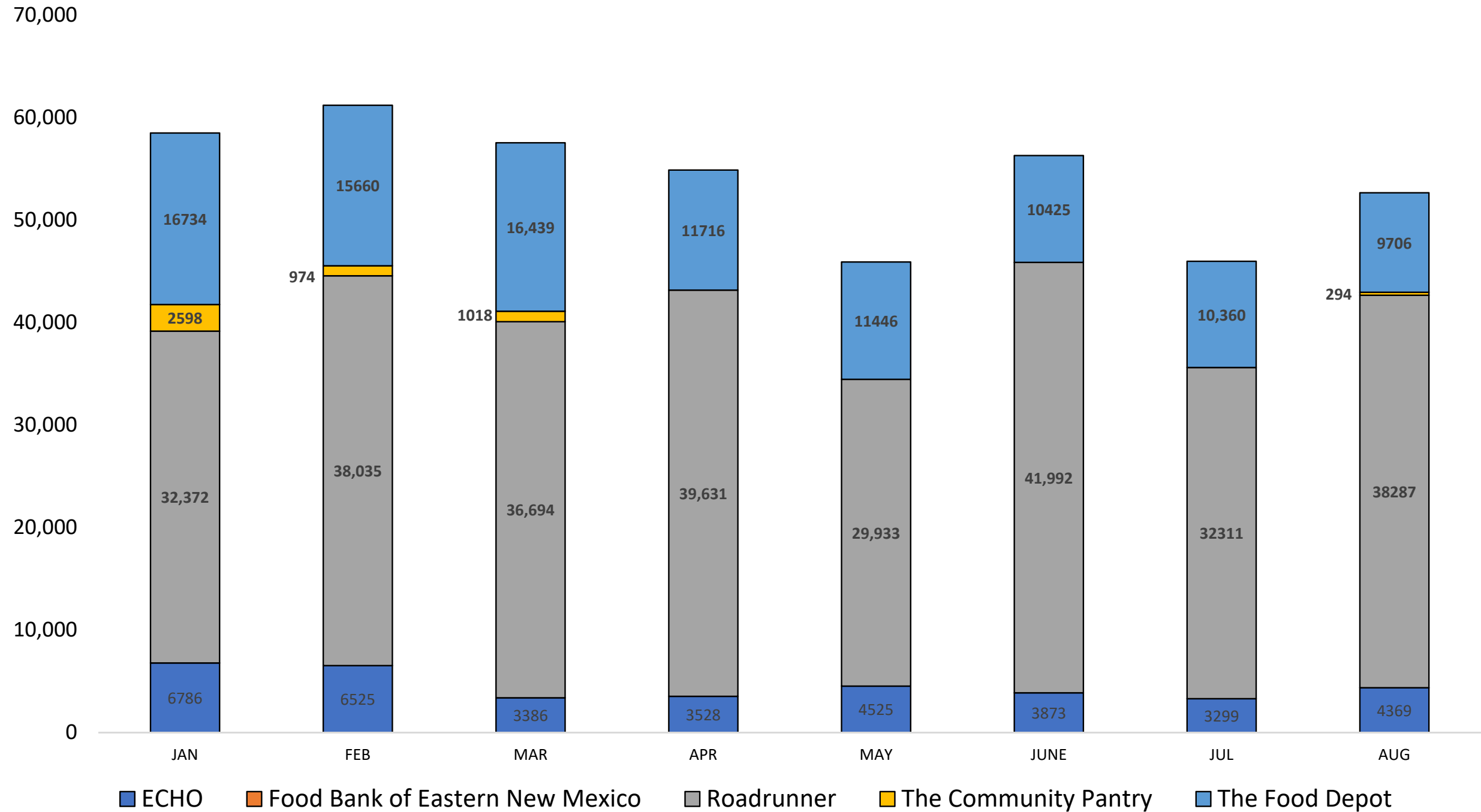

# New Mexico Emergency Food Assistance Program Households Served Monthly January-August 2020



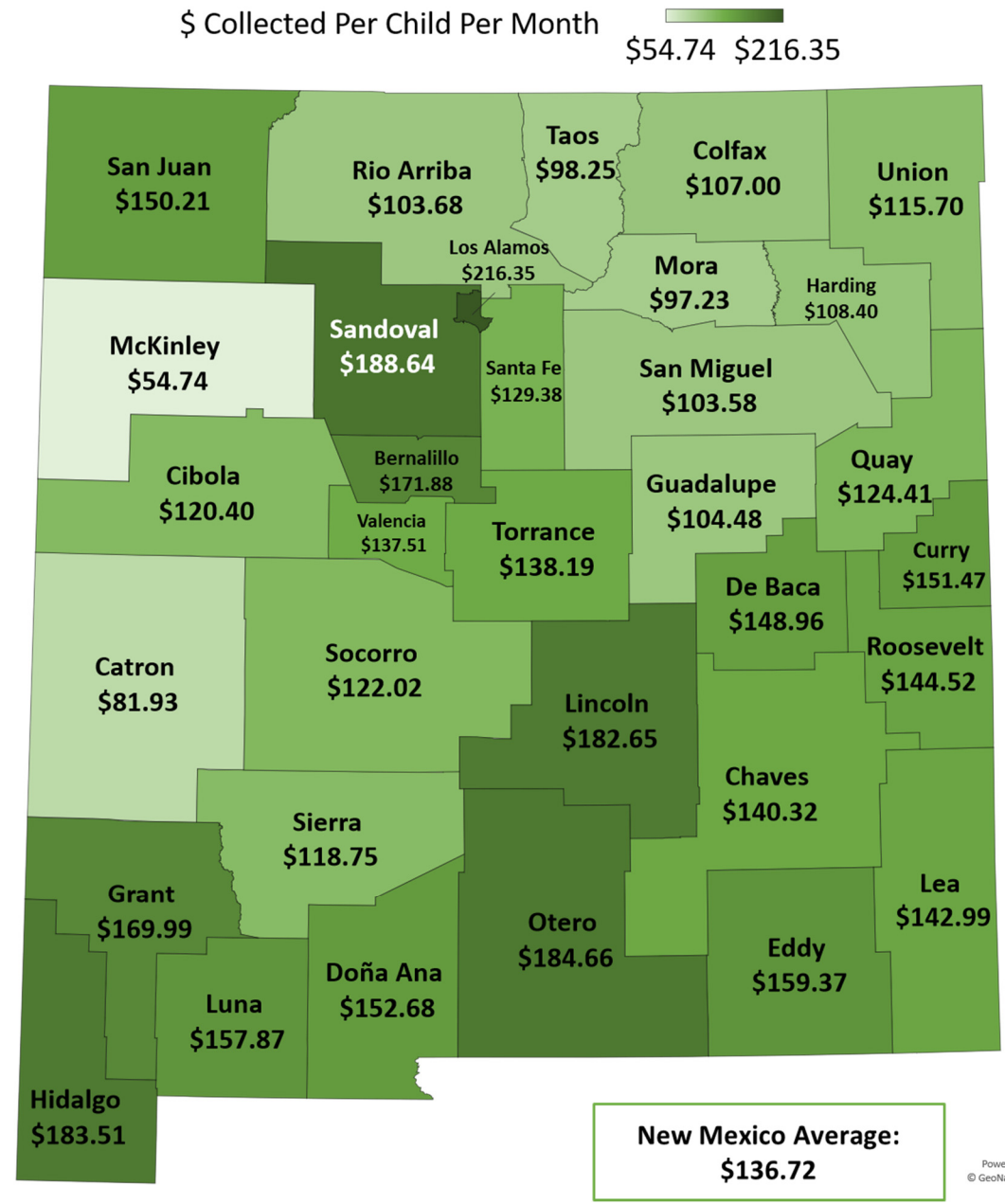
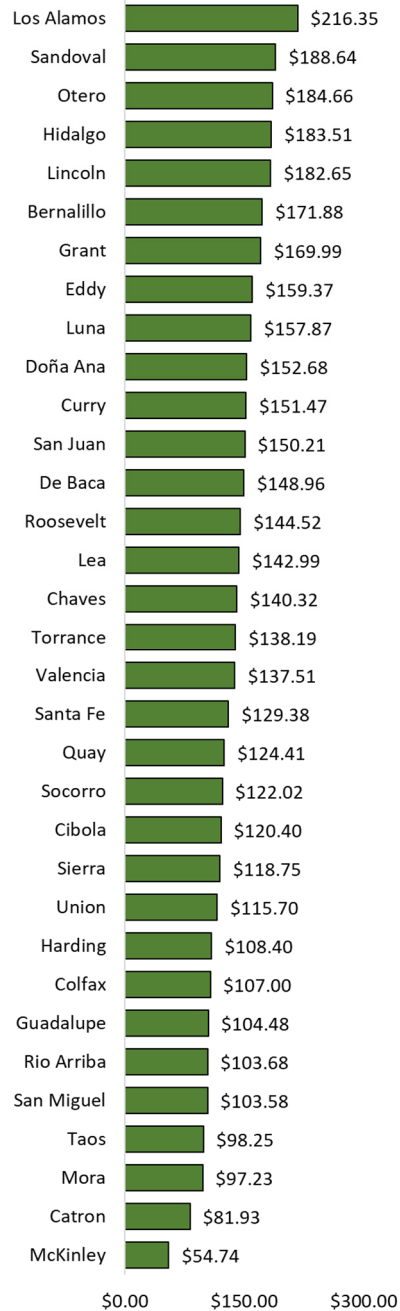
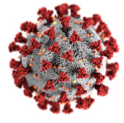

# New Mexico Meals Served at Soup Kitchens and Shelters Monthly January-August 2020



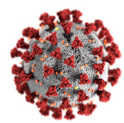
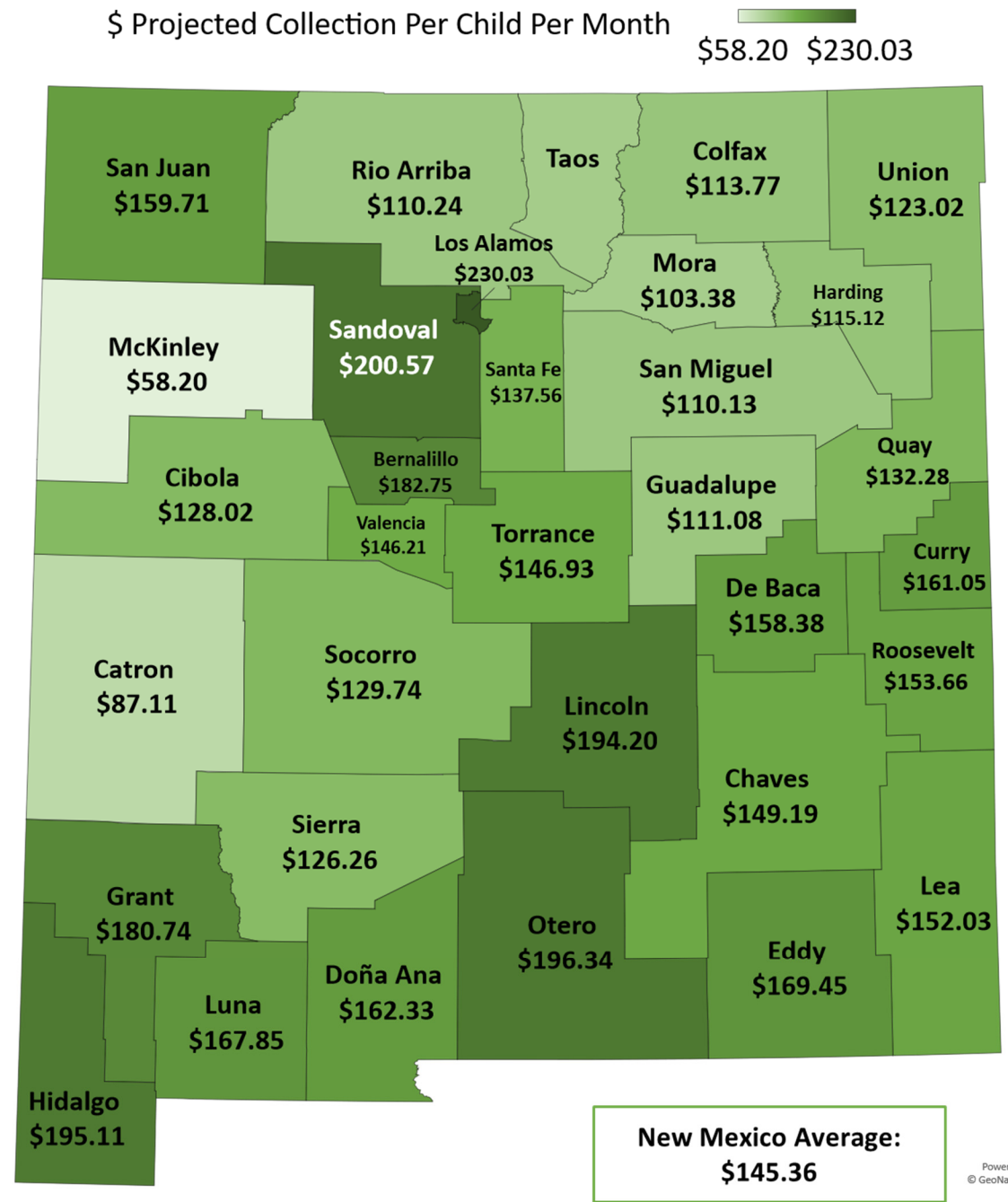
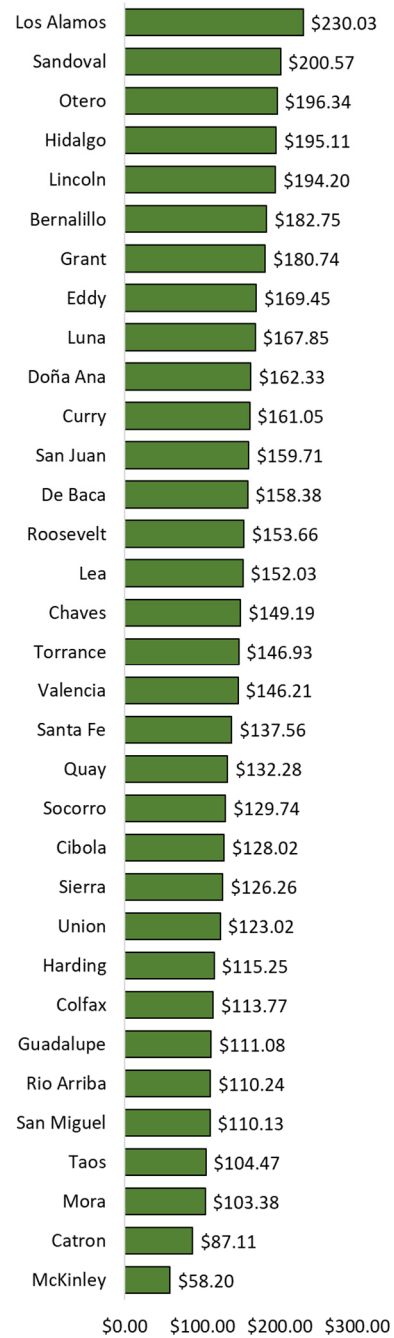

# New Mexico Child Support Dollars Collected Per Child Per Month Federal Fiscal Year 20 (FFY20)



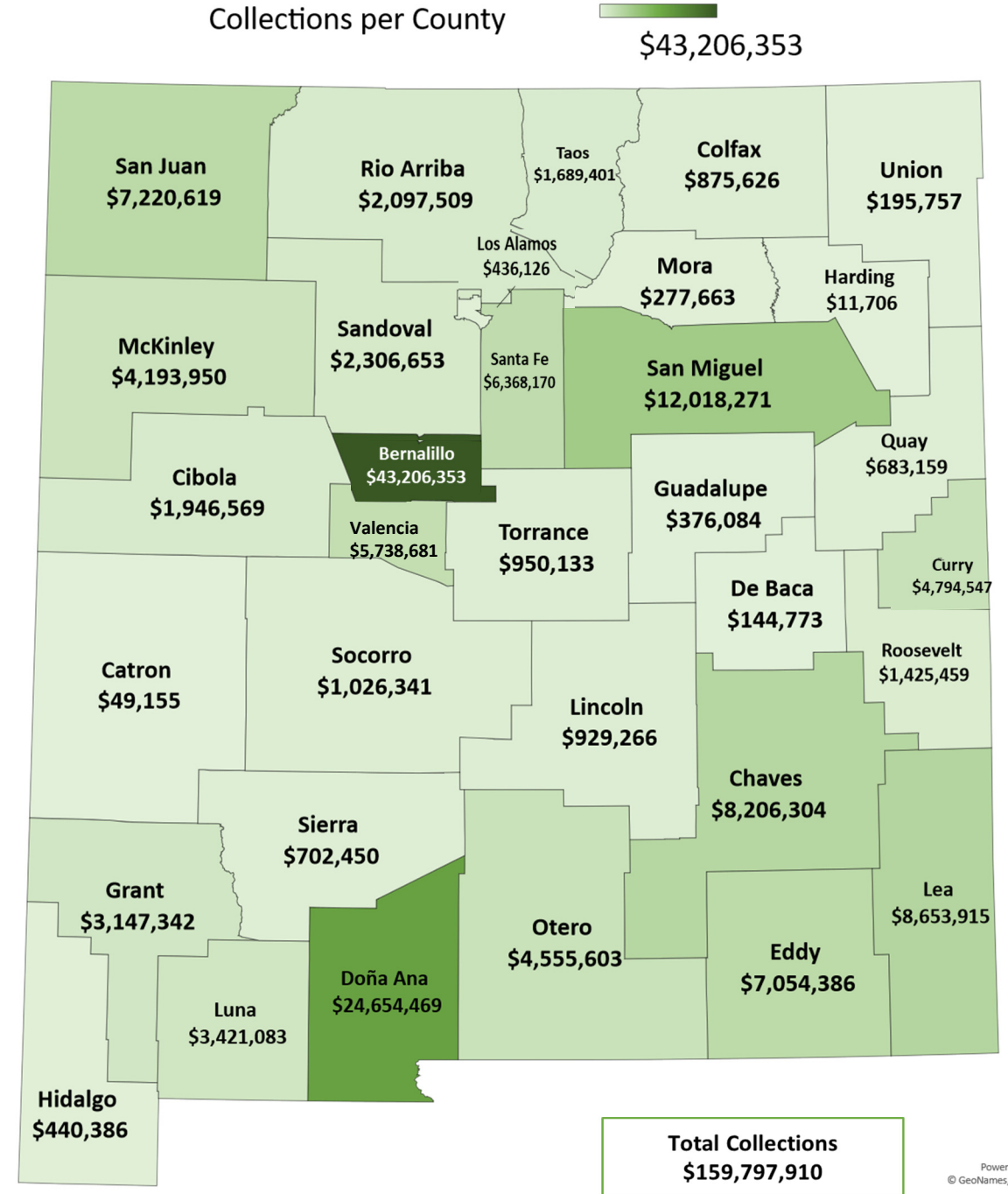
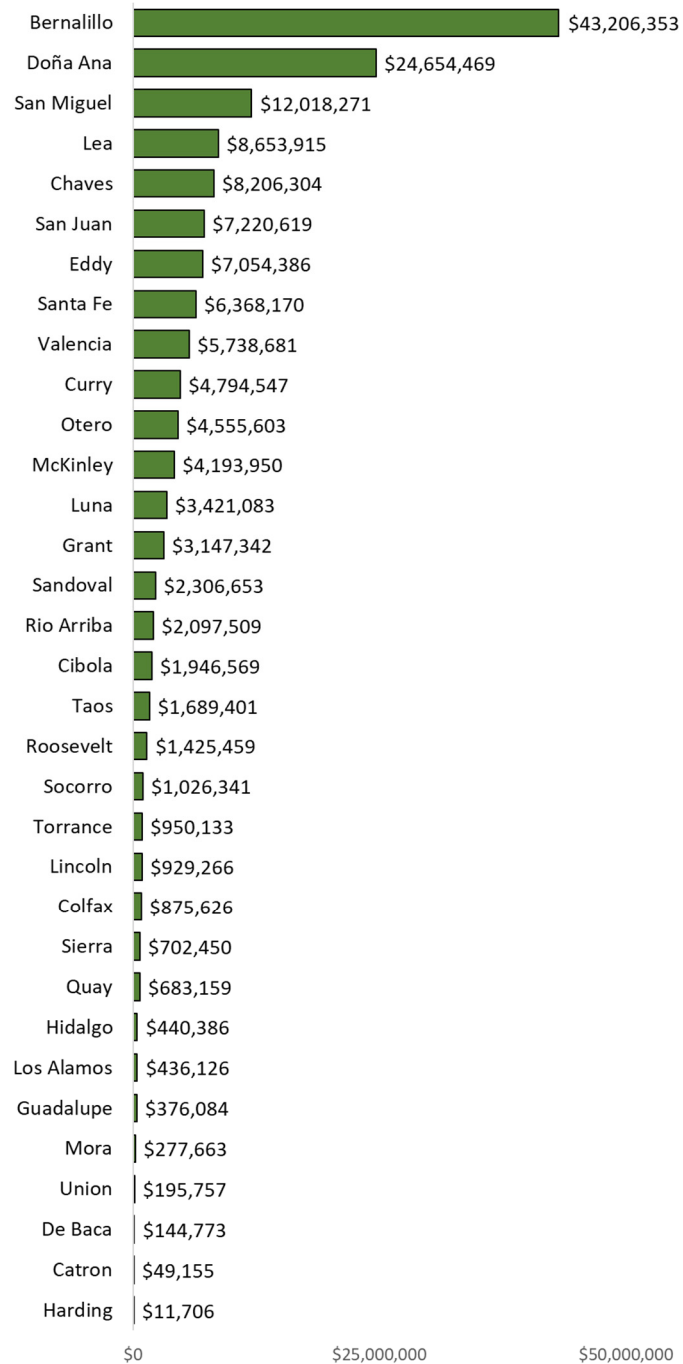
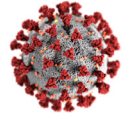

# New Mexico Child Support Dollars Projected Collection Per Child Per Month Federal Fiscal Year 20 (FFY20)



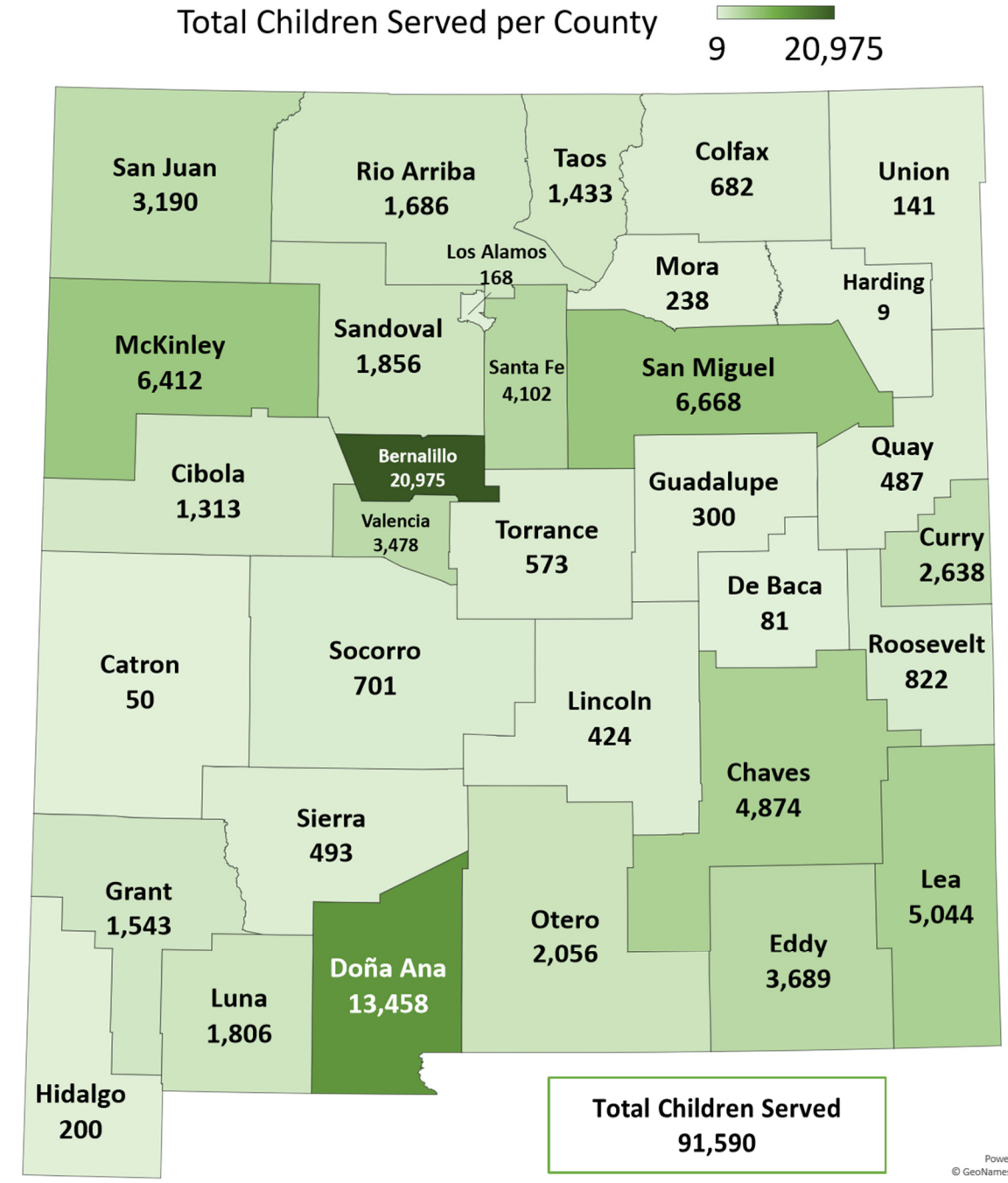
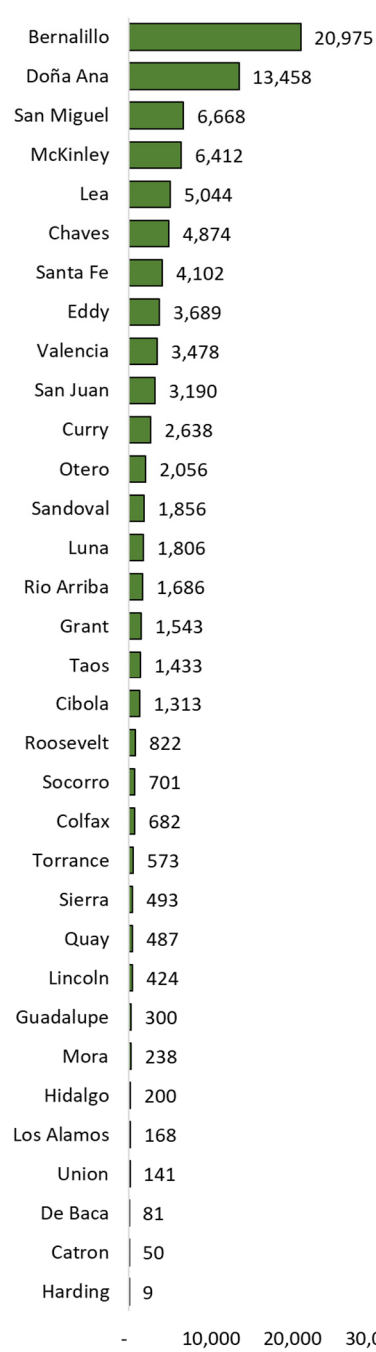

# New Mexico Child Support Average Collections by County Federal Fiscal Year 20 (FFY20)



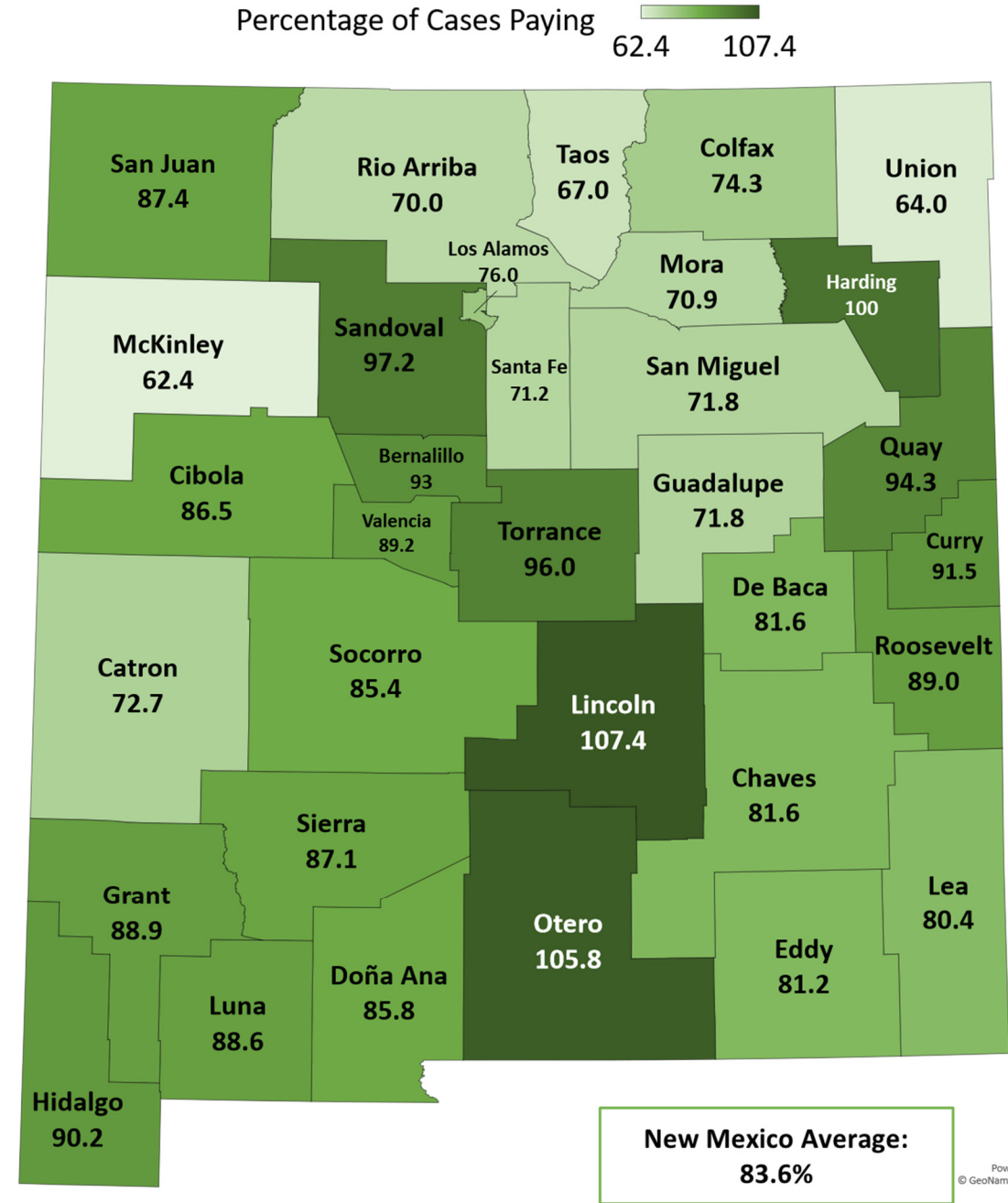
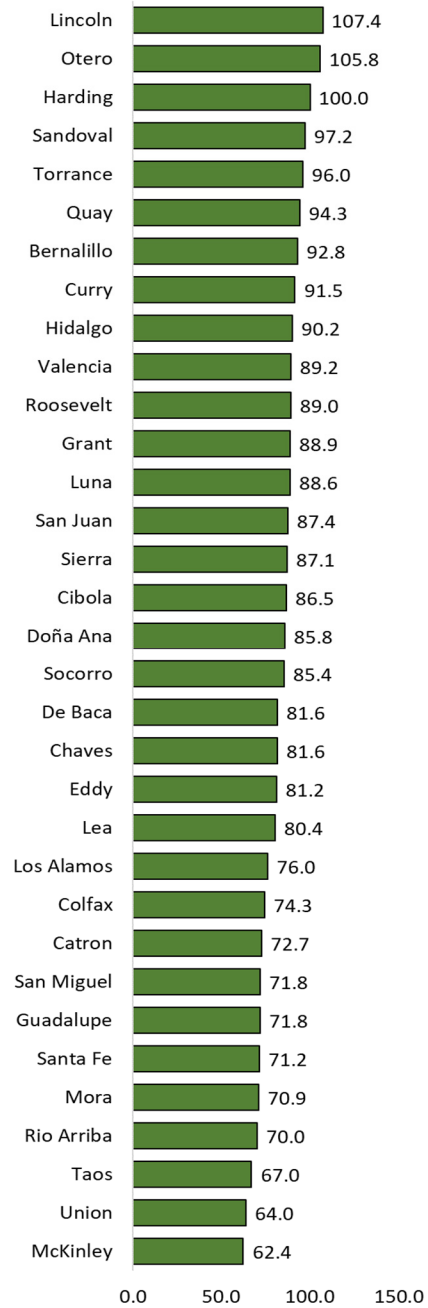
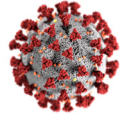

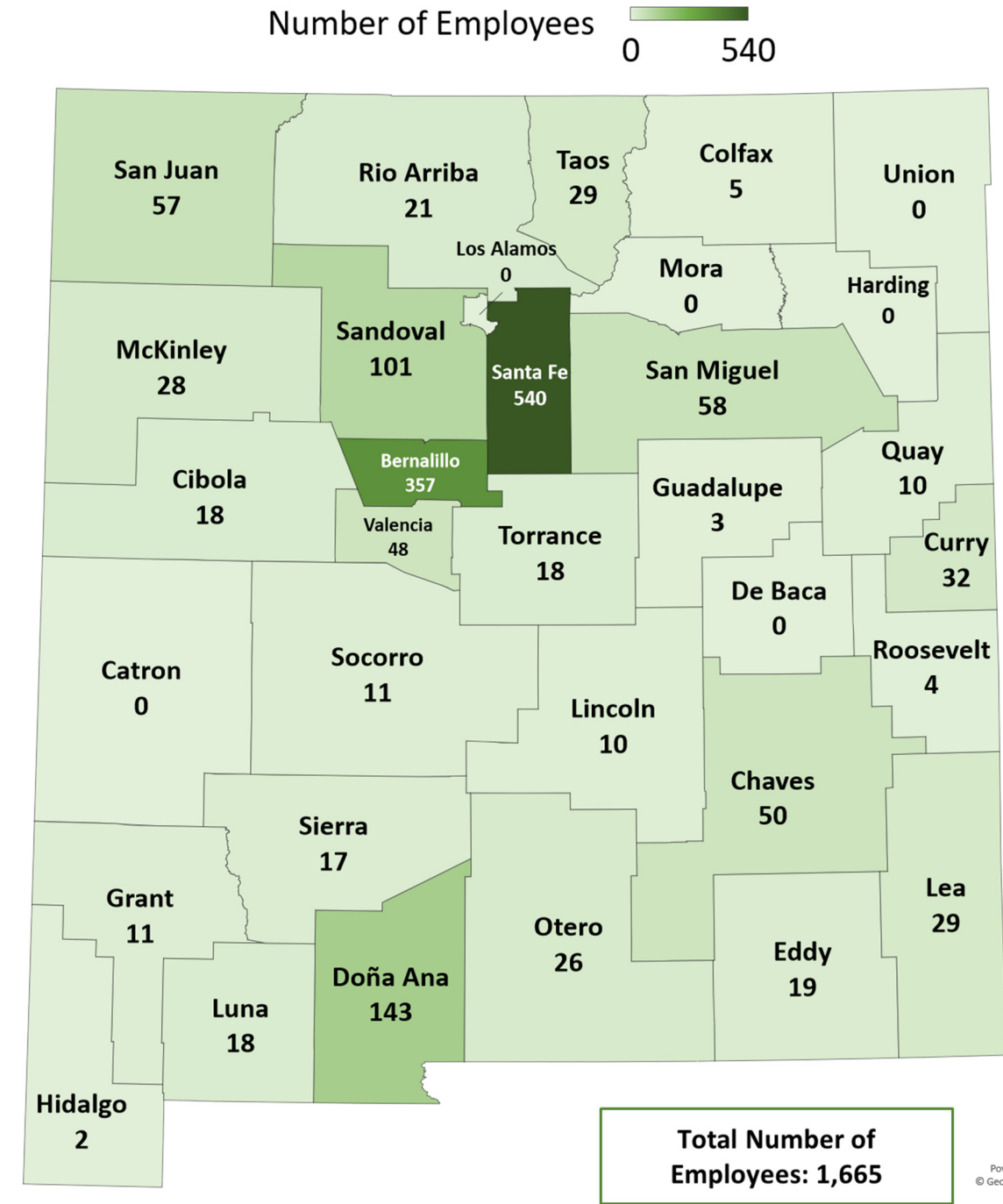
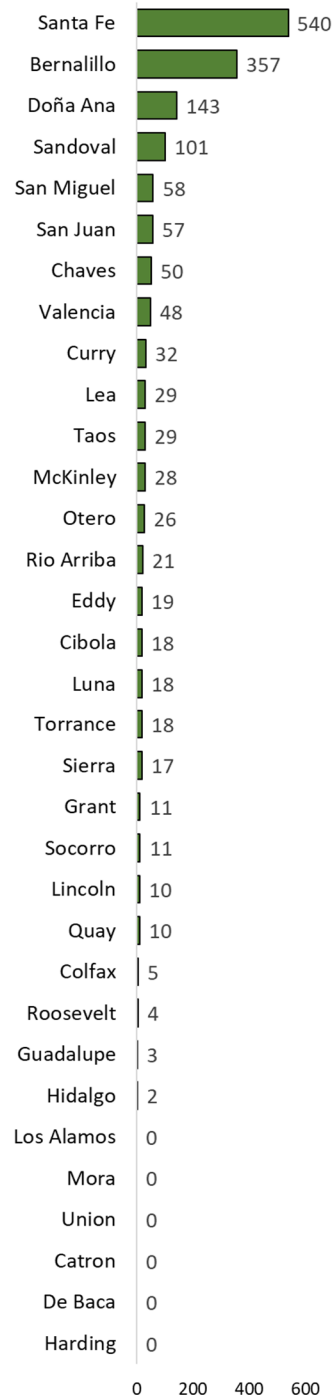
# New Mexico Child Support Enforcement Division Percentage of Obligated Cases Paying, Annually Fiscal Year (FFY) 20

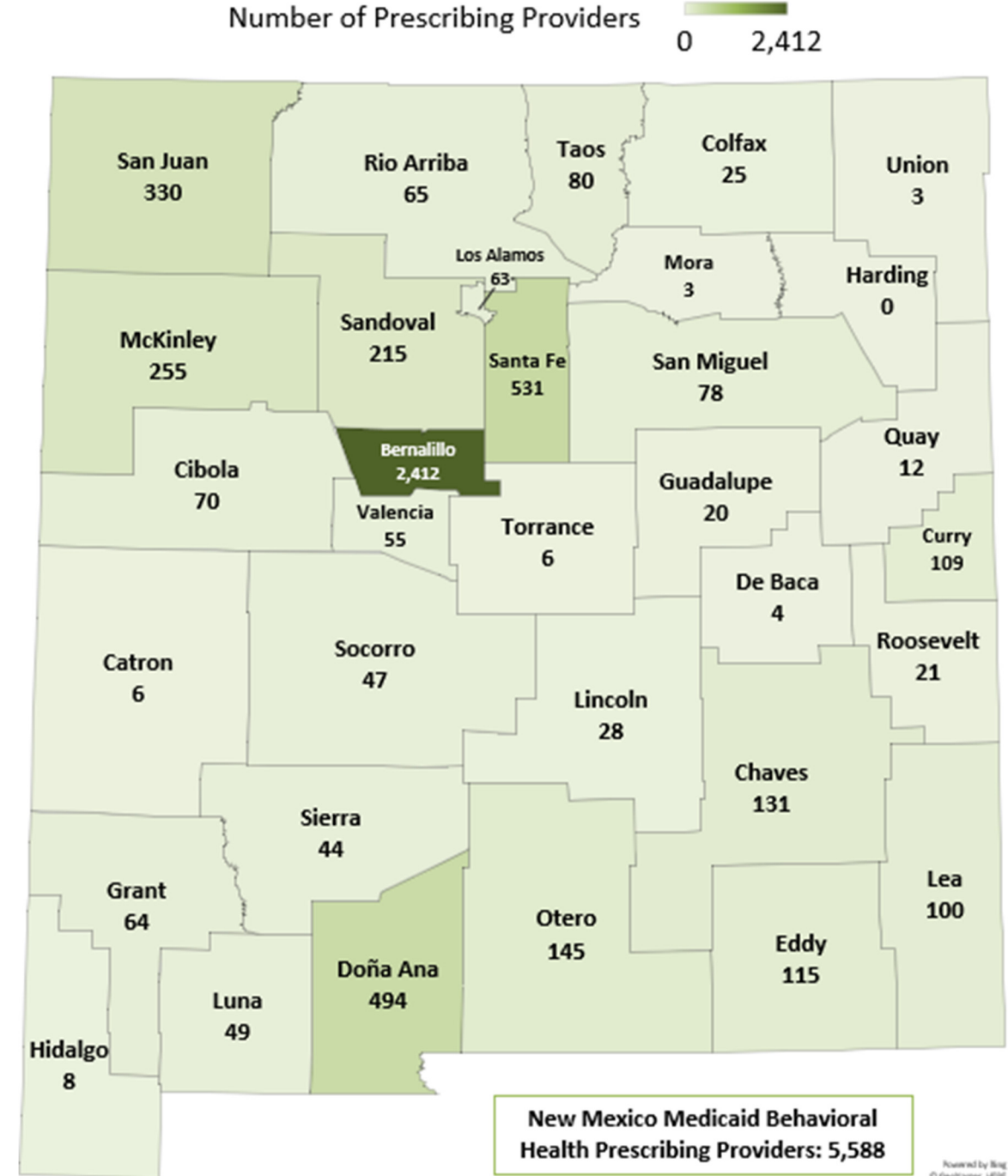
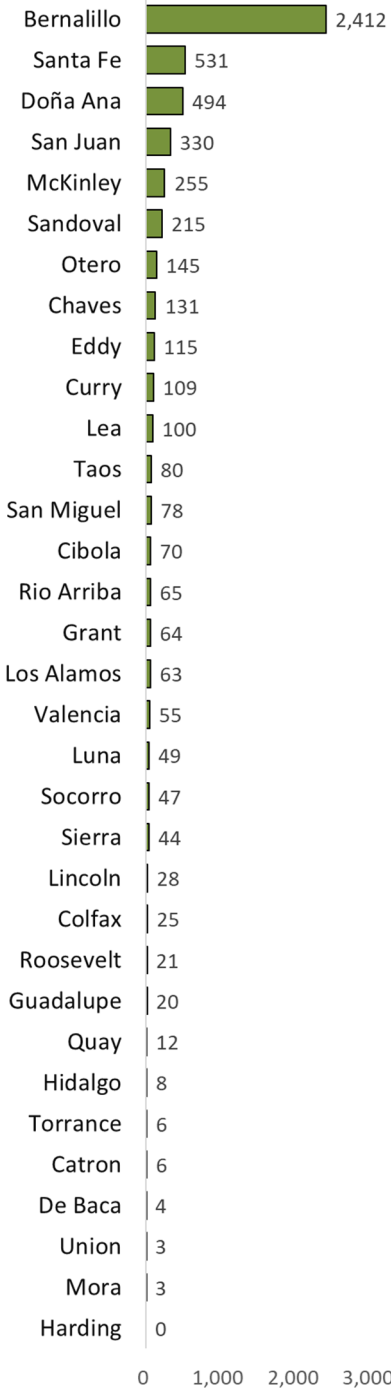


# New Mexico Human Services Department Employees by County as of October 2020



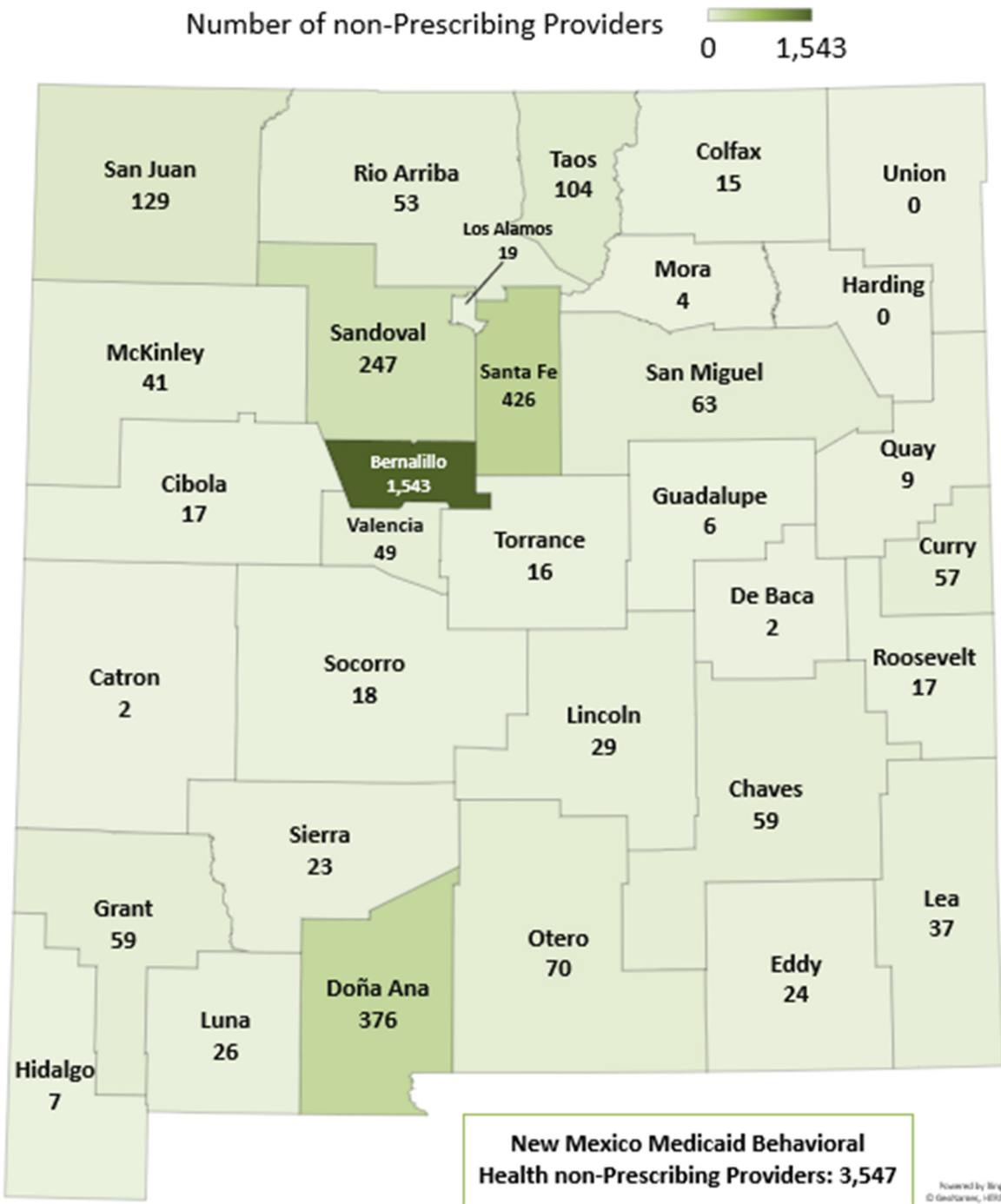
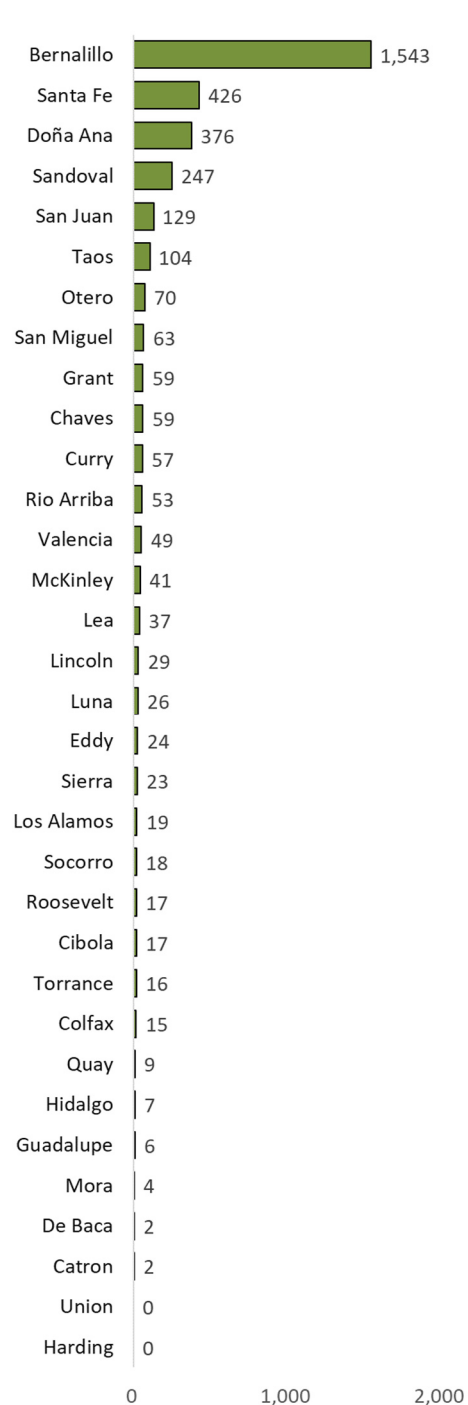

# Medicaid Behavioral Health Prescribing Providers by County as of October 2020



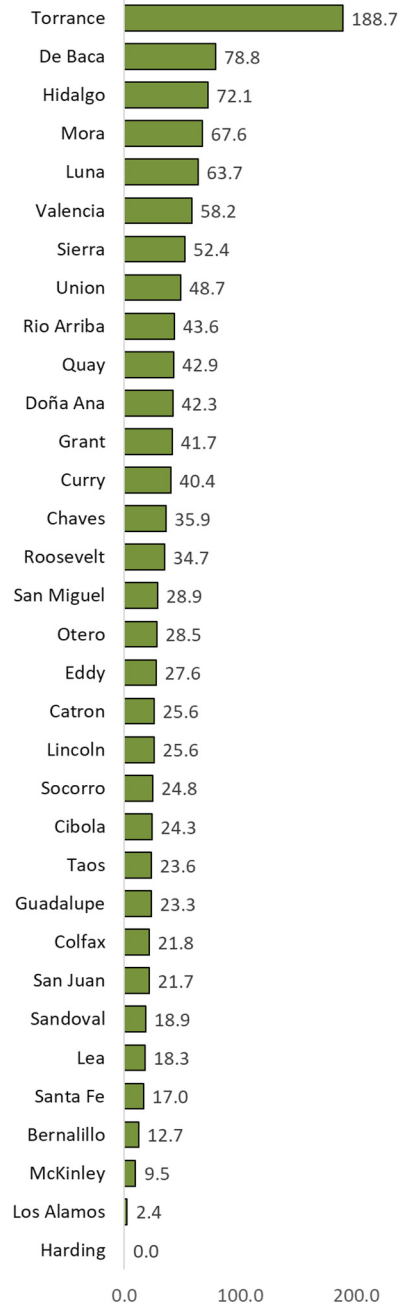
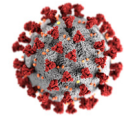

# Medicaid Behavioral Health non-Prescribing Providers by County as of October 2020

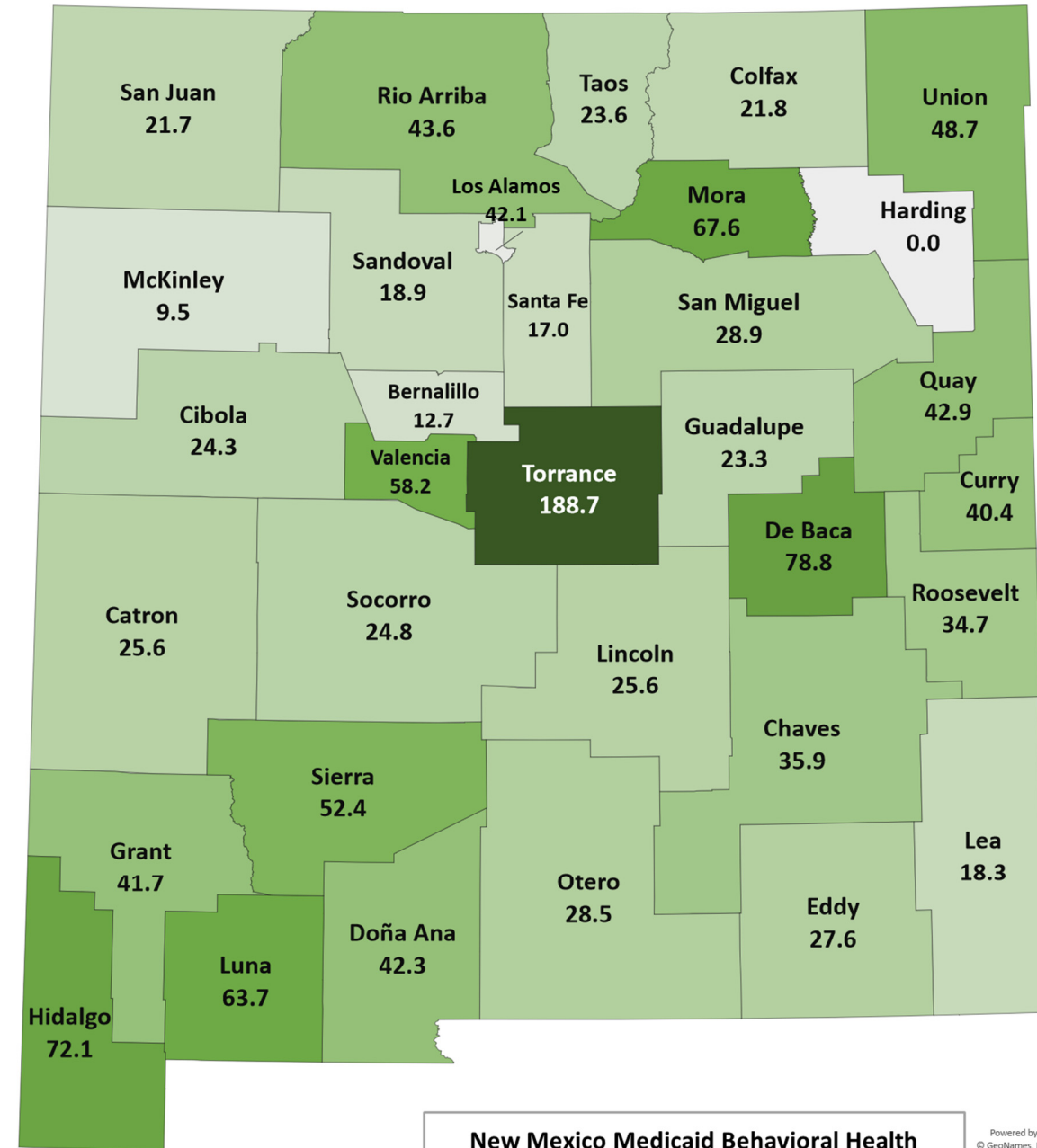

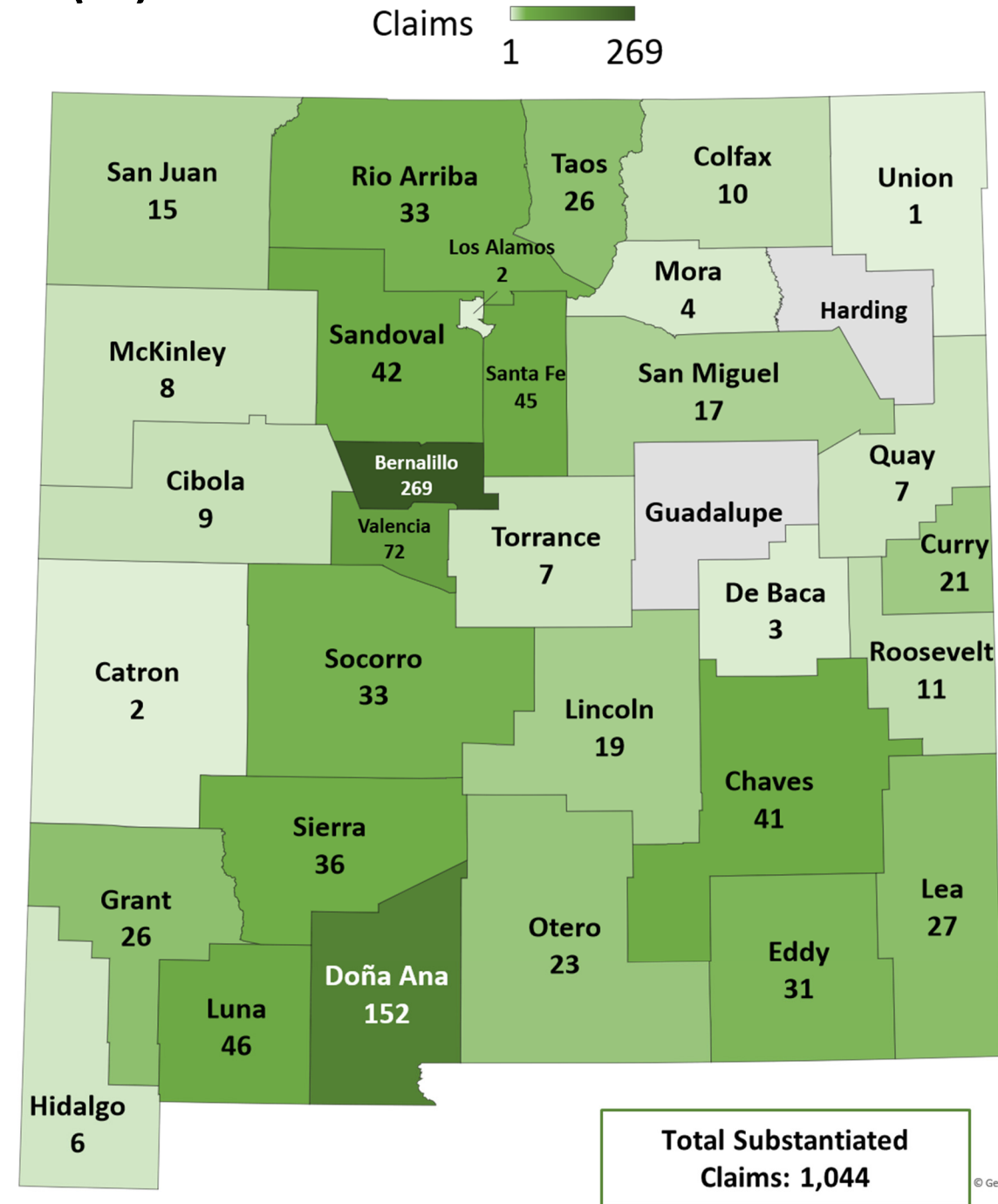
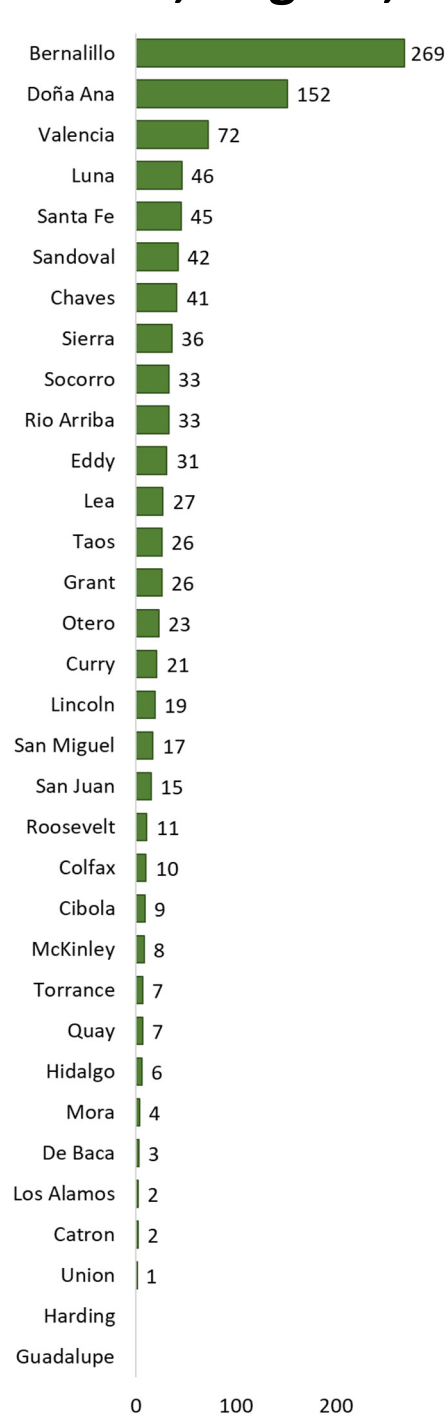


# Aging and Long Term Services Department (ALTSD) Adult Protective Services (APS) Number of Investigations by County, Fiscal Year (FY) 20

# Children Youth and Families Department (CYFD) Domestic Violence Survivors and Dependents Served by County, State Fiscal Year (SFY) 20



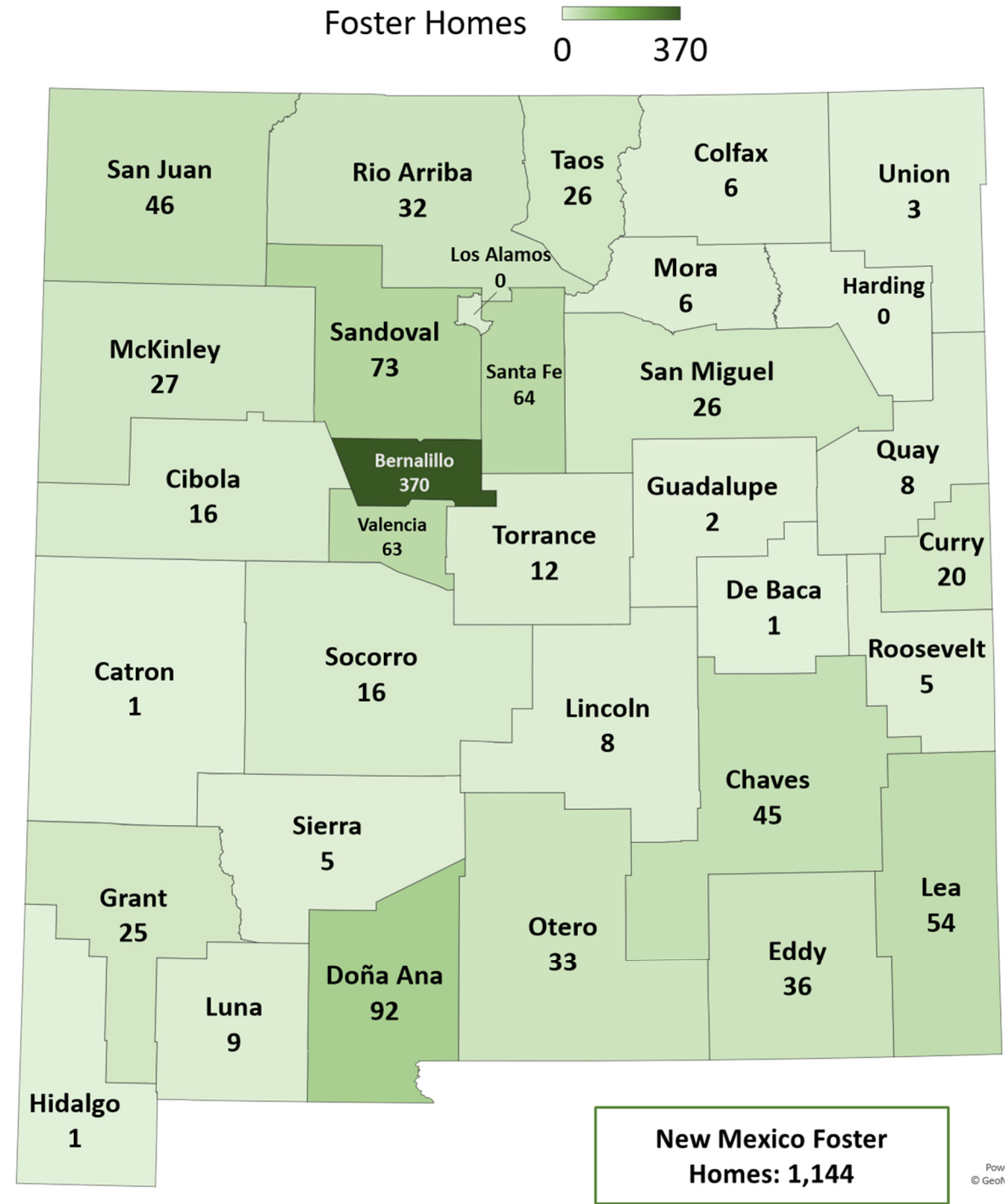
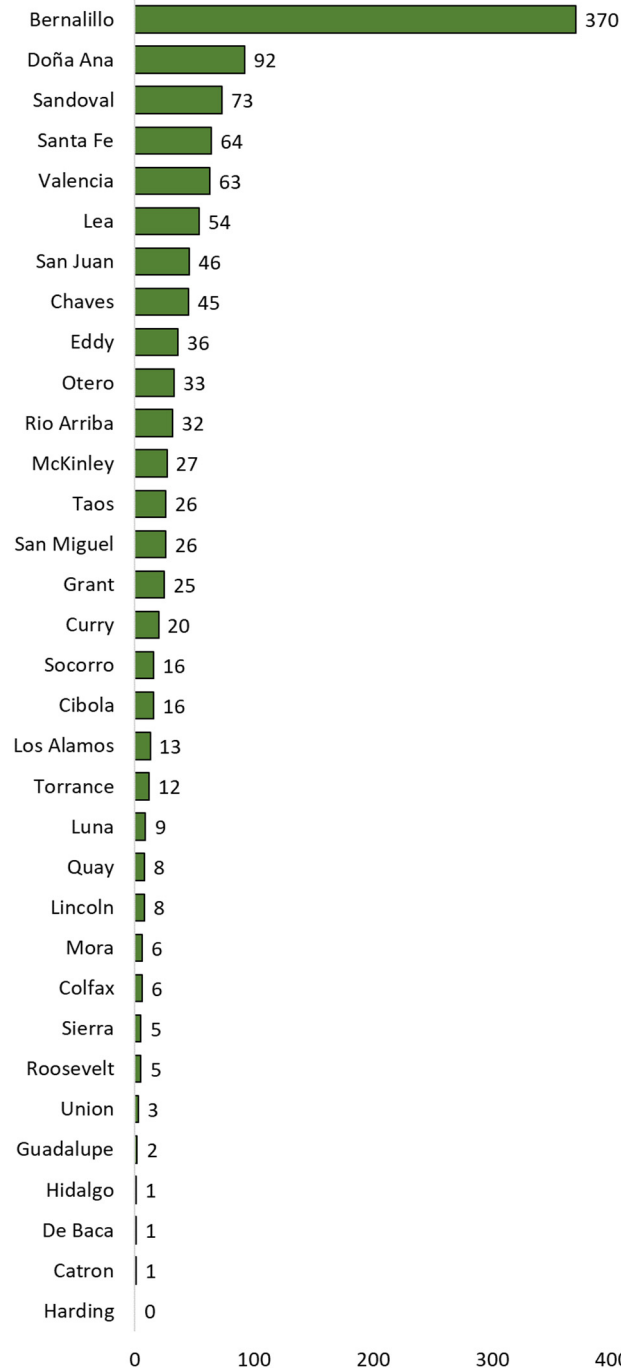
