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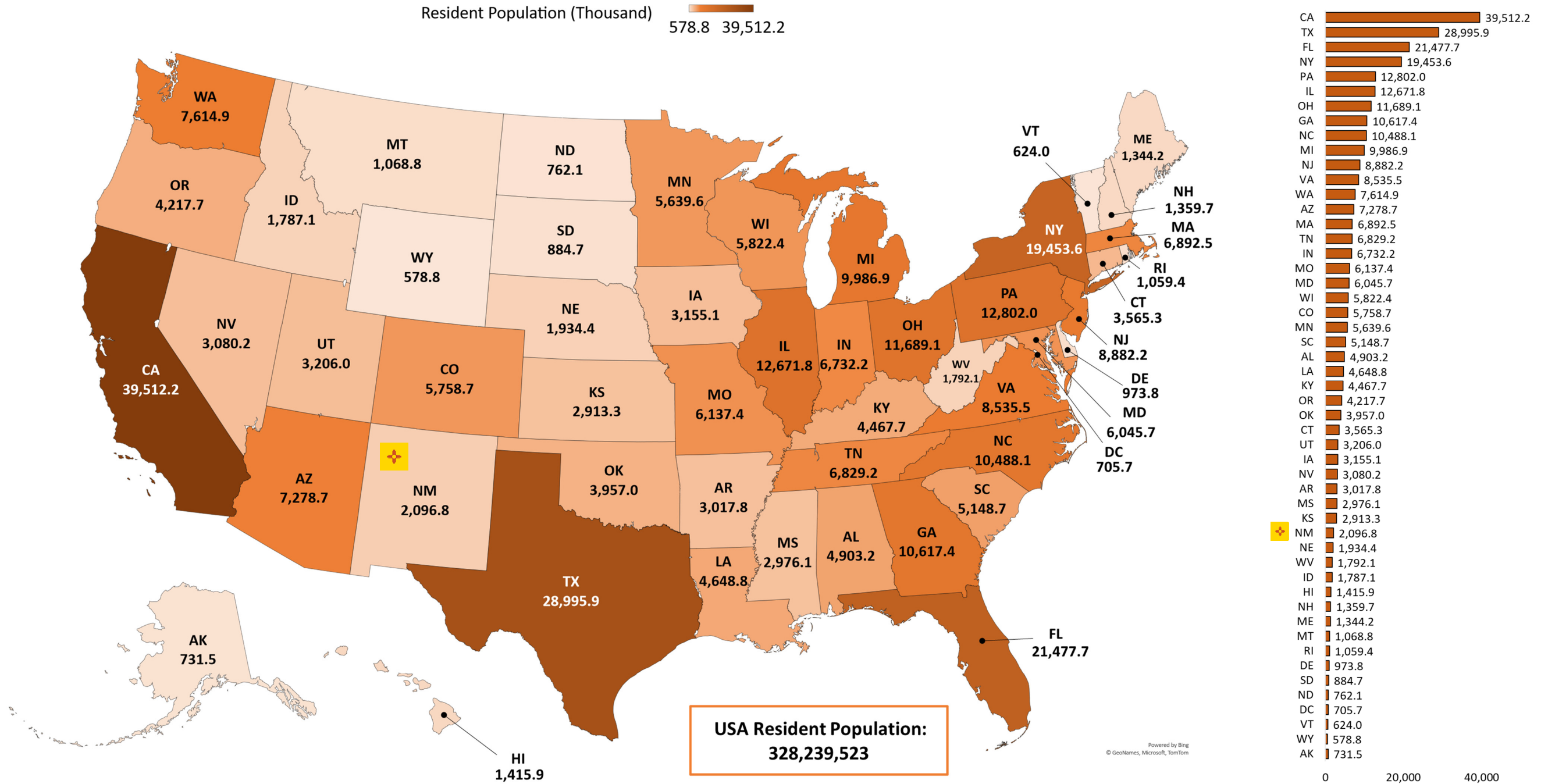

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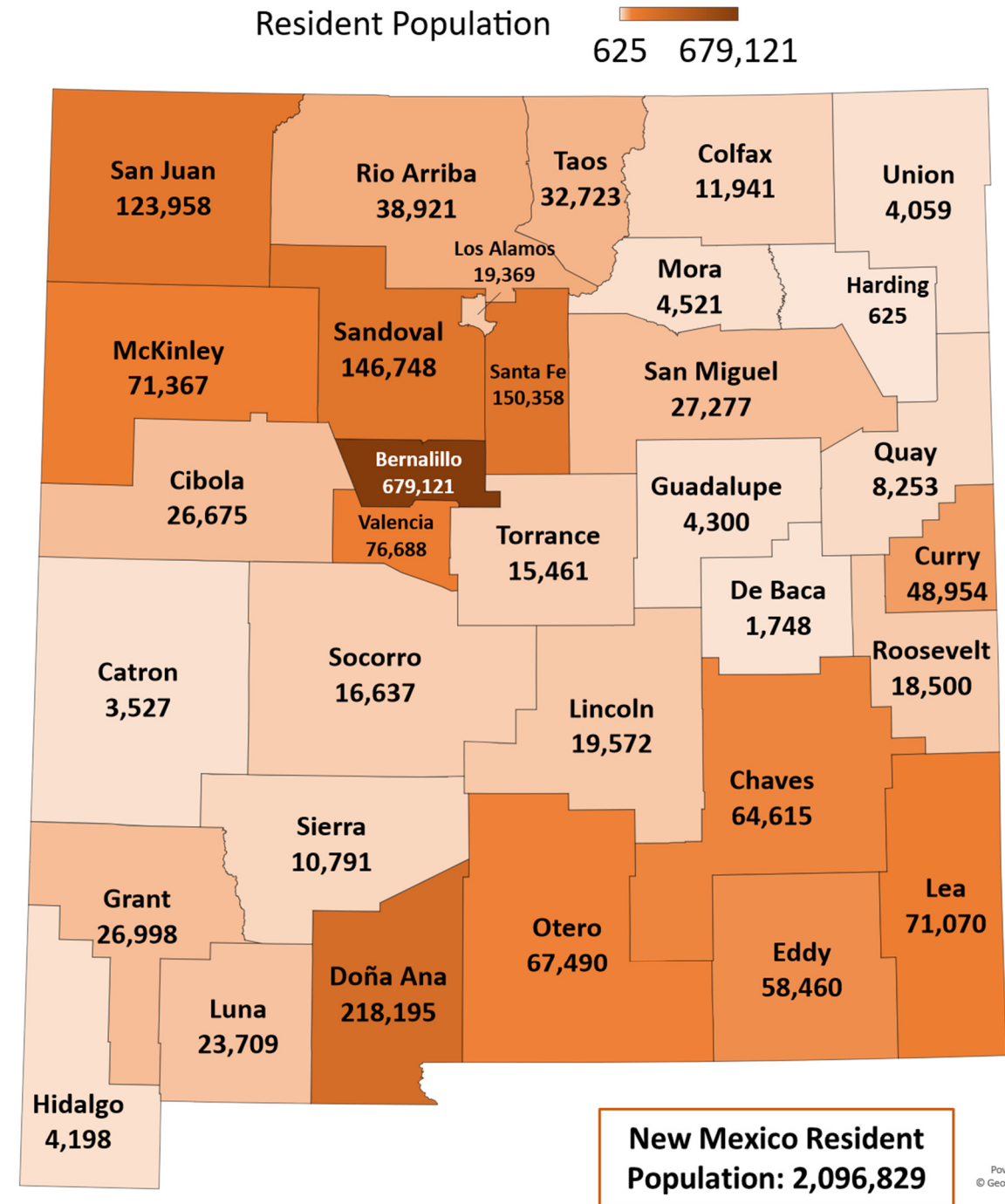
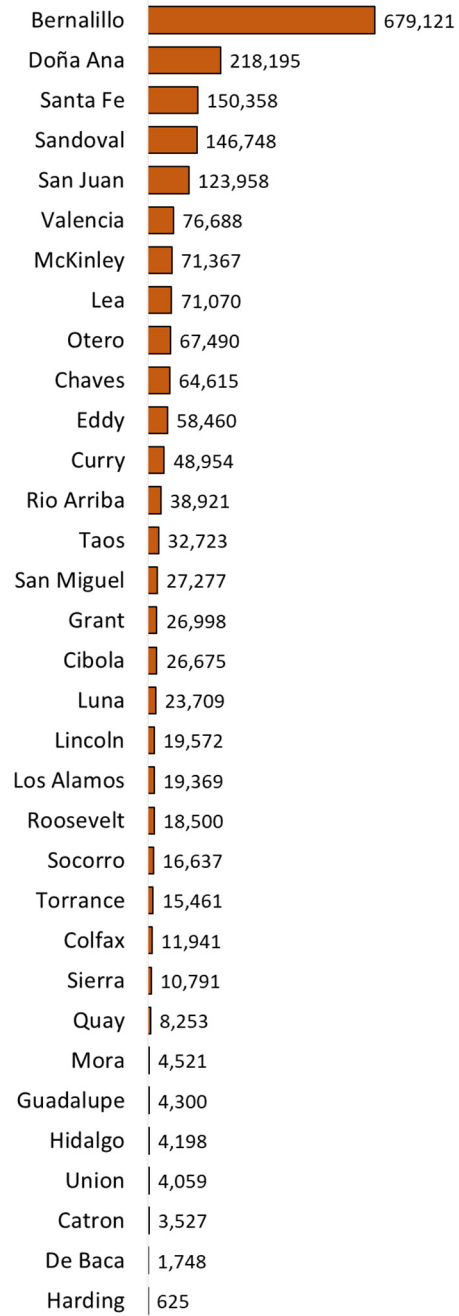

U.S. Resident Population by State as of 2019



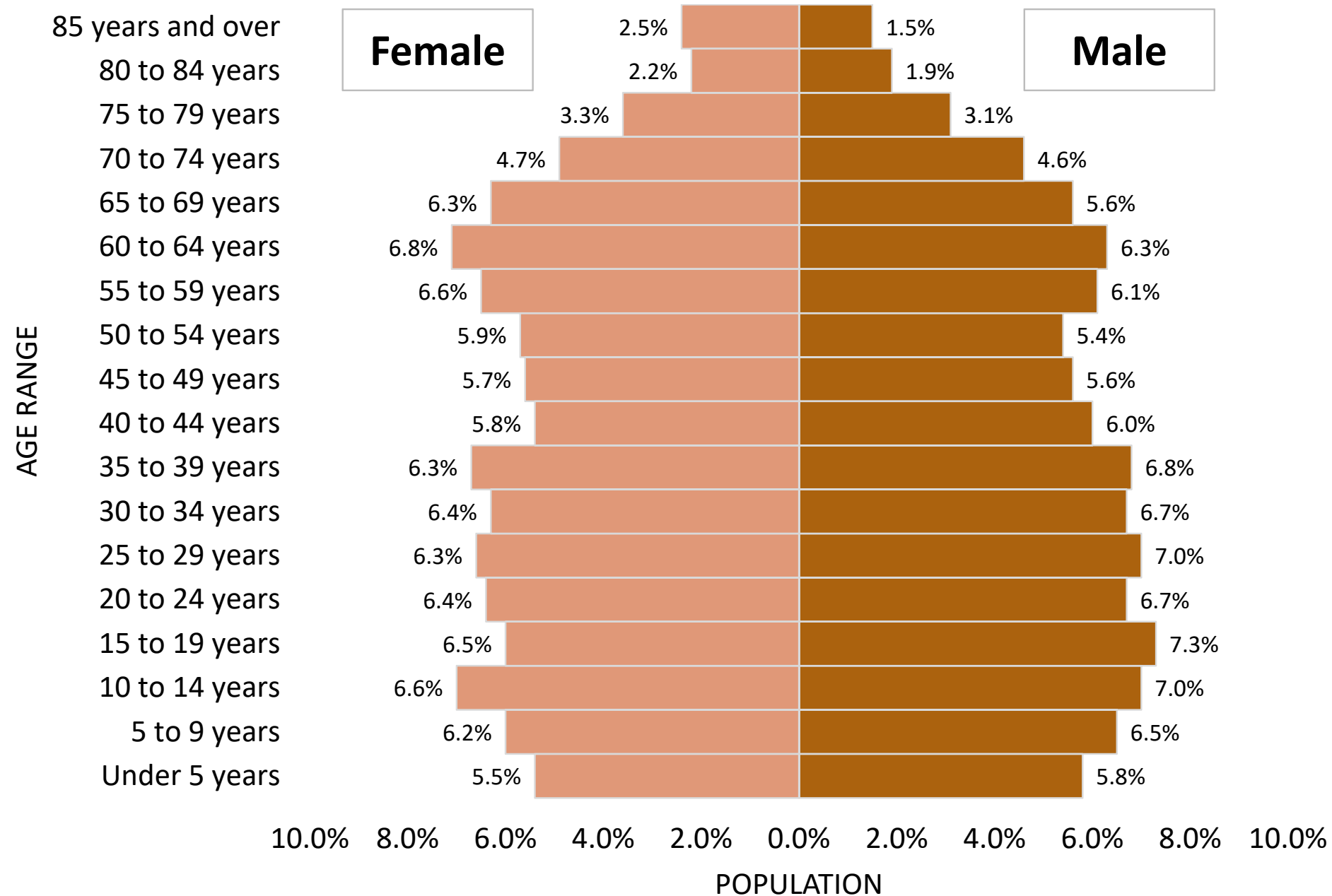

New Mexico Resident Population by County as of 2019



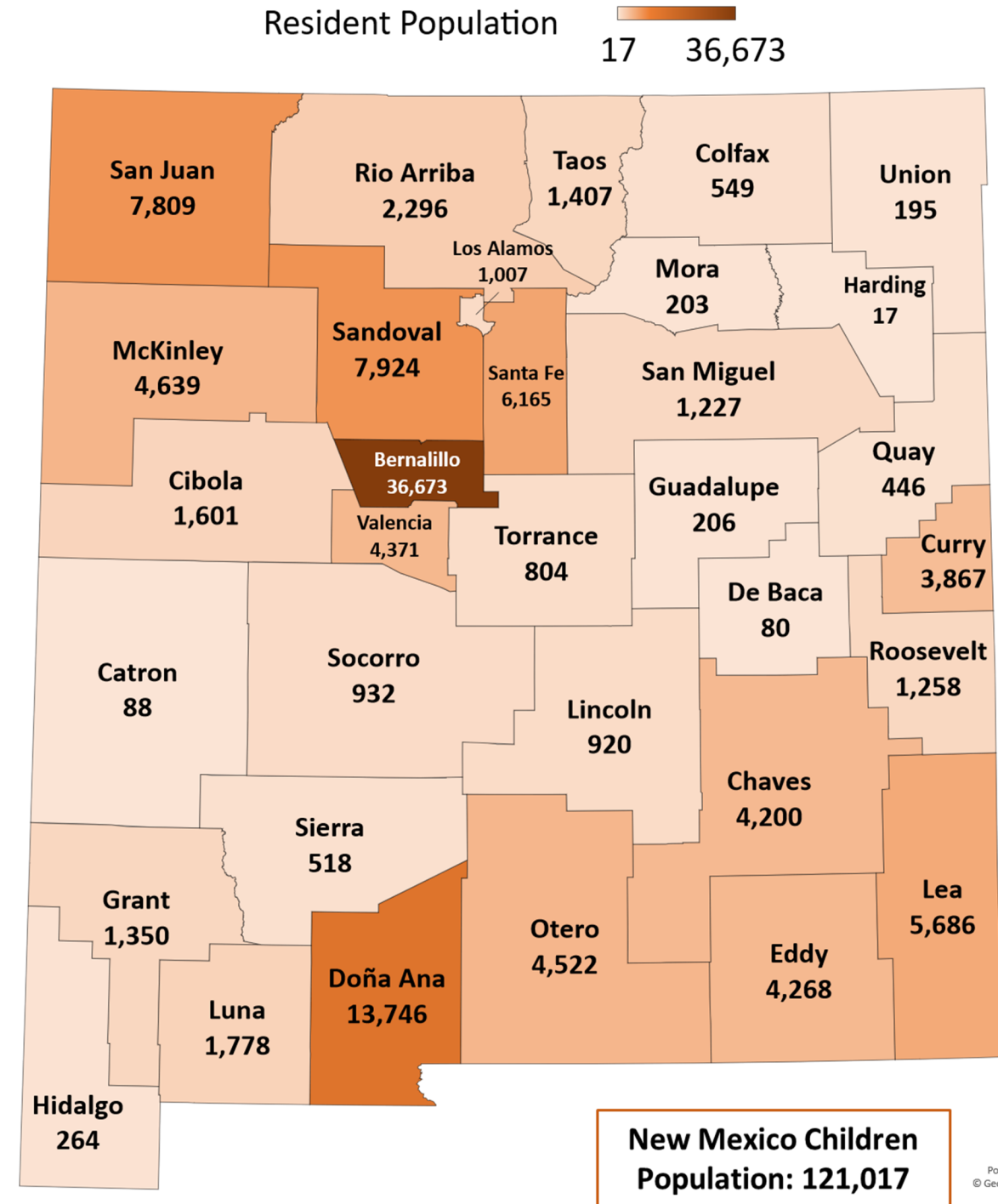
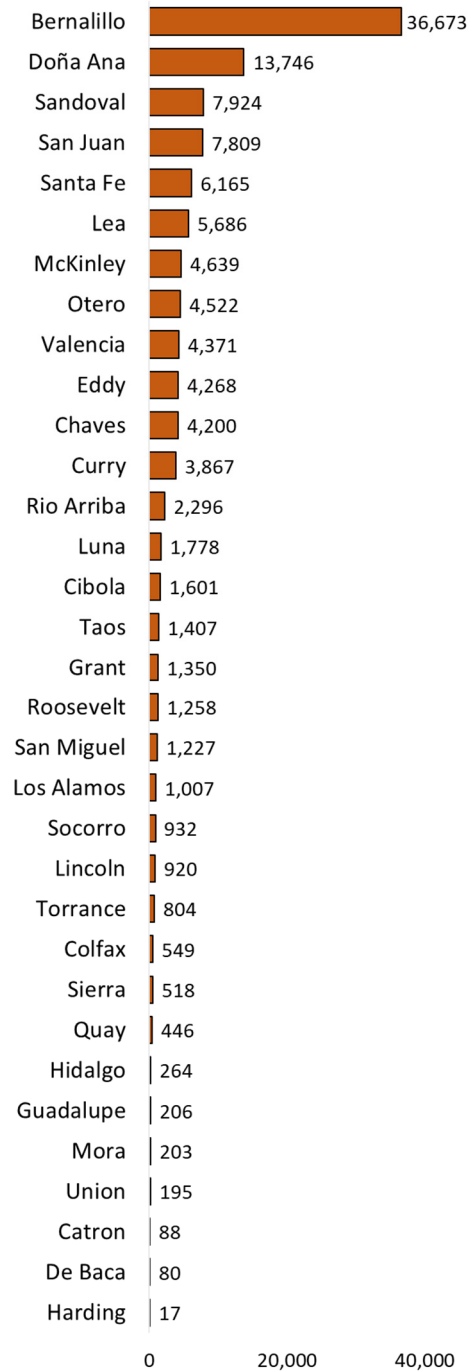

New Mexico Population by Age and Gender as a Percent of Total Population as of 2019



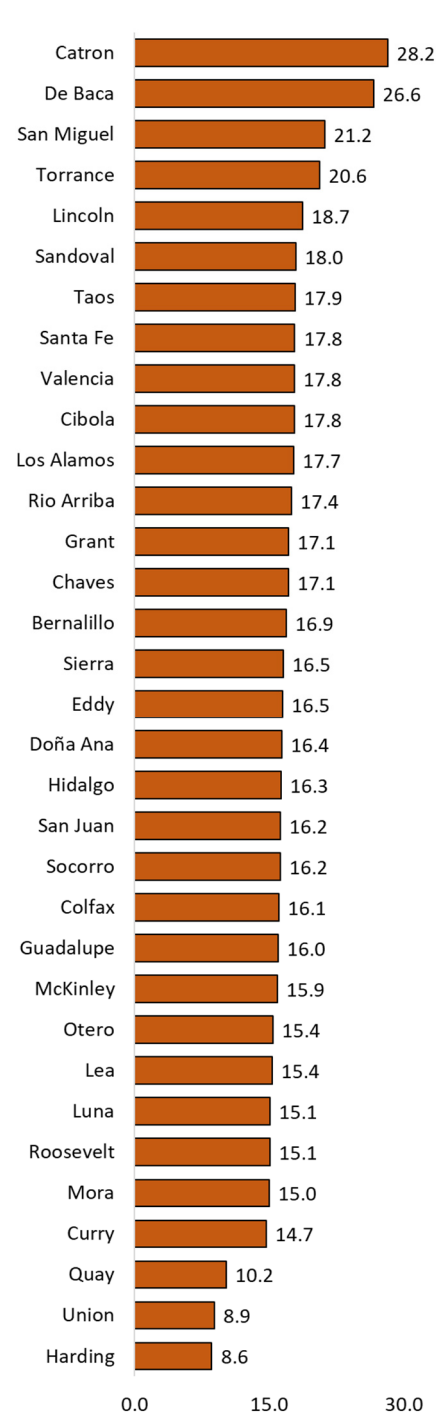

New Mexico Children (Under 5 Years) Resident Population by County as of 2019

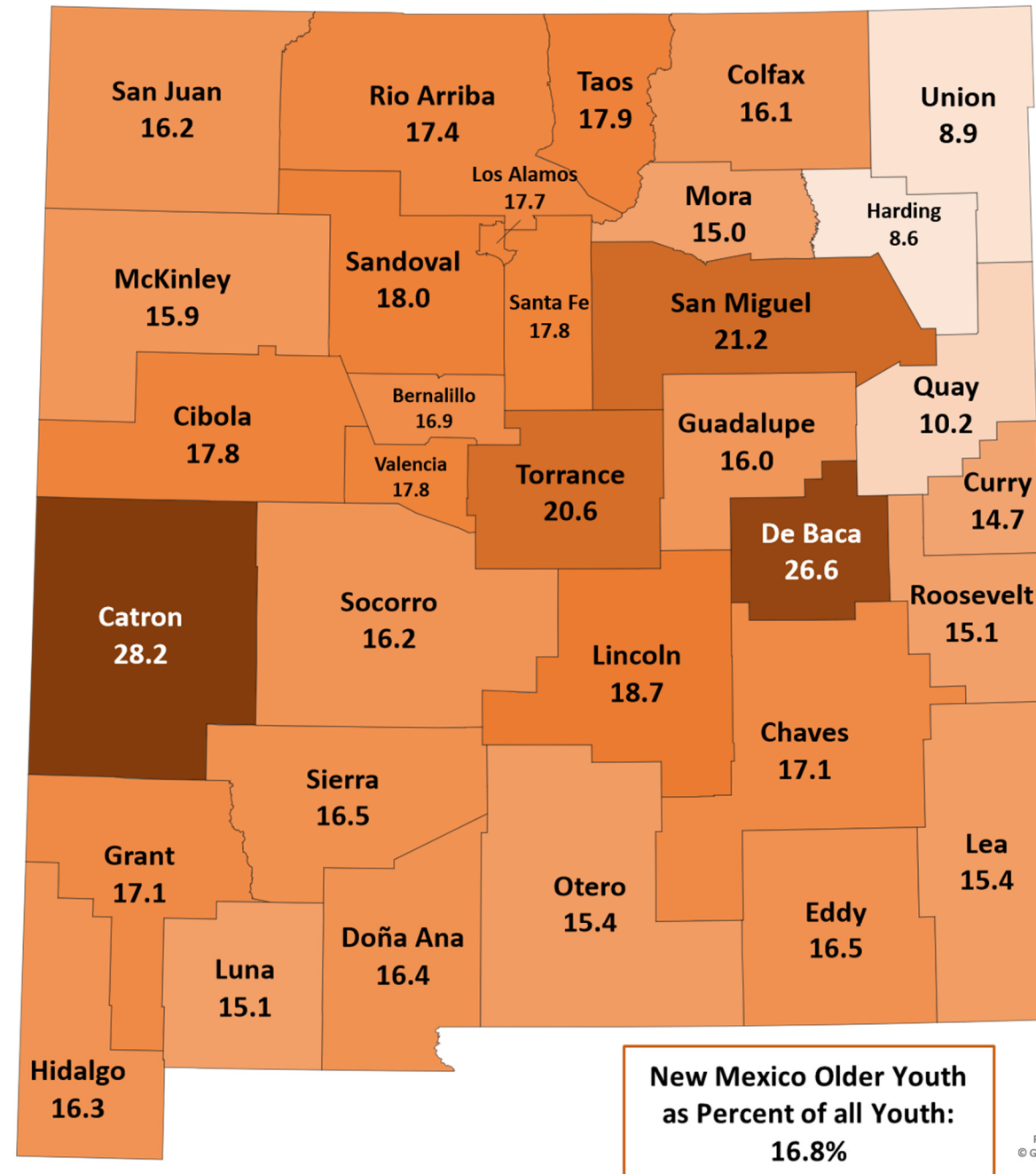

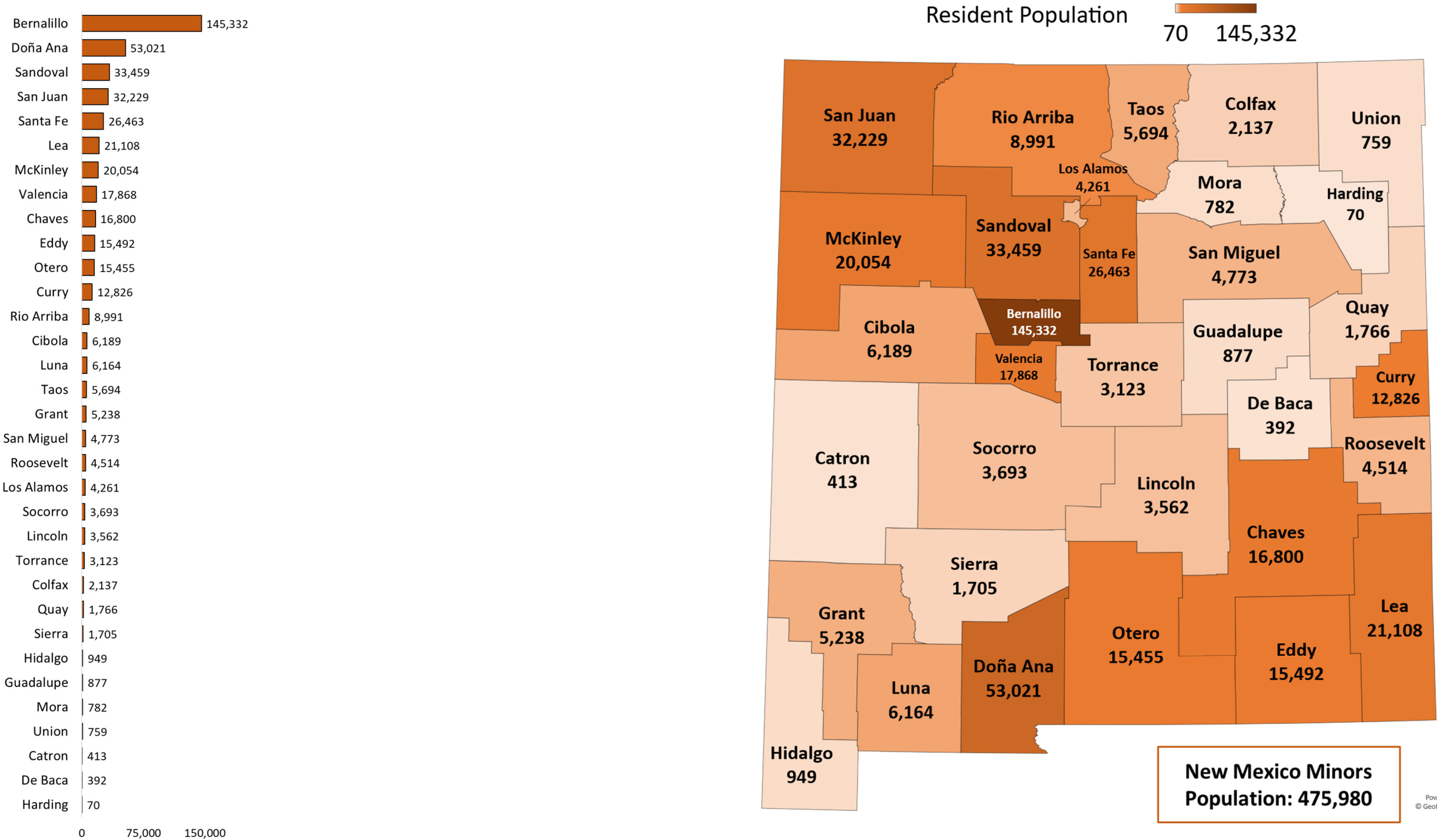

New Mexico Minors (Under 18 Years) Resident Population by County as of 2019



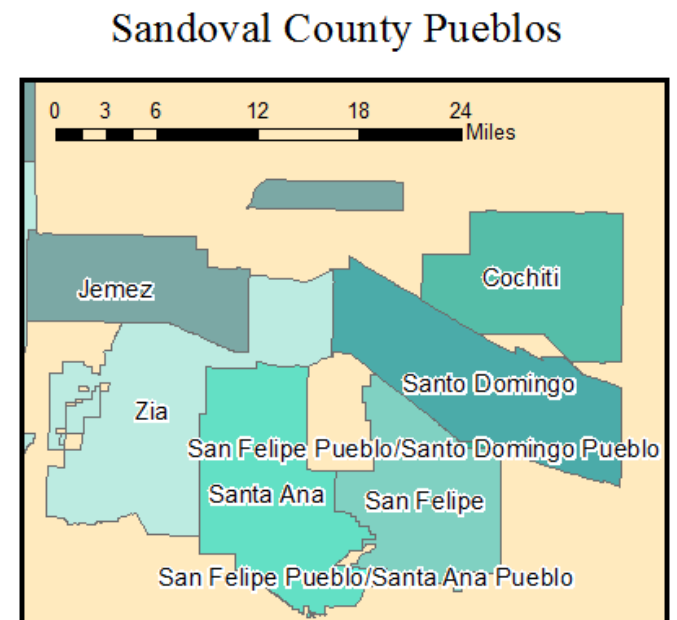
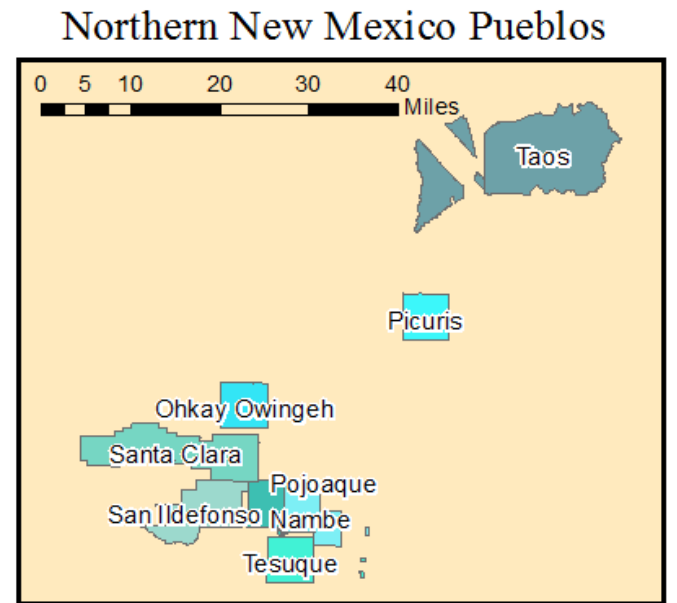
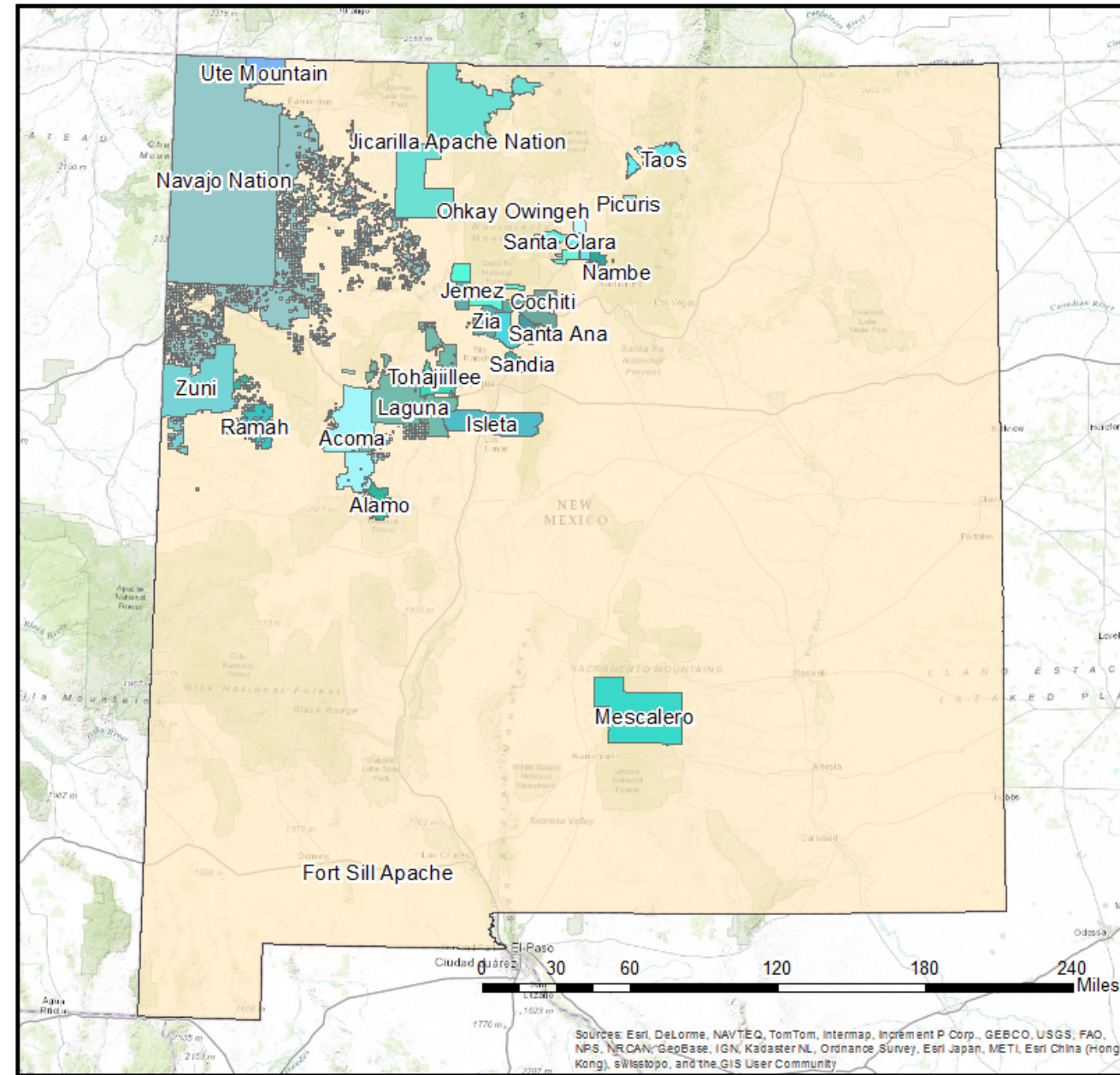
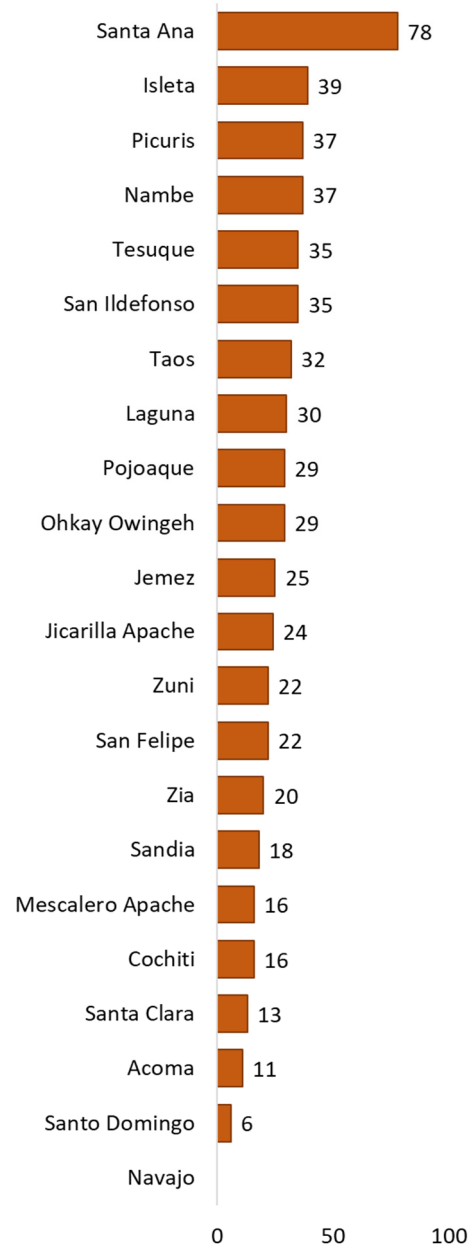

New Mexico Number of Native American Elders (50+ Years) by Tribe, Nation and Pueblo as Percentage of Total Population, 2017-2020

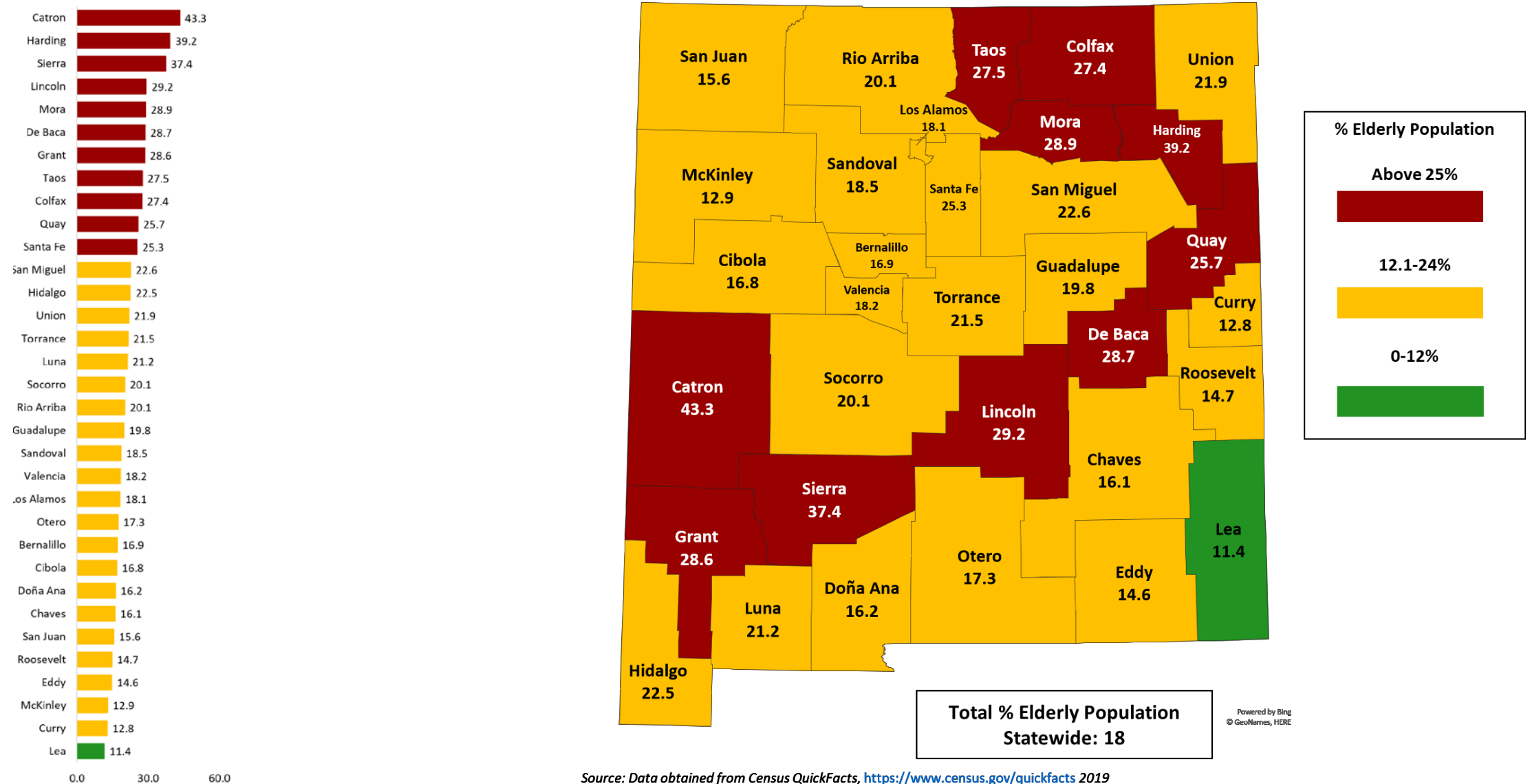

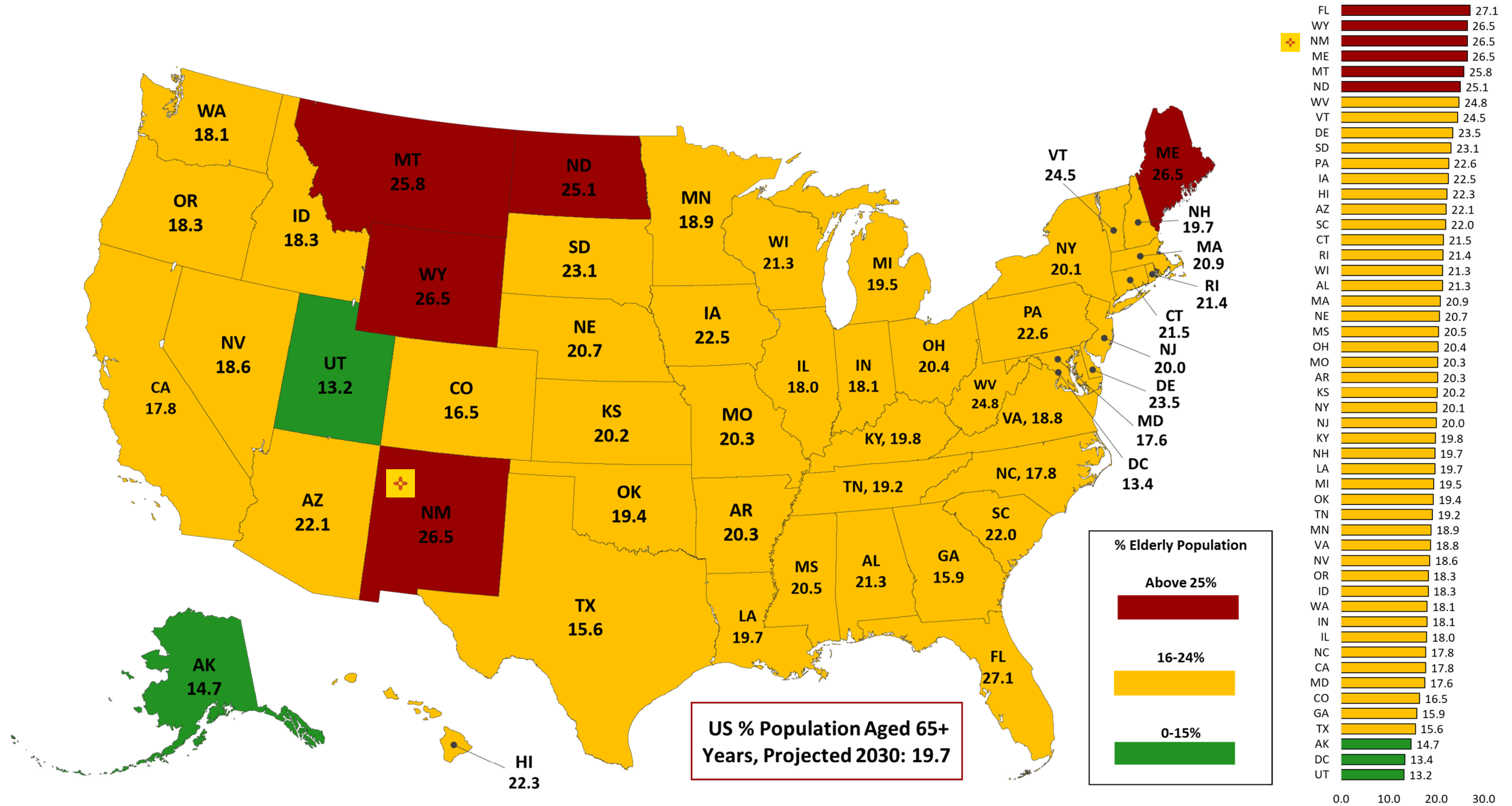
Percent Elderly (65+ Years) Resident Population by County as of 2019

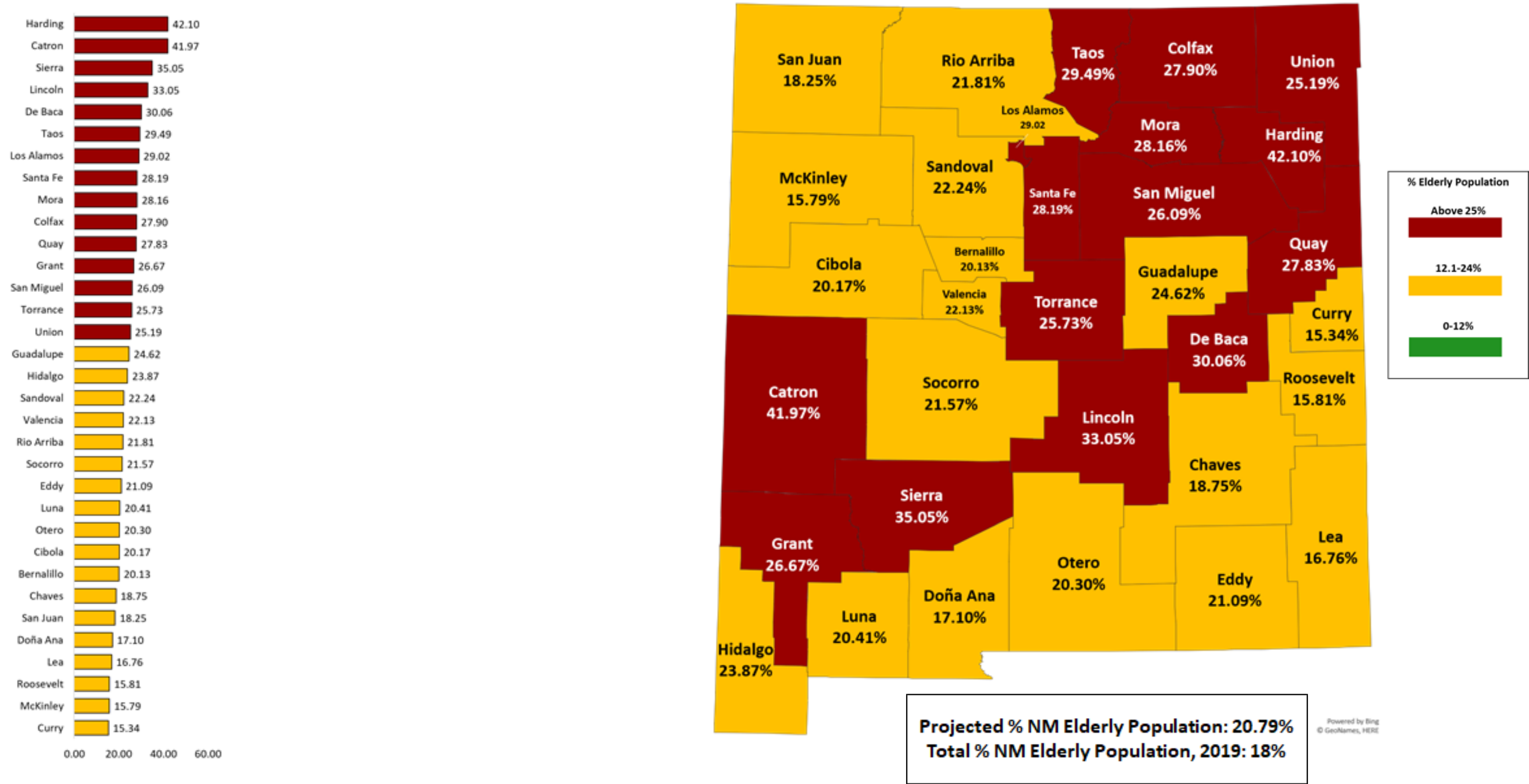

U.S. Projected Percent Elderly (65+ Years) Resident Population by State, 2030



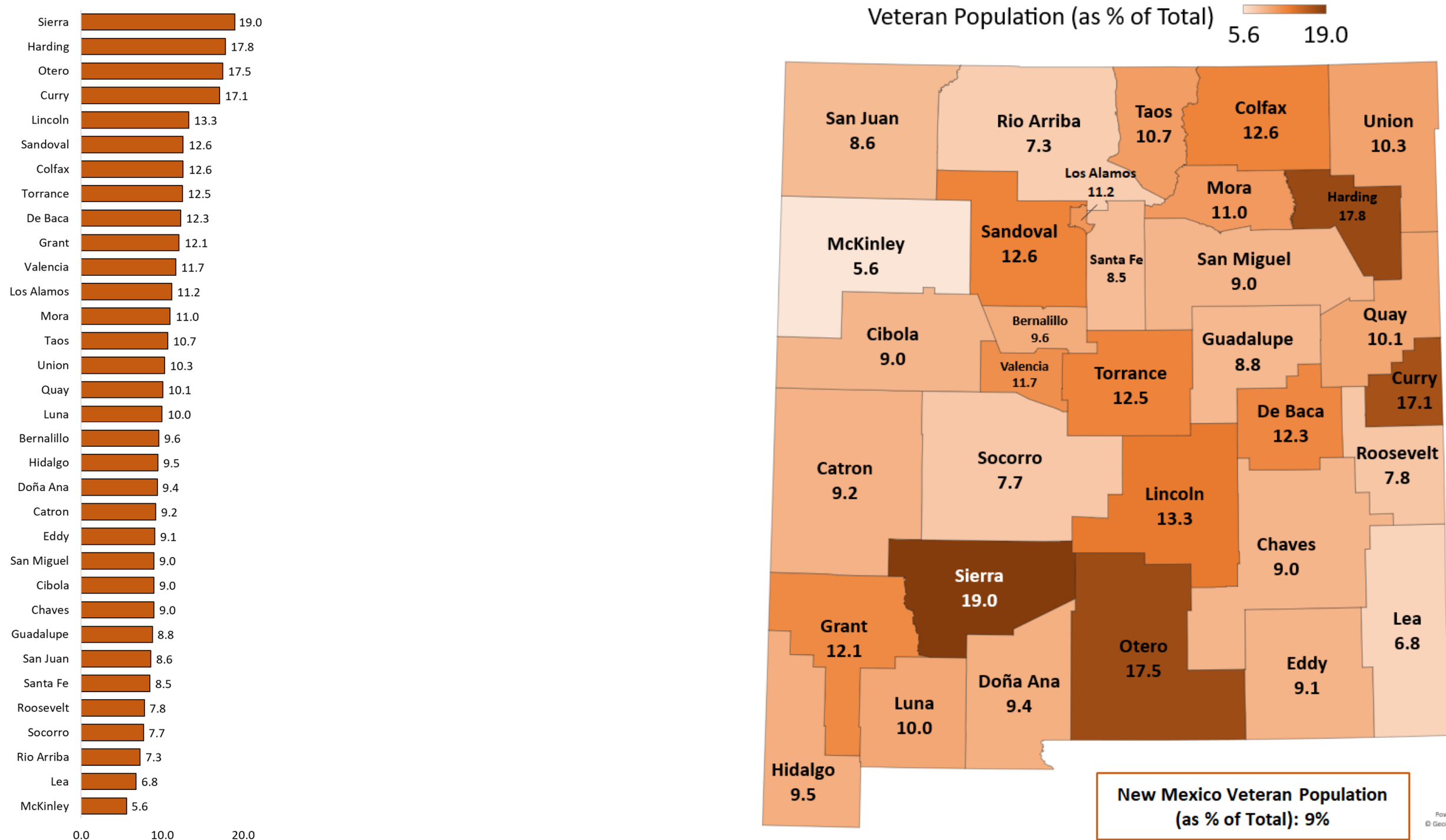

New Mexico Projected Percent Elderly (65+ Years) Resident Population by County, 2030



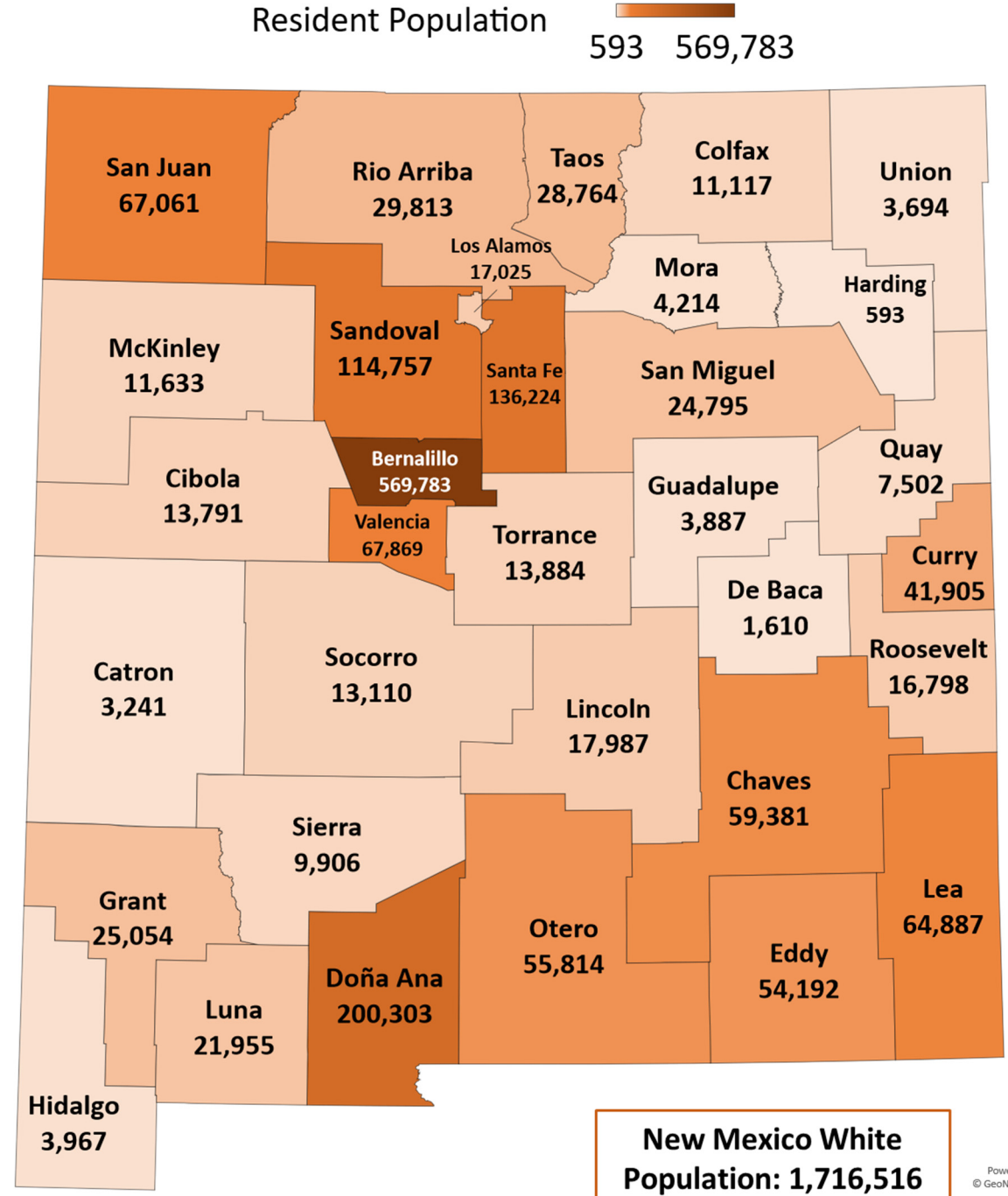
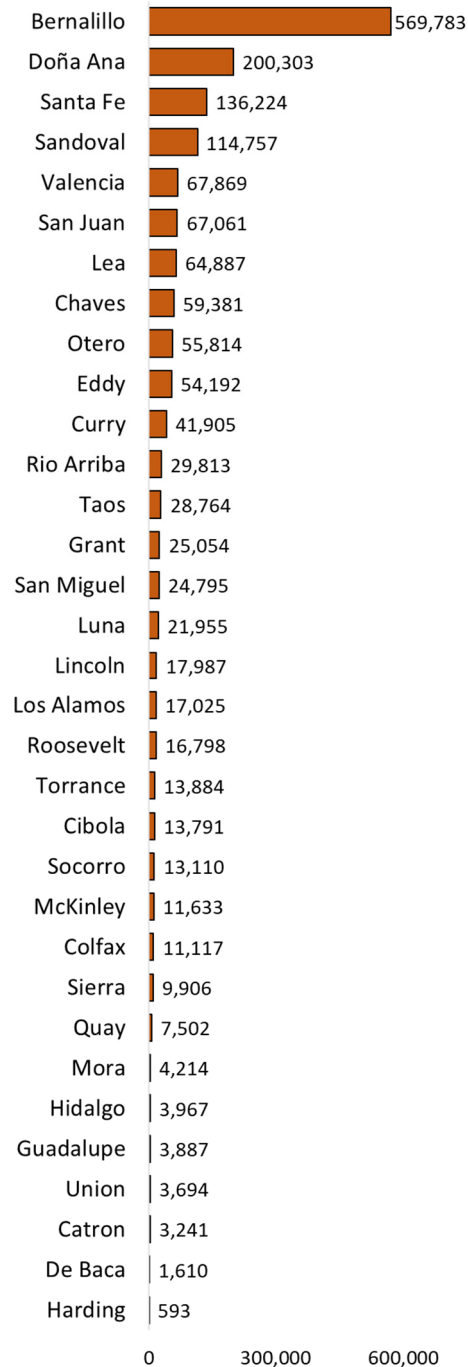

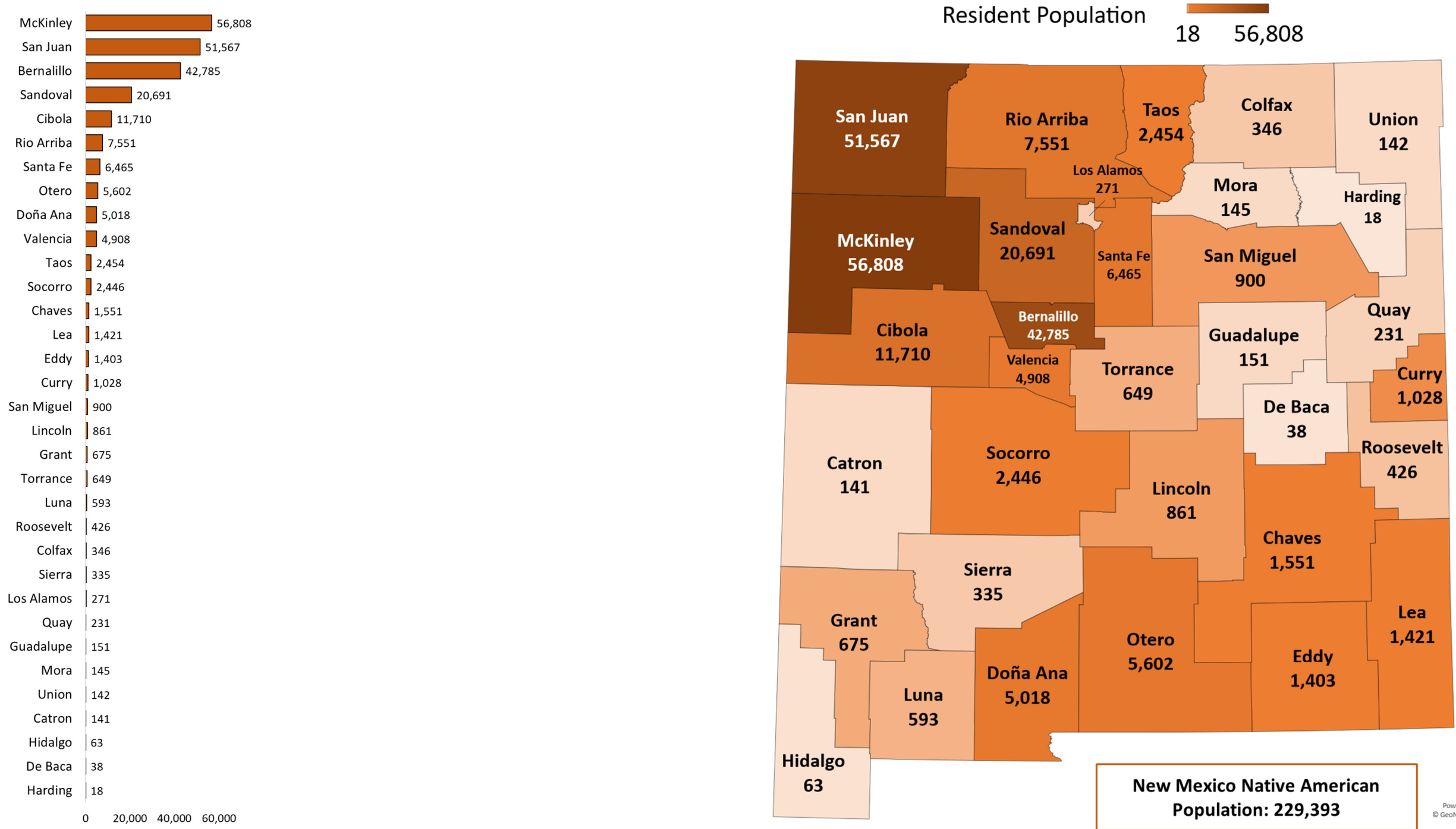

New Mexico Native American Resident Population by County as of 2019



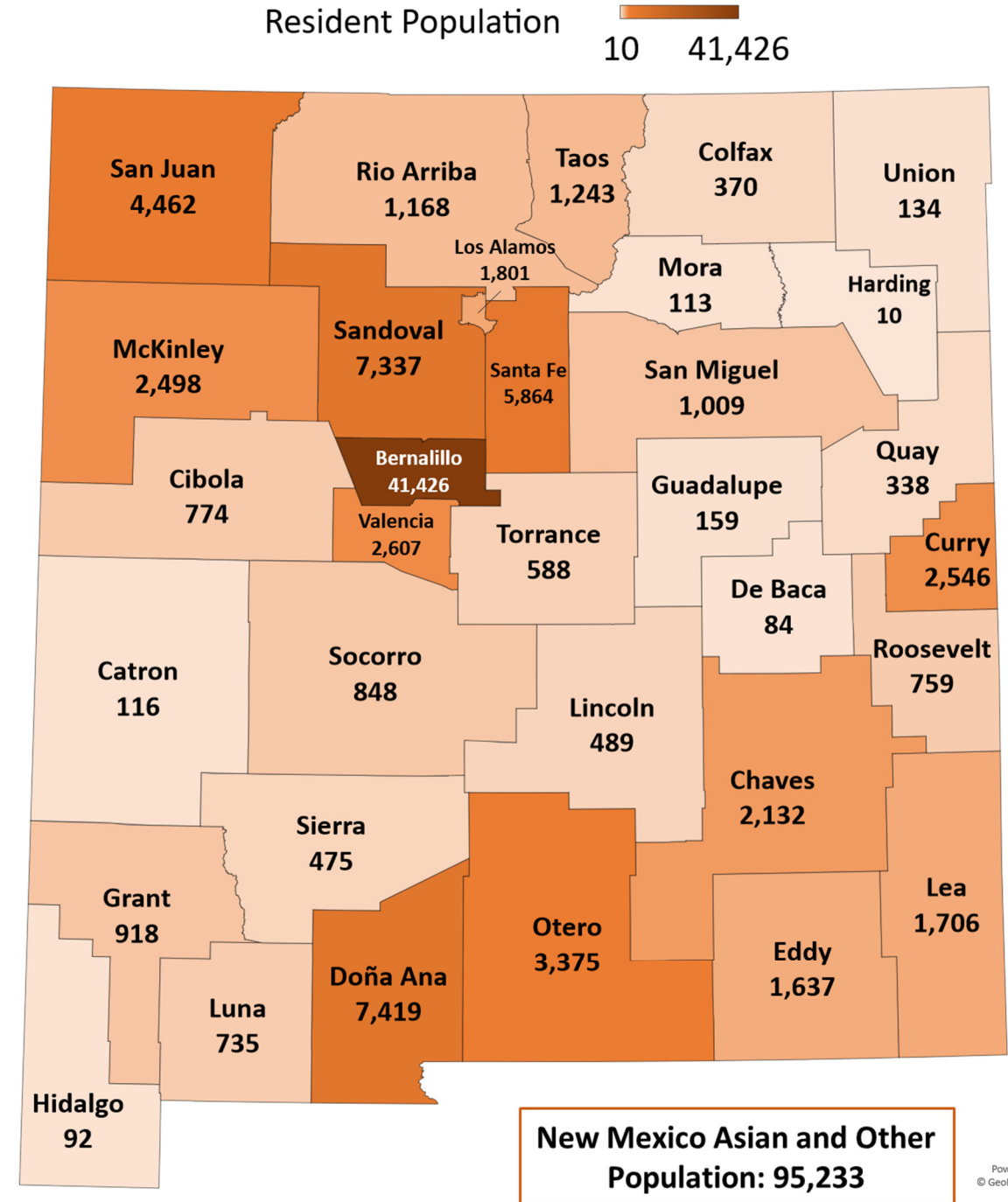
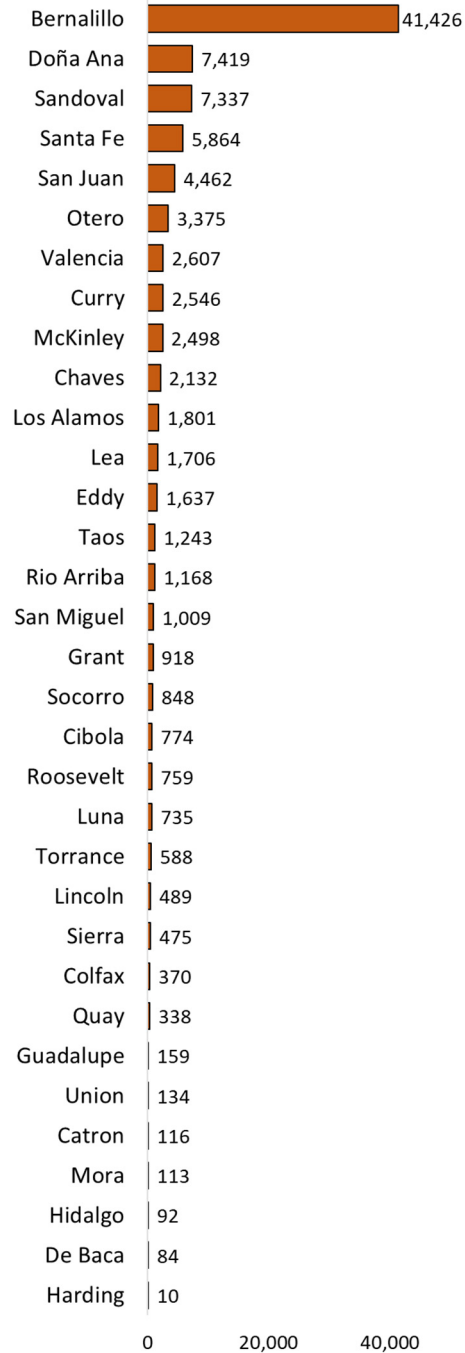

New Mexico Black/African American Resident Population by County as of 2019



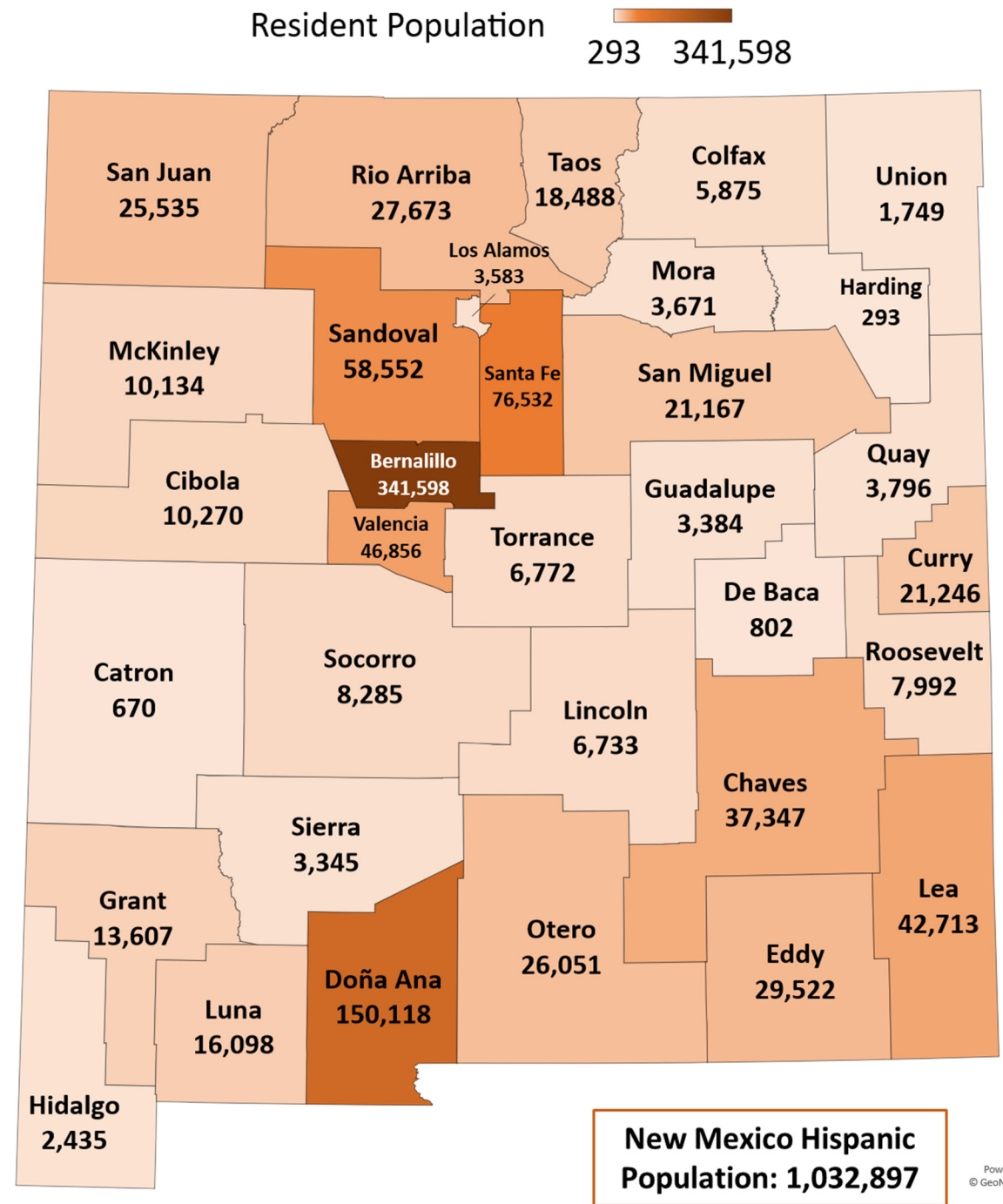
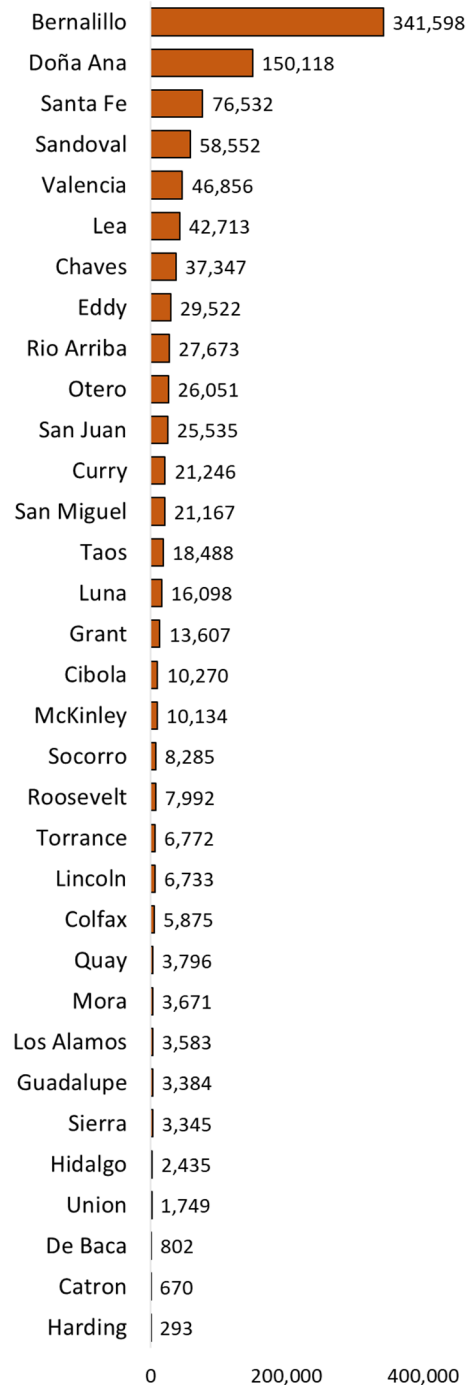

New Mexico Asian, Pacific Islander and Other Race Resident Population by County as of 2019



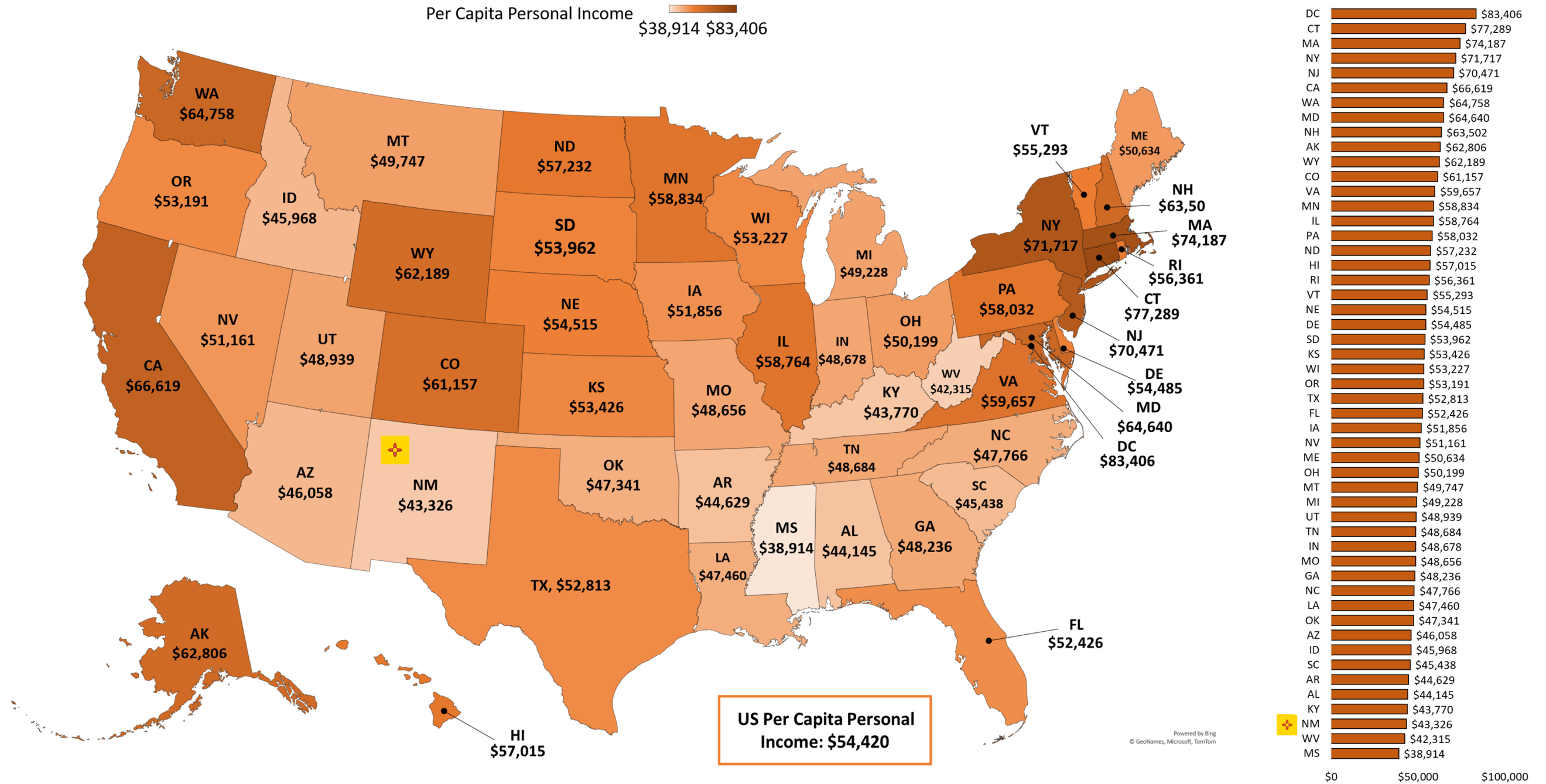

New Mexico Hispanic/Latino Resident Population by County as of 2019



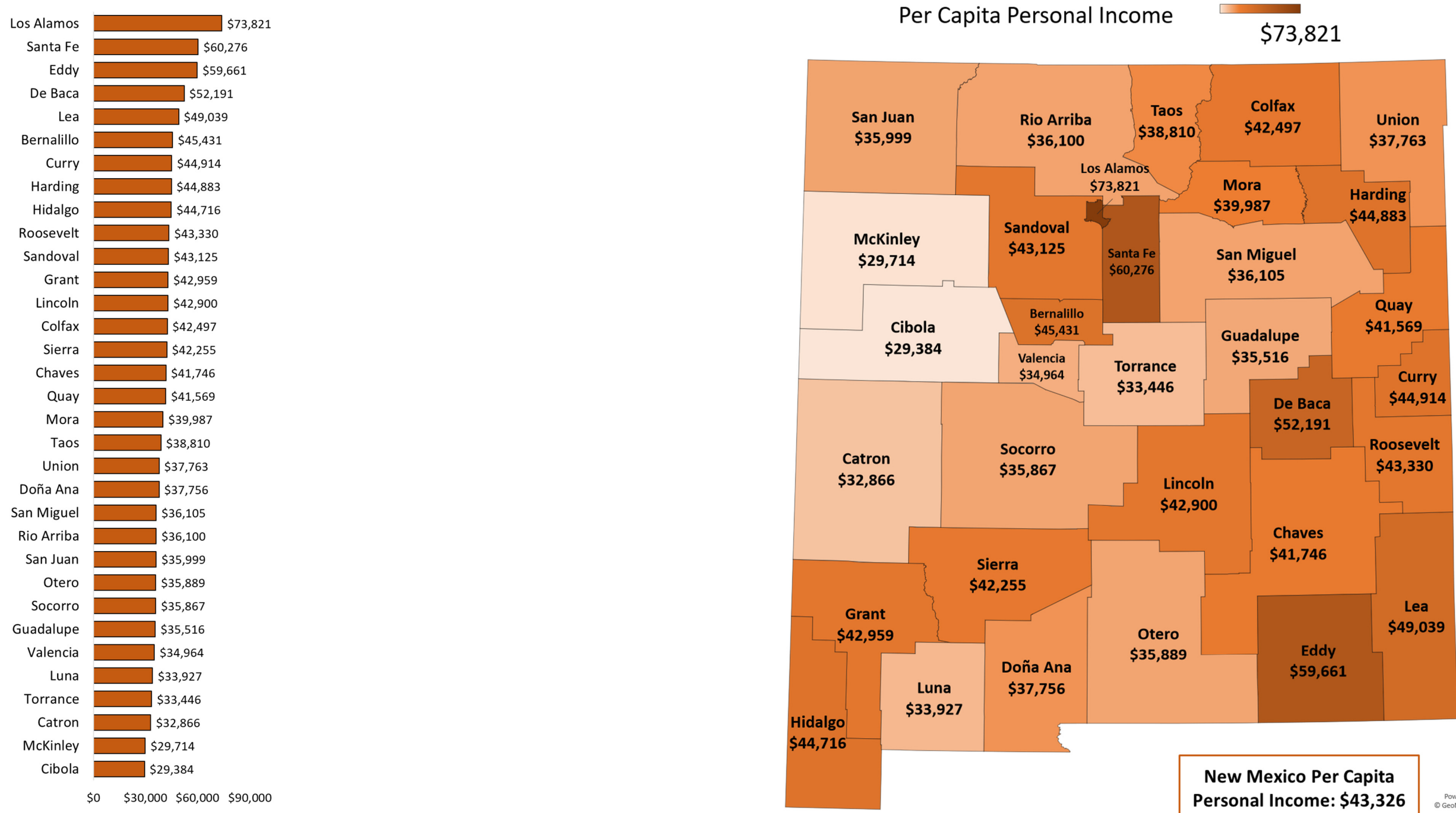

U.S. Per Capita Personal Income by State as of 2019



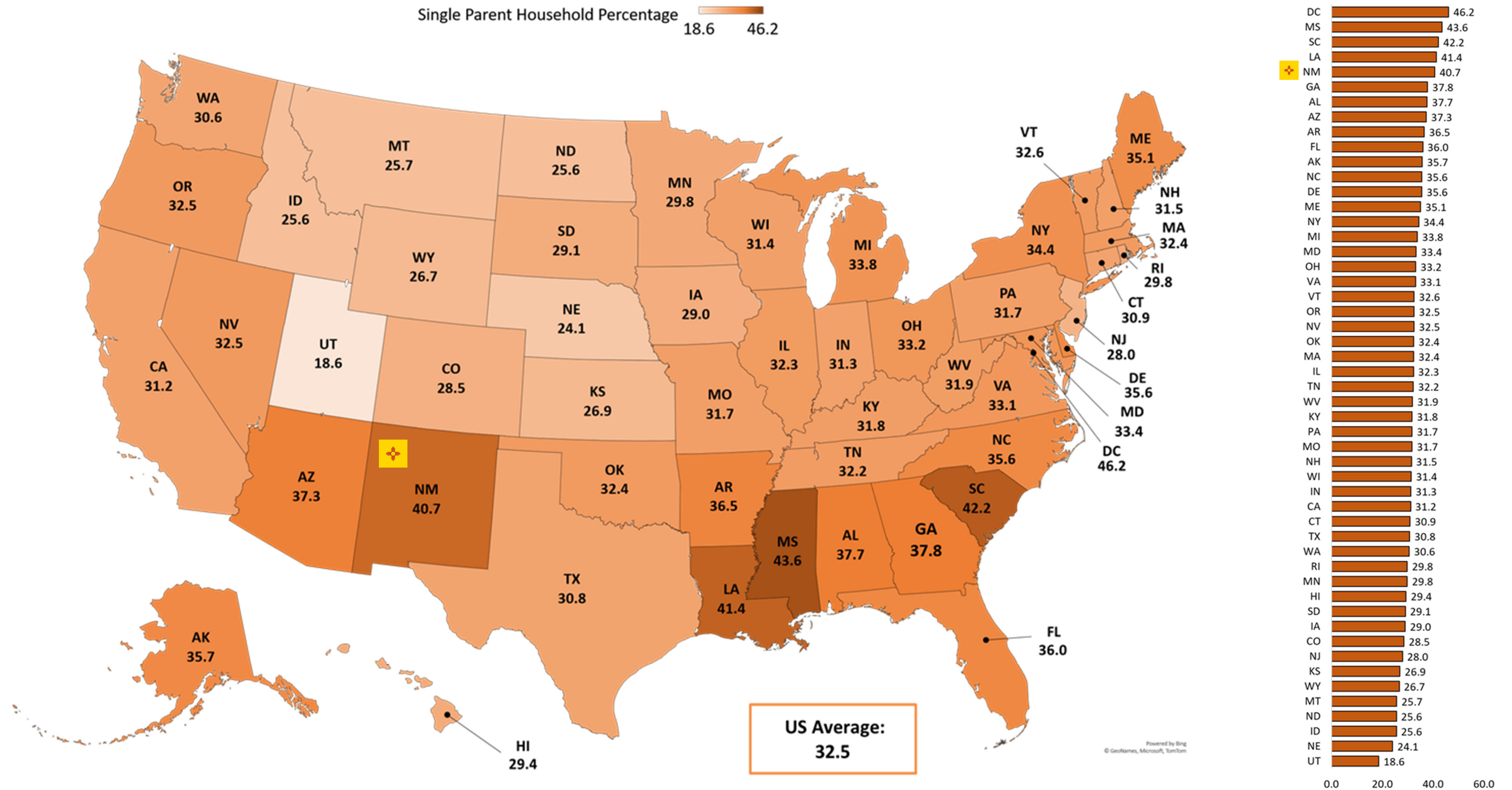

New Mexico Per Capita Personal Income by County as of 2019



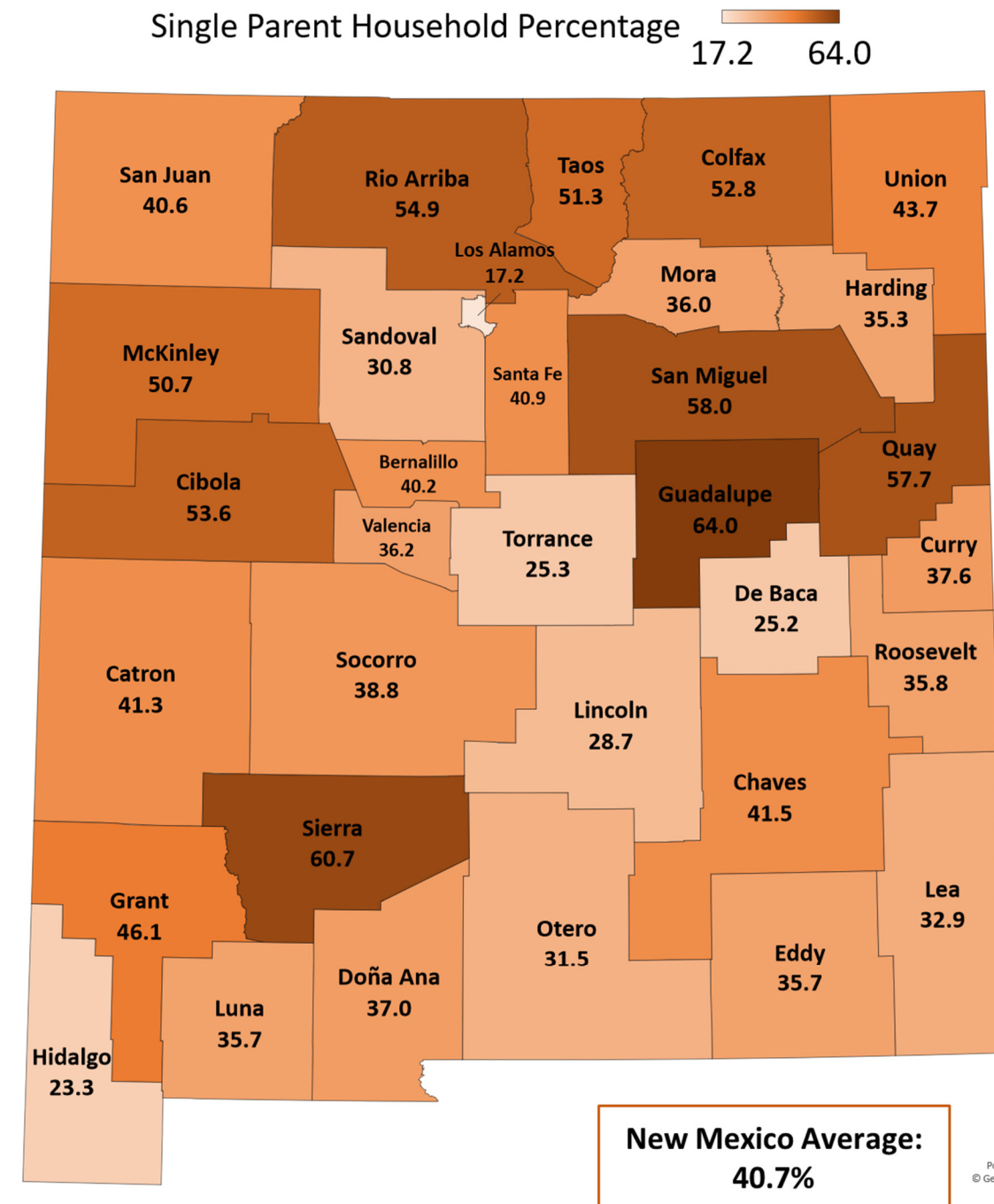
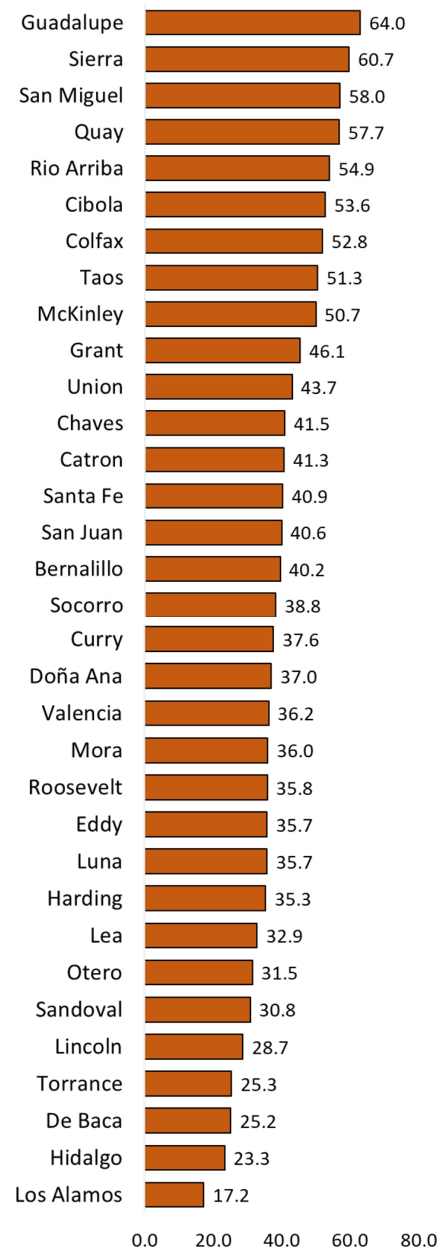

U.S. Single Parent Households with Children as a Percentage of Households with Children by State as of 2018



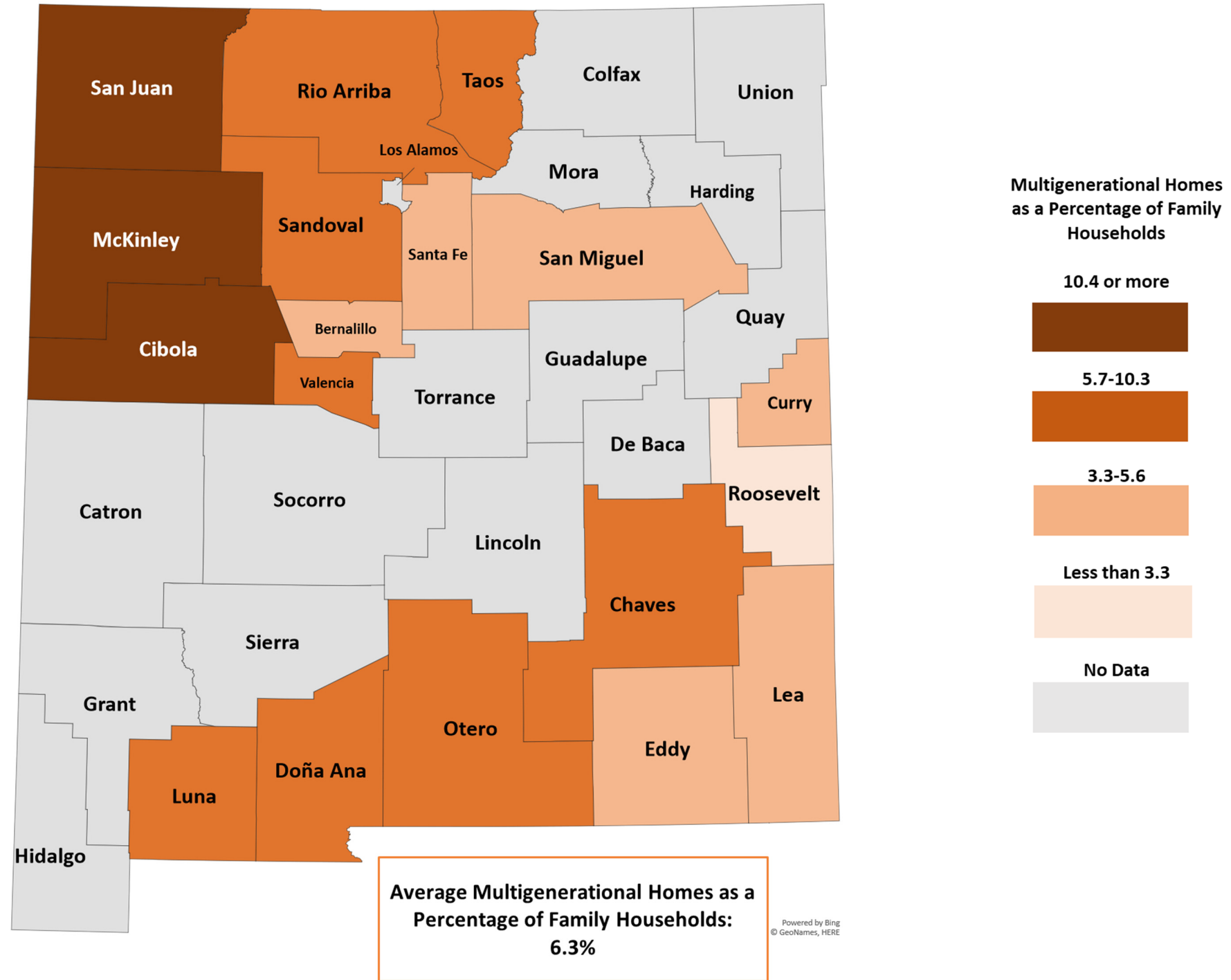

New Mexico Single Parent Households with Children as a Percentage of Households with Children by County as of 2018



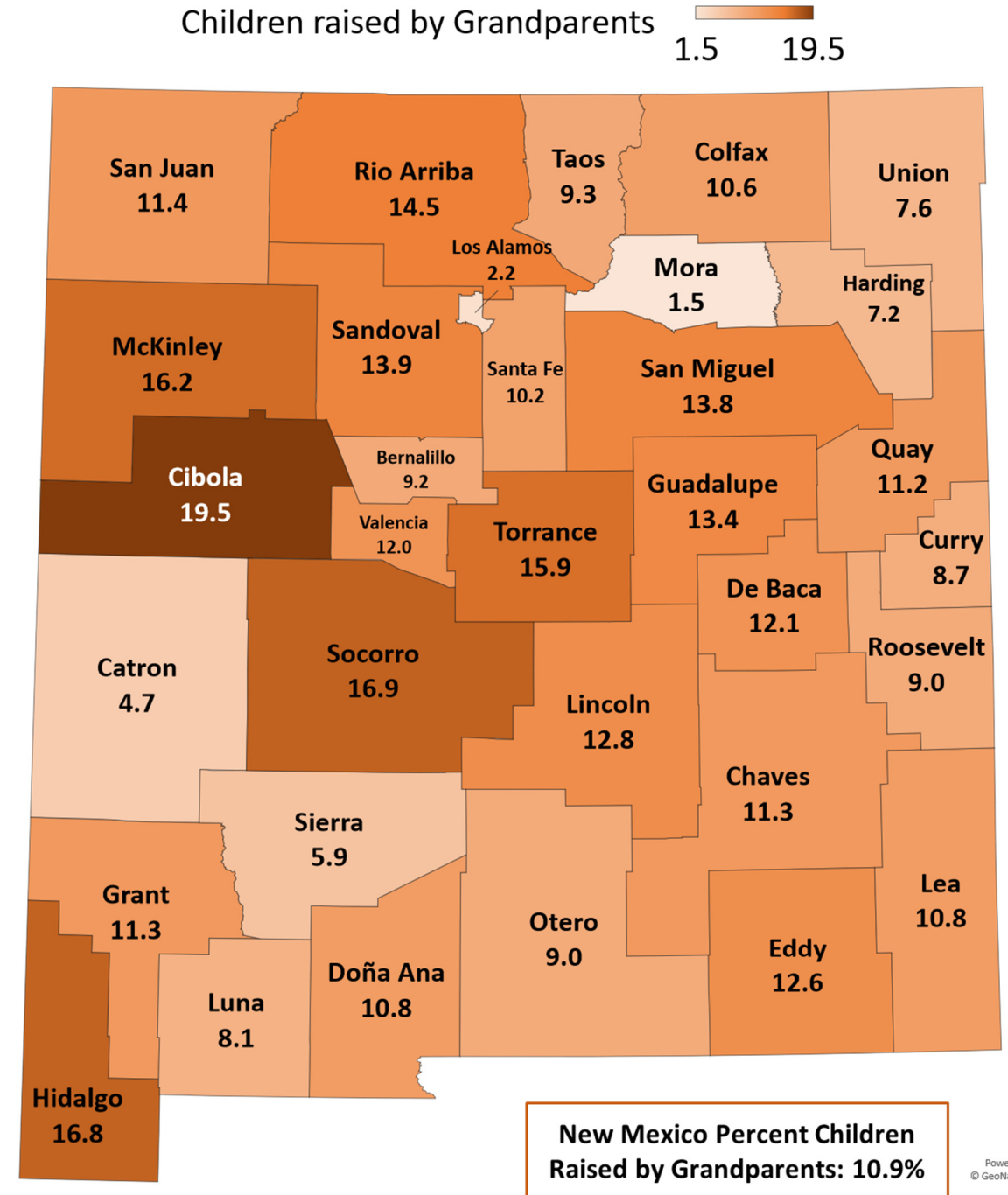
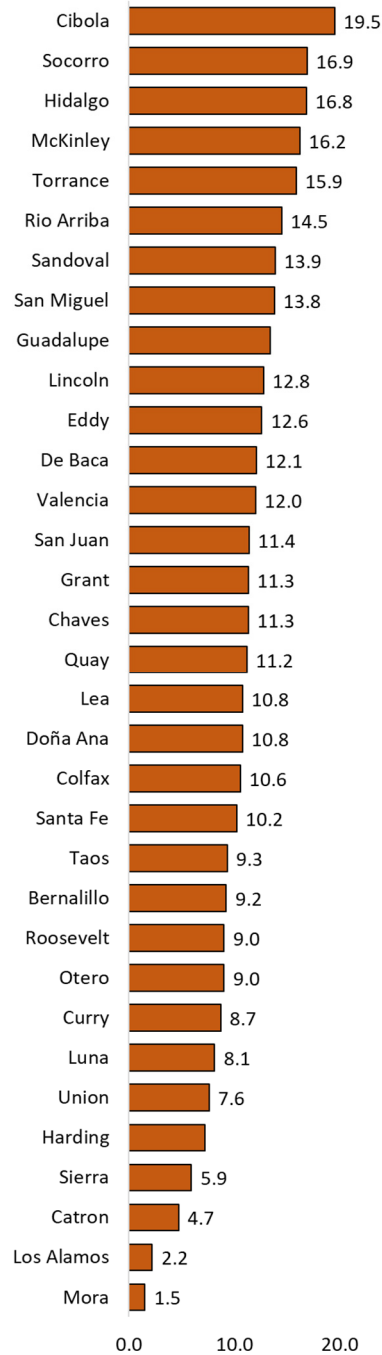

New Mexico Multigenerational Households as a Percentage of Family Households by County, 2009-2011



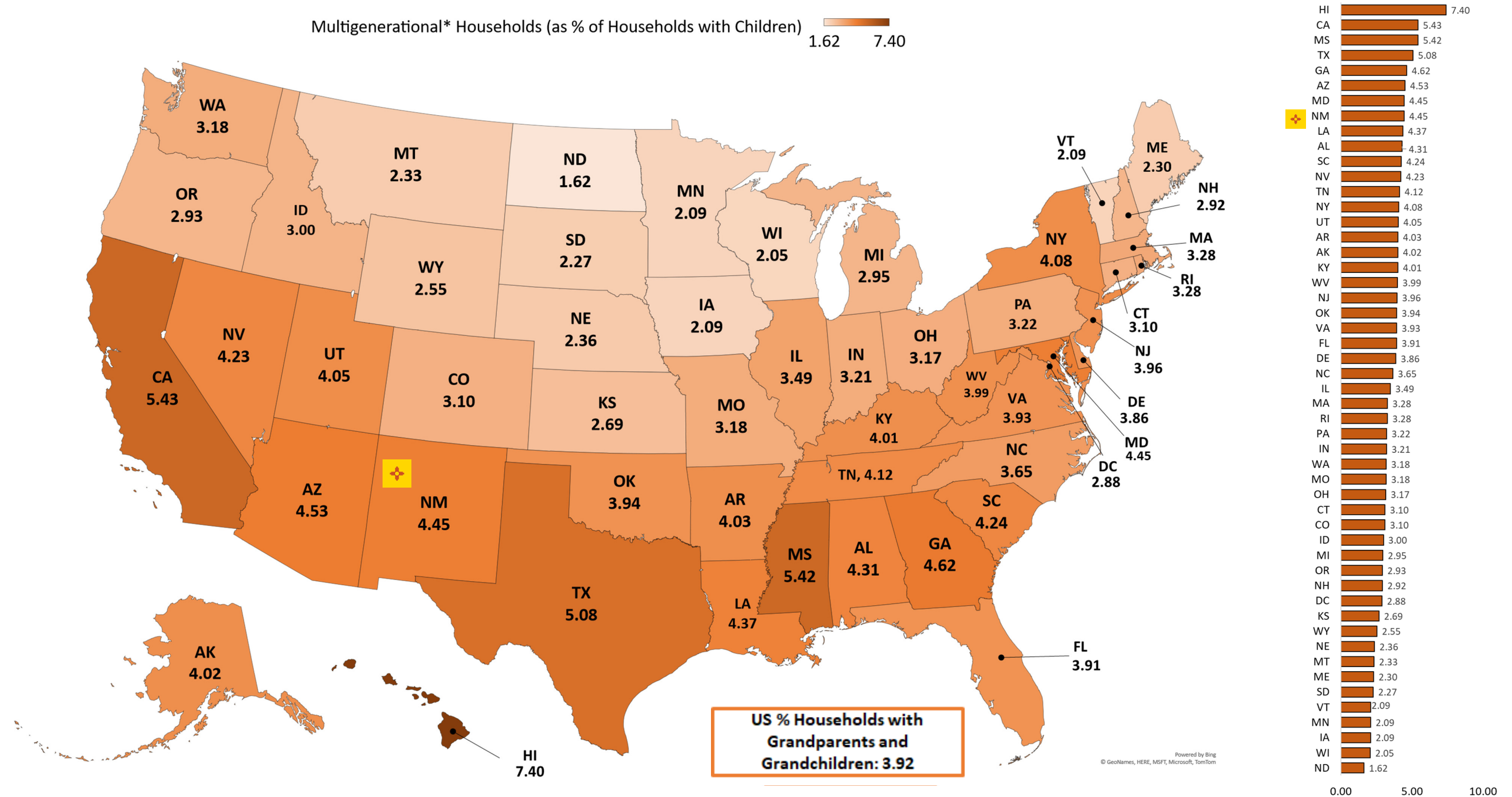

New Mexico Percentage of Children Raised by Grandparents, 2011-2015



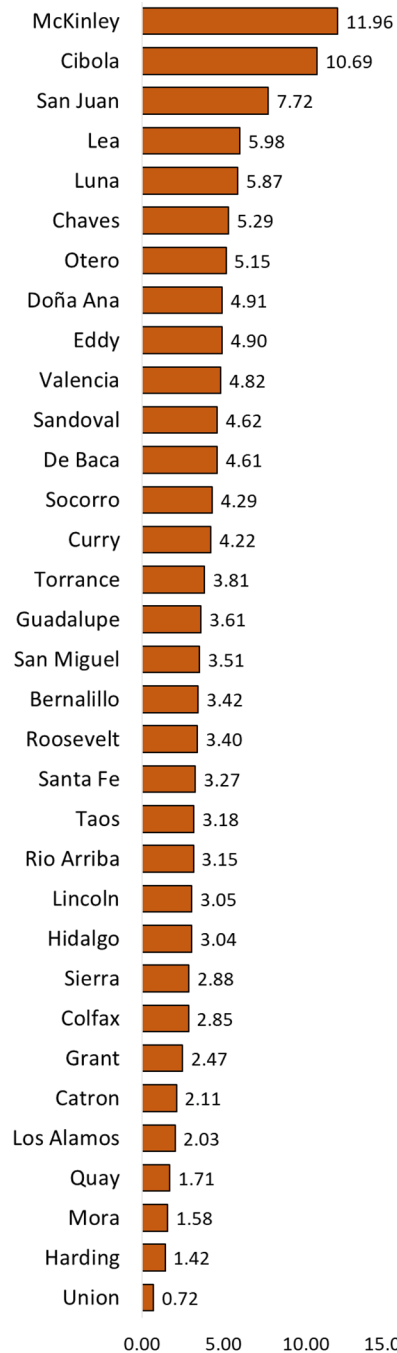

U.S. Households with Grandchildren and Grandparents as a Percentage of Households with Children as of 2019

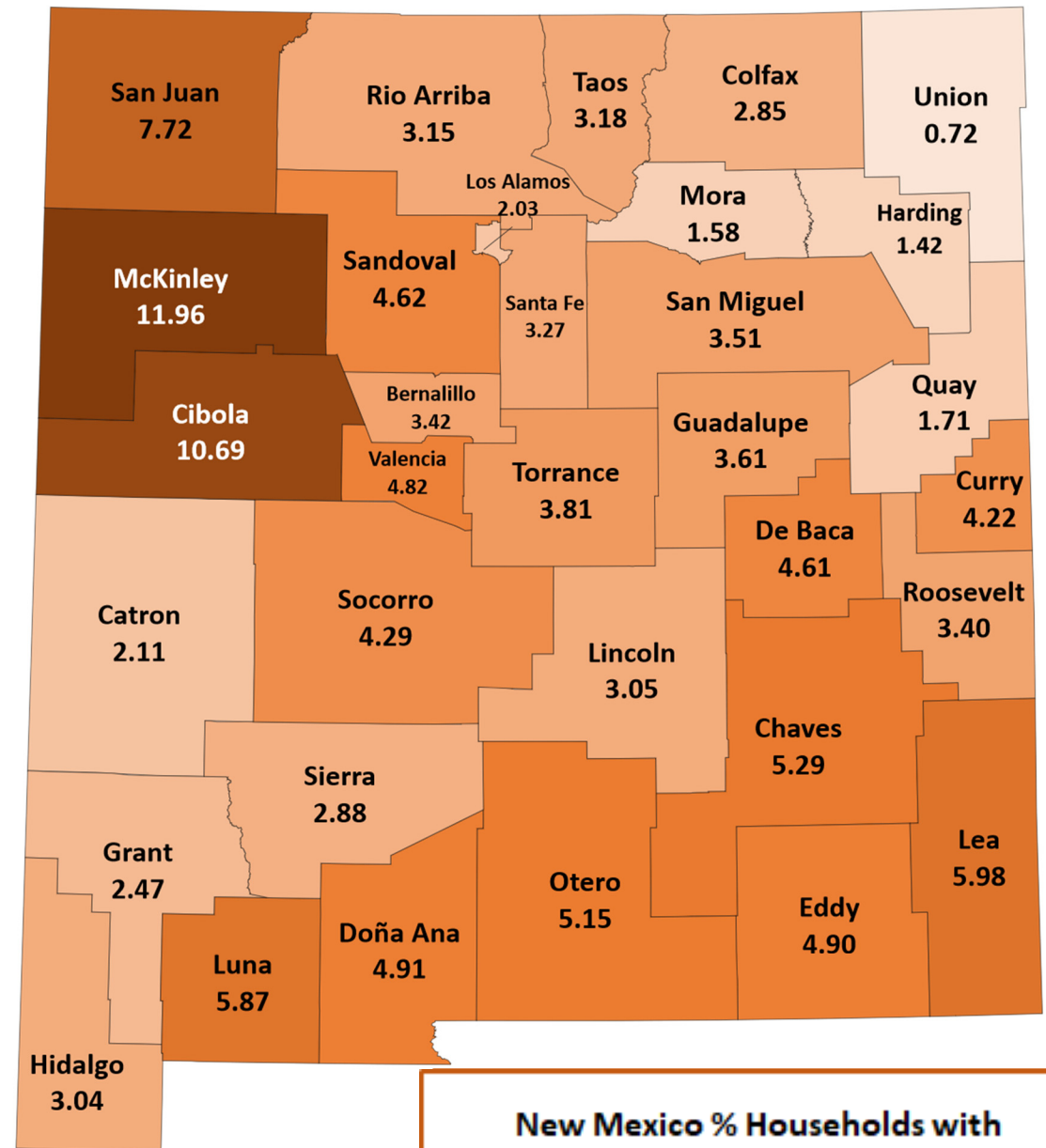

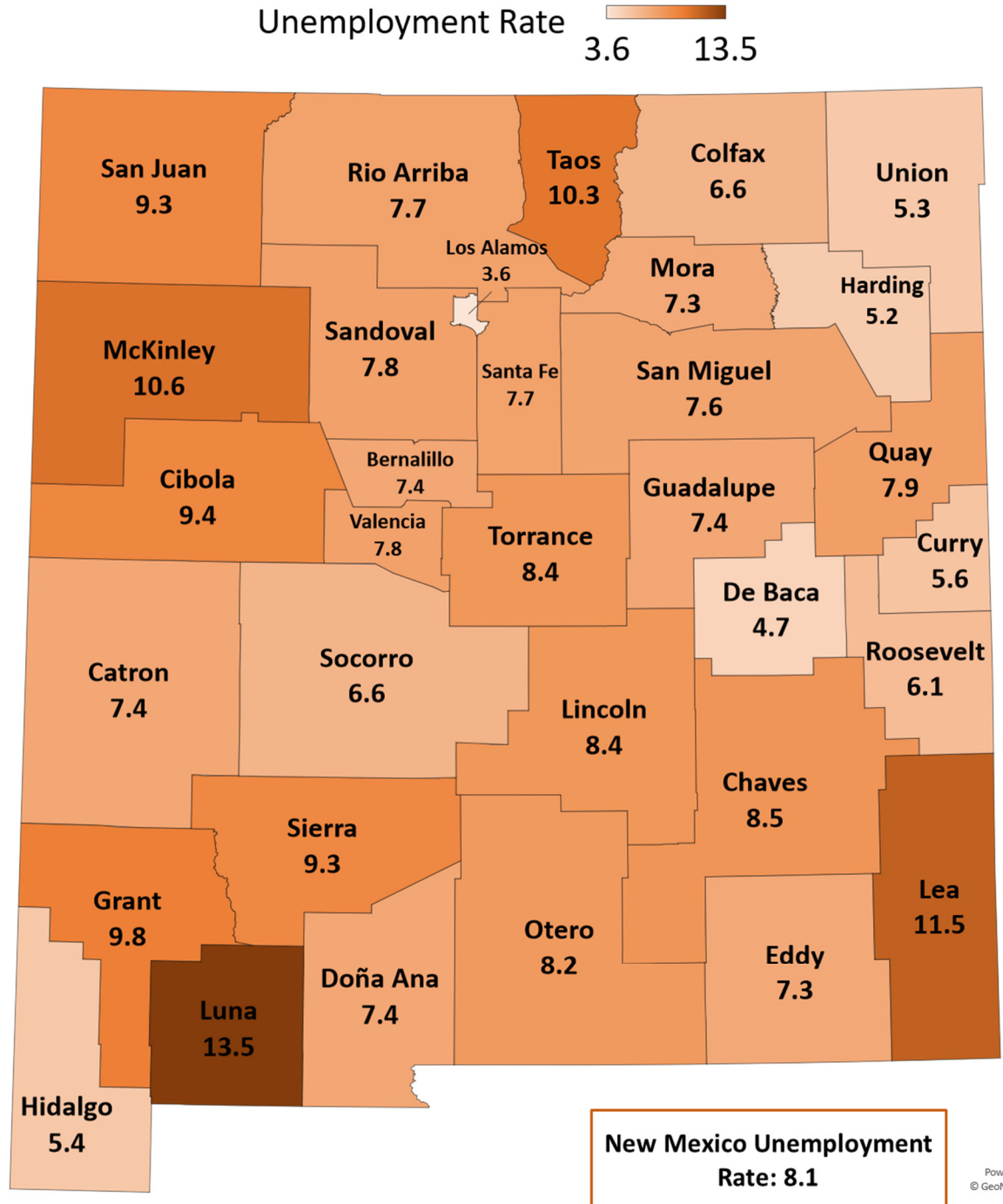

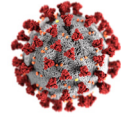

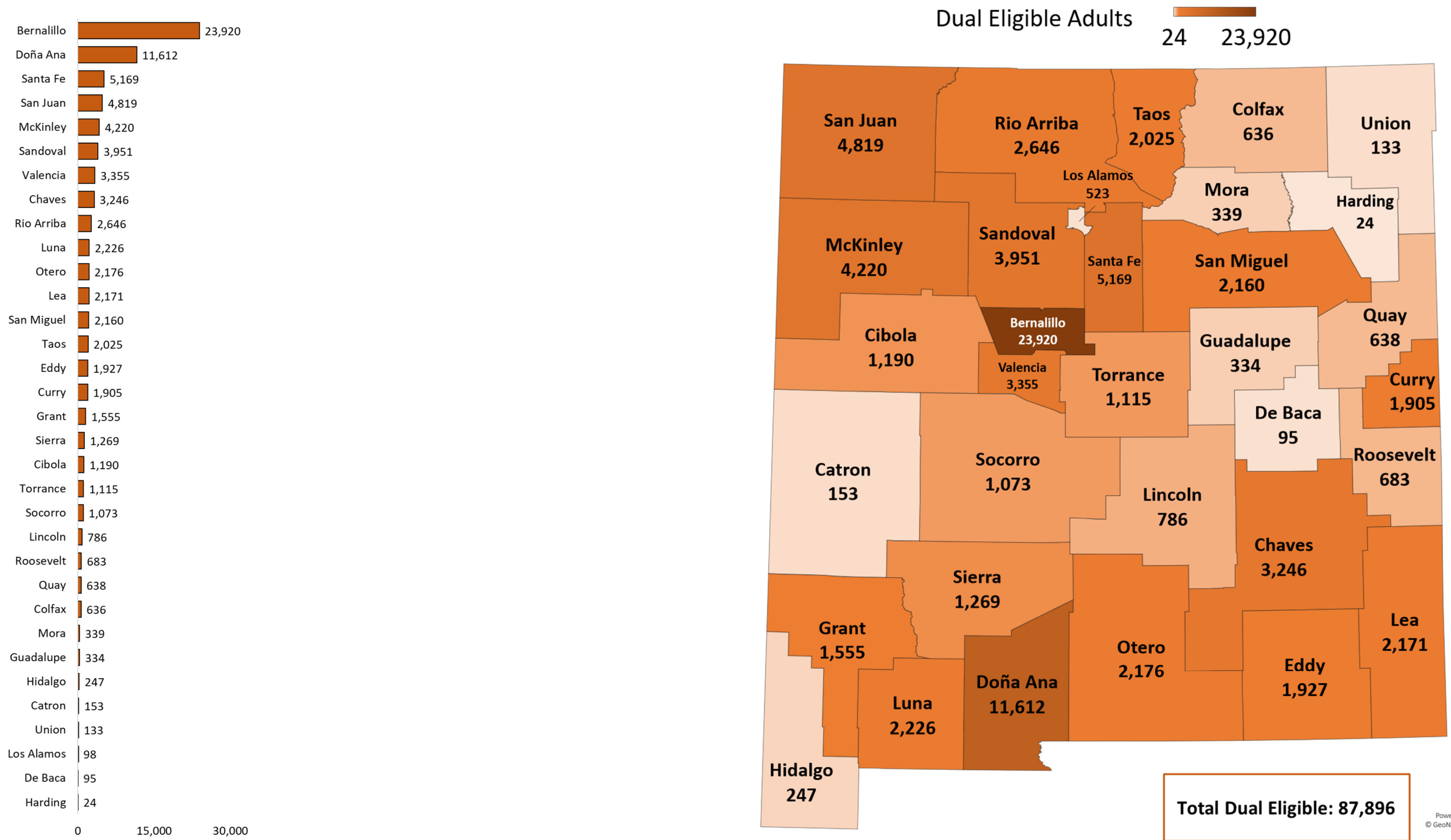

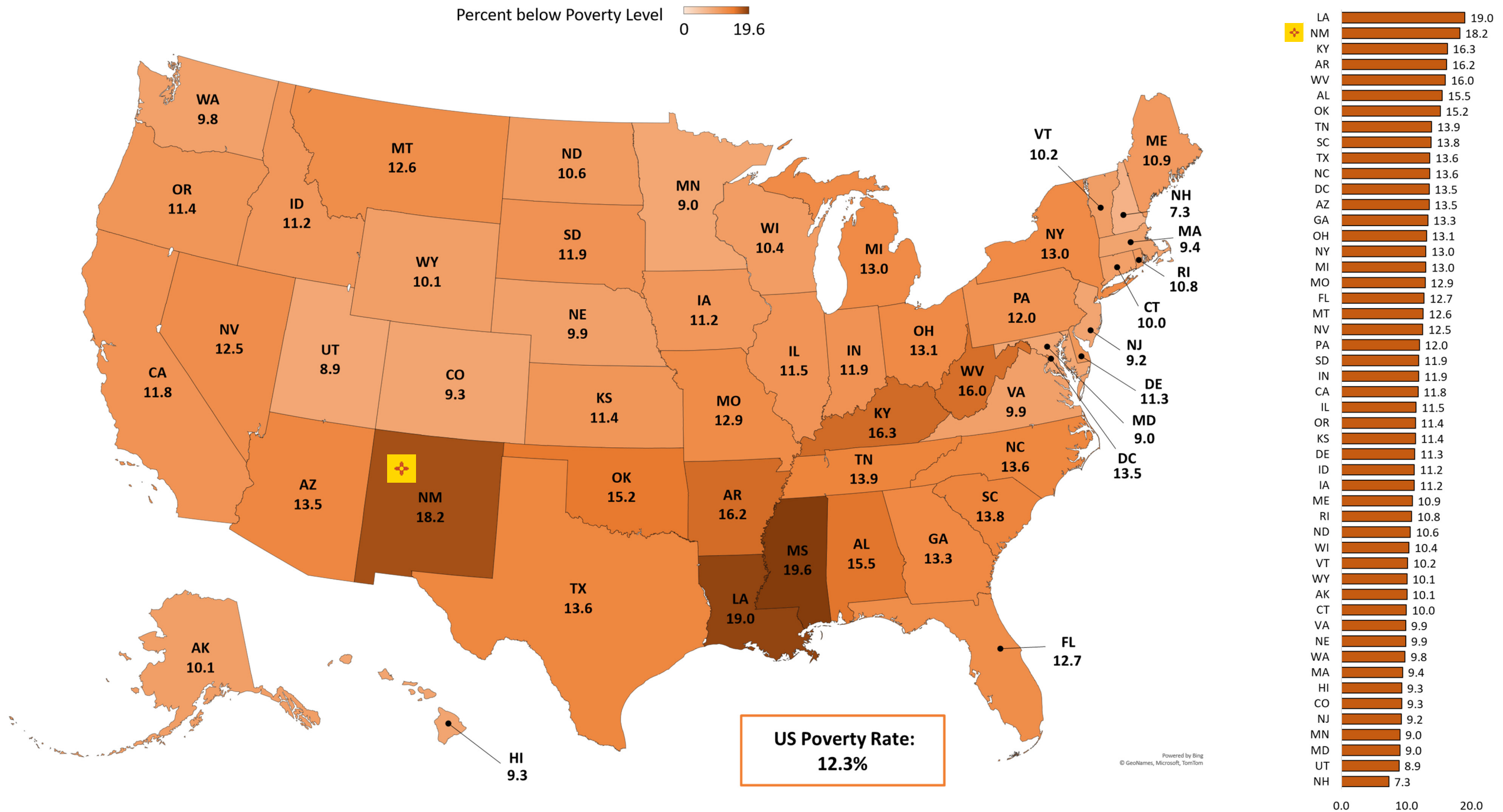

New Mexico Number of Medicaid/Medicare Dual Eligible Adults by County as of October 2019



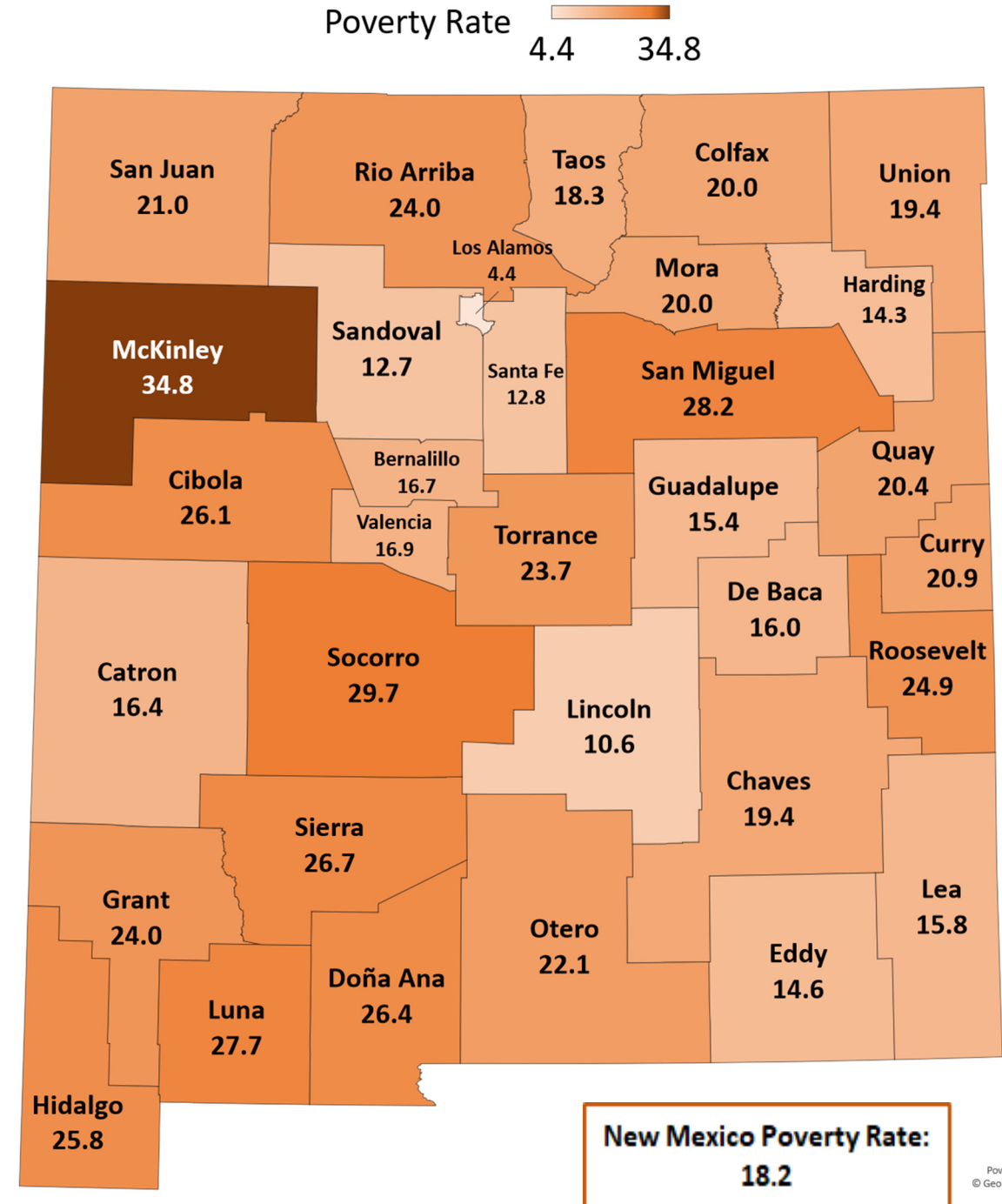
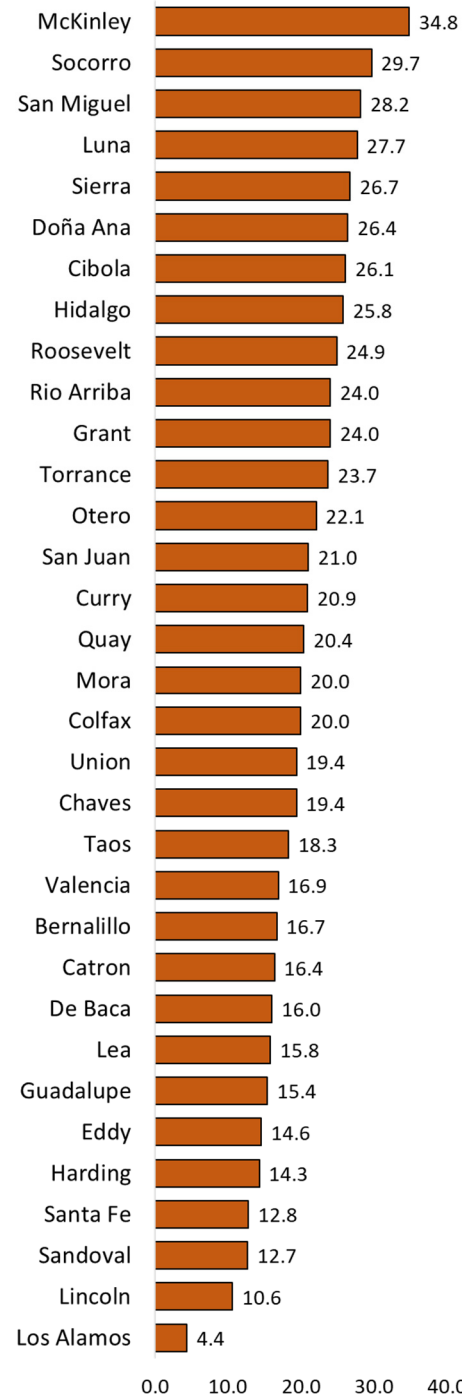

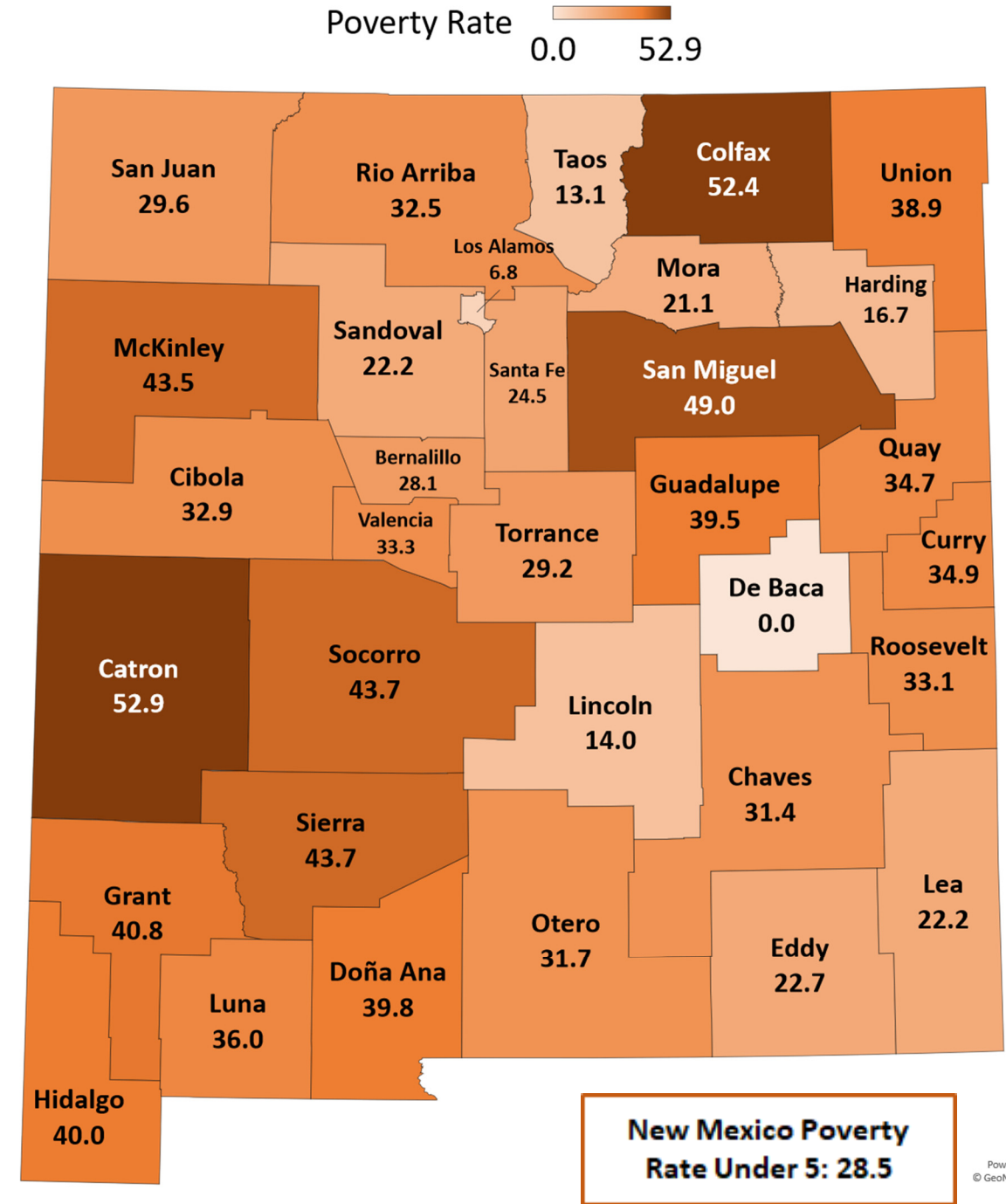
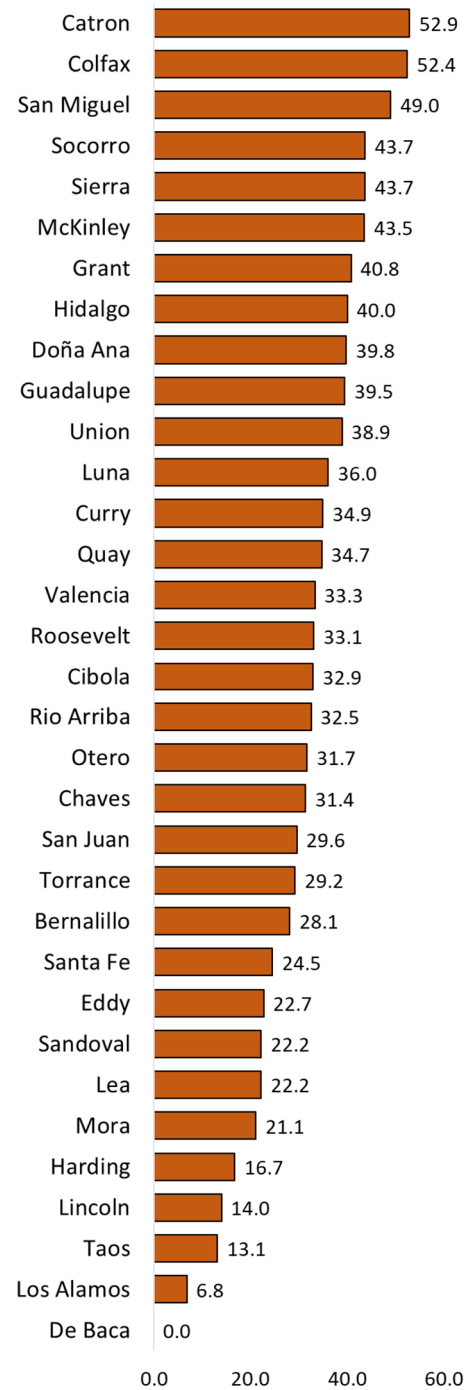
New Mexico Poverty Rate by County as of 2019



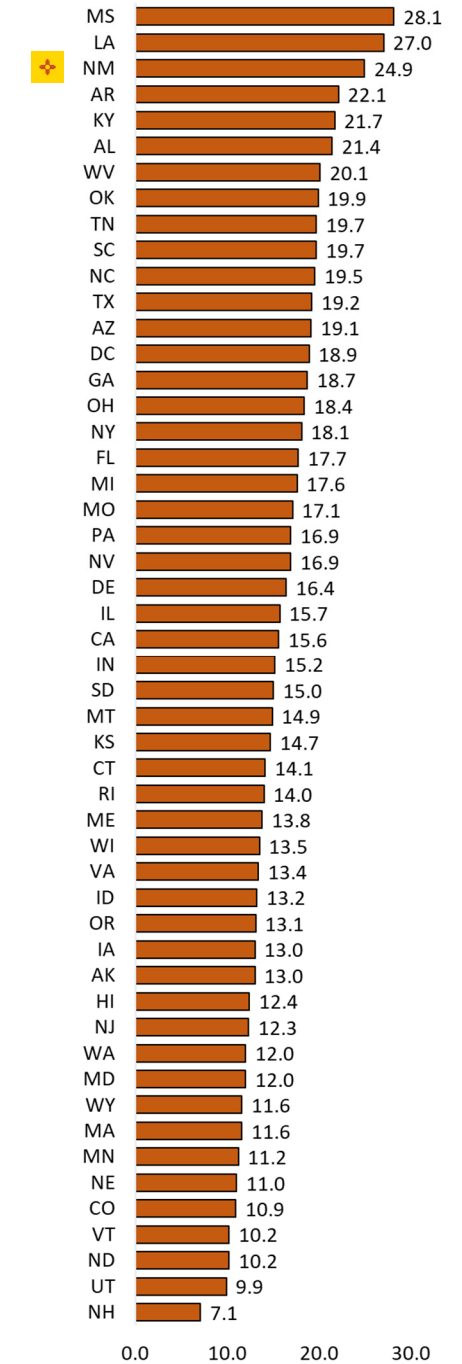
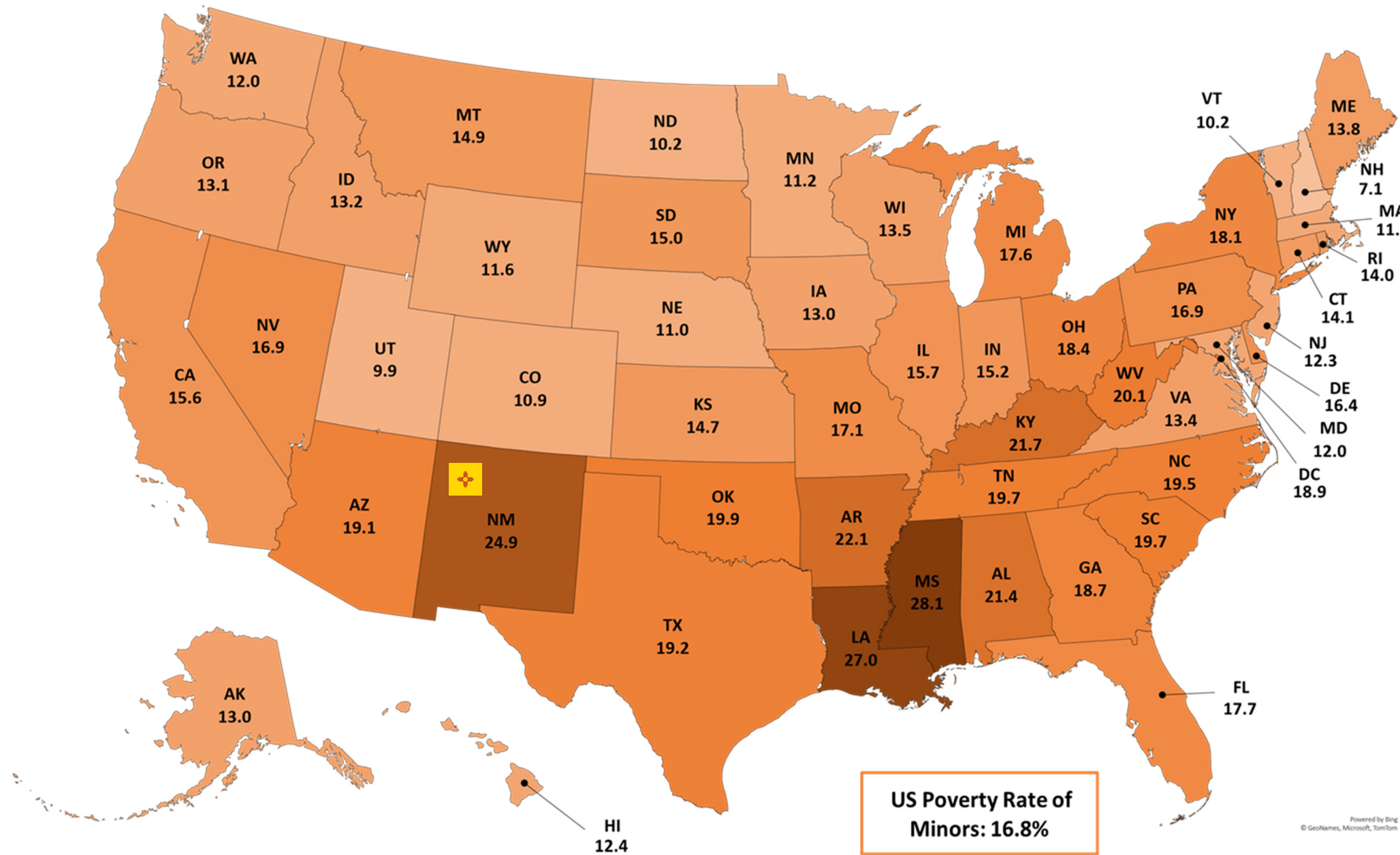
New Mexico Poverty Rate of Children (Under 5 Years) by County as of 2019

U.S. Poverty Rate Minors (Under 18 Years) by State as of 2019

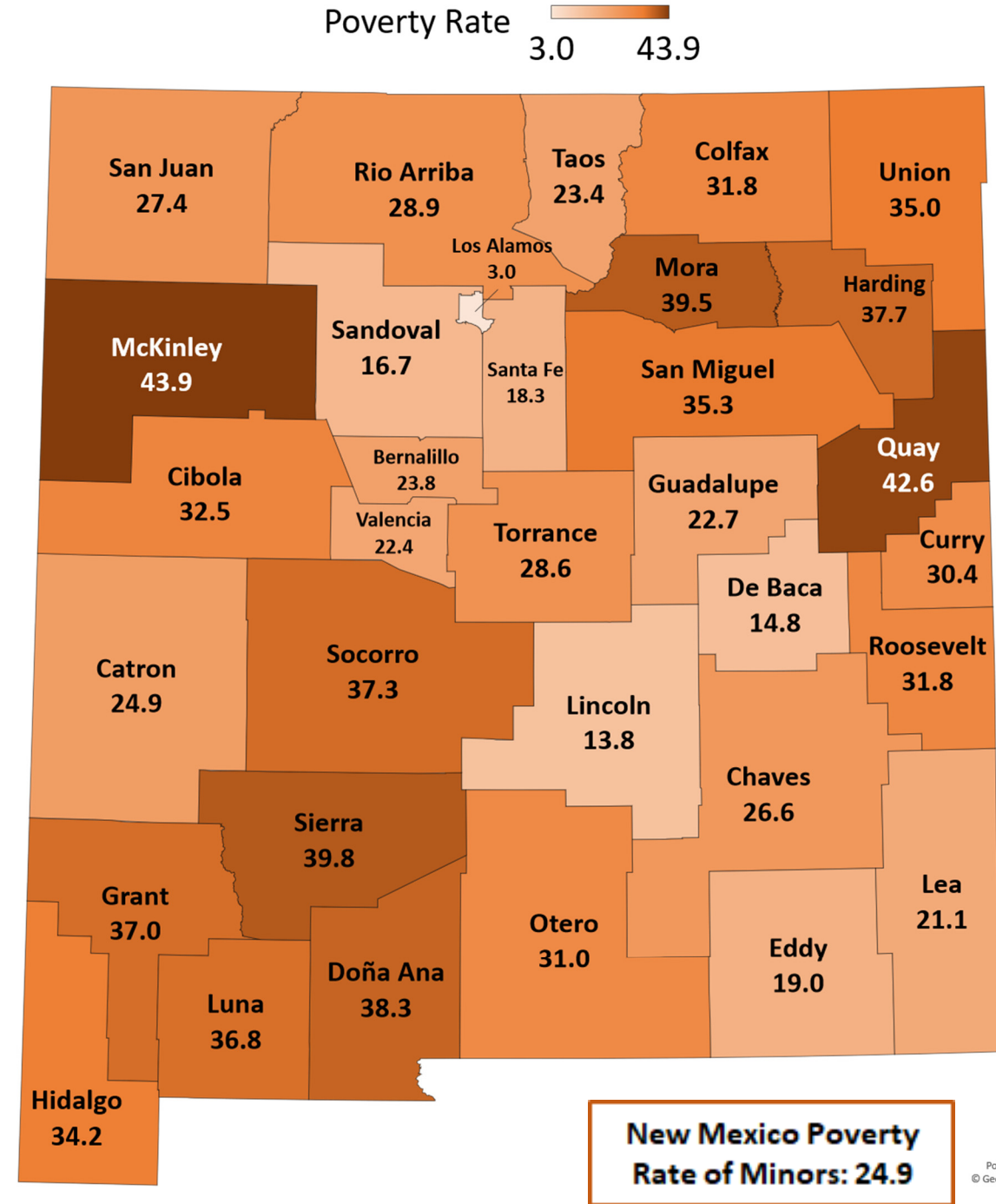
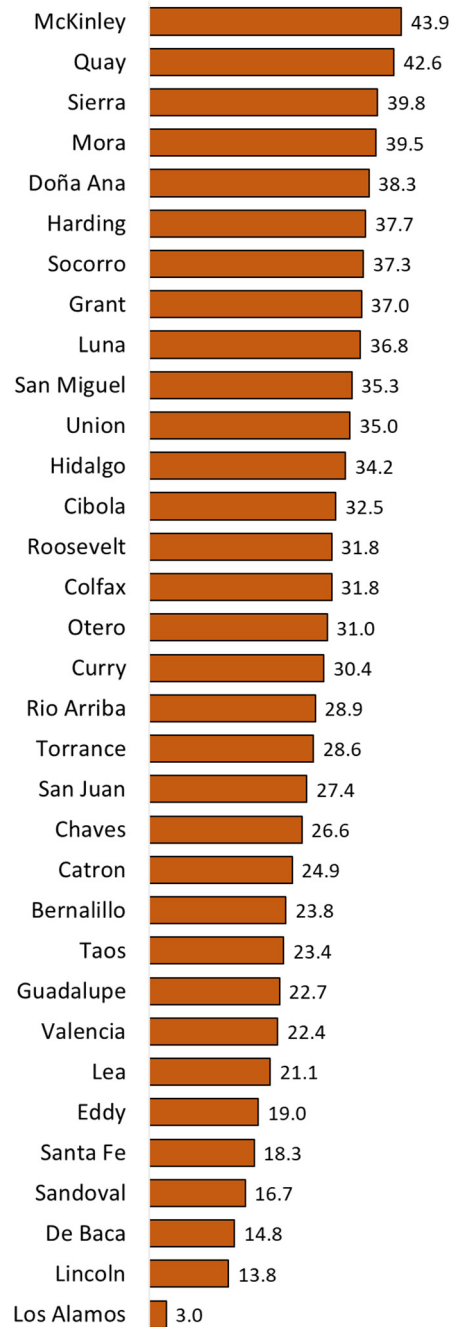

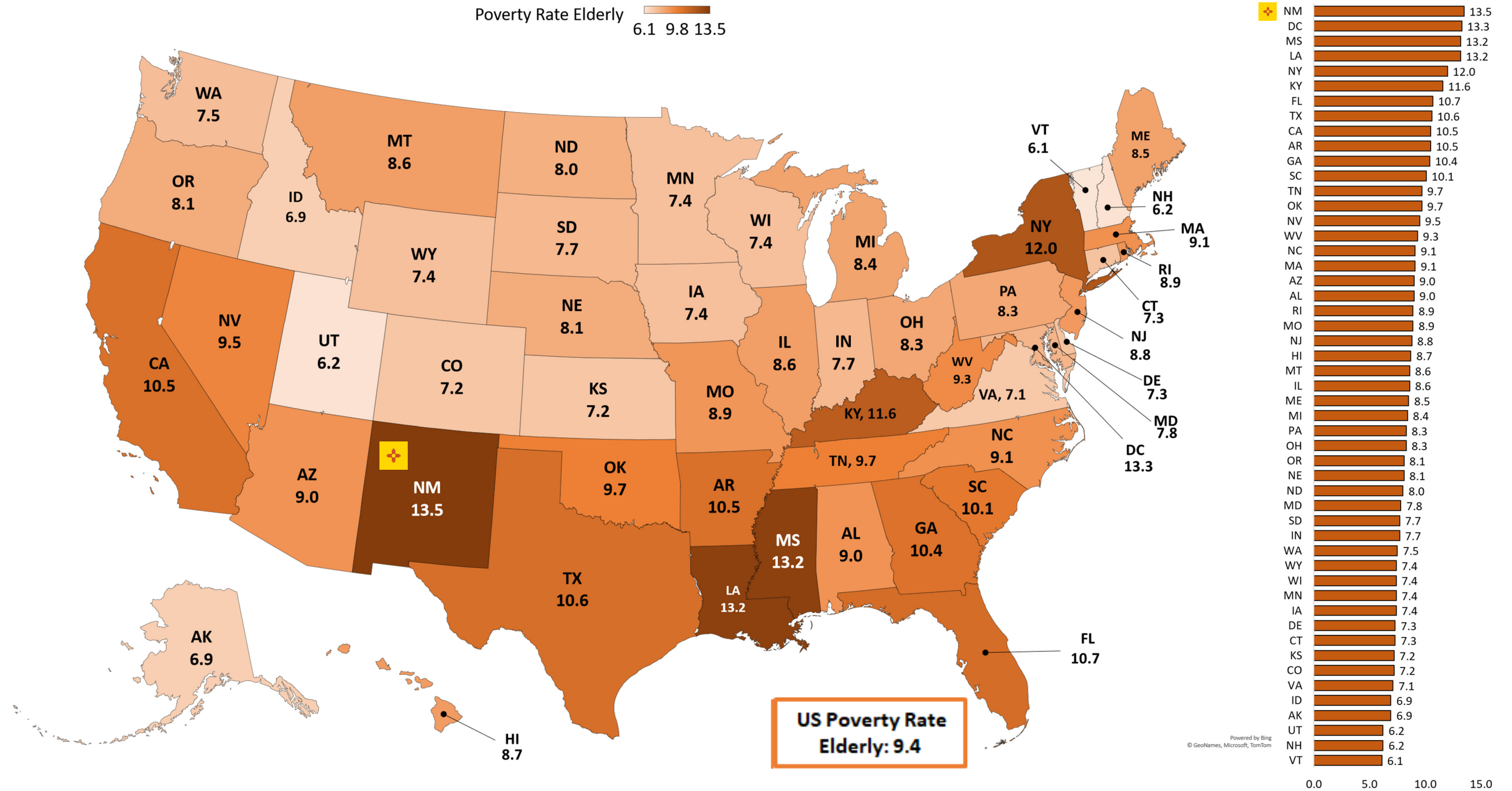
New Mexico Poverty Rate of Minors (Under 18 Years) by County as of 2019

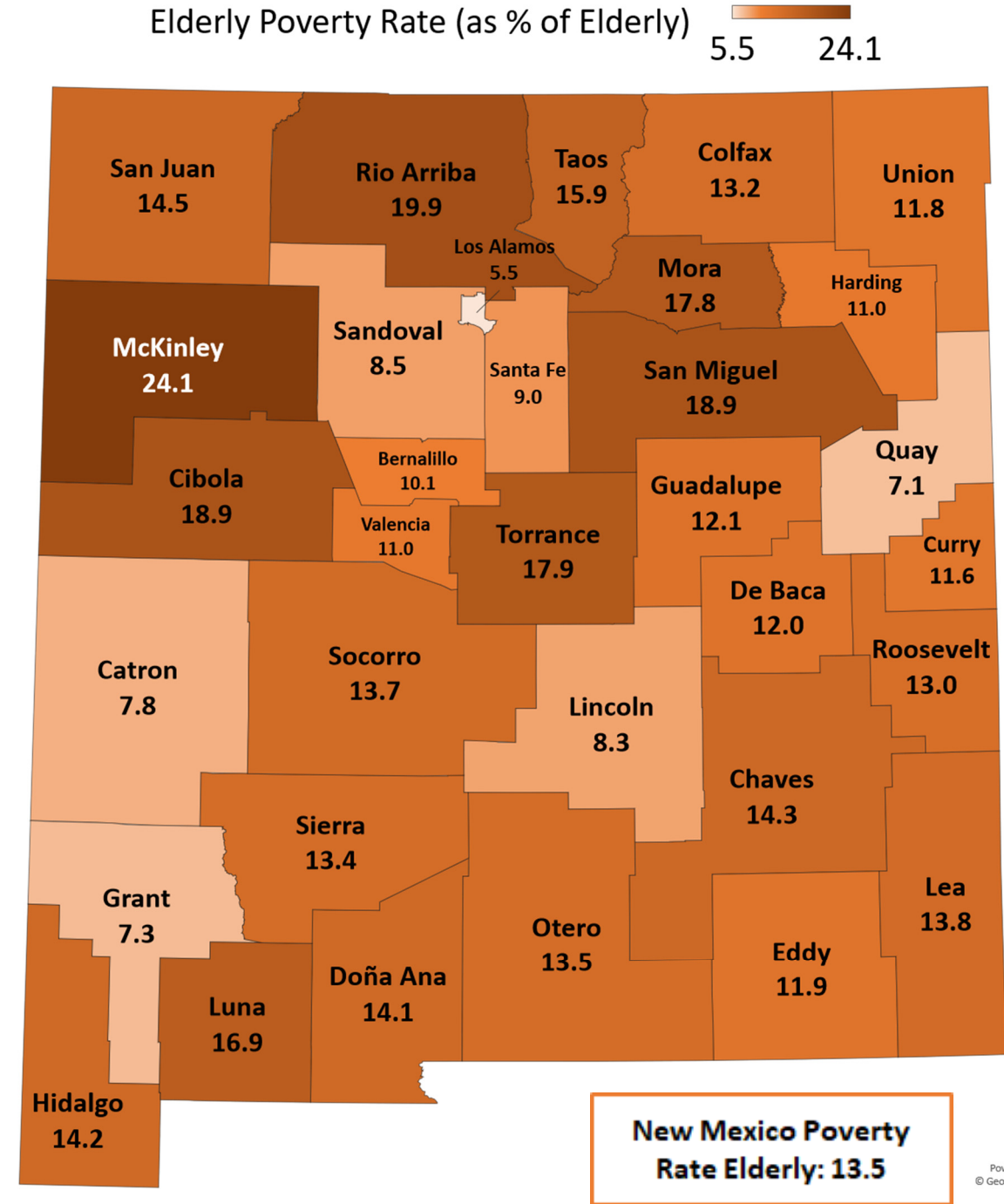
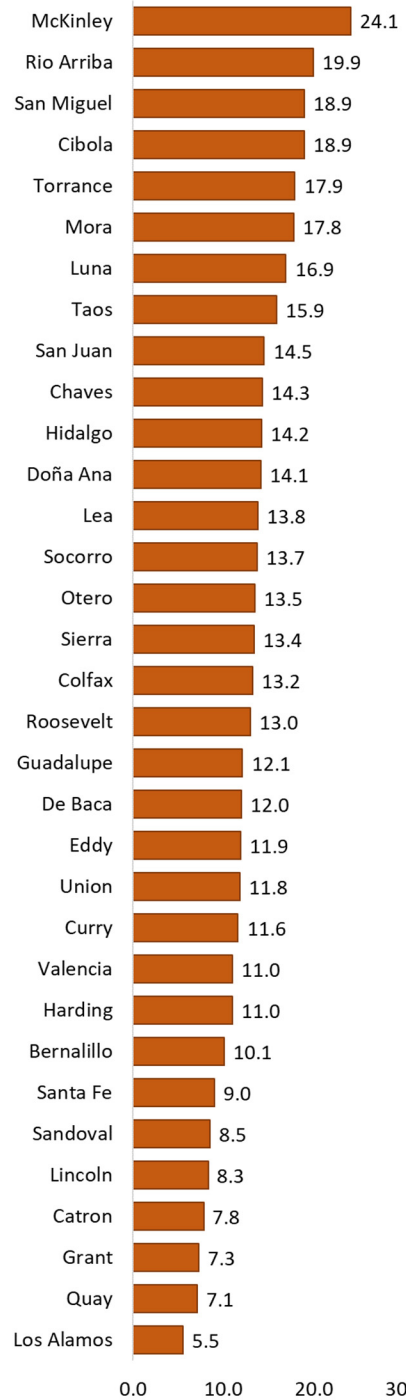

U.S. Poverty Rate Elderly (65+ Years) by State as of 2019



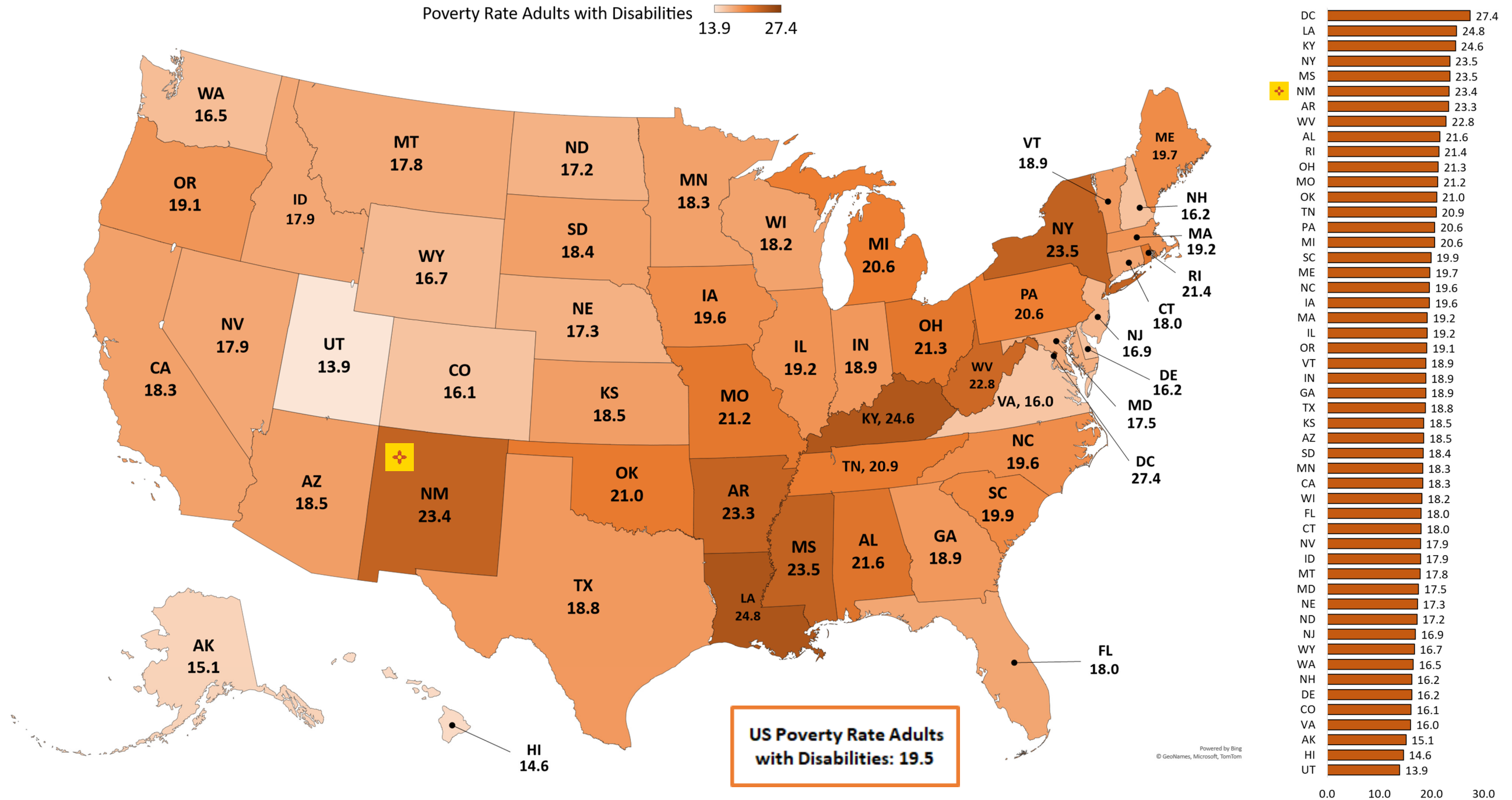

New Mexico Poverty Rate Elderly (65+ Years) by County as of 2019



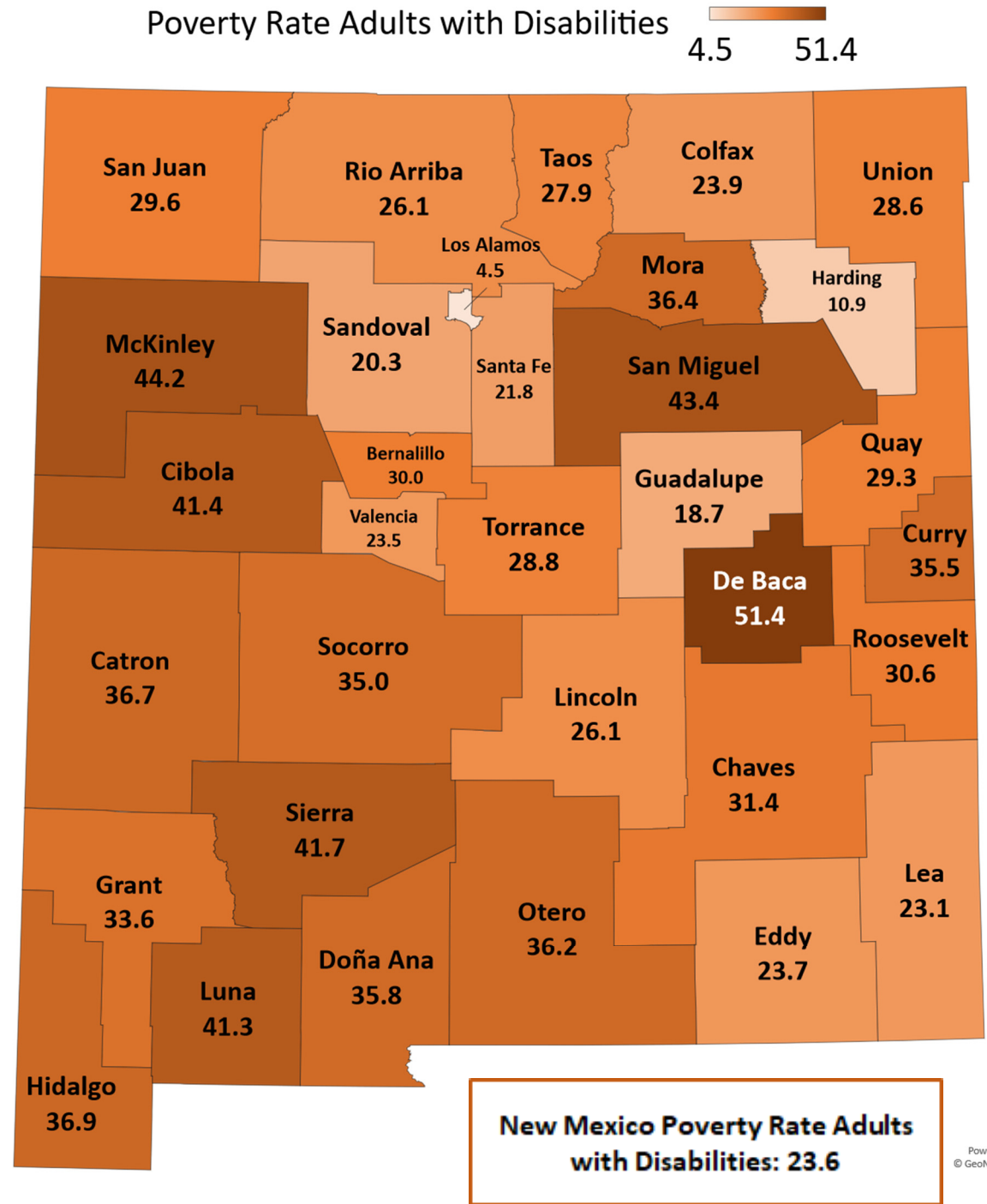
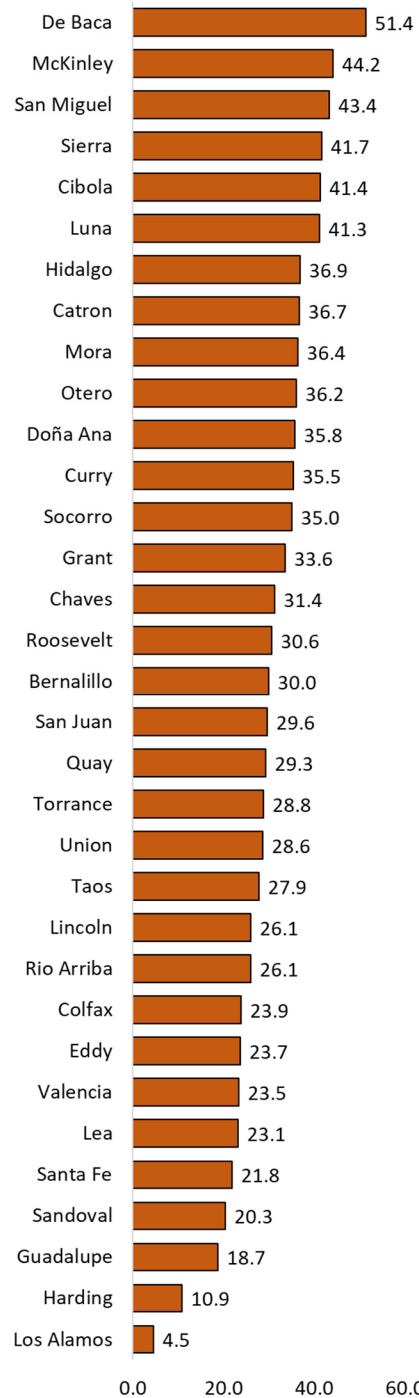

U.S. Poverty Rate Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by State as of 2019



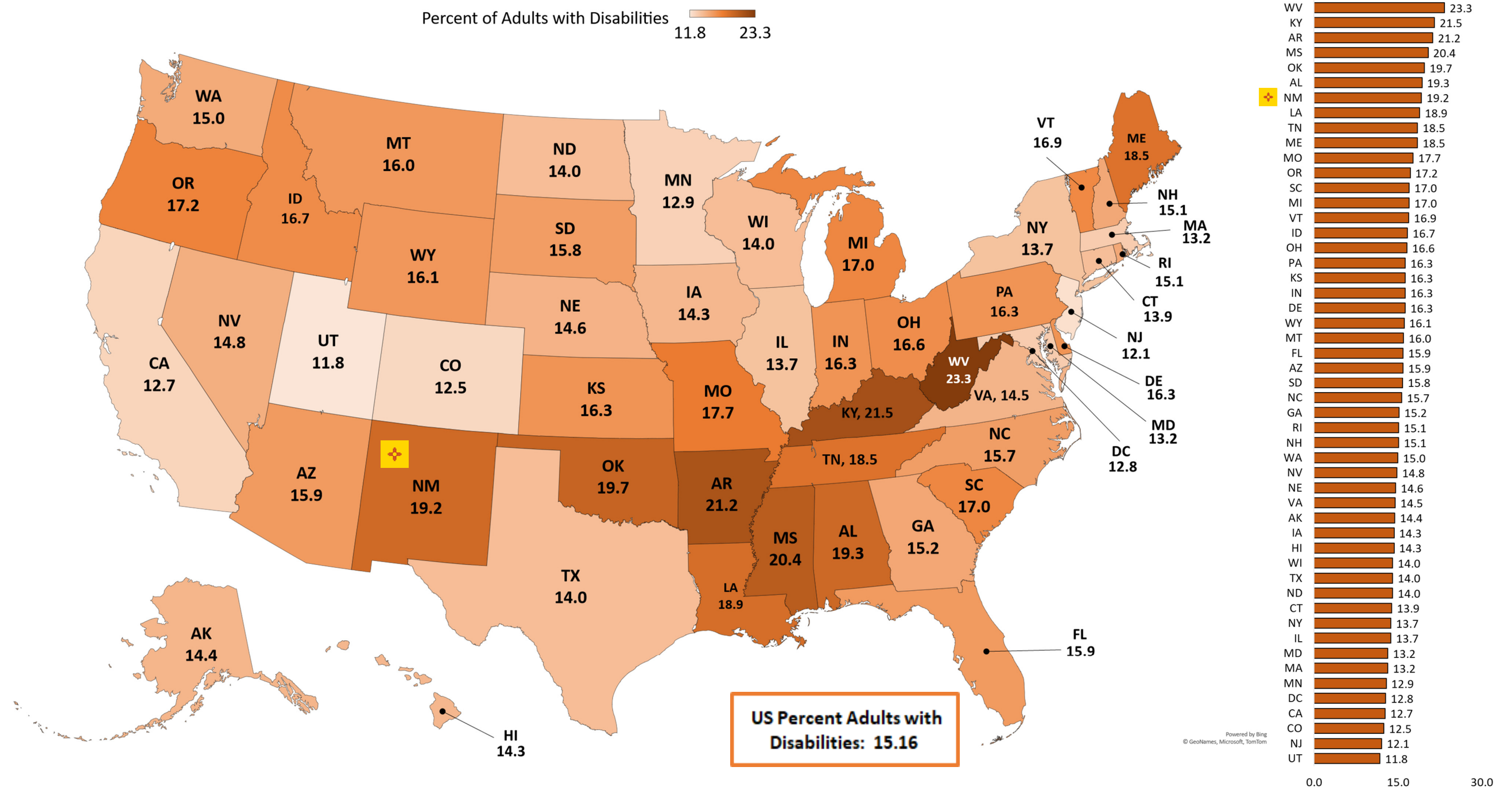

New Mexico Poverty Rate Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by County as of 2019



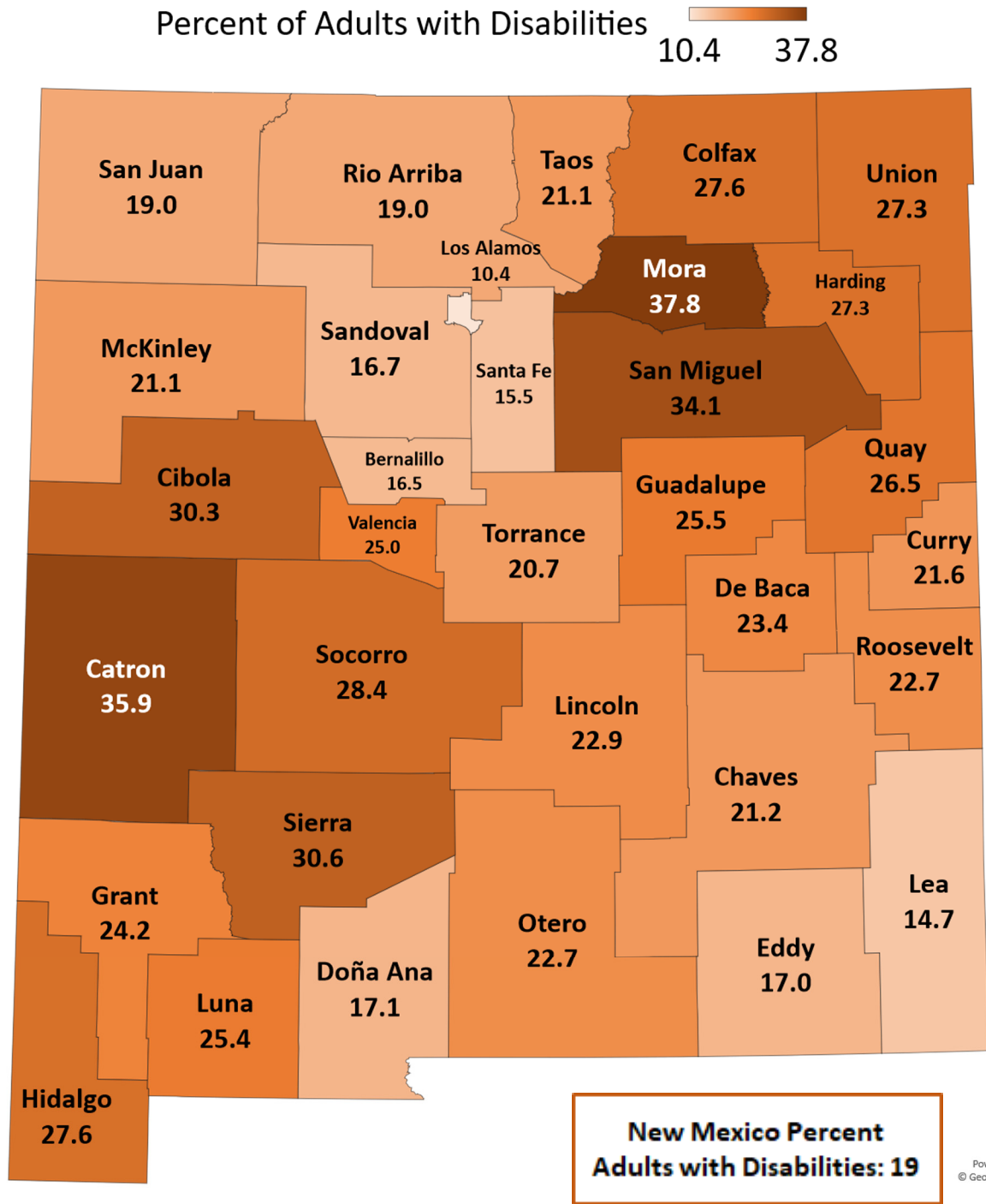
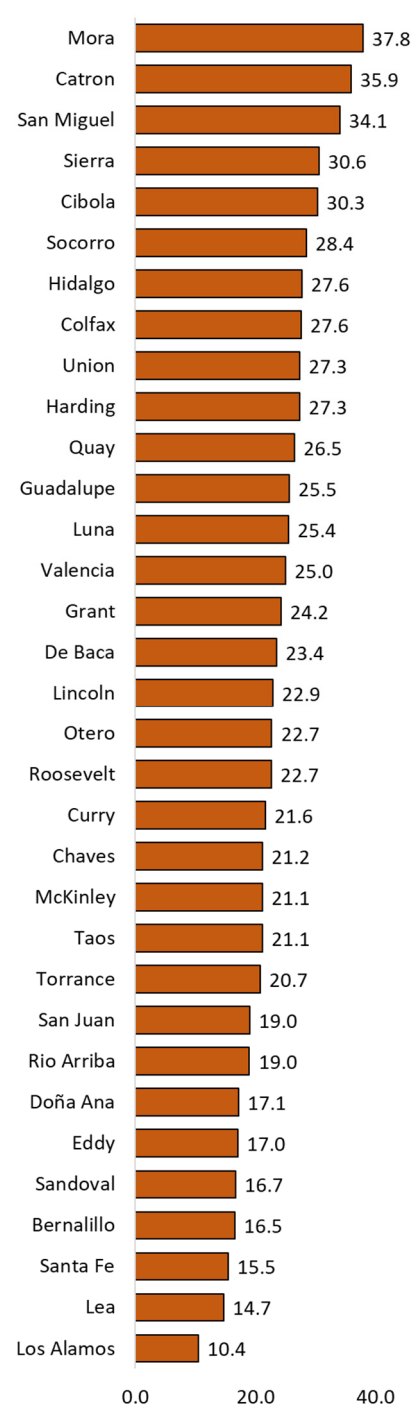

New Mexico Percent Adults (18+ Years) with Disabilities by County as of 2019

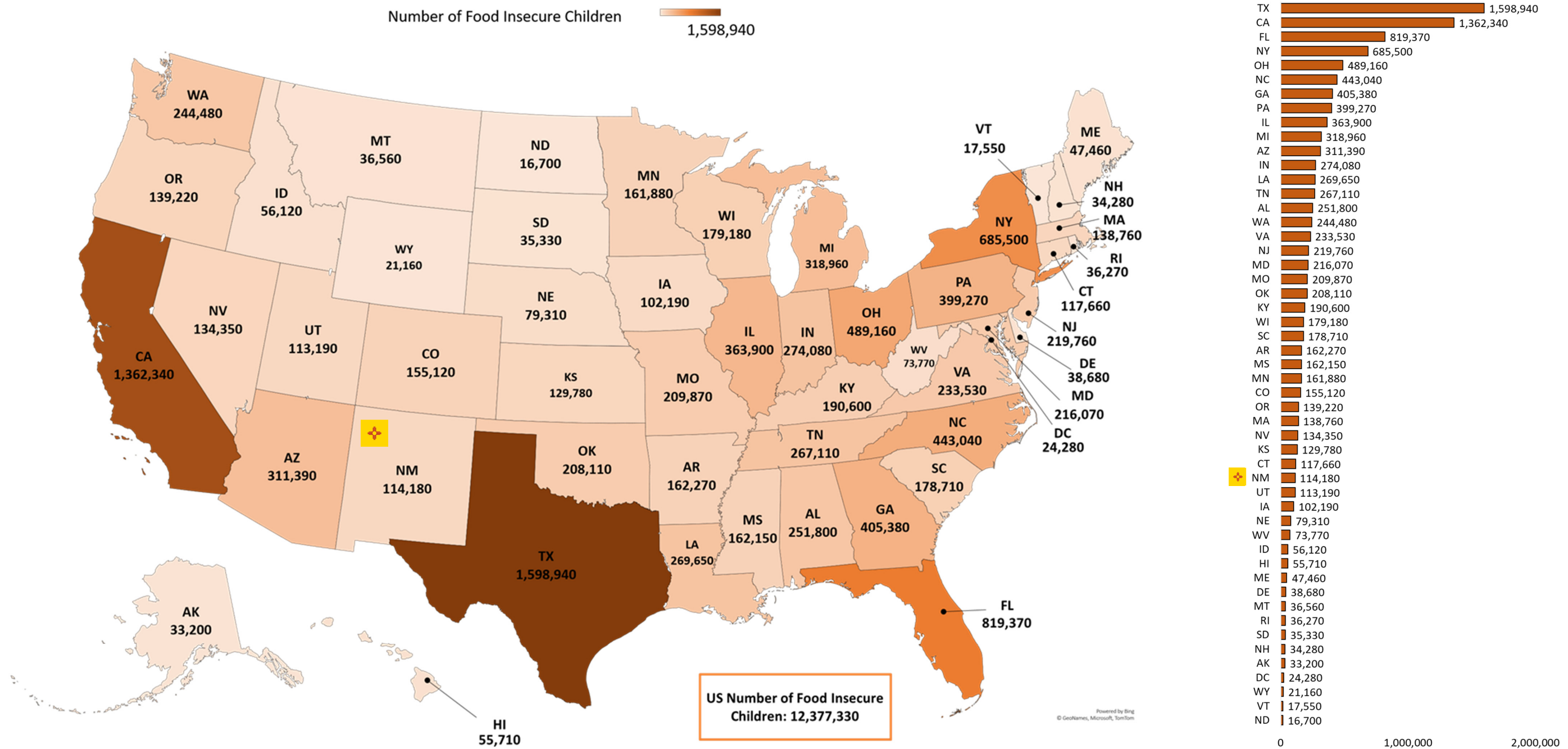

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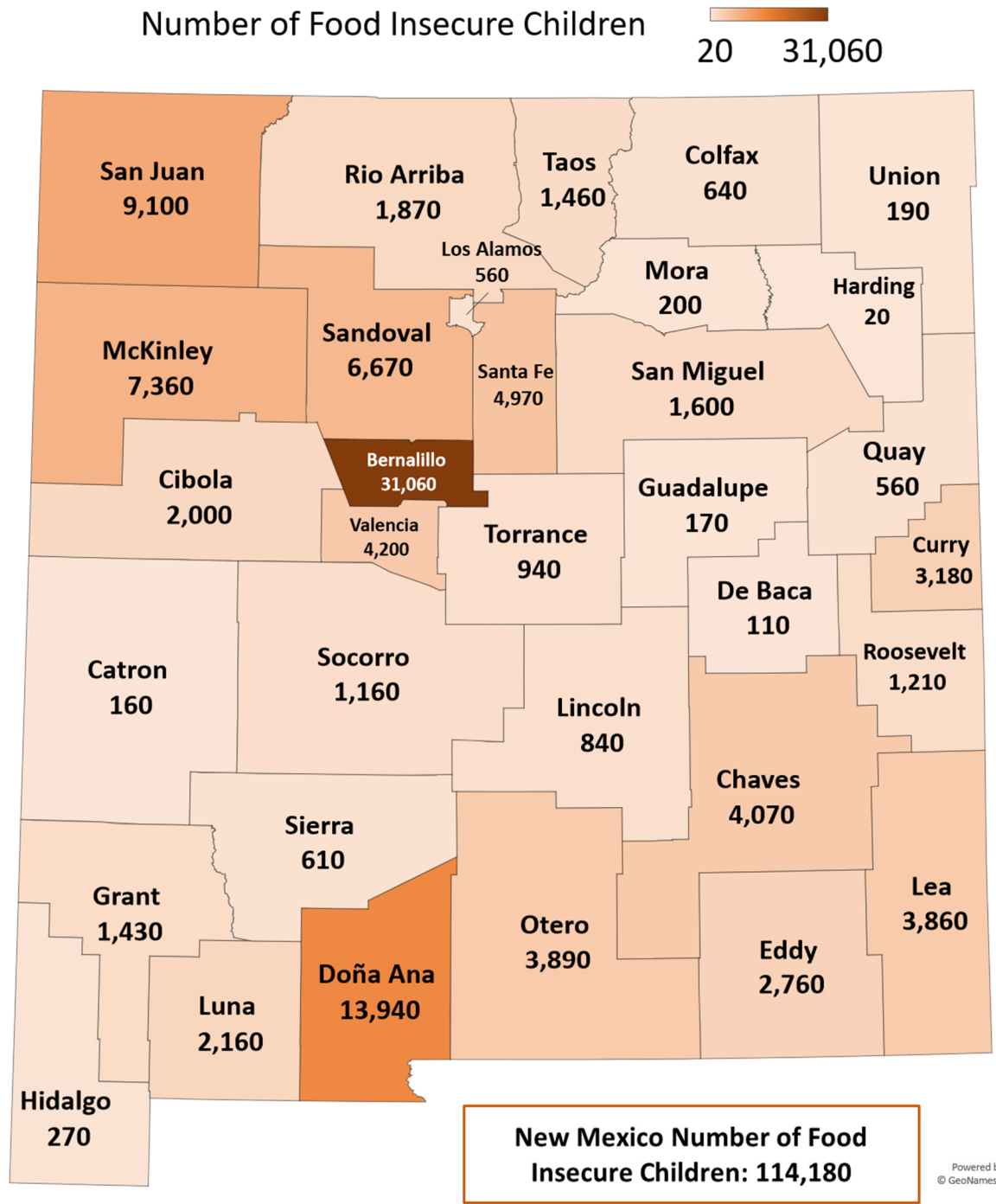
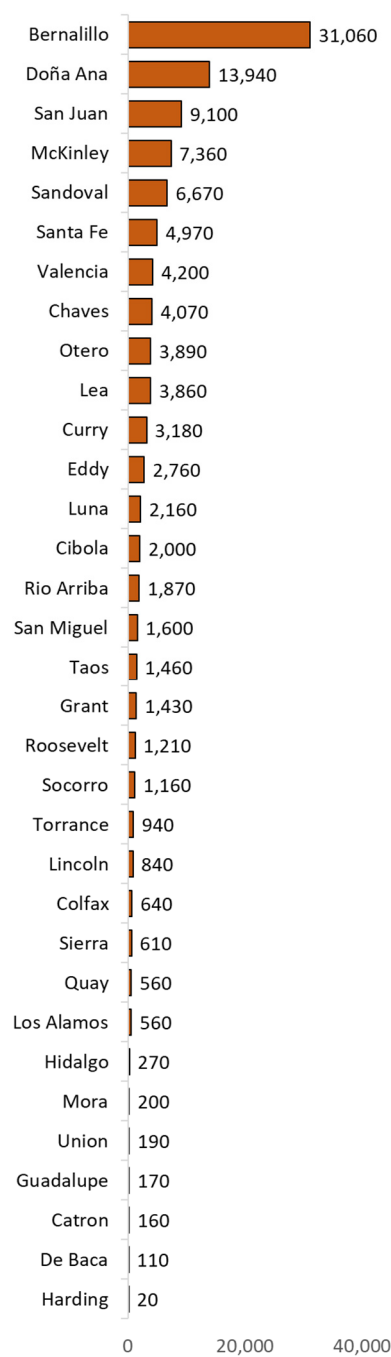

U.S. Number of Food Insecure Children by State as of 2018



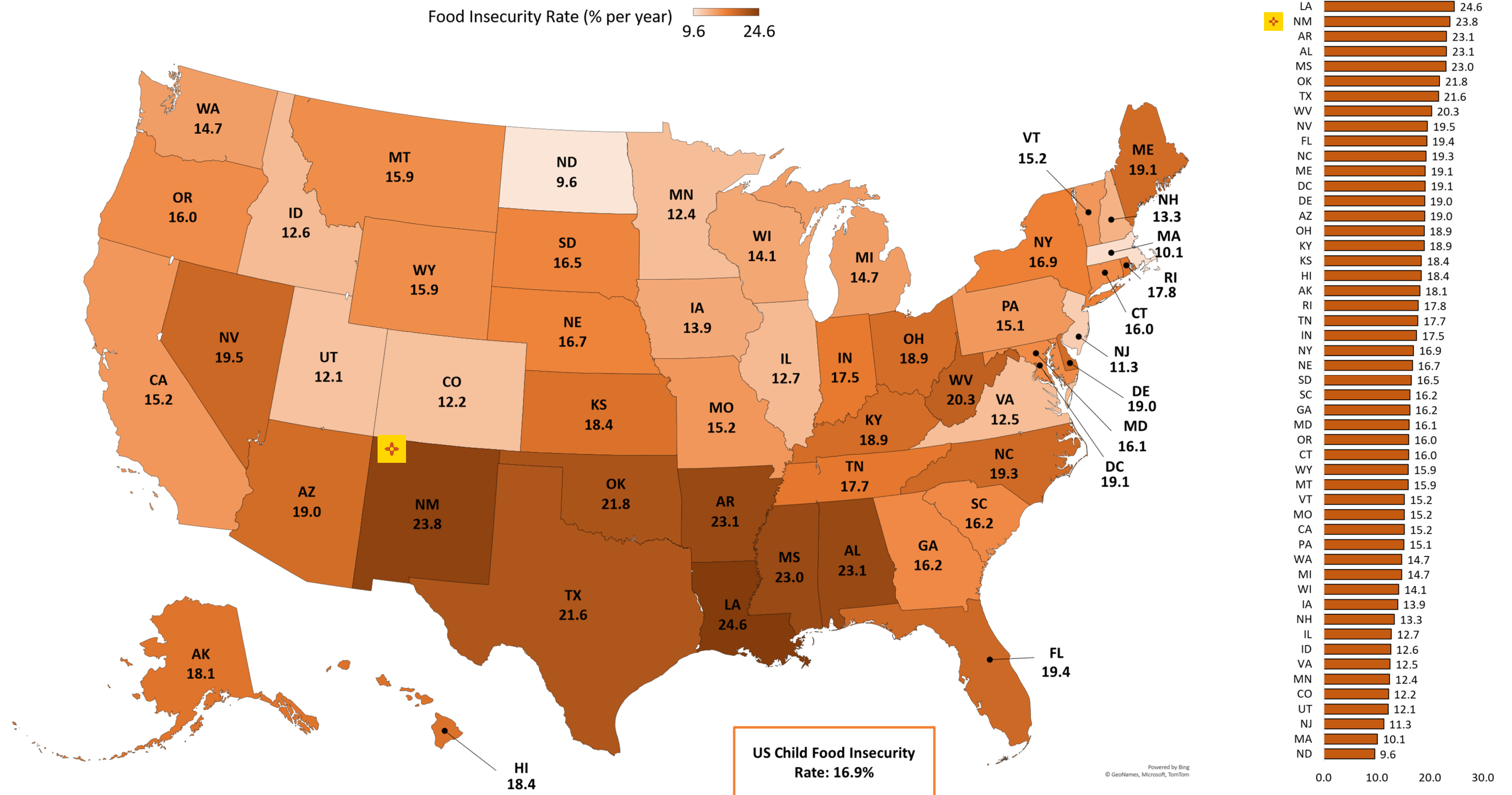

New Mexico Number of Food Insecure Children by County as of 2018



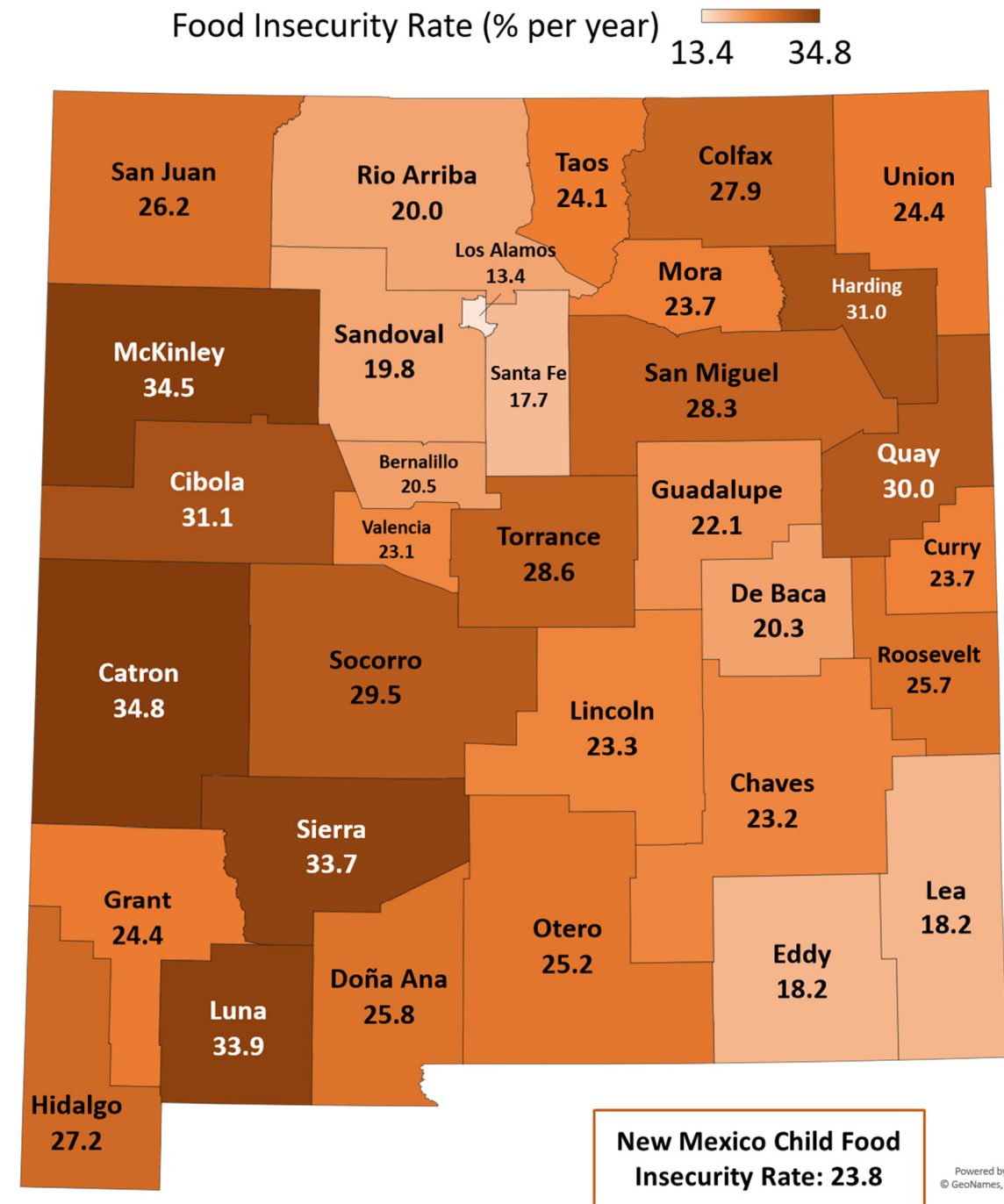
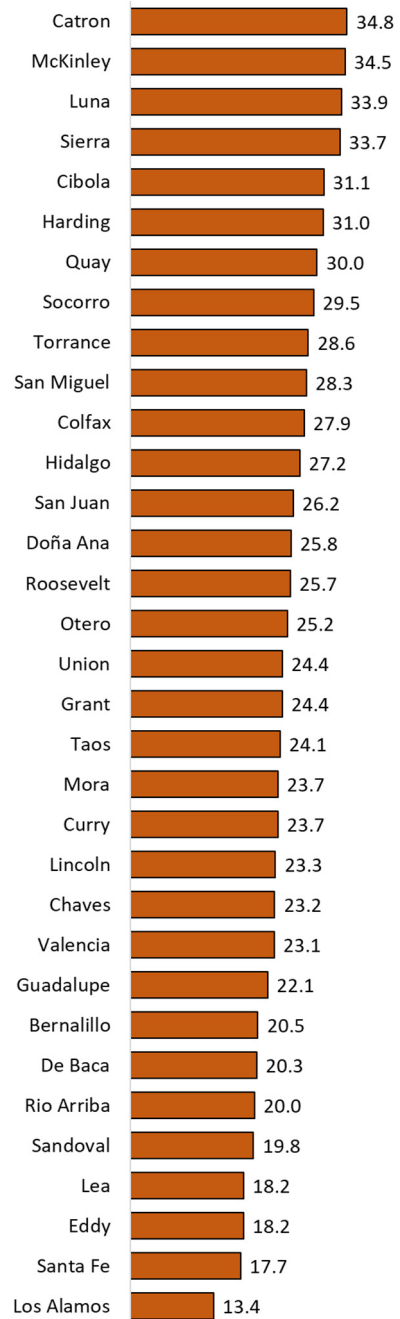

U.S. Food Insecurity Rate of Children by State as of 2018



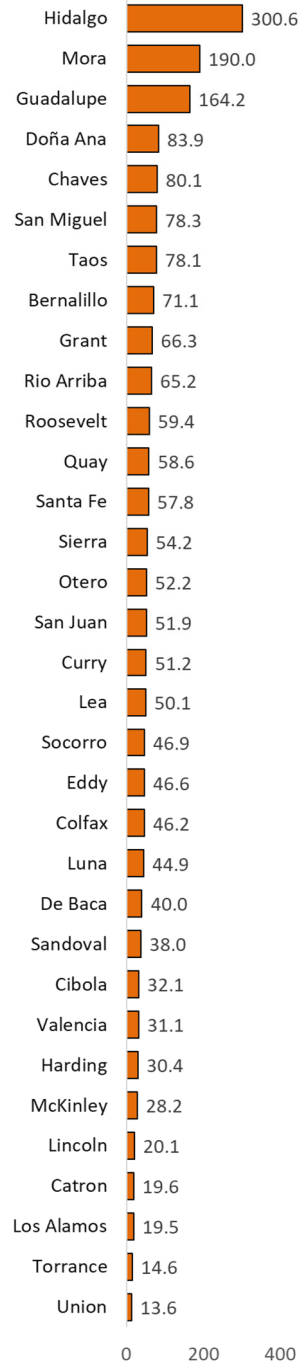
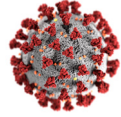

New Mexico Food Insecurity Rate of Children by County as of 2018

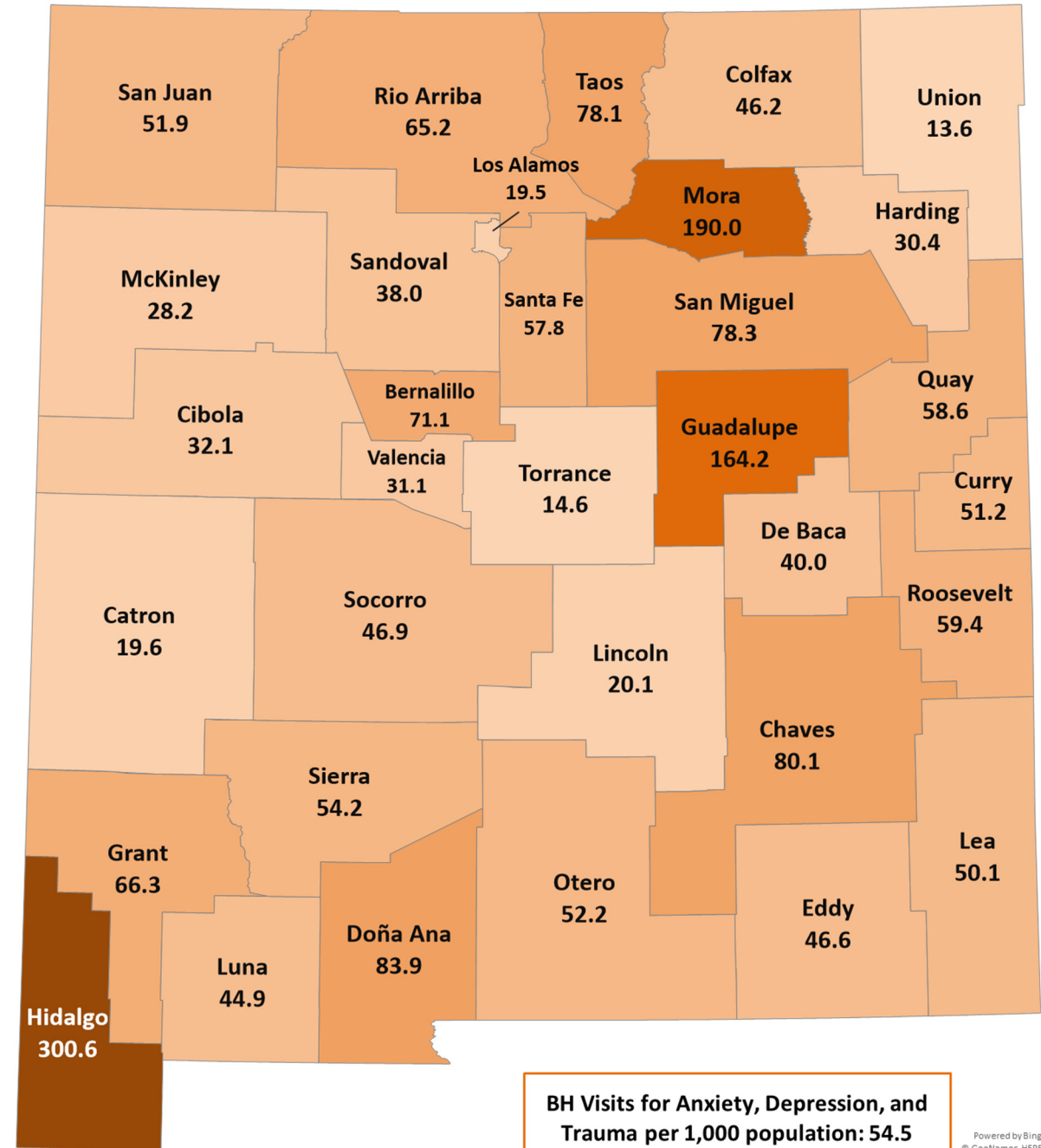

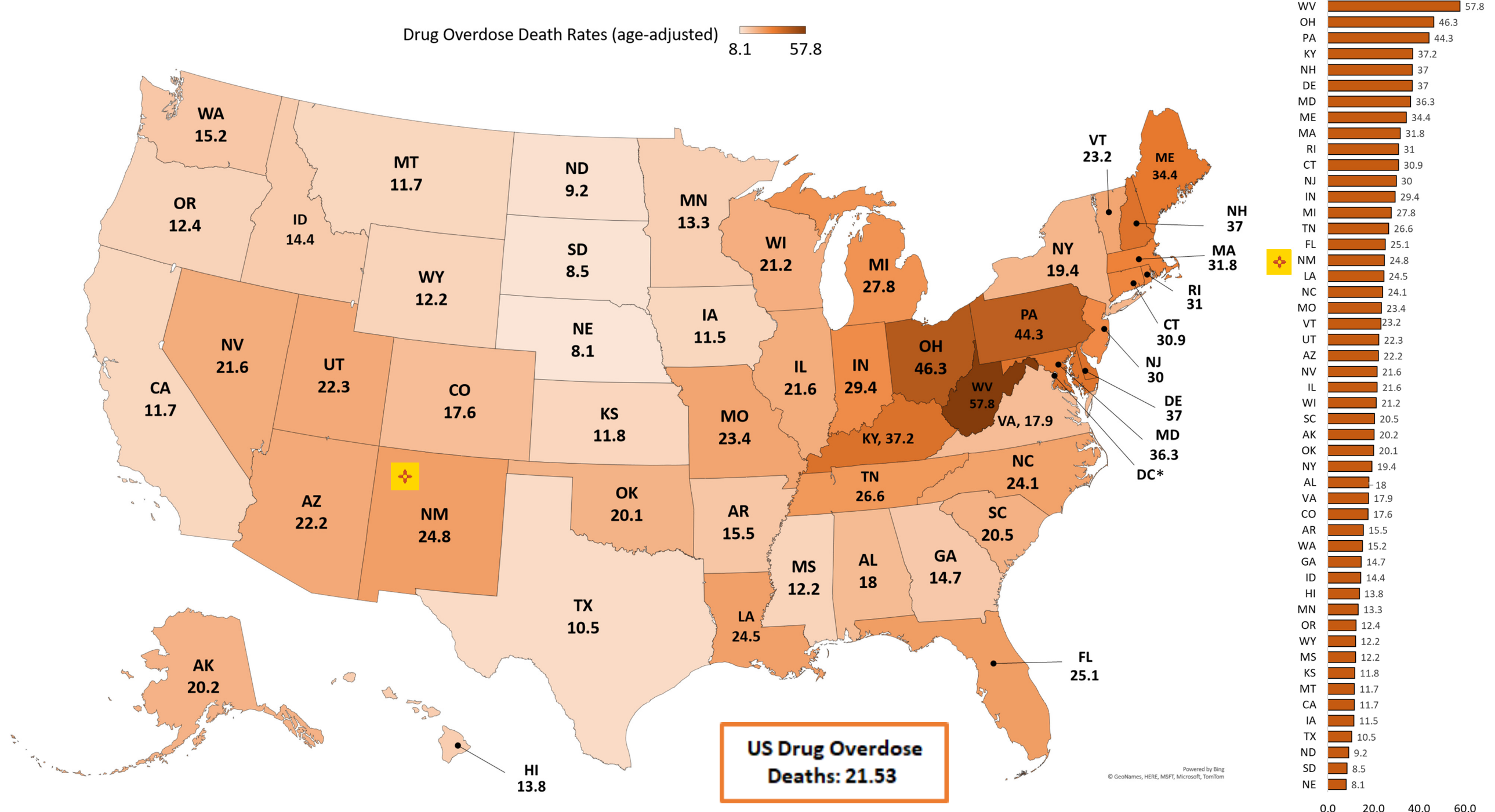

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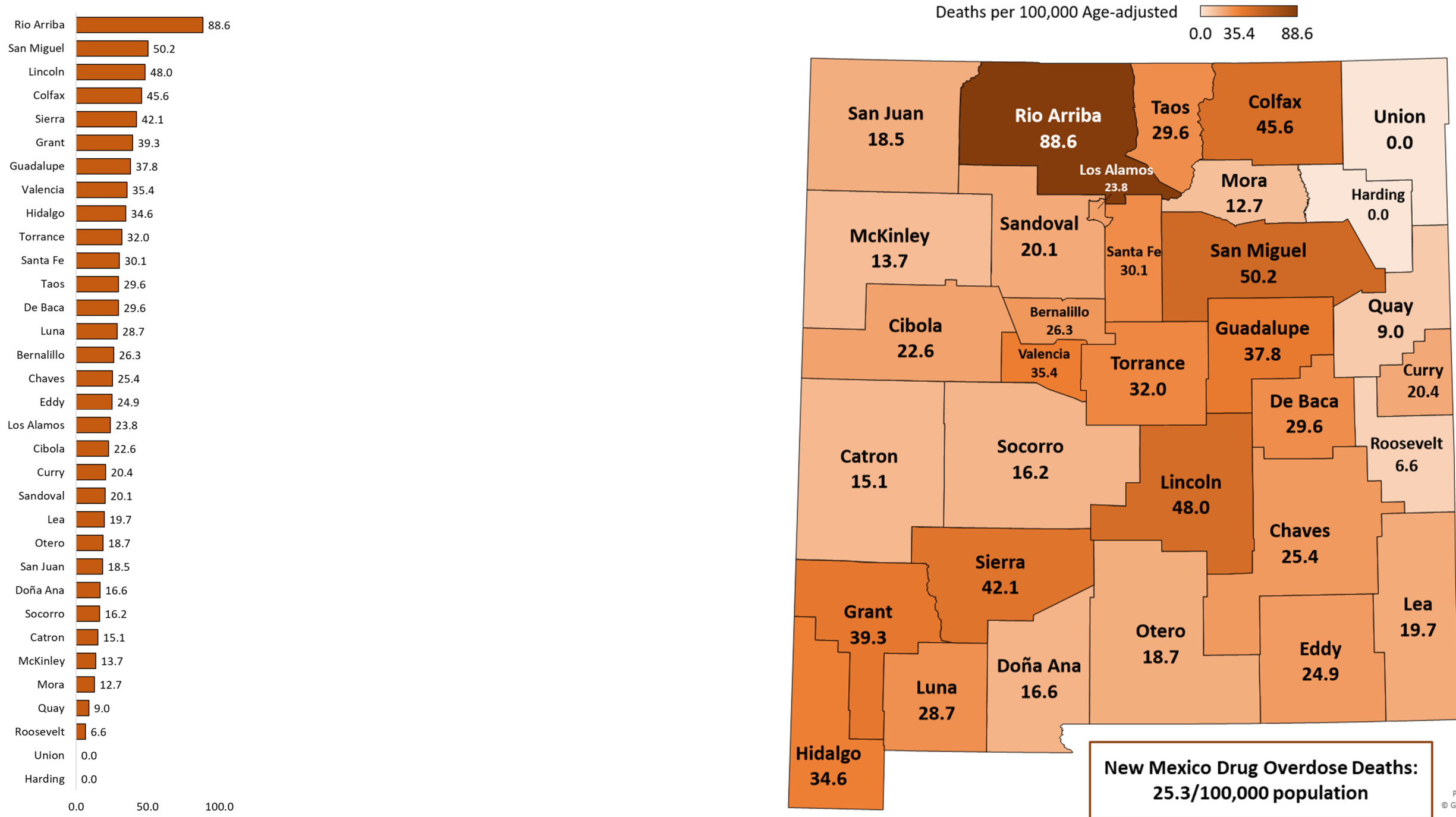

U.S. Drug Overdose Death Rate by State Age-Adjusted per 100,000 Population as of 2017



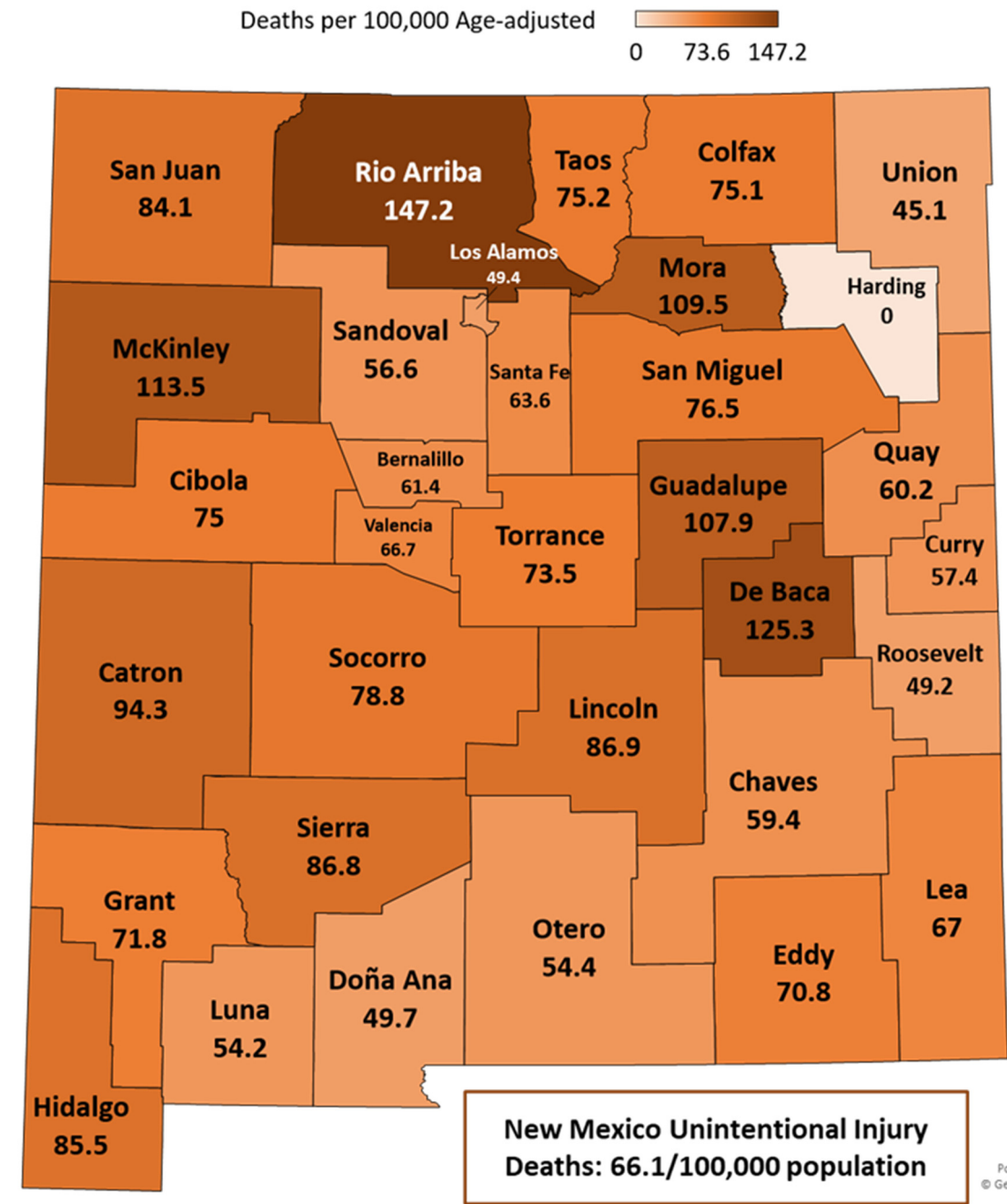
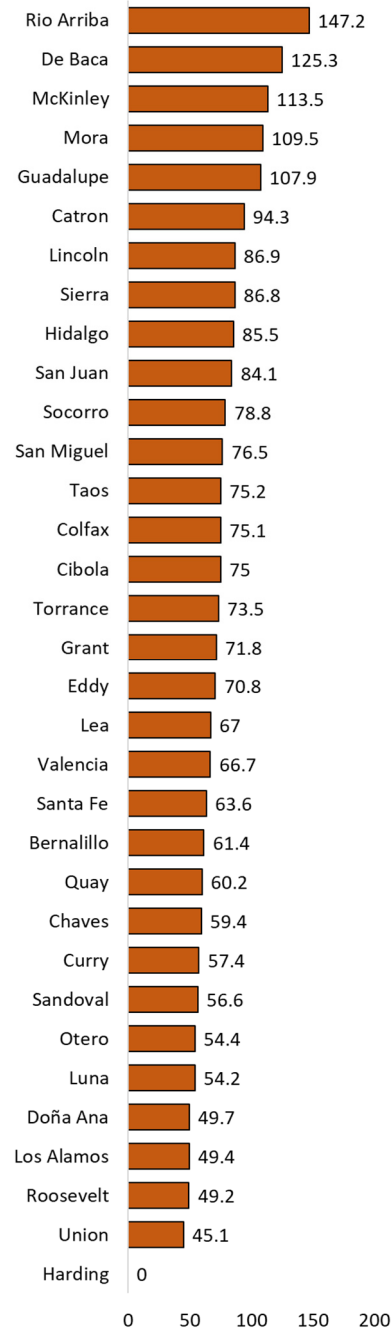

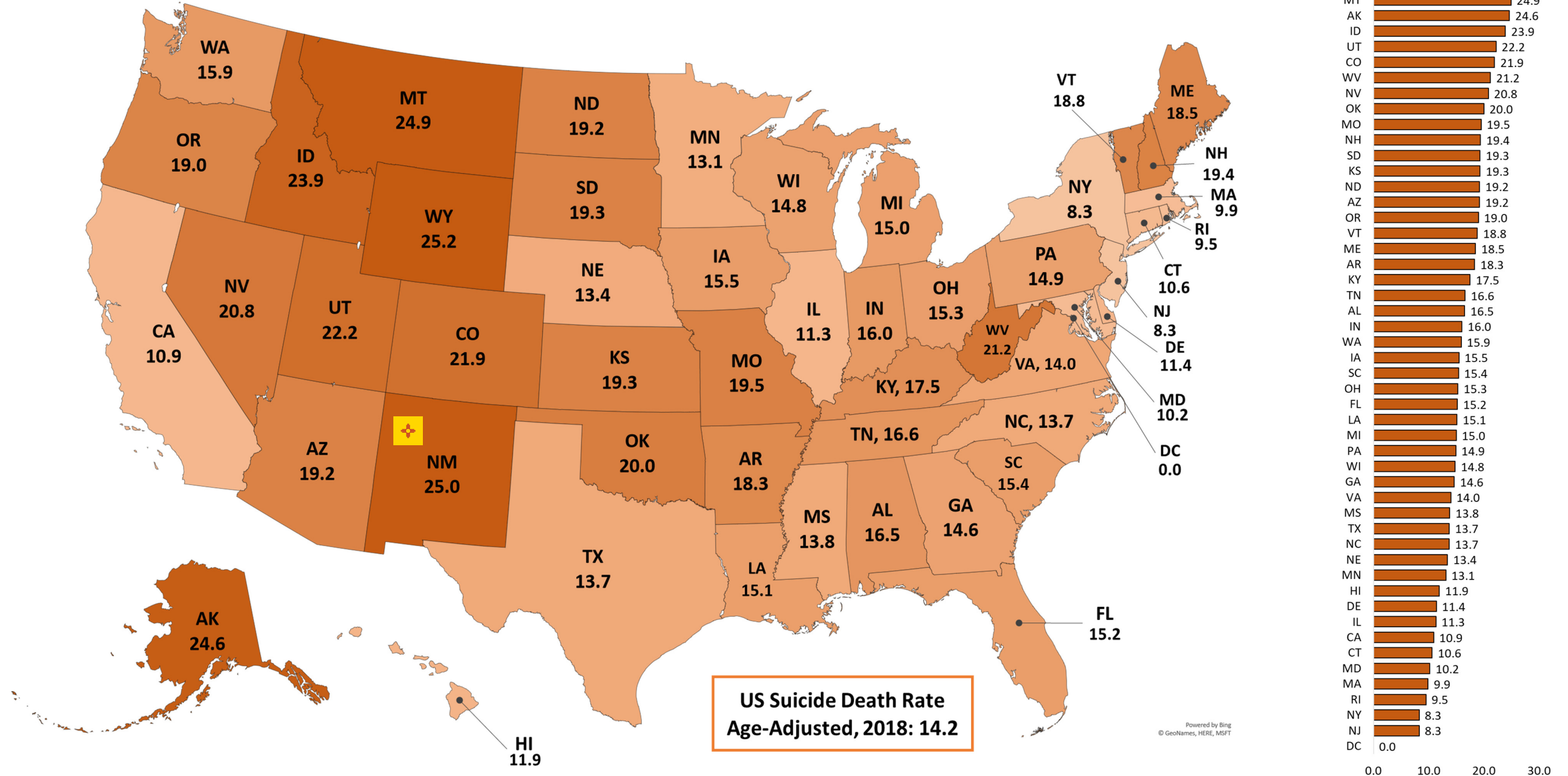
New Mexico Unintentional Injury Deaths per 100,000 Population by County, 2013-2017

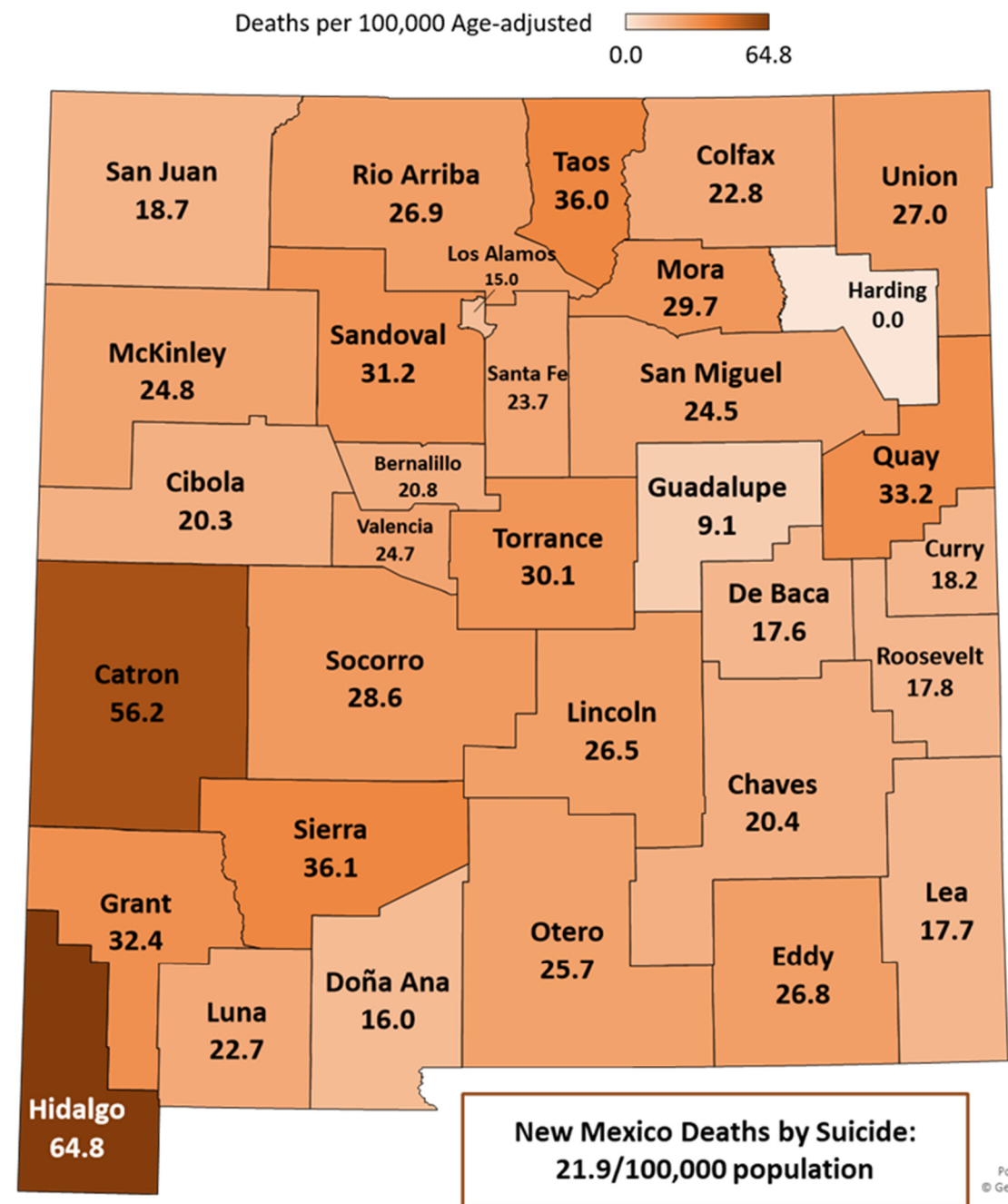
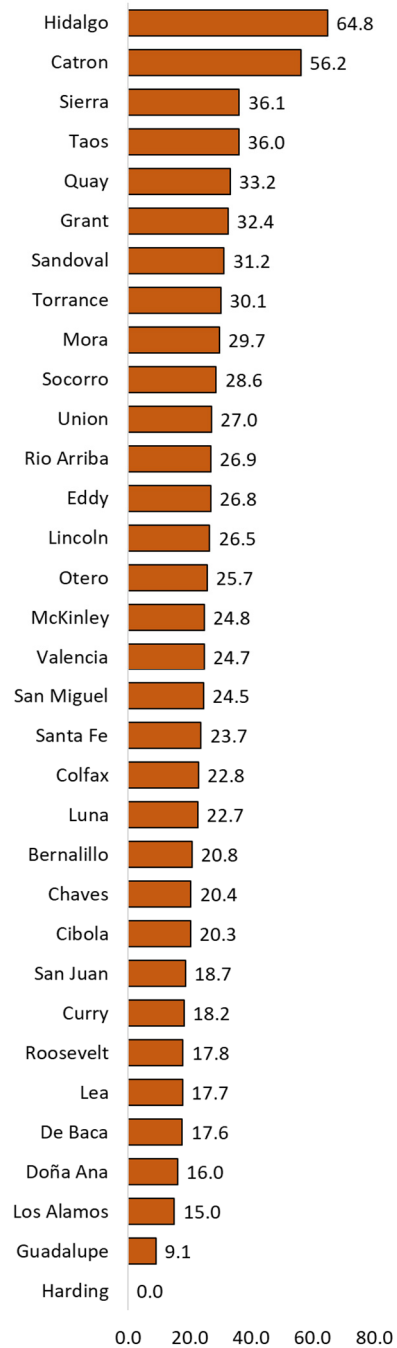

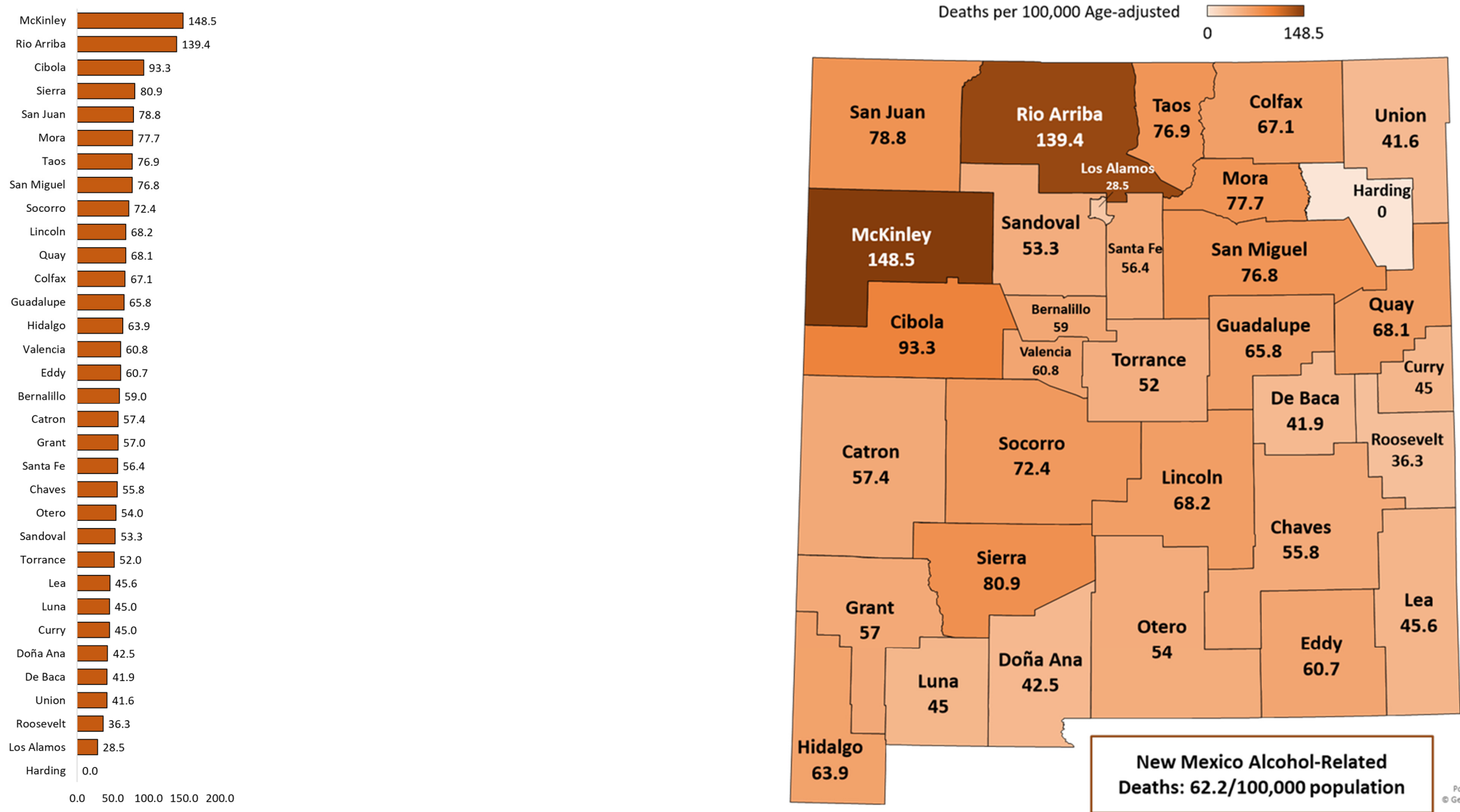

New Mexico Suicide Deaths by County per 100,000 Population, 2013-2017



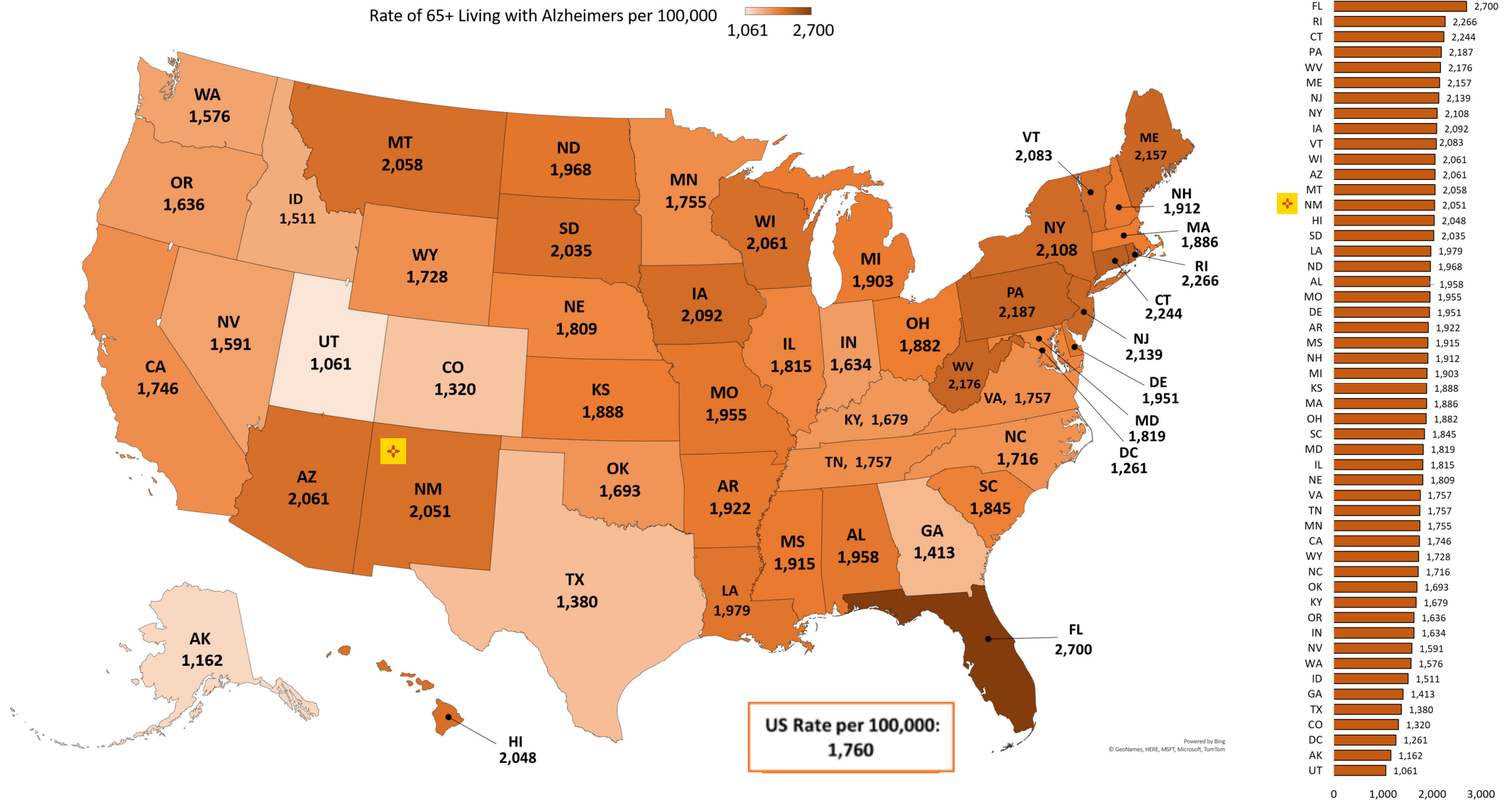

New Mexico Alcohol-Related Deaths by County per 100,000 Population, 2013-2017



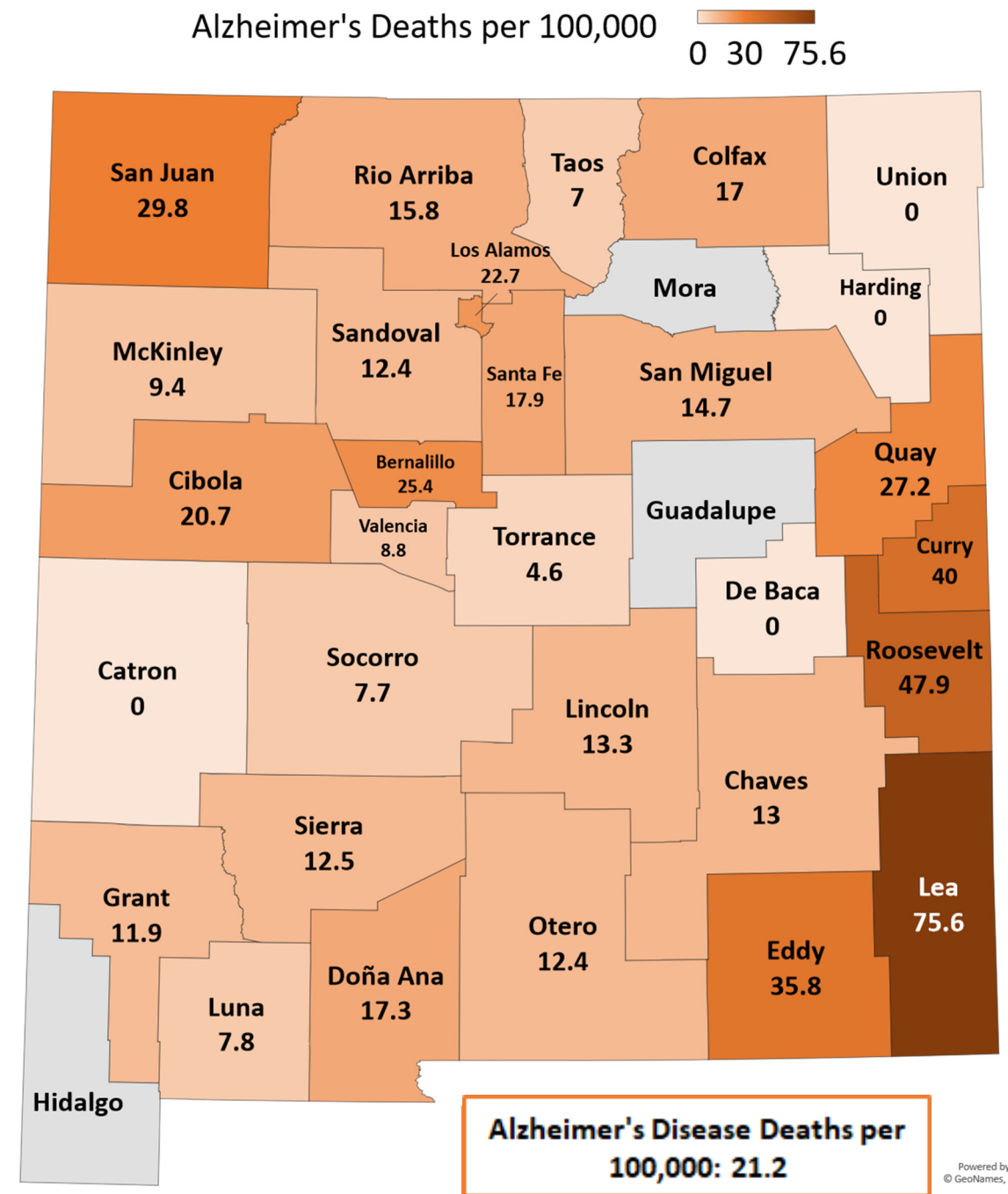
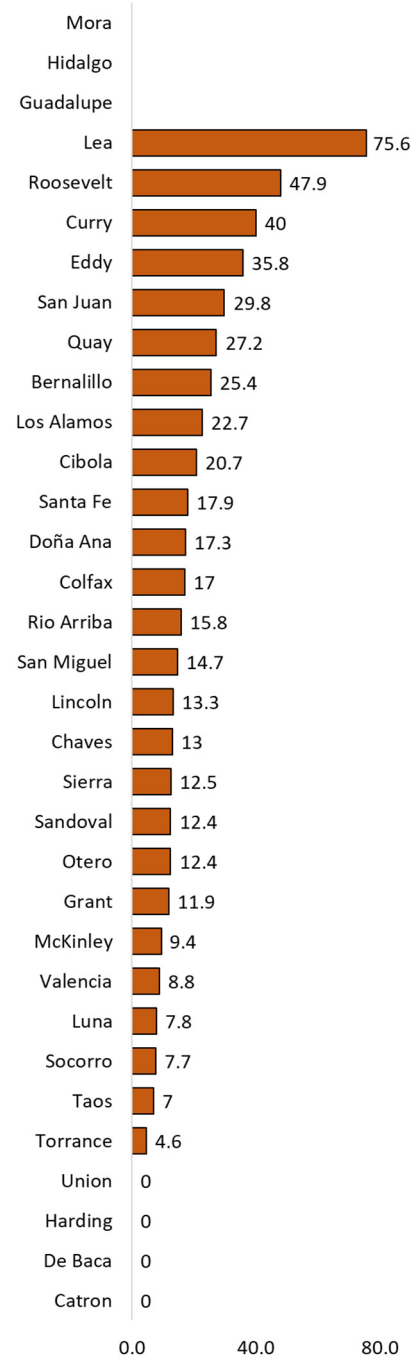

U.S. Rate of Elderly (65+ Years) Living with Alzheimer's per 100,000 Population as of 2020



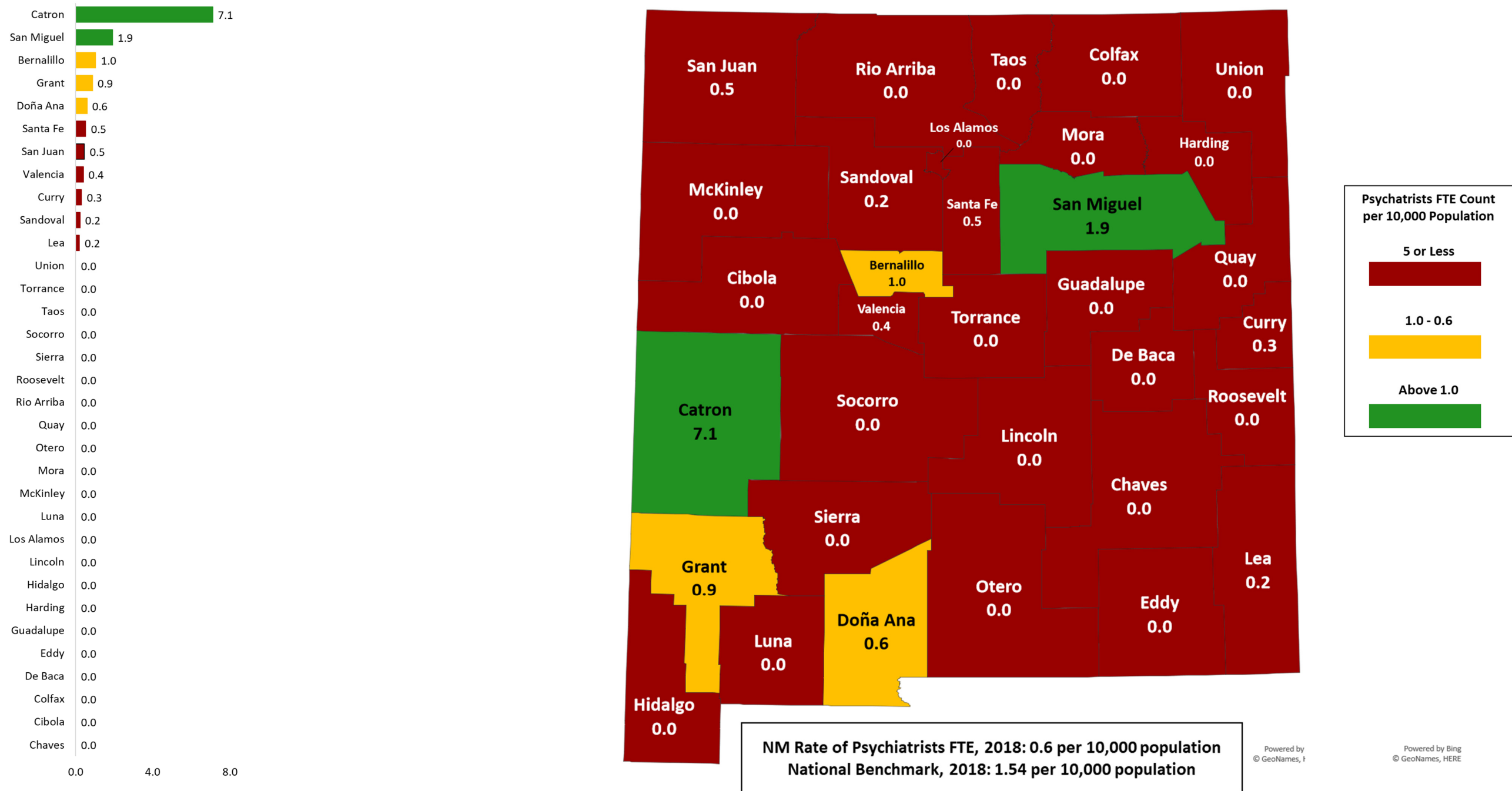

New Mexico Alzheimer's Disease Deaths per 100,000 by County Age-Adjusted per 100,000 Population as of 2019



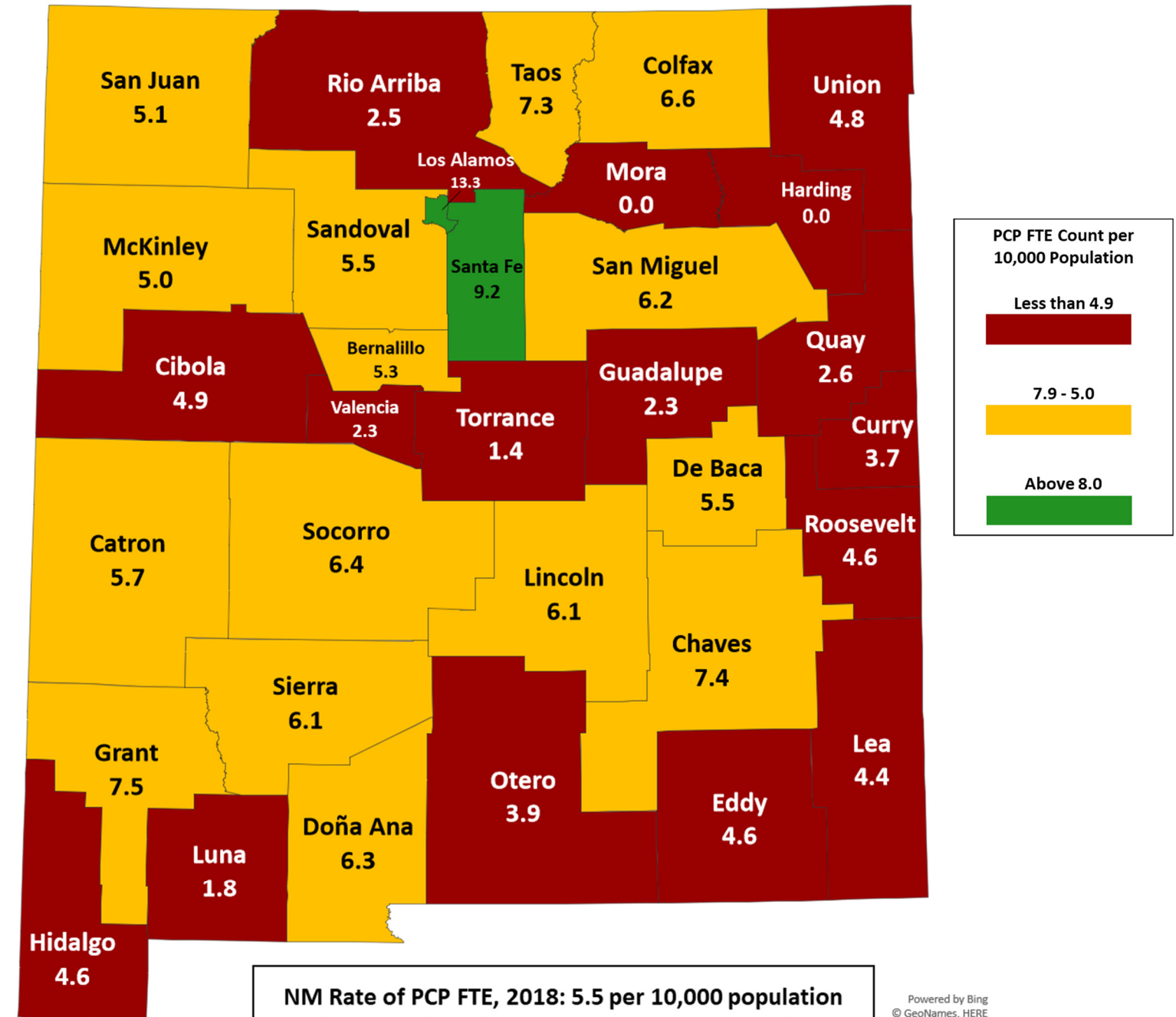
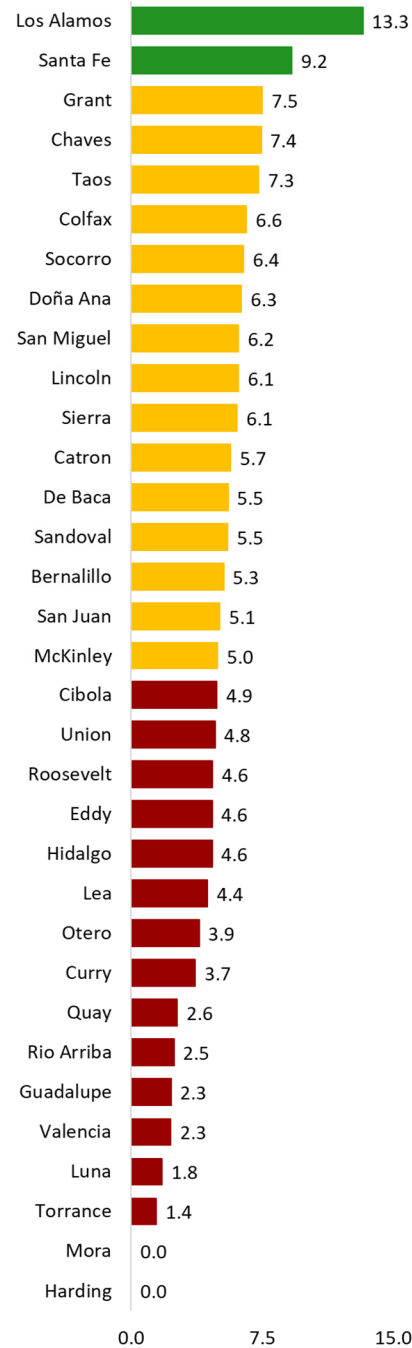

New Mexico Primary Care Physicians Full-Time Equivalent Count by County per 10,000 Population as of 2018

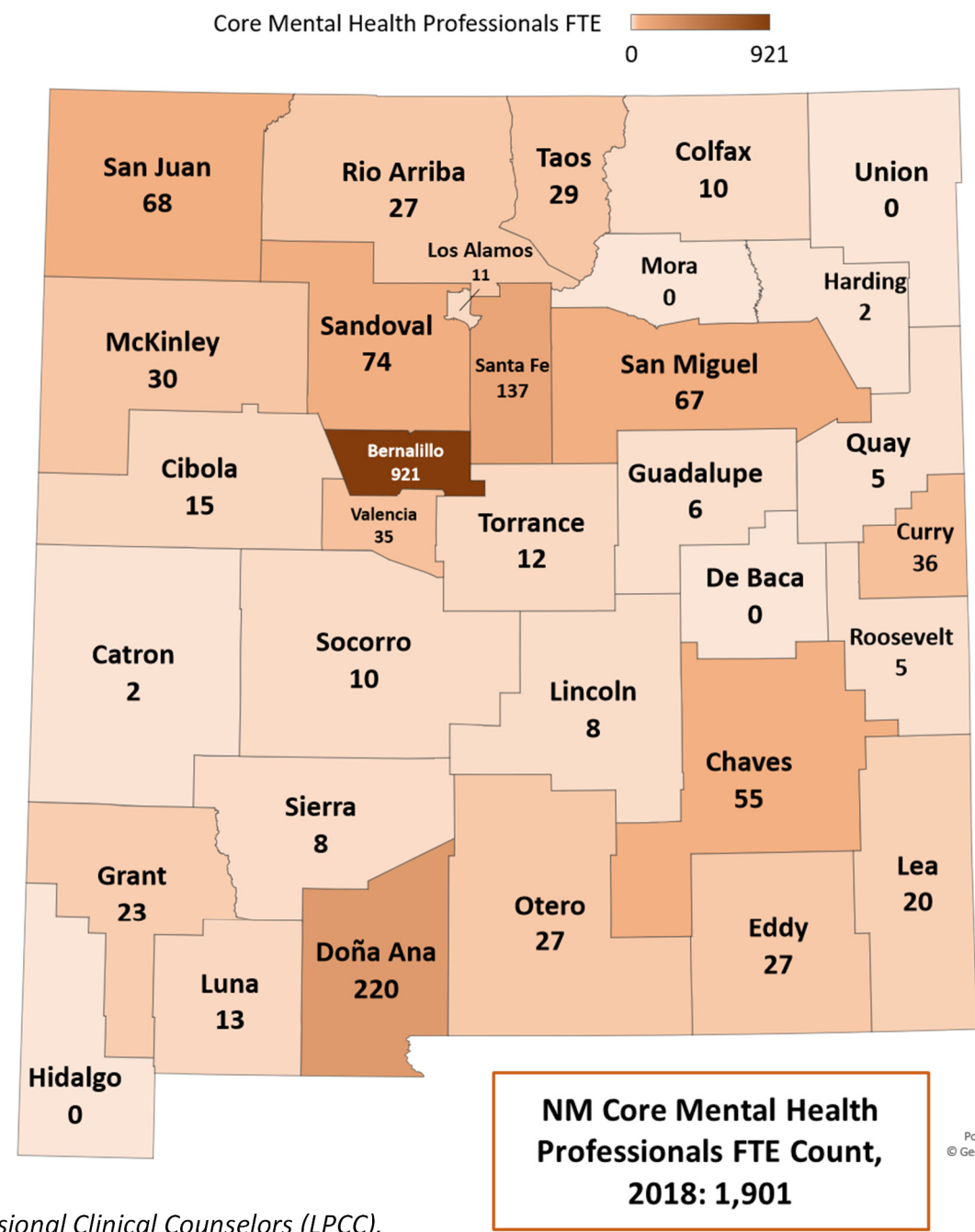
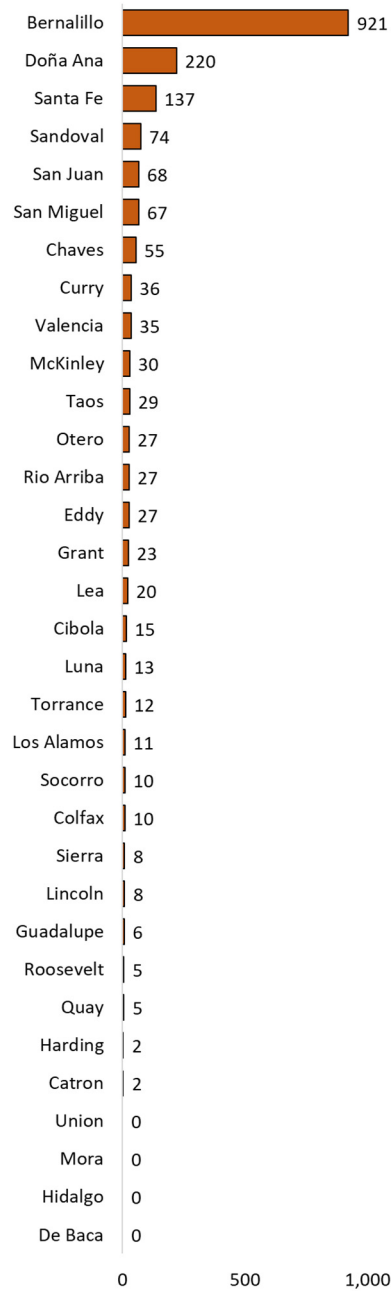

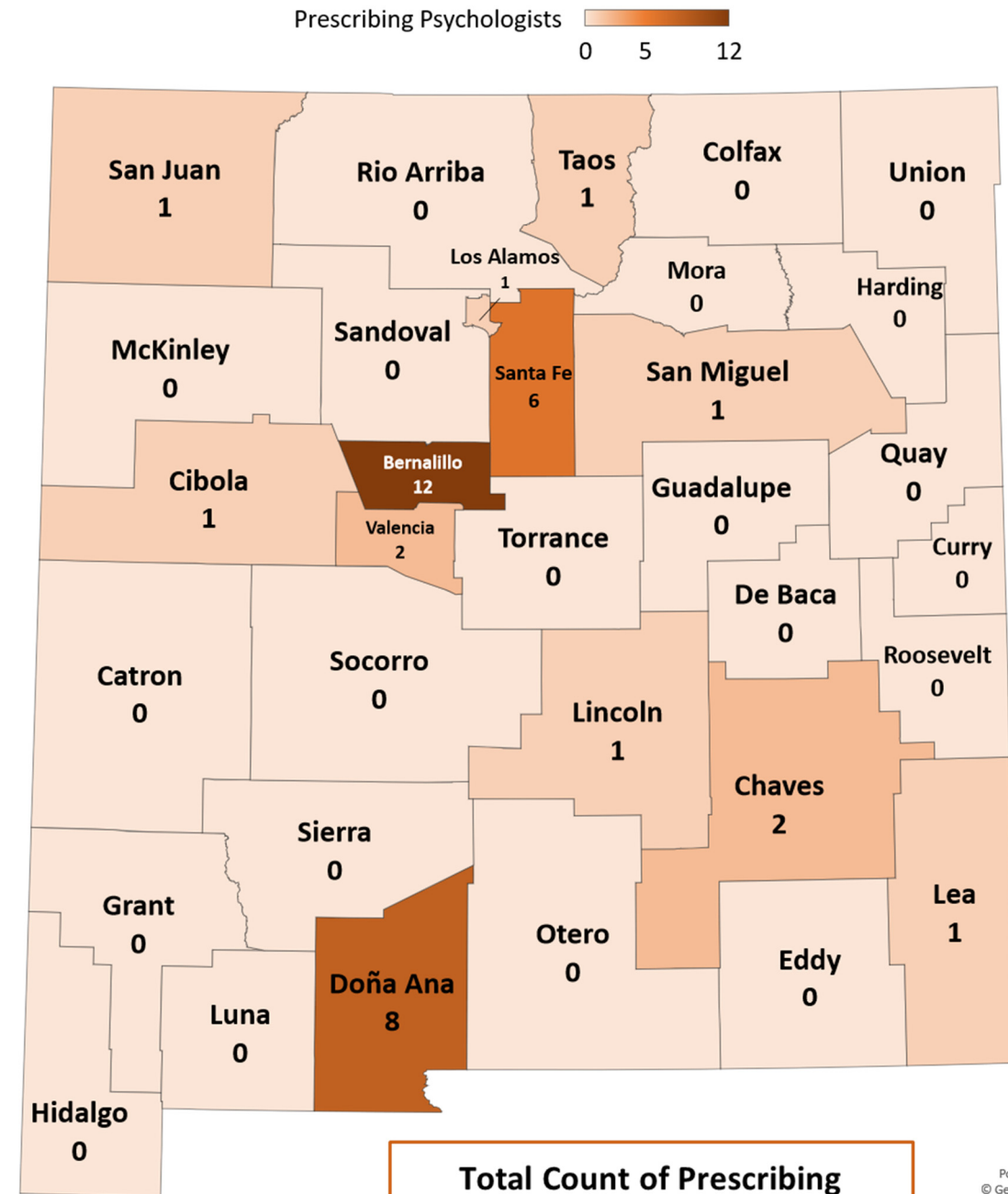
New Mexico Core Mental Health Professionals Full-Time Equivalent Count by County as of 2018

New Mexico Prescribing Psychologists by County as of 2018

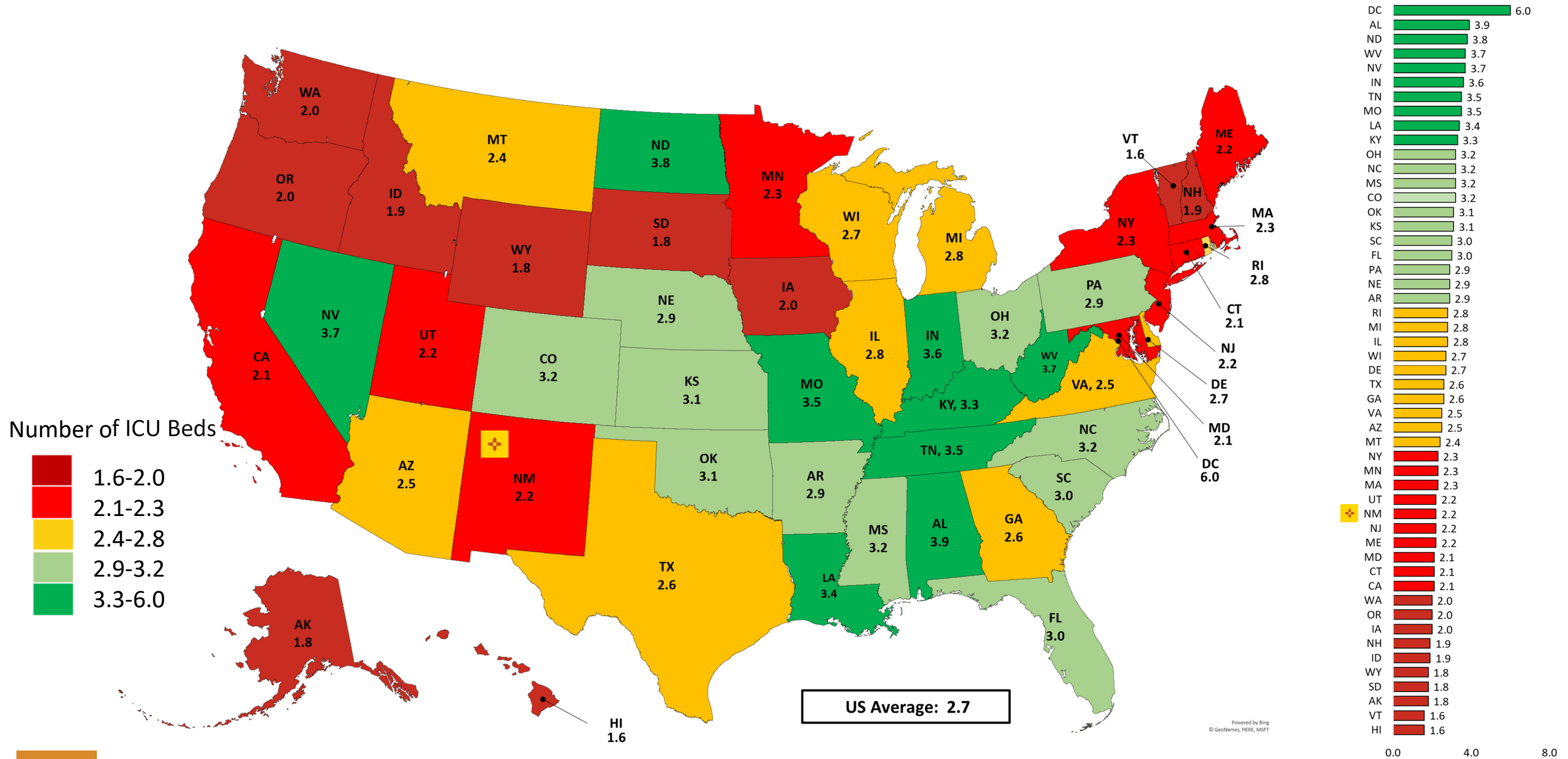

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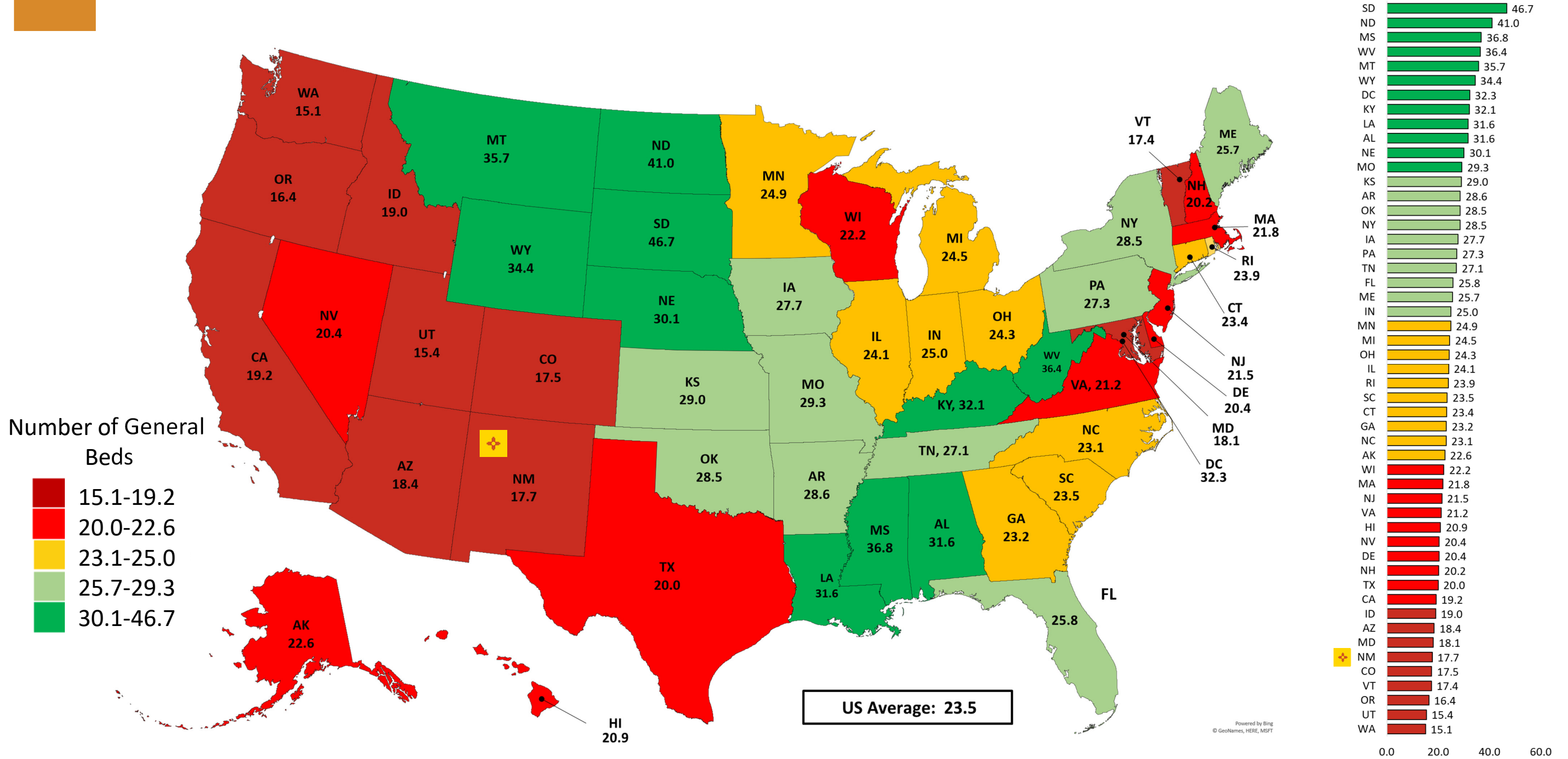

U.S. Number of ICU Beds by State per 10,000 Population as of 2018



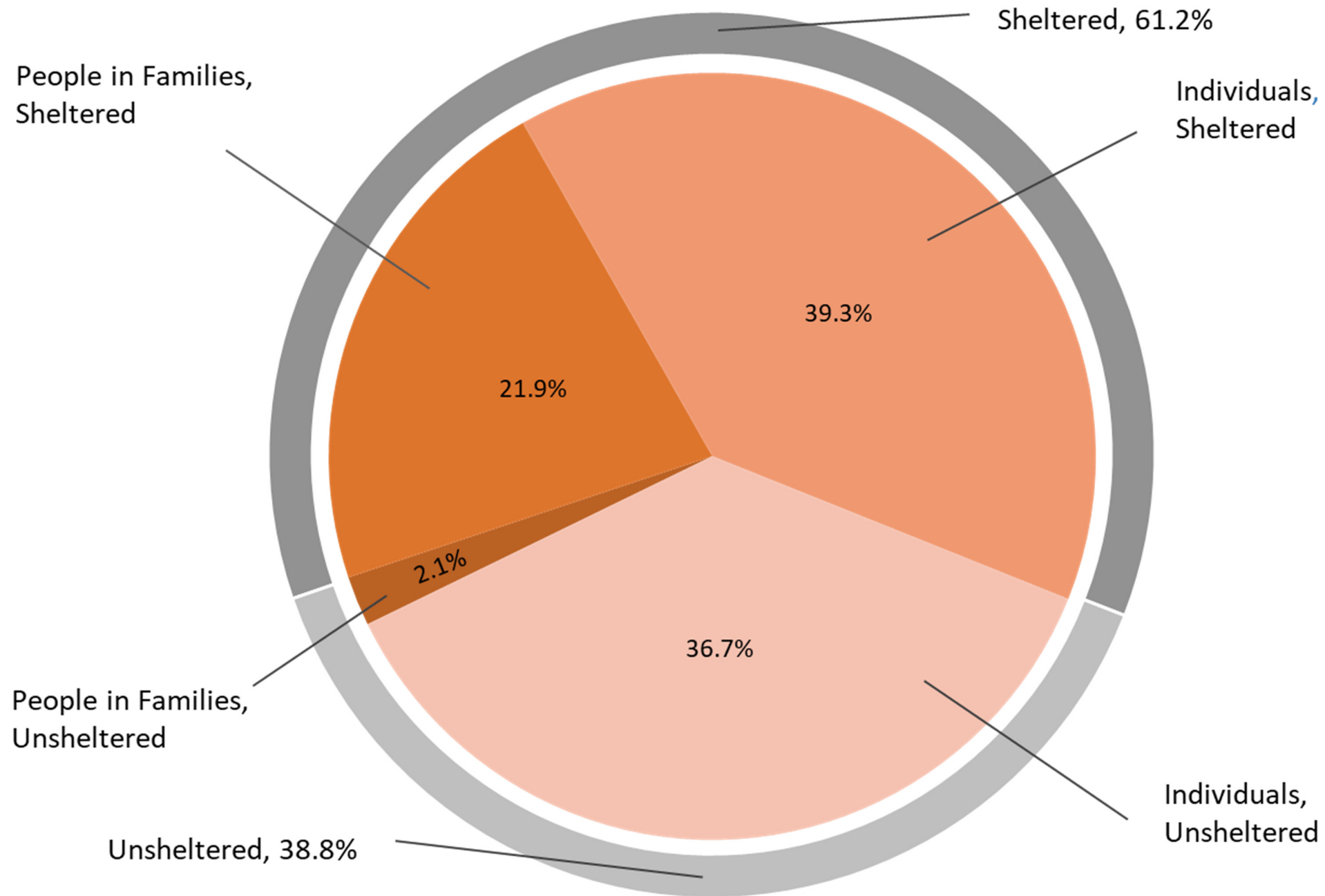
