IV.	Medicaid Budget Projections	Jason Sanchez presented the Medicaid Budget Projections.  FY17 Budget is a Lag Model based on actual data. \$1.5 million in increased total expenditures has rolled over from FY16 into current year for an overall decrease of 11.9 million in total expenditures. Overall revenue surplus of 15.2 million of general fund (GF) which is 3.9 million higher than previous projection.  FY18 projection shows an overall reduction in the projection of 48.2 million in total expenditures. Overall revenue shortfall for budget FY18 is 22.6 million GF.  FY19 budget request totaled a projected increase above FY18 of 80.7 million in total expenditures. Overall GF need for budget FY19 is 997.2 million. 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V. Updated Medicaid Data  • 1115 Waiver Renewal Presentation	Nancy Smith-Leslie presented a Director's update on the Medicaid 1115 Waiver  Waiver update - MAD is currently in the public comment period for the Centennial Care waiver renewal. (Today is the second public hearing regarding the waiver renewal. There will be two more public hearings in Las Vegas and Albuquerque.) MAD is still on track to submit the final waiver application to CMS at the end of November also MAD is in the process of an active procurement to select the Centennial Care 2.0 managed care organizations. Contracts will be awarded in March of 2018. There will be 8 months of readiness before going live on January 1, 2019.  MMISR update – MAD is in active negotiations with the System Integrator vendor. MAD will then start negotiations with the selected Data Services RFP vendor in the upcoming weeks. The Quality Assurance RFP Module is scheduled to be released in November. The Benefit Management Services Module has been created to fit components from the Quality Assurance Module which include Provider Management and Benefit Management. The Benefit Management and Financial Services Module will be released in 2018. The Outcomes Based Management Module is scheduled to be released after the Financial Services Module.  CHIP reauthorization update – 11 thousand children covered under CHIP. Funding will continue through June 2018 before the CHIP fund is exhausted. HSD will continue to monitor the reauthorization bills.  HSD received a 3 month extension from CMS to assess for Mental Health Parity. Our initial findings show we need to make few changes to be compliant with Mental Health Parity.  Nancy reviewed the Medicaid Utilization and Expenditure Dashboard report – the report compares the previous period of April 2015 through March 2016 to April 2016 through March 2017. Managed Care enrollment continues to increase about 5% between the two periods. Medical Care cost decreased by 1.0% on a per-capita basis, primarily driven by reductions in the Physical Health program and Long-Term Supports and Services, while	None The information on each 1115 subcommittee meeting is available on the HSD website.
