(from Mi Via Advisory Committee member)	State response: The analysis of service utilization data included Medicaid expenditures from October 1, 2011 thru April 30, 2014 which indicated zero utilization of the Assisted Living service by recipients (DD and MF) enrolled in the Mi Via program. Mi Via participants have not utilized this particular service since 2011 despite its availability. In addition, there continues to be the expectation by the CMS that participants have full access to benefits of community living and the opportunity to receive services in the most integrated settings. The rules put forth have set the expectation for all

		states to focus their efforts on providing home and community based services through integrated community based settings rather than through segregated and/or facility based settings. The zero utilization of this service since 2011 combined with the efforts of the state to meet the rules/expectations put forth by CMS on a national level regarding community integration provides indication this service is not of interest to those receiving Mi Via Home and Community Based Waiver services.
