HB400 Discussion and Guidance-

- New Mexico Health Care Authority (HCA) contracted with Mercer Government Human Services Consulting (Mercer), part of Mercer Health & Benefits LLC, to support the legislatively mandated study of the Medicaid Forward Plan, as outlined in HB400 (2023)
- Mercer is a consulting firm that works with State Medicaid agencies to design, implement, and evaluate Medicaid programs
- The Mercer team is comprised of specialists in a variety of areas including actuarial, financial, clinical, informatics, and policy and operations
- Mercer engages in a variety of work with HCA including actuarial services, benefit design and fee development, policy and operations support, and other projects as assigned

2023 House Bill (HB) 400

As described in HB 400 (2023), Medicaid Forward would provide health care coverage to residents that:

- 1. Are under the age of 65
- 2. Are not otherwise eligible for and enrolled in New Mexico Medicaid
- 3. Have a household income that exceeds 133% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)

The Medicaid Forward study is required by HB 400 (state legislation passed by the New Mexico legislature in 2023) and requires a study on the feasibility of creating and implementing a state-administered health coverage plan that leverages Medicaid, or Medicaid Forward

HB 400 (2023) does not mandate the following for Medicaid Forward:

- 1. Structure of the delivery system
- 2. Particular benefits
- 3. Limits on income eligibility

The Medicaid Forward study is required by HB 400 (state legislation passed by the New Mexico legislature in 2023) and requires a study on the feasibility of creating and implementing a state-administered health coverage plan that leverages Medicaid, or Medicaid Forward

- Phase one of the Medicaid Forward study was conducted by the Urban Institute on behalf of the New Mexico Office of the Superintendent of Insurance (OSI)
- Mercer, in phase two, is furthering the work of phase one, including aiding HCA with program design recommendations regarding Medicaid Forward and assessing the impacts on health care coverage in New Mexico
- Mercer will be conducting a variety of tasks including an assessment of:
- Expected impact of Medicaid Forward on; enrollment levels, premiums, and cost sharing on different areas of the market (Medicaid, New Mexico health insurance exchange, and other public plans)
- Reimbursement levels for providers and facilities
- Operational costs of administration of Medicaid Forward
- Potential Medicaid waiver authorities and strategies
- Budgetary needs and impacts
