Dear Interested Parties,

The Human Services Department (the Department) through the Medical Assistance Division is proposing to repeal and replace 8.320.6 NMAC School-Based Services for MAP Eligible Recipients under Twenty-One Years of Age. The Department is taking this action instead of amending sections due to the number of changes to standardize language, update terminology, and to bring sections of the rule under one section for structural organization. A significant change to the proposed rule is new language that will change the current payment methodology to a cost reporting methodology that includes interim payments, a quarterly random moment time study, and annual cost settlement report. HSD is proposing to change the current payment methodology to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) "CMS preferred" cost reporting methodology that ensures MAD school-based service providers are reimbursed the actual costs of providing IEP or IFSP-related direct medical services.
