The New Mexico Health Care Authority (HCA) Medical Assistance Division (MAD) is providing this notice of opportunity to comment on proposed State Plan Amendment (SPA) to add Comprehensive Addiction Recovery Act (CARA) program-Plan of Care services for infants who have a prenatal exposure to substances. (SPA) 24-0005, Comprehensive Addiction Recovery Act (CARA).

Effective July 1, 2024, hospital providers can bill and be reimbursed for implementing a plan of care for infants in the (CARA) program separate from the Diagnoses Related Group (DRG). These are infants who have prenatal exposure to substances and require a plan of care that includes ongoing wrap around services and family referrals to voluntary support and treatment services once discharged.

The estimated total financial impact is \$66,742 in federal funds for FFY 2024 and \$271,499 in federal funds for FFY 2025.
